A Type, Size, and Location inspection was held on July 13, 2020, for the above referenced project. The following personnel were in attendance:

Mike Sedlacek, Yankton County Highway Superintendent Adam R. Polley, IMEG Michael Gutenkauf, IMEG Trent Baumeister, IMEG Rod Gall, Yankton Area Engineer-SDDOT Tom Kallemeyn, Bridge Design Engineer-SDDOT Colton Stahl, Local Government Assistance-SDDOT

The following items were discussed and agreed upon by the inspection participants:

The most applicable structure for this site, is a 496' 4 span steel girder bridge with a 30' 8" deck (28' clear width) and a 30° RHF skew. Approach slabs and deck drains will be included. The crown slope of the structure shall be 0.02 ft/ft. The substructure shall consist of berm abutments. The bridge location will be shown on the Final Hydraulic Data Sheet and will be centered at approximately station 10+00. Concrete barrier MASH TL-3 (32") will be shown in the plans. Approach rail will be needed. Fence anchor eyes will be provided. The Consultant will provide erosion protection recommendations with the Final Hydraulic Data Sheet. This site is a Topeka Shiner site.

The Contractor will remove and dispose of the existing structure. The abutments and bents shall be removed to 1' below flowline. No channel change and no channel cleanout will be necessary at this site

The project limits will run from approximately 500' north to 500' south of the structure. The road will be closed, and a signed off-site detour will be shown in the plans.

The current grade shall be maintained. The approach roadway typical section will include a crown slope of 0.02 ft/ft, 4:1 inslopes, 5:1 backslopes, and a standard 10' ditch at 20:1. The approach subgrade shall taper from the structure to match the new subgrade and will provide for 2-12' lanes and 2-2' shoulders for a total 28' finished roadway top. The surfacing will consist of asphalt, which will be furnished and installed by the County. Clear zone for this site

has been set at 10' from edge of driving lane as per the AASHTO Guidelines for Geometric Design of Local Roads. Unless otherwise stated, all design data for the project will meet the current design speed for the roadway which is 55mph.

The Contractor will be responsible for traffic control, topsoiling, and seeding.

The County will be responsible for the following items without Bridge Improvement Grant Participation:

- 1) Right of way and temporary and permanent easements
- 2) Coordination of any utility adjustments
- 3) Furnish and install final surfacing
- 4) Furnish and install temporary and/or permanent fencing
- 5) Furnish and install new permanent signing

The DOT Geotechnical Engineering Activity office will provide foundation and backfill recommendations.

The Consultant will provide the name, address, and phone number of adjacent landowners. Utility Company contact information is also needed in the plans for any utilities that exist within the project area. This office will initiate the 404 permit and other related environmental clearances and will provide the Consultant with materials recommendations if needed.

The letting date will be determined later as it depends on whether this project will be let with local funding or a successful award of a Bridge Improvement Grant for Replacement.

Boys & Girls Club of Yankton is a non-profit youth development program that provides impactful programming and a safe place for school-age youth. For an affordable annual fee of \$25, youth in 1st-12th grade receive daily free snacks and meals, participate in academic and leadership enrichment programs, and are led by caring, trained adult mentors during the hours other adult supervision may not be available after school until 7:00pm during the school year and from 7:30am to 6:00pm on no-school days, snow days, and throughout the summer. Our affordable annual membership (\$25/year), hours of operation, and variety of services, including close partnerships with local school districts, free meal opportunities, connections to mental health services, life skills programs, and more, make the Club the most accessible and productive option for youth in Yankton county.

With your help, we continue to see our programs reach more youth more often! Since 2017, Boys & Girls Club of Yankton has gone from serving 204 youth per day to 350 youth per day in 2023. This means at **least 350 youth a day** have access to healthy, daily snacks and meals, caring adult mentorship, and programs focusing on academic success, character and leadership, and healthy lifestyles. With the county's investment in 2022 we were also able impact youth in the following ways:

- Engage 1,185 individual youth in Club services throughout the year
- Serve over 76,500 free meals and snacks
- Connect youth to service & volunteer opportunities totaling 1,718 hours of service
- Act as a resource to at least 184 local employers whose employees utilize the Club
- Engage 842 youth in homework help, visual arts & STEM programs
- Lead 820 individual youth in positive self-esteem, mentorship, nutrition, and physically engaging healthy lifestyle practices.

Boys & Girls Club of Yankton has also served as a leader in juvenile youth diversion efforts for and in partnership with Yankton County through Teen Court and other youth diversion programs. In 2021, Boys & Girls Club of Yankton received an Alternatives to Detention subgrant from the South Dakota Department of Corrections to fund the development of the Yankton County Youth Diversion and Conditional Release programs and hire a full-time Youth Diversion Director at the Club. Over the last 2 years, the Youth Diversion Director and the diversion program has had 127 youth referred to the program and 7 additional youth referred to Conditional Release. Of those 127 referred youth, 70 have successfully completed the program and 45 and still working to complete the program.

The Yankton County Youth Diversion program is conducted in collaboration with the State's Attorney's office, alongside other preventative organizations, and focuses on restorative justice and diversion. The offenses of youth referred to this program vary in degree and can include possession of marijuana or alcohol, burglary, juvenile sexting, simple assault, or are reoffenders. These diversion cases are managed on an individual, one-on-one level by the Boys & Girls Club Youth Diversion Director, who leads them through an individualized 120-day program with mandatory requirements that include scheduled intakes, assessments, check-ins, and specific diversion classes that focus on leadership, healthy lifestyles, academic success, service, and career readiness skills, and are offered mental health counseling and mentorship services. This program partners closely with Lewis & Clark Behavior Health services to identify any underlying issues that may have led to the teens committing the offense and recommend a proper course of action. Youth and their families are highly involved in the diversion process and assist the Youth Diversion Director and Executive Director in making a contract to fit the specific needs of the youth in order to give them the tools to be successful going forward.

Boys & Girls Club of Yankton appreciates the commitment of Yankton County to support the Boys & Girls Club and the programs that benefit over 1,100 youth in Yankton County. Since 2015, the County's support of capital and operating costs have made a great impact on the youth of Yankton County by providing them a safe, productive place in which to develop their academic success, character and leadership, and healthy lifestyles as well as receive important and impactful diversion services. To support the growing needs and continuation of our mission, we respectfully request that the Yankton County Commission consider an appropriation of \$35,000 in 2024 to support the programs at the Boys & Girls Club of Yankton.

Funding at this level will directly support the overall operations of the 1st – 12th-grade Club for youth after school and in the summer and will make it possible for all current diversion programs like Teen Court, Yankton County Youth Diversion Program and Conditional Release Program to remain in place and run consistently throughout the entirety of 2024, and ensure the essential role of Youth Diversion Director remains in place following the end of the South Dakota Department of Corrections funding in July 2024. This level of funding will allow Boys & Girls Club of Yankton to serve their growing daily attendance numbers and allow the diversion programs in Yankton County to maintain momentum and impact by supporting the appropriate amount of staff and resources to assure successful advances in the area of diversion as reform programs work to prove to be cost effective, transformative, and advantageous long-term solutions for juvenile offenders.

On Final Day Of Session, Voter ID, Tax Break Bills Approved

LINCOLN, Neb. — State sena-tors ended a tumultuous 2023 session Thursday, giving a final OK to bills concerning voter identification, tax breaks for eco-nomic development and criminal iustice reform.

The 90-day session ended two days early and will be re-membered for historic tax cuts, hard feelings aired during floor debate, and an almost session-long string of filibusters mounted in protest of a bill that banned gender-affirming procedures for minors

State Sen. Tom Briese of Albion, a key player in the legislation that delivered income tax cuts and property tax relief, summed it up best: It was a "momentous session" for what got done and for how hard it was to get those

things done. The time-sucking filibusters, led by Omaha Sens. Machaela

Cavanaugh and Megan Hunt, forced legislators to get creative to get bills passed. Instead of several individual

bills being advanced for debate, "Christmas tree" bills, contain-ing up to 30 pieces of legislation, became the norm.

In the end, only 56 bills were passed, but those measures contained 291 separate bills. That compares favorably with the most recent 90-day sessions, in which 281 bills were passed in 2021 and 322 were passed in

2019 The perception that state lawmakers weren't getting anything done because of the

filibusters was incorrect, said the Speaker of the Legislature, Sen. John Arch of LaVista.

"We have done the work we were sent to do despite all the challenges before us," Arch said. Cavanaugh, who helped set a new record for filibusters, said

it was a disappointing session in which income tax cuts that mostly benefit the wealthiest Nebraskans and out-of-state corporations were passed, but little for average Nebraskans.

"We had record revenue and we did next to nothing to ease the economic struggles of every-day Nebraskans," she said COVID-19 era food stamp and

childcare credits were extended for two years, but not increased, Cavanaugh said, despite in-creased need at a time of record inflation.

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP) — At a celebra-tion of Minnesota's new law that restores voting rights to people who have left prison, Democratic Secretary of State Steve Simon registered newly eligible voters Thursday, when the law went into effect.

"It is the largest single act of enfranchise-ment in over 50 years" for the state, Simon said at Arlington Hills Community Center in St. Paul, where dozens of people wearing purple

T-shirts that said "Restore the Vote" clapped and cheered. The new law allows people with felony convictions to vote as long as they are not currently incarcerated. It expands voting rights to at least 55,000 people in Minnesota said Simon, the state's chief election official. Antonio Williams, a formerly incarcerated

Person and nonprofit director, spoke at the ceremony before registering himself to vote. "After spending years registering other people to vote, I will now be able to register myself!" Williams said to a round of spirited applause.

In an interview with The Associated Press. Williams said he spent 14 years in prison for second-degree murder. Since leaving prison in 2020, he has worked as a canvasser on several political campaigns. He also started a non-profit called Tone Up to help other formerly incarcerated people find housing, jobs and

healing Democratic Rep. Cedric Frazier, of New Hope, championed the legislation in the House and spoke at the celebration. He said Democratic lawmakers decided early in the session that passing this law would be a top

priority. "Because what we know is strong and

enduring democracies — they allow for the voices of the people to be heard," Frazier said. Democrats took full control of state goveriment when the Legislature convend for its 2023 session, marking the first time in eight years they have held the Senate, the House and the governor's office. People With Felony Convictions Can Now Vote In Minnesota; Secretary Of State Celebrates

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP) - At a celebration of Minnesota's new law that restores voting rights to people who have left prison, Democratic Secretary of State Steve Simon registered newly eligible voters Thursday,

Michelle L'Heureux, climate scientist at the Climate Predic-tion Center, said the weather pat-tern could intensify conditions. 314 Animals in the Workplace Policy

This policy is intended to protect the health and safety of the Yankton County customers, employees, vendors and visitors; to maintain a professional and clean environment in which to work, conduct business and visit; and to promote the welfare and safety of animals.

For reasons of liability, safety, health and sanitation, no animals of any type are allowed in any Yankton County owned or leased buildings, or in County owned or leased vehicles with the following exceptions: • Service animals as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, for use by customers, employees, vendors and visitors. Yankton County recognizes the ability of persons with documented disabilities to utilize service animals as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act 1990 (ADA). Customers, employees, vendors and visitors who require a service animal should consult with the Yankton County Auditor Office.

• Emotional support animals where the owner has medical certification from a qualified medical or psychiatric practitioner, and that have been approved by the Auditor's Office as a reasonable accommodation. • Animals professionally trained for search and rescue activities or law enforcement or a certified therapeutic dog as defined by SDCL 23A[1]24-10-(1).

• Livestock, rodeo animals, and other animals for showing will be allowed as required for the fair and other approved events at the County Fairgrounds and in employee buildings. Animals professionally trained for theatrical purposes and directly supervised by show personnel within a controlled environment for training purposes.

• Aquariums, containing aquatic fish only, may be permitted in County buildings with approval of the Department Head or Administrative Supervisor of the County employee requesting approval. Any damage caused by having aquariums will be repaired at the expense of the aquarium owner.

Animals on County grounds (not buildings) must be in the control of their owners. Under no circumstances should animals be allowed to run loose. Animals may not be tethered to buildings, handrails, trees, bicycle racks or other objects. Any animal found tethered to County property or wandering loose on campus may be impounded at the owner's expense. Animals left in an unattended motor vehicle are subject to the same rules and regulations if they become a nuisance, or if the welfare of the animal is threatened. Any infractions or complaints should be directed to the Yankton County Sheriff or the City Animal Control Office.

Animals walked on County property must be kept on a leash; and all animal fecal matter should be removed to a proper disposal container by the animal's owner to protect the health and safety of others.

Feral and/or stray animals (such as dogs, cats, raccoons, possums) sometimes appear on campus. If such an animal is noticed, please alert the Sheriff's Office or the City Animal Control Office. Although it may be tempting to feed or offer care for such animals, it is in the best interest of the animals to allow an animal-related professional to find proper environments for them.

Individuals having permission as listed in the exceptions must assume the responsibility of their animal. Individuals should:

• Carefully consider the needs of their animals and the sensitivities of other members of the work areas or community.

- Remain with their animal at all times.
- Clean up after their animal.

• Be responsible for any costs or consequences of damage caused.

The Department Head or Administrative Supervisor will enforce this policy to ensure a safe and healthy work environment is maintained. Abuse of this policy will be reviewed for disciplinary action.

This policy is effective 24 hours per day including holidays and weekends.

Additional exception requests: The Yankton County Auditor's Office, must approve any additional exceptions to this policy.

If the exception request is denied, the employee may initiate an appeal to the denial by seeking and receiving written approval from their Department Head or Administrative Supervisor. The Department Head or Administrative Supervisor will them submit a written appeal to the Auditor Office for secondary review. If the appeal is denied, the request will no longer be considered.

YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING July 5, 2023

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Vice-Chair Wanda Howey-Fox at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 5, 2023.

Roll call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Dan Klimisch, Ryan Heine, John Marquardt and Wanda Howey-Fox; Absent: Don Kettering.

There were no conflicts of interest reported by Commissioners.

Action 23198C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Marquardt to approve the agenda with the following addition: item 4C introduce new Ambulance Director. All present voted aye; motion carried, 4-0.

There were no public comments. Vice-Chair Fox closed public comment.

Commissioner Marquardt introduced Eric Van Dusen as the new Yankton County Ambulance Administrator. Mr. Van Dusen thanked the commission for the opportunity and is looking forward to serving the people of Yankton County.

Maria Schwader from the State Department of Legislative Audit presented her findings of the 2020/2021 audit for Yankton County.

Action 23199C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Heine to approve the 2020/2021 Legislative Audit report and note that management chose not to respond to this finding. All present voted aye; motion carried, 4-0.

The board discussed Sundance Road and South Sundance Road District petitions presented by Todd Huber and Bob Currie. Individuals speaking on the petitions where: Todd Huber, Bob Currie, Wayne Nesje, Tim Wrage, Jim Schmitz, Adam Schilousky, Ron McCabe, Elaine Schmitz and Lisa Huber. The board asked the two parties if they could reach an agreement and form just one district. The approval for the Road District will be at the August 1, 2023 commission meeting.

Gary Vetter presented a policy to be placed in the county handbook to allow animals in the workplace. The board asked the States Attorney to review the document and submit at the next commission meeting.

A motion was made by Marquardt to approve the policy, but motion died for lack of second.

Rezone: There was a first reading on the request from Connie Bornitz to rezone six lots in a Rural Transition District to a Moderate Density Rural Residential District (R2). The second reading of the rezone request will be at the next commission meeting on July 18, 2022.

Margo Mehrman spoke on the rezone.

Action 23200C: A motion was made by Marquardt and seconded by Klimisch to recess the regular session and convene as Board of Adjustment. All present voted aye; motion carried, 4-0.

CUP Public Hearing: This was the time and place for a public hearing for a Conditional Use Permit application from Kristen Kozak. Applicant request is for an illuminated sign less than 1500 feet from a dwelling in a Lakeside Commercial District. Applicant wishes to install an illuminated sign on a commercial building that is less than 1500 feet from a single family dwelling. Said property is legally described as Lot 25, Lewis and Clark Business Center, located in S16-T93N-R56W.

Kristen Kozak spoke on the CUP application.
