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





U.S. Attorney Ramsdell Recognizes Elder Abuse Awareness Month

SIoux FALLS—Alison J. Ramsdell, U.S. Attorney for the District of South Dakota, joins federal, state, tribal, and local advocates in recognizing June as Elder Abuse Awareness Month to increase awareness of the many forms of elder abuse and promote the resources available to those at risk.

"Millions of seniors are affected by elder abuse each year, which robs them of their finances, their security, and

their dignity. The U.S. Attorney's Office is committed to working alongside our law enforcement partners to investigate and prosecute those that target our vulnerable friends, family and neighbors. It is crucial that the public also join the effort by checking on older adults and watching for signs of abuse or unusual financial transactions," said Ramsdell.

Warning signs that your loved one may be experiencing

elder fraud include:

- Unexplained charges or withdrawals from a bank account;
- Suspicious signatures on checks or other financial documents;
- Abrupt changes in a will or other financial document; and
- Unpaid bills despite having adequate financial resources.

To help older individuals and their families identify and avoid fraudulent activity, the Justice

Department provides Senior Scam Alerts with information about the various tactics used in specific scams or frauds. Common examples may include:

- Calls from someone you don't know telling you a loved one has been kidnapped or arrested;

receive the death penalty.

Jason Jones was convicted of fatally shooting 86-year-old Gene Twiford and his 85-year-old wife, Janet, and their 55-year-old daughter, Dana, in their home and 53-year-old Michele Ebeling in her house. After the killings, he set each residence on fire.

Carrie Jones stands trial as a co-defendant for her alleged role both before and after Gene Twiford's death.

DEPOSITION GRANTED

Melsmer approved the state's request to depose Jason Jones in an order filed last Monday. The judge noted that the defendant did not oppose the state's motion.

"The court, upon consideration thereof, finds that said motion should be granted," the judge said. "The date, time and location of the deposition shall be arranged and agreed upon by the parties."

Assistant Attorney General Sandra Allen filed the motion seeking to depose Jason Jones prior to his wife's trial, expected to last three weeks based on the length of his trial.

In support of this motion, the state has a reasonable belief, based on information received from the ongoing criminal investigation, that Jason Jones will be called as a witness on behalf of the defendant at trial," Allen said.

In her motion, Allen wrote that Jason Jones' testimony "may be material or relevant to the issue to be determined at the trial of the offense, and (b) may be of assistance to the State in preparation of its case."

Allen cited four sources of information:

- Carrie Jones' letter, dated Jan. 2, 2025, stating Jason Jones is supposed to be a witness at her trial;
- Jail phone calls made by Carrie Jones on Jan. 29, 2025, and March 19, 2025, where discussions are held regarding Jason Jones testifying at her trial;
- Visitation records from the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services (NDCS) indicating that on March 11, 2025, Jason Jones had a visit with his attorneys and Carrie Jones' attorneys, Doug and Nate Stratton;
- Jail phone calls Jason made on March 11, 2025, where he stated that he met with Carrie's attorneys, and they are going to have him testify at her trial.

ALLEGED ROLE

The prosecution alleges that Carrie Jones encouraged her husband to "do something" about Gene Twiford for what she termed his sexually inappropriate remarks toward her over a three-year period.

In addition, the state alleges she aided her husband by hiding or destroying evidence, not turning him over to authorities and misleading law enforcement by her statements and withholding information.

The defense argues that Carrie Jones didn't participate or assist her husband in carrying out the crimes. Also, the defense notes she was not at home at the time and didn't return from her job in Sioux City until after the crimes were committed.

Under Nebraska law, an accessory can be charged and sentenced the same as a perpetrator.

CHANGE OF VENUE

Melsmer previously granted a defense motion for a change of venue. The defense argued that Carrie Jones couldn't receive a fair trial in Cedar County because of pre-trial publicity and juror questionnaires where a large number expressed a strong bias against the defendant.

Melsmer moved the trial to Madison County, about 60 miles away. The judge noted Madison County's 36,000 residents, including 25,000 in Norfolk, provides a much larger jury pool than Cedar County's 8,300 residents.

In addition, Melsmer noted that, while the Norfolk media covered the Laurel case, that a Madison County jury would be less affected by pre-trial publicity. Also, a Madison County jury wouldn't have personal knowledge or connections to the case, victims and witnesses as would a Cedar County jury, he said.

ACTING ON MOTIONS

During the status hearing earlier this month, Melsmer heard motions and arguments from prosecutors Allen and Corey O'Brien, acting as Special Deputy County Attorneys, and the Strattons as defense counsel.

Melsmer said he makes a very concerted effort at separating co-defendants' trials in a jury's mind.

"With every co-defendant, I try not to speak of the other co-defendant... because it can confuse the jury," the judge said.

Melsmer said he intended to act quickly on the large number of motions, given the tight timeline before next month's trial.

He has granted the state's motion to call additional witnesses and a joint order for disclosure of the jury list and questionnaires. Also, the two sides have agreed to usual actions such as the defendant appearing before the jury in street clothes rather than prison attire and free of restraints such as handcuffs and shackles. Those measures are taken as part of the guarantee of a fair trial.

In addition, Melsmer issued an order regarding the defendant's accommodations during trial proceedings.

Carrie Jones will remain housed in Madison County through the duration of her trial. Unless otherwise ordered by the court, she will be returned to the Cedar County Jail or other facility designated by Koranda upon conclusion of the trial.

Currently, she is housed at the Boone County Jail in Albion, Nebraska.

Jason Jones is scheduled for a status hearing July 25 at the Cedar County Courthouse in Hartington.

His trial was moved from Cedar County to Dakota County, where the jury that convicted him also found circumstances warranting consideration of the death penalty.

A three-judge sentencing panel, consisting of Melsmer and two others, is expected to meet later this year at the Cedar County Courthouse. The judges will decide whether Jason Jones receives the death penalty or a life sentence.

No date has been announced for the sentencing panel.

said. "Then they put me over to do these little keys that I had to scrape. Then I went to polishing, and then they moved me up to inspection, and then I had to stamp. And then, in between the time the painter had retired, I had to go paint. Then I got into posting and eventually moved to inspecting the machines."

She also worked for the founder and owner of the company at the time, Edgar Freeman.

"He walked through the plant every morning, checked everything out, and, boy, if he saw somebody doing something wrong, they'd hear about it," she said.

Brown did retire and they even held a retirement party for her.

"We had this big retirement party — big cake and everything — out in the lunchroom," she reminisced. "And, as I'm walking out the door, Mark Rittenhouse says, 'We haven't got anybody trained for shipping, can you work tomorrow?'"

She did go back and help.

That's what people used to do. Brown said she enjoys the current state of the old building now that it is a brewery.

"I like the air conditioning," she said. "There is definitely much less heat, noise and smells."

Due to the heat, summers could be challenging at the plant.

It was sort of a family business for Adeline as both her mother, her aunt and her two sons — Troy and Quentin — worked for Freeman. Troy still works for the company.

She said her aunt worked at the company first and that led to her mother, Josephine Braunesreither, getting employment there as well. Brown recalled walking to high school (now Walnut Village) and walking past the old brick building.

"I honestly didn't know what they did in there," she said. "I went to high school over here. I didn't know what

(this building) was until my aunt started working here."

Brown believed the workforce reached 200 in its heyday.

"I think we were selling parts to Cessna and Spirit," she recalled. "I think there was even some that went overseas to different places. There was a lot of people."

Brown was also one of several women who worked in manufacturing at the plant, which was not a common practice at the time.

"There weren't quite as many women as there are today, but there were a lot," she said. "Inspection was all women."

After 52 years of working in the Freeman Building, Brown said she likes the look of the new place.

"It is really nice," she said. "This was kind of like my home away from home. It still smells like (a manufacturing plant). I love to see the place, what's been done to it."

Hanten said when the building became available, it had several appealing characteristics that drove him to buy it — and designing the building as an homage to the Freeman Company in doing so.

"I think the building is really unique (for many reasons)," he said. "When it was first being built, I think the Press & Dakotan referred to it as the 'mega complex' that's being built at Eighth and Walnut. So, it was a big thing for this town, and it's obviously stood up pretty well."

"I enjoy the building. It's great for what I need to do, which is get a lot of people to have fun. But it's also a production facility. I also like that it's right in the heart of town."

Hanten, who just celebrated the 20th anniversary of his brewing company on Tuesday, also said his customers truly enjoy the history of the place.

"The tourists that come in here, when they come into a place like this, it's just kind of a real marvel, just because it's so big," he said. "And because it's so big, we have to fill it with lots of things to do. So, it's just unique. We can have 300 people in here and be producing beer at the same time with no interference. It works out well."

Brown did retire and they even held a retirement party for her.

"We had this big retirement party — big cake and everything — out in the lunchroom," she reminisced. "And, as I'm walking out the door, Mark Rittenhouse says, 'We haven't got anybody trained for shipping, can you work tomorrow?'"

She did go back and help. That's what people used to do. Brown said she enjoys the current state of the old building now that it is a brewery.

"I like the air conditioning," she said. "There is definitely much less heat, noise and smells."

Due to the heat, summers could be challenging at the plant.

It was sort of a family business for Adeline as both her mother, her aunt and her two sons — Troy and Quentin — worked for Freeman. Troy still works for the company.

She said her aunt worked at the company first and that led to her mother, Josephine Braunesreither, getting employment there as well. Brown recalled walking to high school (now Walnut Village) and walking past the old brick building.

"I honestly didn't know what they did in there," she said. "I went to high school over here. I didn't know what

away from home. It still smells like (a manufacturing plant). I love to see the place, what's been done to it."

Hanten said when the building became available, it had several appealing characteristics that drove him to buy it — and designing the building as an homage to the Freeman Company in doing so.

"I think the building is really unique (for many reasons)," he said. "When it was first being built, I think the Press & Oakes complex that's being built at Eighth and Walnut. So, it was a big thing for this town, and it's obviously stood up pretty well."

"I enjoy the building. It's great for what I need to do, which is get a lot of people to have fun. But it's also a production facility. I also like that it's right in the heart of town."

Hanten, who just celebrated the 20th anniversary of his brewing company on Tuesday, also said his customers truly enjoy the history of the place.

"The tourists that come in here, when they come into a place like this, it's just kind of a real marvel, just because it's so big," he said. "And because it's so big, we have to fill it with lots of things to do. So, it's just unique. We can have 300 people in here and be producing beer at the same time with no interference. It works out well."

1 **An Act to require counties and municipalities to provide emergency medical services**

5 **Section 1. That § 23-3-52 be AMENDED:**

6 **23-3-52.** In addition to any other penalty, assessment, or fine provided by law,
7 there ~~shall~~ must be levied liquidated costs ~~in the amount of fifty-five~~ dollars for partial
8 reimbursement to state government and its subdivisions for ~~law enforcement and judicial~~

25 (3) Counties and municipalities that collaborate in the provision of emergency medical

30 (1) An application process for grants from the emergency medical services fund;

PUBLIC INFORMATION MEMO

The Board of Clay County Commissioners has passed a Resolution for Opt Out for 2025 property taxes payable in 2026 in the amount of \$750,000. The Board of County Commissioners take this opportunity to convey to the taxpayers that the opt out was a necessary step to operate the county government without cuts to services and personnel.

The Board began work in 2018 to replace the aging county facilities and has faced unprecedented expenses since the jail was transitioned to a temporary holding facility in 2021. After a bond issue to replace the jail, law enforcement center, and courthouse failed in 2021, a subsequent bond issue was passed to replace the jail and law enforcement center. Inmates were housed at other jails, increasing costs for the county, creating the need for opt out resolutions in several subsequent tax years. While the new Public Safety Center has been under construction, renovations have been underway in the courthouse to make the existing facilities better serve county government needs. More renovations will take place in 2026, bringing the County's cost of all planned courthouse and current safety center projects to an estimated \$4.34 million, with grant funding covering an additional \$336,000 in construction, for a total of \$4.68 million.

In addition, the software program(s) used by all county offices have become obsolete and unavailable, leaving the Commissioners no option but to purchase new software programs, at cost of approximately \$350,000 from the period of 2021-2026.

The County's agreement with the City for Vermillion/Clay County EMS includes replacement of an ambulance every five years at the County's cost. The County purchased an ambulance in 2023 at a cost of \$248,000. Due to ongoing mechanical issues with an existing ambulance, rapidly escalating costs, and an approximate delivery timeline of 18 months from the date of order, the Commissioners authorized the order of a replacement ambulance ahead of the normal replacement schedule. The cost is \$361,000.

County officials have requested additional staff for 2026 to mitigate increasing workloads, but only the most essential staff were added for operation of the new Public Safety Center. The personnel requests from other offices were denied as funds were not available without a larger opt out. Other budgetary requests were also reduced or eliminated from the departments' budgets.

New Positions - New positions may be requested by the Department Head. The County Commission must approve all new positions and the position's associated pay grade. New position requests will typically be considered as part of the annual budget process. When necessary, new job descriptions will be developed in cooperation with the Department Head.

Re-filling Current Positions during Hiring Freeze – At the discretion of the County Commission, current positions may be re-filled during a hiring freeze. Department Heads must submit a justification letter to re-fill to the Commission for review, which will then be added as a meeting agenda item at next meeting date for approval or denial.

Transfers - County employees may apply for job openings in other County departments. If the new position is at the same level of responsibility as the current position, the employee will receive the same rate of pay.

- ☐ 2. When improvements on any real property were considered or included in the valuation thereof, which did not exist thereon at the time fixed by law for making assessment;
- ☒ 3. When the complainant or the property is exempt from the tax;
- ☐ 4. When the complainant had no taxable interest in the property assessed against him at the time fixed by law for making the assessment;
- ☐ 5. When taxes have been erroneously paid or error made in noting payment or issuing receipt therefor;
- ☐ 6. When the same property has been assessed against the complainant more than once in the same year, and the complainant produces satisfactory evidence that the tax thereon for such year has been paid; provided that no tax shall be abated on any real property which has been sold for taxes, while a tax certificate is outstanding.

10-4-40. Partial exemption of dwellings owned by certain disabled veterans. One hundred fifty thousand dollars of the full and true value of the total amount of a dwelling or portion thereof classified as owner-occupied pursuant to §§ 10-13-39 to 10-13-40.4, inclusive, that is owned and occupied by a veteran who is rated as permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected disability is exempt from property taxation. The veteran shall apply for this partial exemption on a form prescribed by the secretary of revenue. Any application or supporting document for this exemption is confidential. Any veteran who would otherwise qualify for this exemption but fails to comply with the application deadline for the owner-occupied classification or the deadline for application for this exemption may petition the board of county commissioners to recalculate the taxes based upon the owner-occupied classification and this exemption and abate or refund the difference in taxes pursuant to chapter 10-18.
