STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR WEED SPRAYING SERVICES BY COUNTY

This Joint Powers Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by and between the State of South Dakota, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, referred to in this Agreement as the "STATE," and Yankton County, South Dakota, referred to in this Agreement as the "COUNTY."

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The STATE is the owner of real property located in Yankton County, South Dakota.
- 2. The STATE wants the COUNTY to control the growth of declared noxious weeds within the right of way of state highway routes.
- 3. The COUNTY is willing to provide weed spraying services to the STATE.

THE STATE AND THE COUNTY MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

I. JOINT POWERS

This Agreement does not establish a separate legal entity, as contemplated by SDCL 1-24-5. The cooperative undertaking described in this Agreement will be financed and conducted under the provisions of this Agreement by the COUNTY and the STATE. Each party has responsibilities under the terms of this Agreement and no joint board or administrator will be used. No real property will be purchased for use in connection with this Agreement.

- II. THE COUNTY
 - A. The COUNTY services under this Agreement will commence May 1, 2024, and will end October 1, 2024, unless terminated earlier pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
 - B. The COUNTY will provide services in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and any amendments.
 - C. The COUNTY will:
 - 1. Furnish the necessary equipment, materials, and labor to control the growth of declared noxious weeds in accordance with the bid proposal attached to this Agreement as Exhibit A.
 - 2. Ensure that the weed spraying is accomplished by personnel properly licensed by the South Dakota Department of Agriculture.
 - 3. Advise the STATE'S local maintenance shop of the COUNTY'S intent to spray, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to spraying.
 - 4. Ensure the COUNTY'S spraying vehicles are equipped with a flashing amber warning light which must be in operation while spraying highway right of way. The COUNTY will not stop its vehicle(s) on the roadway, driving lanes, or shoulders on the Interstate highway system.
 - 5. Complete form DOT-820 Daily Pesticide Application Record, furnished by the STATE, a copy of which is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B. The COUNTY will complete this form on a daily basis after completion of the spraying.
 - 6. Provide the STATE with a completed copy of the DOT-820 Daily Pesticide Application Records within one (1) week after completion of the spraying.

- 7. Submit an invoice for payment to the STATE. The invoice will be accompanied by the completed original DOT-820 daily form(s). The COUNTY may submit separate invoices for the spring and fall spraying, if the COUNTY desires to do so.
- 8. Supply the STATE with visible proof the spraying operations are effectively killing noxious weeds. If the spraying operations do not effectively kill the noxious weeds, the COUNTY will not be paid for that portion of the spraying operations the STATE determines were ineffective.

II. THE STATE will:

- A. Pay the COUNTY the actual costs for services as set out below. Payment will be made pursuant to itemized invoices submitted by the COUNTY, and accompanied by the required form DOT-820 Daily Pesticide Application Records.
- B. Reimburse the COUNTY for all labor required to satisfactorily complete the work contemplated by this Agreement based on the hourly rate per employee as stipulated in the attached Exhibit B.
- C. Reimburse the COUNTY for all pesticides and equipment required to satisfactorily complete the work contemplated by this Agreement based on the costs as stipulated in the attached Exhibit B.
- D. Furnish the COUNTY with form DOT-820 Daily Pesticide Application Records.

III. AMENDMENT PROVISION

This Agreement may not be amended, except in writing, which writing will be expressly identified as a part of this Agreement, and be signed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

IV. TERMINATION PROVISION

Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days' written notice to the other. If the COUNTY breaches any term or condition of this Agreement, the STATE may terminate this Agreement with or without notice. If the STATE terminates this Agreement due to the COUNTY'S default, the STATE may adjust any payment due to the COUNTY at the time of termination to cover any additional costs to the STATE due to the COUNTY'S default. Upon termination, the STATE may take over the work and may award another party an agreement to complete the work under this Agreement. If, after the STATE terminates for a default by the COUNTY, it is determined the COUNTY was not at fault, then the COUNTY will be paid for eligible services rendered and expenses incurred up to the date of termination.

V. FUNDING PROVISION

This Agreement depends upon the continued availability of appropriated funds and expenditure authority from the Legislature for this purpose. If, for any reason, the Legislature fails to appropriate funds or grant expenditure authority, or funds become unavailable by operation of law or federal funds reductions, this Agreement may be terminated by the STATE. Termination for any of these reasons is not a default by the STATE nor does it give rise to a claim against the STATE.

VI. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR PROVISION

While performing services under this Agreement, the COUNTY is an independent contractor and not an officer, agent, or employee of the STATE.

No employee of the COUNTY engaged in the performance of services required under this Agreement will be considered an employee of the STATE. No claim under the South Dakota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of said employee or other person while so engaged and no claim made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission by the COUNTY will be the STATE'S obligation or responsibility.

VII. EMPLOYEE STATUS PROVISION

Any officer, employee, or agent engaged in joint action under this Agreement will remain an employee with his or her agency during participation in joint action under this Agreement. Each agency will retain exclusive responsibility for its officers, agents, and employees while these officers, agents, and employees are engaged in joint action under this Agreement, including but not limited to responsibility for regular and overtime wages and salaries, unemployment benefits, workers' compensation coverage, health insurance, or other benefits, and liability coverage and indemnity, except as otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement.

VIII. COMPLIANCE PROVISION

The COUNTY will comply with all federal, state and local laws, together with all ordinances and regulations applicable to the work and will be solely responsible for obtaining current information on such requirements. The COUNTY will procure all licenses, permits, or other rights necessary for the fulfillment of its obligation under the Agreement.

IX. INDEMNIFICATION PROVISION

The COUNTY will indemnify the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all actions, suits, damages, liability, or other proceedings that may arise as the result of performing services under this Agreement. This section does not require the COUNTY to be responsible for or defend against claims or damages arising from errors or omissions of the STATE, its officers, agents, or employees.

X. CONTROLLING LAW PROVISION

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota. Any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this Agreement will be venued in Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.

XI. SEVERABILITY PROVISION

If any court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this Agreement unenforceable or invalid, such holding will not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement.

XII. SUPERCESSION PROVISION

All other prior discussions, communications, and representations concerning the subject matter of this Agreement are superseded by the terms of this Agreement, and except as specifically provided in this Agreement, this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement with respect to the subject matter.

XIII. The COUNTY has designated its County Commission Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative and has empowered the Chairperson with the authority to sign this Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY. A copy of the COUNTY'S Commission minutes or resolution authorizing the execution of this Agreement by the Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit C.

By signature of their representatives below, each party certifies that approval of this Agreement by ordinance, resolution, or other appropriate means has been obtained by that party's governing body or officer pursuant to SDCL § 1-24-3 and § 1-24-6.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A lederal judge refused Thursday to throw out the classified documents prosecution against Donaid

throw out the classified documents prosecution against Dona Trump, turning aside defense arguments that a decades-old law permitted the former president to retain the sensitive records after he left office. Lawyers for Trump had cited a 1978 statute known as the Presidential Records Act in demanding that the case, one of four against the presumptive Republican nominee, be tossed out before trial. That law requires presidents upon leaving office to turn over presidential records to the federal govern-ment but permits them to retain puerly detroopal paper.

ment but permits them to retain purely personal papers. Prosecutors on special counsel Jack Smith's team coun-tered that that law had no relevance to a case concerning the mishandling of classified documents and said the records Trump is alleged to have hoarded at his Mar-a-Lago estate A state of the sta

wrote that the 40 count indictment against Trimp makes "no reference to the Presidential Records Act" nor does it "rely on that statute for purposes of stating an ollense."

The ruling by represents a modest win for Smith's team, which has been trying to push the prosecution forward to trial this year while also expressing growing (rustration, including earlier this week, with Cannon's oversight of the case. Other Trump motions to dismiss the indictment remain unresolved by the judge, the trial date is in flux, and additional legal disputes have slowed the progress of the case.

Trump: Israel Must Get Gaza War Over 'Fast'

NEW YORK (AP) - Former President Donald Trump offered a lough message to Israel over its war against Hamas on Thurs-day, urging the country to: "Get it over with." in an interview with conservative radio host Hugh Hewitt,

Trump said that Israel is "absolutely losing the PR war" and called for a swift resolution to the bloodshed. "Get It over with and let's get back to peace and stop kill-

Ing people. And that's a very simple statement, "Trump said. "They have to get it done. Get it over with and get it over with fast because we have to – you have to get back to normalcy and peace."

The presumptive GOP nominee, who has criticized President Joe Biden for being insulficiently supportive of Israel, also ap-peared to question the tactics of the Israeli military as the civilpeared to question the factics of the Israeli military as the civil-ian death toil in Gaza continues to mount. Since Hamas militants attacked Israel on Oct. 7. Israel's military has battered the terri-tory, killing more than 30,000 Palestinians, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, and creating a humanitarian catastrophe. "I'm not sure that I'm loving the way they're doing it, because you've got to have victory. You have to have a victory, and it's taking a long time," Trump said.

UK Jurists Call To Stop Arms Sales To Israel

LONDON (AP) — More than 600 British jurists, Including three retired judges from the U.K. Supreme Court, are calling on the gov ermment to suspend arms sales to Israel, piling pressure on Prime Minister Rishi Sunak after the deaths of three U.K. aid workers in an Israeli strike. Britain is just one of a number of Israel's longstanding allies

whose governments are under growing pressure to halt weapons exports because of the toll of the six-month-old war in Gaza.

fn an open letter to Sunak published late Wednesday, the lawyers and judges said the U.K. could be complicit in "grave breaches of International Jaw" If it continues to ship weapons,

Signatories, including former Supreme Court President Brenda Hale, said Britain is legally obliged to heed the International Court of Justice's conclusion that there is a "plausible risk of genocide" in Gaza.

The letter said the "sale of weapons and weapons systems to Israel ... falls significantly short of your government's obligations under international law."

NEW YORK (AP) — A major spring storm brought heavy snow, rain and high winds to the Northeast into Thursday, downing trees and power lines and leaving nearly 700,000 homes and businesses without power at some point. Two feet of snow is possible in parts of northern New England by Thursday evening, with wind gusts of 30 to 60 mph (80 to 97 kph) in coastal areas as well as Inland. according to the National Weather Service.

Judge Rejects Trump Request For Dismissal

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal judge refused Thursday to throw out the classified documents prosecution against Donald Trump, turning aside delense arguments that a decades-old law permitted the former president to retain the sensitive records after he left office. Lawyers for Trump had cited a 1978 statute known as the

Presidential Records Act in demanding that the case, one of four against the presumptive Republican nominee, be tossed out before trial. That law requires presidents upon leaving

out before trial. That hav requires presidents upon leaving office to turn over presidential records to the federal govern-ment but permits them to retain purely personal papers. Prosecutors on special counsel Jack Smith's team coun-tered that that hav had no relevance to a case concerning the mishandling of classified documents and said the records misrandung of classified nocuments and said the records Trump is alleged to have hoarded at his Mara-Lago estate were unquestionably presidential records, not personal files, and therefore had to be returned to the government when Trump left the White House in January 2021. U.S. District Judge Aileen Cannon, who heard arguments

on the matter last month, perinitited the case to proceed in a three-page order that rejected the Trump team claims. She wrote that the 40-count indictment against Trump makes "no

Trump: Israel Must Get Gaza War Over 'Fast'

NEW YORK (AP) — Former President Donald Trump offered a tough message to Israel over Its war against Hamas on Thurs-day, urging the country to: 'Get it over with.' In an interview with conservative radio host Hugh Hewitt, Trump said that Israel is "absolutely losing the PR war" and

rrump said that Israel is "absolutely losing the PR war" and called for a swift resolution to the bloodshed. ' "Get it over with and let's get back to peace and stop kill-ing people. And that's a very simple statement," Trump said. "They have to get it done. Get it over with fast because we have to -you have to get back to normalcy and peace."

The presumptive GOP nominee, who has criticized President Joe Biden for being insufficiently supportive of Israel, also ap-peared to question the tactics of the Israeli military as the civilian death toll in Gaza continues to mount. Since Hamas militants attacked Israel on Oct. 7, Israel's military has battered the terri-tory, killing more than 30,000 Palestinians, according to the Gaza

Health Ministry, and creating a humanitarian catastrophe. "I'm not sure that I'm loving the way they 're doing it, because you're got to have victory. You have to have a victory. and it's taking a long time, "T'rump said.

UK Jurists Call To Stop Arms Sales To Israel

I.ONDON (AP) - More than 600 British jurists, including three retired judges from the U.K. Supreme Court, are calling on the gov-ernment to supper d arms sales to Israel, piling pressure on Prime Minister Rishi Sunak after the deaths of three U.K. aid workers in an Israell strike.

Britain is just one of a number of Israel's longstanding allies whose governments are under growing pressure to halt weapons exports because of the toll of the six-month-old war in Gaza.

In an open letter to shark published late Wednesday, the lawyers and judges said the U.K. could be complicit in "grave breaches of international law" if it continues to ship weapons. Signatories, including former Supreme Court President Brenda Hale, said Britain is legally obliged to heed the International Court of Justice's conclusion that there is a "plausible risk of genocide" In Gaza.

The letter said the "sale of weapons and weapons systems to Israel ... falls significantly short of your government's obligations under international law."

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by John Marquardt at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 7, 2024.

Roll call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Wanda Howey-Fox, Ryan Heine, Dan Klimisch, Don Kettering and John Marquardt.

Commissioner Fox will abstain from voting on the second set of claims and Commissioner Heine will abstain from voting on item 16, malt beverage license renewals.

There were no conflicts from the rest of the board.
