#### EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES AGREEMENT

This agreement is made and entered into the South Dakota Counties of Yankton and Bon Homme, counties to approve and execute the agreement:

WHEREAS Yankton County presently employs two Emergency Management Staff, and

WHEREAS Bon Homme County wish to enter into an agreement with Yankton County for emergency management services, and

WHEREAS both Yankton and Bon Homme County have discussed the possibility of Bon Homme County contracting with Yankton County for its emergency management services, and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Commissions of both counties that it would be mutually advantageous for both counties to enter into such an arrangement,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Boards of County Commissioners of Yankton County and Bon Homme County hereby mutually agree that Yankton County will contract with Bon Homme County to provide emergency management services for Bon Homme County, and Yankton County agrees to provide such emergency management services according to the following terms and conditions:

- 1.) Bon Homme County will pay Yankton County the sum of \$26,000 per year for Emergency Management services to be provided to Bon Homme County.
- 2.) The services to be provided and their basic cost allocation is as follows:

a.) Travel - 4 trips per month average	\$2,500.00
b.) Attend meetings with fire, EMS, hospitals, businesses for development of Emergency plans for county wide continuity. When required	\$1,000.00
c.) Attend LEPC groups meetings as required by state law	\$1,000.00
d.) 36 Days (min) of a year working on Bon Homme County requirements	\$9,500.00
e.) Emergency response to events within Bon Homme for EM staff	\$5,340.00
f.) Updating Bon Homme County Plans and unforeseen expenses including mitigation, planning, preparedness, recovery, emergency response plans and other contingencies.	\$6,660.00

In addition to the above, the Yankton County Emergency Management Department will provide the Bon Homme County Commission with timely in person or written reports of its activities as requested, and will advise Bon Homme County of available emergency management grant availability and provide assistance in applying for such grants.

Payments by Bon Homme County to Yankton County will be made on a quarterly basis.

This contract shall continue for a term of one-year unless previously terminated by mutual agreement of the parties and shall be automatically renewable for an additional one-year term thereafter unless either party shall notify the other of their intent not to renew at least 90 days prior to the expiration of the then current term. The initial term shall commence on Jan 1, 2026 and end on Doc 31, 2027.

Chair Marquardt & Commissioners Howey-Fox, Heine, Kettering and Klimisch:

I am writing you regarding the Yankton County 4-H Position. I know you have and will hear impassioned opinions, thoughts and feelings on this topic, but I know from addressing and testifying at numerous other County Commissions, Zoning Boards, Public Boards and State Legislative Committees across the nation, you can only work with and decide on factual information. I formally request the letter be entered into the official record. Please find the facts below:

Fact #1, My entrepreneurial spirit and choosing to base businesses in Yankton County are because of Yankton County 4-H. I was born and raised in Yankton County, graduating from Yankton High School that included 12 years in the Yankton County 4-H Program. My entire personal and professional career success traces its lineage and roots back to how I was raised and the 4-H Program. I have worked in Extension & 4-H in multiple states, served and chaired numerous boards at the state and national 4-H levels. Today, I own several small businesses that are based in Yankton County and pay taxes.

Fact #2, the opportunities I received while in 4-H from being selected for the State 4-H Council Ambassador Program, to being selected as only one of four (4) youths to represent South Dakota at the National Science and Technology Symposium, to chairing the State Youth Conference would have never happened without Yankton County 4-H. 4-H shaped my choices for college and major at South Dakota State University (SDSU), competing on the University Livestock Judging Team and the leadership roles I held during my time. This includes being named the 2001 South Dakota 4-H Volunteer of the Year, the youngest person to ever receive the award, all because of Yankton County 4-H. I continue to give back to multiple 4-H Programs at the local, state and national levels today because of the impact Yankton County 4-H had on me.

**Fact #3**, funding the Yankton County 4-H Program is one of the best uses of county dollars available due to supporting state and federal dollars. This is further supported by the time, talent and treasure donated by Yankton County businesses, Yankton County 4-H Leaders, Yankton County 4-H Volunteers and 4-H Alumni. Where do you find this level state and federal support for any other county positions? The Yankton County 4-H position has further support and training supplied by other partners at no additional cost to the county.

**Fact #4**, you have already saved county dollars and brought budget efficiencies by not replacing the Assistant FTE position in the Extension Office.

**Fact #5**, multiple university research reports across the nation show the 4-H Program has long-term benefits, essential to the future success of Yankton County:

- 4-H'ers are
  - Two (2) times more likely to have the goal of becoming a leader.
  - o Three (3) times more likely to participate in community service.
  - o Two (2) times more likely to report living life with intentionality and purpose.
- When compared with a U.S. general population who had not participated in 4-H, 4-H alumni demonstrated more positive long-term outcomes. Not only did 4-H alumni report a strong sense of community, better physical and mental health, and feeling more financially stable they also confirmed that 4-H helped them develop leadership, public speaking, and other real-world skills.
- Ultimately, projects and programs in 4-H help youth develop skills and confidence in a
  way which has a lasting impact. Our time, effort, and valiant efforts with youth will most
  likely follow these youth into adulthood and beyond.

Fact #6, the Yankton County Code of Conduct adopted by the Yankton County Commissioners outlines several items in the Preface outlining Business Ethics and Conduct:

"The successful business operation and reputation of Yankton County is built upon the principles of fair dealing and ethical conduct. The continued success of Yankton County is dependent upon the public's trust and those who serve the public on behalf of the County should be dedicated to preserving that trust. County Commissioners, elected and appointed department heads, members of all boards, commissions, committees, task forces or other appointed advisory groups owe a duty to Yankton County and the public to act in a way that will merit the continued trust and confidence of the public."

Fact #7, Section 2 of the Yankton County Code of Conduct: Responsibility of Public Service declares as follows:

"Members are to be trustworthy, respectful, responsible, fair, caring and promote citizenship at all times and are not entitled to special consideration or treatment based on their official position or responsibility."

"D. Members should dispose of the business of the County in a deliberate manner that assures citizens have meaningful knowledge of and input into their decisions."

**Fact #8**, the 4-H Program teaches the life skills of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, caring and citizenship to Yankton County youths. The program, 4-H Leaders, 4-H Volunteers, and 4-H Alumni continue to devote their own time, talent and treasure to support what you are charged to do in the name of Public Service.

**Fact #9**, by not funding the Position you risk the entire Yankton County 4-H Program in South Dakota becoming the first county in the state to not support 4-H and lose the state support, which includes state and federal funding.

All of the above stated facts create a series of questions:

- Why would you cut a program that also doesn't allow you to use the Extension Office for the 4-H Program and also then for other County Programs creating an efficient use of space and dollars?
- Why cut a program that has a federal and state match along with support in time, talent and treasure from Yankton County constituents and voters?
- Looking at the decades of positive results of Yankton County 4-H'ers who were able to compete at the state and then onto the national levels along with their personal and professional successes all because of the 4-H program and at no additional cost to Yankton County. Are you prepared to take that away from current and future 4-H'ers?
- Why would you cut a program that supports your Code of Conduct and Responsibility of Public Service?
- What will it cost Yankton County in the years and decades to come from not teaching the life skills to develop future Leaders and future Commissioners who are sworn to uphold the same ideals and principles?
- Yankton County continues to and has for decades promoted it wants to be a leader in the state for growth, agriculture business development and serve its constituents. Yet, Yankton County continues through decisions like this to be very short sighted, failing to account for long-term impacts. When will the short sightedness finally end?

In conclusion, I chose as part of the 4-H Program from an event I attended to live my life via a quote from Eleanor Roosevelt, "The future belongs to those who believe in the beauty of their dreams." By not funding the Yankton County 4-H Position, you are jeopardizing and ruining the future of Yankton County youths, and over the long-term, Yankton County's future. I strongly urge you to fund the Yankton County 4-H position with a multi-year commitment to Yankton County 4-H and South Dakota State University.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

#### between

## SDSU and Yankton County of South Dakota 2025

In accordance with SDCL Chapter 13054, as amended, and in furtherance of Extension educational programs in Agriculture and Natural Resources, Family and Consumer Sciences, Community Development and 4-H Positive Youth Development with the complete understanding of all parties concerned. **South Dakota State University** on behalf of SDSU Extension ("SDSU"), and the Board of County Commissioners of **Yankton County** (the "County") enter in the following:

#### 1. COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

South Dakota State University Extension agrees to give guidance and active assistance to the 4-H Educator in determining and carrying out South Dakota 4-H (SD4-H) Positive Youth Development educational programs that will be of greatest benefit to the people in the county. SDSU agrees to assist the 4-H Educator in the conduct of their work by providing program planning and development, leadership, training, supervision, and subject matter support through Extension specialists, field specialists, publications, and technology information services.

#### 2. PERSONNEL AND FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF COOPERATING COUNTY

The County agrees to furnish an office suitable to all parties of the Memorandum. The County further agrees to provide sufficient funds for qualified office administrative support, 4-H Educator travel expenses, office supplies, and equipment, postage, demonstration and educational supplies, telephone/internet and related charges and up-to-date computer/related equipment, subject to the county's budgetary authority.

The County agrees to pay annually to SDSU for partial salary support of the 4-H Educator position. Payments must be made by the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March in the 2025 calendar year. For the calendar year 2025, this is in the amount of \$23,050 which reflects the 4-H Educator's 1.00 FTE appointment in Yankton County. Should the position become vacant during the 2025 calendar year, or portions thereof, the county shall be reimbursed on a pro-rata basis for such period(s) of vacancy at the close of the calendar year.

The County agrees to reimburse the 4-H Educator for official use of their personal vehicle, meals, and lodging on official business away from their county office headquarters at rates and policies (e.g., IRS, GSA) equal to or above those established by the State Board of Finance. The 4-H Educator will submit itemized vouchers for official travel expenses to the County Auditor (or appropriate designee) for presentation to the County for payment.

The 4-H Educator will travel within the county to serve clientele and conduct educational programming. Furthermore, the 4-H Educator will participate in some out-of-county activities that are related to their duties for the county (e.g., State Fair) for which the County agrees to reimburse travel expenses. The County further agrees to allow the 4-H Educator to participate in some training and special events outside of the county which are related to their duties and continued professional development. For these specific mandated professional development events, SDSU will provide travel reimbursement to the 4-H Educator.





#### 3. ACCESS TO CONFIDENTIAL DATA

Access to SDSU data and communications, whether it resides on county-owned or SDSU-owned equipment, shall be restricted to SDSU personnel or their respective designees. As stated in the South Dakota Board of Regents Acceptable Use Policy, information resources and technology should be used to support the operations and missions of the South Dakota Regental System. Accordingly, the SDSU Office of Technology and Security will investigate any and all allegations of misuse of technology by SDSU personnel. Allegations of misuse of technology on county-owned equipment by SDSU personnel will be investigated jointly by the SDSU Office of Technology and Security and the appropriate county personnel. SDSU will work with individual counties as requested to establish a standard Third-Party Agreement to address network access concerns.

#### 4. COOPERATIVE PERSONNEL EMPLOYMENT POLICY

It shall be the responsibility of SDSU to screen and certify the qualifications of applicants for a vacant position. The County will be represented in interviewing candidate(s) for the open position and participate in recommending approval or rejection of the candidate's employment by SDSU. Salary will be determined by SDSU with approval the South Dakota Board of Regents.

If the performance of a 4-H Educator becomes unsatisfactory, his/her employment may be terminated in accordance with SDSU and Board of Regents Personnel policies. In addition, SDSU may need to remove a 4-H Educator when either appropriated State or Federal funds or the County funds are not adequate to satisfactorily carry on effective 4-H Positive Youth Development Extension educational programs in the county.

The employment policies of SDSU and parties to this cooperative agreement are required to conform to provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related amendments thereto prohibiting discrimination.

#### 5. CONDITIONS FOR ACCESS AND USE OF COUNTY FACILITIES

The County and SDSU recognize the positive impacts SD4-H Programs have on the youth in the County and the local Community in general. By providing opportunities for educational and personal growth among the County's Youth, the County benefits from maintaining and strengthening the social bonds of the Community as a whole. Therefore, the County agrees to allow SDSU to host SD4-H Youth Program events at appropriate facilities owned by the County or operated by a third party for the benefit of the County. At the County's request, SDSU will require SD4-H Youth Program participants to sign waivers of liability and hold harmless as a condition to participate in an event.

#### 6. LIABILITY COVERAGE

SDSU is subject to the limitations of liability set forth in SDCL Chs. 3-21 and 3-22 and the PEPL fund agreement thereto. Currently, the PEPL Agreement specifically excludes liability coverage for volunteers of the SD 4-H Programs among other exclusions. Specified coverage is provided for covered negligence of SDSU employees, including 4-H Educators. As a State entity, SDSU cannot contract for coverage beyond the statutory and PEPL liability coverage limitations because that would be considered an unauthorized waiver of sovereign immunity.

SD 4-H Program Volunteers are covered by an Excess Volunteer Liability Policy.

SDSU will inform the County in the event of any material change in the above-referenced liability coverages.

#### 7. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

The parties acknowledge that the terms of this Agreement constitute the full and final agreement of the parties hereto, superseding all prior negotiations and all prior or subsequent oral agreements. No statement, promises or inducements made by the parties, or their employees, agents or assigns which are not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. This Agreement may be amended only by written agreement and executed by each of the parties hereto.





#### 8. GOVERNING LAW

The parties agree and acknowledge that this Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota. Venue shall be in a court of competent jurisdiction in South Dakota.

#### 9. ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement shall not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the parties hereto and executed by each of the parties.

#### 10. NONAPPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

In the event funds to fulfill the terms of this Agreement are not budgeted or appropriated for any fiscal year, then in that event there shall be no obligation on non-budgeted or appropriated Party to fulfill such appropriation or budget and this Agreement shall become null and void except as to terms for which an appropriation or budget has been made, and no right of action or damage shall accrue to the benefit of any person or entity, their agents, successors or assigns for any further payments or other performance under this Agreement.

#### 11. APPROVAL AND/OR MODIFICATION OF MEMORANDUM

This memorandum will be in effect upon when both the County and SDSU approve by authorized signature. It supersedes all previously signed agreements and shall remain in effect until it is expressly terminated in writing by one or more of the parties concerned. This agreement should be reviewed at the first meeting of the County Commission each year for purposes of informing new members and reacquainting experienced members with its provisions.

## YANKTON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS YANKTON COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA POLICY TO DOUBLE CHIP SEAL COUNTY ROADS RESOLUTION #

WHEREAS, the board of county commissioners shall manage the fiscal concerns of the county and secure their management in the best possible manner; and,

WHEREAS, the construction, improvement, maintenance, and repair of the county highway system shall be under the supervision of the county superintendent of highways; and,

WHEREAS, before any permanent improvement is undertaken upon the county highway system, the county highway superintendent shall, under the general direction of the board of county commissioners prepared plans, specifications, and estimates for the improvement; and,

WHEREAS, chipseal is a pavement surface treatment that combines one or more layers of asphalt with one or more layers of fine aggregate; and,

**WHEREAS**, when the chipseal process is applied to a road surface it not only extends the life of the road but also decreases the need for maintenance and upkeep significantly for the road surface.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** that the Yankton County Board of Commissioners approves the following process to determine the application of chipseal to road surfaces for Yankton County roads.

Cost/ Benefit Analysis. Where applicable within the Yankton County highway system, the Yankton County Highway Superintendent shall determine the expenses not to include winter months over the previous 5 years to maintain specific identified road surface. If said amount is less than the cost to apply double chipseal to said road surface, the Yankton County Highway Superintendent shall submit such plan to the County Commission for approval. This cost/ benefit analysis may take into consideration contributions through voluntary property assessments from property owners located appurtenant to the road surface.

#### **YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING**

August 19, 2025

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chairman John Marquardt at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 19, 2025.

Roll call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Wanda Howey-Fox, Ryan Heine, Dan Klimisch, Don Kettering and John Marguardt.

Commissioner Fox abstained from the Harmelink Plat. There were no conflicts of interest from rest of the board.

**Action 25256C**: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Kettering to approve the meeting agenda with the following change: Item 15 will be re-scheduled. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

There was no public comment. Chairman Marquardt closed public comment.

**Action 25257HWY**: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to approve the surplus road project millings. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Preston Crissey, Yankton County Sheriff, presented his 2025 second quarter report and asked approval to surplus 2017 Chevy Express Van and 2019 Dodge Grand Caravan.

**Action 25258S**: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to approve surplus of 2017 Chevy Express Van. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

**Action 25259S**: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Klimisch to approve to transfer 2019 Dodge Caravan to the States Attorney's Office. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

**Action 25260S**: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to accept Sheriff's office 2025 second quarter report. A detailed report is on file with the County Auditor. Klimisch, Fox, Heine, Kettering and Marquardt voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

**Action 25261C**: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Heine to recess the regular session and convene as Board of Adjustment. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Gary Vetter, read a statement regarding the investigation into the zoning violation request from Richard Vellek. Mr. Vetter said in his opinion while there are issues that need attention, it does not justify revocation of the Conditional Use Permit. Also speaking were Preston Crissey, Yankton County Sheriff, Shane from Central Specialties (via teams) and Richard Vellek. No action was taken.

**Action 25262C**: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Kettering to recess Board of Adjustment and reconvene in regular session. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Tyler Klatt from Tegra Architecture, Sioux Falls, SD, appeared before the board and asked the commission to approve hiring a Geotek and SE2S to perform Phase 1 environmental site analysis and site survey for a Juvenile Detention addition to the Yankton County Jail. A site utility survey will provide the contractor with current information on the location, type, information to identify potential conflicts and relocations early in the process. Brad Bies, Economic Development Director from the City of Yankton, also spoke.

**Action 25263C**: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Heine to hire the firm to conduct the utility survey. Klimisch, Kettering, Heine and Marquardt voting aye; Fox voting nay; motion carried, 4-1.

**Action 25264Z**: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to adopt the following resolution: Whereas it appears Angie Highland, owner of record, has caused a plat to be made of the following real property: NW1/4, NE1/4, Section 33-94N-54W, County of Yankton, S.D., and has submitted such plat to the Yankton County Planning Commission and Yankton County Commission for approval. Now therefore be it resolved that such plat has been executed according to law and conforms to all existing applicable zoning, subdivision, erosion and sediment control and same is hereby approved. County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to endorse on such the proper resolution and certify the same. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

**WHEREAS,** tourism is an important part of the economy of the State of South Dakota and Yankton County that will allow its citizens to be involved in a planning process of how that island is to be used; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Yankton County, South Dakota as follows:

The Board supports the designation and use of land in Yankton County to be included as possible public access and outdoor recreation, enabling photography, painting, drawing, and other forms of expression that improve the quality of life in the area, and maintaining the development and productive use of the resources on or within such lands.

The Board supports acquisition from willing sellers/landowners and for the payment of full and fair market value for all rights and interests acquired, for the well-being, health, safety, welfare, economy, and culture of Yankton County, its businesses, and its citizens.
