



YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING

February 20, 2024

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by John Marquardt at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 20th, 2024.

Roll call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Don Kettering, Wanda Howey-Fox, Ryan Heine, Dan Klimisch and John Marquardt.

Commissioner Fox will abstain from voting on the second set of claims from Harmelink & Fox Law Office. There were no conflicts from the rest of the board.

Action 2444C: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Klimisch to approve the meeting agenda, adding contractual matters to executive session. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

There were public comments from Tom Bixler and Lauren Nelson. Chairman Marquardt closed public comment.

Brian Hunhoff appeared before the board to present the Register of Deeds fourth quarter and annual reports for 2023.

Action 2445ROD: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox approve the 2023 fourth quarter report from the Register of Deeds Office. A detailed report is on file with the County Auditor. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Highway Superintendent Mike Sedlacek appeared for approval of the 2024 bridge inspection resolution, approval of the annual highway bids, and the striping agreement.

Action 2446HWY: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch to approve the annual highway bids as presented. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Action 2447HWY: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to approve the following resolution. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0

BRIDGE REINSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, 23 CFR 650 Subpart C, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years. **THEREFORE**, Yankton County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program.

The County requests SDDOT to hire IMEG Consultants Corp. for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered and bill the County for 20% of the cost. The County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

Action 2448HWY: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to approve Striping Agreement between State of South Dakota Department of Transportation and Yankton County. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Yankton County Director of Equalization Michelle Goeken reported on 2024 property values and discussed dates for the local and consolidated boards of equalization. The board set April 9, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. for opening of board of equalization and April 19, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. for the appeal process.

Harry Redman from Planning and Development District III presented a power point on the county's building permit system. Commissioner Heine said he would meet with Mr. Redman and Gary Vetter to complete the transition.

Preston Crissey, Yankton County Sheriff, presented the food service bids for the Jail. Bids were from Trinity Services Group and Summit. Sheriff Crissey also requested approval for the purchase of a transport van.

Action 2449S: A motion was made by Heine and seconded by Fox to approve the bid from Trinity Services Group for inmate meals. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Action 2450S: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch to approve the purchase of a 2024 AWD Ford Van for \$56,988.00 and extra fee of \$399.00. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Rezone: There was a second reading on the request from Mark and Tamara Mabee to rezone a parcel in a Rural Transitional District (RT) to a Moderate Density Rural Residential District (R2). There were no public comments.

Action 2451Z: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Heine to approve Rezone request from Mark and Tamara Mabee. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Mideast Cease-Fire Efforts Gain Steam, US Envoy Visits

JERUSALEM - International efforts to broker a cease fire be-tween Israel and Hamas appeared to gain new momentum Thursday as the White House sald a visit by a senior envoy with Israeli leaders was "going well" and other media-tors reported encouraging signs

from the warring parties.

The new signs of progress came ahead of an expected summit this weekend in Paris, where mediators plan to present a new proposal, The U.S., Egypt and Qatar have been struggling for weeks to find a formula that could halt Israel's devastating offensive in Gaza, but now face an unofficial deadline as the Muslim holy month of Ramadan approaches. White House Mideast envoy

Brett McGurk held talks through-out the day with Israell leaders and families of Israell hostages

held by Harnas.
"The initial Indications we're getting from Brett are these discussions are going well," said White House spokesman John

A Western diplomat involved In the efforts said both sides want a pause. "What we have heard from our partners is that they are willing to give concessions, she said, spealding on condition of anonymity to discuss closeddoor diplomacy. "Time is pressing

In new fighting, Israeli strikes killed over 10 people in southern and central Gaza, Palestinian health officials said.

Tens sons were also rising in the Israeli-occupied West Bank, where three Palestinian guunen opened fire on morning traffic at a highway checkpoint, killing one man and wounding five others, Israel declared war after Hamas milltants stormed across the border on Oct. 7, killing some 1.200 people and taking 250 others hostage. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has dismissed the Hamas demands as 'felusional'. But in

demands as "delusional." But in recent days, Israeli leaders have begun to voice cautious optimism and Hamas has signaled it is softening its demands. Defense Minister Yoav Gallant,

a member of Israel's three-man War Cabinet, Indicated some flexibility. "We will expand the authority given to our hostage negotiators," he said.

Private Craft Lands On Moon; Signal Weak

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — A private lander on Thursday made the first U.S. touchdown on the moon in more than 50 years. but managed just a weak signal back as flight controllers scram-bled to gain better contact.

Despite the spotty communication, intuitive Machines, the

company that built and managed the craft, confirmed that it had landed. There was no Immediate word from the company on the condition — or even the exact location — of the lander. The com pany ended its live webcast soon after confirming a touchdown.

Mission director Tim Crain sald the team was evaluating how

Mission director 1 m Crain said the team was evaluating now to refine the lone signal from the lander, named Odysseus, which delivered experiments to the moon for NASA.

"But we can confirm, without a doubt, that our equipment is on the surface of the moon." he said.

Added intuitive Machines CEO Steve Alternus: "I know this was

a nail-biter, but we are on the surface and we are transmitting. Welcome to the moon."

They believe abortion can be a winning issue as the debate widens to include increasing concerns over miscarriage care, access to medication, access to emergency care and now IVF treatments.

The GOP has struggled to talk about the issue while abortion rights advocate have wan races were in conservative leaning.

rights advocates have won races even in conservative-leaning states. Reproductive rights groups on Thursday compared the Alabama ruling to the impact of the Supreme Court's Dobbs ruling that overturned Roe v. Wade and nullified a federally guaranteed right to abortion.

The criminal complaint unsealed Thursday in U.S. District Court in Richmond alleges that the four defendants — who were all carrying Pakistani identification cards — were transporting
