Dear Commission Chair Kettering,

City staff, working together with Yankton County staff and officials have put together a plan to address a blighted property while helping tackle an important housing need in our community. We appreciate the proactive approach you've already taken with the City of Yankton and other municipalities in Yankton County in working together on these type of problem properties. As you know, properties that we are working to address in the City from a code enforcement standpoint are also properties that often have liens and unpaid taxes that make them very unattractive for redevelopment. By the time our demolition and abatement costs are included, these properties often spend 5 to 10 years generating zero property tax revenue, while also not providing much needed housing stock.

This proposal seeks to address 1402 Ash Street, owned by Yankton County since September of 2021. The property received no bids at the County's tax sale and remains owned by Yankton County. The existing structures on the property are in poor condition and represent a liability. Redevelopment is further complicated by the issuance of Preliminary Risk Maps by the Federal Emergency Management Agency showing the property mapped into the Special Flood Hazard Area.

City staff has developed a plan with Habitat for Humanity of Clay and Yankton Counties to demolish the existing structures and replace them with a new housing unit built at or above base flood elevation. The City of Yankton will not receive payment for the property transfer. Habitat will assume all costs associated with demolition and redevelopment.

The City of Yankton requests that Yankton County transfer the property to the City forgive any outstanding or pending liens, assessments, or unpaid taxes on the property. A records search indicates that may have already occurred. The Yankton County Auditor's Office had previously requested the City of Yankton forgive and waive \$2,040.63 in past due assessments on the property, which the City Commission did in January 2023. The only remaining encumbrance, a nominal \$30.00 City of Yankton "Road Tax" assessment, would be cleared during the proposed transaction. Included with this request is a location map showing the property. Thank you for your consideration.

## Good Morning Paul,

Thank you for reaching out, we are the only owners of this truck, we speed it out, had it built and it is currently still in service as we speak. We are taking delivery of a new rescue pumper next week and honestly that is the only reason for the sale. With diminishing volunteers we decided to get away from a "dry" rescue and go to a rescue pumper so we only had to run one truck to calls that previously required us to run the rescue plus an engine.

- The only known issue with the truck is the ABS light is on for the anti-lock brakes. It's been on for 10+ years and doesn't affect how the truck runs (or stops) so we have had no reason to repair it. Other than that the truck has been serviced yearly and as I said still goes on calls regularly.
- The engine is an International DT466e, 230hp Diesel. Top speed is somewhere up around 65-70mph. Our district is at the foothills of the Adirondack mountains, so we literally travel up or down a hill wherever we go and fully loaded, the truck has no issues moving around.
- It has a 20kw PTO driven WINCO generator. The generator was rebuilt last year and had a new shaft installed. It has two 100' electric reels that run off that generator. The generator also runs the 20' Wil-Burt Light Tower, which had its seals replaced within the last 5 years.
- It has two 100' air reels that quite honestly we never use. They were put on to run air tools off the truck compressor, but we never used them other than on a drill night just checking tools.
- In the left rear compartment it has two hydraulic reels that will come with the truck. We used these for oue hydraulic rescue tools. If you have no use for them, we can remove them, but we recently switched to battery powered rescue tools so they are not much use to us anymore.
- The cascade system has 4 6,000 PSI DOT bottles that were just hydrotested last year. It has a two bottle fill station in the walk-in part of the truck, so the person filling bottles is out of the weather and not standing on the side of the road filling bottles.

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
















Public Information & Warning occurred on May 19th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky submitted a press release to the local paper (Yankton Press & Dakotan) regarding Yankton County Search and Rescue lifejacket give away this month for children and water safety.

Threat & Hazard Identification was engaged on May 24th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Yankton County Search and Rescue held a meet and greet and lifejacket give away event. This event is a time for everyone to come out to meet the team, their equipment, and kids can receive a free lifejacket with fitting and water safety instructions, and have a dinner of hot dogs, chips, and lemonade.

June: Operational Coordination was achieved on June 9th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky met with Hutchinson County EM and representatives from the hospitals in Freeman and Parkston to discuss the addition of Hutchinson County to Yankton-Bon Homme POD. Ideas and guidelines were put forth to adopt them into the Yankton-Bon Homme POD plan. On June 15th, YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky attended a Yankton County FEMA Flood Map meeting with other local agencies to review the new map and its presentation to the county that evening.

Threats & Hazard Identification were completed on June 29th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky inspected and replaced lifejackets at the two stations along the Missouri River.

## 4. Response

Response is defined as activities that address the short-term, direct effects of an incident. Response includes immediate actions to save lives, protect property, and meet basic human needs. October: Operational Coordination occurred on October 19th, when a fire broke out at a local assisted living facility and a potential evacuation was coordinated between the facility, emergency services, local transportation, and the SD Department of Social Services. Evacuation did not occur, but plans were put in place in case the incident increased in severity. Mass Care Services were engaged by providing Influenza vaccine through Yankton/Bon Homme Points of Dispensing (POD) to the following locations on the subsequent dates: October 5th – Sacred Heart Elementary and Middle Schools; October 13th – Gayville School District; October 15th & 19th – Yankton Elementary Schools; and October 26th – Yankton High School and Yankton Middle School.

November: Mass Care Services were engaged by providing Influenza vaccine through Yankton/Bon Homme Points of Dispensing (POD) to the following locations on the subsequent dates: Lesterville community on November 7th and Gayville community on November 14th.

December: Operational coordination occurred on December 12th when YCOEM opened their Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to a level 3 due to impending severe winter storm. The EOC was open for four days until the storm passed and threats/hazards were mitigated. During this time, Operational Communications were maintained by sending local sitreps to SDOEM twice a day. This practice of sending twice-daily sitreps to SDOEM was also restarted December 22nd, when another severe winter storm hit the state. Situational Assessment was completed through sitreps and communications with the National Weather Service (NWS). Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky viewed Webinars from the NWS on the following dates: December 12th, 20th, and 21st.

### 2nd Quarter

February: Resource Management and Logistics was engaged on February 2nd when Lisa Swartz from the SD Office of Emergency Management arrived at Yankton County Office of Emergency Management to update the office's Salamander ID card printer.

March: Operational coordination occurred on March 6th when Yankton County Office of Emergency Management staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky completed a drone mission of flying a tower for the emergency manager of Cedar County, Nebraska.

#### 3rd Quarter

May: Operational Coordination was engaged on May 10th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky assisted local emergency service agencies with an accident that resulted in two fatalities and Highway 50 being shut down for a few hours during the investigation. YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt also coordination with SD DANR about the possibility of a diesel fuel release.

June: Situational Assessment was engaged on June 6th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky responded to a cement truck rollover within Yankton County.

YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt worked with SD DANR about the potential problem of liquid cement and diesel fuel in a waterway. In the end, the liquid cement was contained within the drum and the diesel fuel was below reportable quantities.

Mass Care Services was implemented on June 20th when YCOEM staff Paul Scherschligt and Erin Hacecky responded to a request from the City of Yankton to assist with the evacuation of an apartment building. Temporary housing was done at a local hotel with the help of Salvation Army. Red Cross was also involved and provided cash cards to the families and individuals to help with expenses. In the end, all residents found new housing locations.

The South Dakota Office of Emergency Management operates a grant program that provides financial support to counties emergency management program. This program is called the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG). It is a grant program that has its lineage from the FEMA's Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG); thus, there are federal grant requirements.

We are sending this grant package to all 66 counties in the state. Counties may participate in the grant annually or decide not to participate in the grant.

The LEMPG provides a single funding and reporting instrument for the accomplishment of activities and products. The Agreement acknowledges the LEMPG applies to preparedness for natural and man-made disasters.

The 2024 Local Emergency Management Performance Grant Sub-Recipient Agreement is comprised of the main agreement and four exhibits; Exhibit A which describes the grant, Exhibit B which describes terms and conditions that apply to the grant, Exhibit C which identifies work topic areas under the LEMPG, and Exhibit D the Administrative Manual which provides administrative instructions and definitions. The main agreement includes Section 25 which identifies general requirements which must be completed by the end of the contract. Exhibit B is derived from Federal requirements of FEMA's Emergency Management Performance Grant (the grant the LEMPG funds are awarded from). Entitics receiving funds from this grant must abide by all Terms and Conditions outlined in this Exhibit. Exhibit C identifies topic areas that all reimbursed positions must participate in, and which should be reported monthly and submitted quarterly.

If your county wishes to participate in the 2024 LEMPG program, please sign the 2024 Local Emergency Management Performance Grant Agreement and return the signed signature to your assigned Regional Coordinator by September 30, 2023. If you do not wish to participate, please have your emergency manager contact their Regional Coordinator by email so we have verification from you. We will notify you when we receive our EMPG award in the spring/summer of 2024 and are able to provide reimbursement payments.

The State and Sub-Recipient hereby enter into this agreement (the "Agreement" hereinafter) for a grant award of Federal financial assistance to Sub-Recipient.

#### A. REQUIRED AUDIT PROVISIONS FOR GRANT AWARDS

#### 1. FEDERAL AWARD IDENTIFICATION:

Information for the Federal Award Identification, as described in 2 CFR 200.331(a) is included in Exhibit A and is incorporated herein. In the event of a change in the award or funding source, the information included in Exhibit A may change. Sub-Recipient's consent shall not be required for the change in award or funding source and the change shall not be subject to the requirements for an amendment to this Agreement. In the event of a change, the State will provide updated information at least annually.

#### 2. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT:

This agreement shall be effective as indicated in Exhibit A.

#### 3. SCOPE OF WORK AND PERFORMANCE PROVISIONS:

The Sub-Recipient will undertake, complete, and report as necessary to their Regional Coordinator the work or performance as described in Section 25, General Requirements, of this agreement. 100% of all activities identified in this contract must be completed. The Sub-Recipient must report on a quarterly basis, all activities performed in Exhibit C.

#### 4. BASIS FOR SUBAWARD AMOUNTS:

This grant is made for the purpose of county emergency management program support referred to as the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG). As a condition of this award, you are required to contribute a cost match of non-Federal funds in the amount of 50% of salary, benefits, and required training costs. Counties with population under 19,000 will be eligible to be reimbursed up to 50% for one emergency manager. Counties with population over 19,000 will be eligible to be reimbursed up to 50% for two emergency managers. This reimbursement is by position, not FTE equivalent. Counties with a population over 100,000 will be reimbursed up to 50% for three employee's as long as all three have an active role in completing LEMPG requirements. Additional information is detailed in Exhibit A.

#### 5. RISK ASSESSMENTS, MONITORING AND REMEDIES:

Risk assessments will be ongoing throughout the project period. Sub-Recipient agrees to allow the State to monitor Sub-Recipient to ensure compliance with program requirements, to identify any deficiencies in the administration and performance of the award and to facilitate the same. At the discretion of the State, monitoring may include but is not limited to the following: On-site visits, follow-up, document and/or desk reviews, third-

If the Sub-Recipient expends less than \$750,000 during any Sub-Recipient fiscal year, the State may perform a more limited program or performance audit related to the completion of the Agreement objects, the eligibility of services or costs, and adherence to Agreement provisions.

Audits shall be completed and filed with the Department of Legislative Audit by the end of the 9<sup>th</sup> month following end of the fiscal year being audited.

For either an entity-wide, independent financial audit or an audit under 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart F, the Sub-Recipient shall resolve all interim audit findings to the satisfaction of the auditor. The Sub-Recipient shall facilitate and aid any such reviews, examinations, agreed upon procedures etc., the State or its contractor(s) may perform.

Failure to complete audit(s) as required, including resolving interim audit findings, will result in the disallowance of audit costs as direct or indirect charges to programs. Additionally, a percentage of awards may be withheld, overhead costs may be disallowed, and/or awards may be suspended, until the audit is completely resolved.

The Sub-Recipient shall be responsible for payment of any and all audit exceptions which are identified by the State. The State may conduct an agreed upon procedures engagement as an audit strategy. The Sub-Recipient may be responsible for payment of any and all questioned costs, as defined in 2 C.F.R. 200.84, at the discretion of the State.

Notwithstanding any other condition of the Agreement, the cooperative audit resolution process applies, as appropriate. The books and records of the Sub-Recipient must be made available if needed and upon request at the Sub-Recipient's regular place of business for audit by personnel authorized by the State. The State and/or federal agency has the right to return to audit the program during performance under the grant or after close-out, and at any time during the record retention period, and to conduct recovery audits including the recovery of funds, as appropriate.

If applicable, Sub-Recipient agrees to comply in full with the administrative requirements and cost principles as outlined in OMB uniform administrative requirements, cost principles, and audit requirements for federal awards – 2CFR Part 200 (Uniform Administrative Requirements).

#### 8. SUB-RECIPIENT ATTESTATION:

By signing this Agreement, Sub-Recipient attests to the following requirements as set forth in SDCL § 1-56-10:

#### 14. ASSIGNMENT AND AMENDMENT:

This Agreement may not be assigned, nor the funds given to a new or additional subrecipient, without the express written consent of the State. This agreement may not be amended except in writing, which writing shall be expressly identified as part hereof, and be signed by an authorized representative of each of the parties hereto. Any assignees, subrecipients, or successors in interest must agree to be bound by all terms contained within this agreement and shall be bound hereby to all these terms.

#### 15. CONTROLLING LAW:

This Sub-Recipient Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota, exclusive of its choice of law principals. Federal law, administrative rules, and grant guidelines control the use and administration of federal grants. Venue for any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this Agreement shall be in the Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.

#### 16. SUPERCESSION:

All other prior discussions, communications and representations concerning the subject matter of this Agreement are superseded by the terms of this Agreement, and except as specifically provided herein, this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement with respect to the subject matter hereof.

#### 17. SEVERABILITY:

In the event that any provision of this Agreement shall be held unenforceable or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect.

#### 18. NOTICE:

Any notice or other communication required under this Agreement shall be in writing.

#### 19. SUBCONTRACTORS/SUB-SUB-RECIPIENTS:

The Sub-Recipient may use contractors to perform work under this Agreement as set forth in Section C. The Sub-Recipient may not sub-grant funds under this Agreement without the previous written approval of the State.

The Sub-Recipient will include provisions in its contracts for this project (or sub-grants if approved) requiring its contractors and sub-recipients to comply with the applicable provisions of this Agreement, to indemnify the State, and to provide insurance coverage for the benefit of the State in a manner consistent with this Agreement. The Sub-Recipient will cause its contractors, sub-recipients, agents, and employees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, ordinances, guidelines, permits and requirements and will adopt such review and inspection procedures as are necessary to assure such compliance. The State, at its option, may require the vetting of any contractors and/or sub-recipients. The Sub-Recipient is required to assist in this process as needed.

- The following courses are required within 6 years of hire. (Note that IS classes can be completed online.)
  - Complete the FEMA Advanced Professional Series (APS) and upload a copy of your EMI certificate in WebEOC. Report completion to your Regional Coordinator. (To be completed within 6 years of hire.)
- The following is required for all county emergency management staff annually.
  - Complete a minimum of one OEM sponsored or training officer approved classroom training course for continuing education. Upload a copy of your certificate in WebEOC. Report completion to your Regional Coordinator. (To be completed by end of performance period)

#### **PREPAREDNESS**

#### Planning

- Conduct an annual Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP) review with stakeholders and county commissioners so it is comprehensive and current. As part of this review, compare your current LEOP with the updated LEOP template and identify sections/annexes that should be added or updated. Consider adding and updating those sections as part of your annual review. Also review and update shelters and Disaster Response and Recovery (DRRI) facilities for your jurisdiction. These facilities and their capabilities should be an attachment to your Mass Care Annex. Documentation of the attendees of the meeting will be reported to the Regional Coordinator and uploaded in WebEOC following the meeting. Upload a new electronic copy of the LEOP to your County Plans board in WebEOC.
- Attend the in-person or virtual refresher COOP Planning Software workshop if you are currently utilizing or plan to utilize this state provided software.

#### Resource Management & Logistics

Update jurisdictional resource inventory within the Comprehensive Resource Management & Credentialing
system (CRMCS) and ensure resources conform to Homeland Security resource typing and naming
standards. This update requires county owned equipment to be updated. Other response resources owned by
municipalities and other response organizations is highly recommended to include in this update.

- Report events to the Office of Emergency Management Duty Officer in a timely manner using current reporting guidelines. (Current guidelines are available in the File Library of WebEOC in the County EM SDOEM Administration folder).
- If the State Emergency Operation Center (EOC) is activated, impacted counties requesting resources must activate and staff their local EOC.
- Consider utilizing the state supplied Bridge4PS application within your jurisdiction and region to exchange information and assist in coordination of emergency response.

#### RECOVERY

- If an event occurs that may meet the guidelines for a Presidential Disaster Declaration, coordinate activities with the State and distribute Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) materials and provide PDA Training to eligible applicants within your jurisdiction.
- If a county has received a Presidential Disaster Declaration, assist the State with briefings and accompany
  the State-FEMA inspection team to meetings, site inspections, and observe the write-up of a project
  worksheet
- Attend the in-person or virtual refresher Crisis Track workshop if you are currently utilizing or are planning
  to utilize this state supplied software. Utilization of the software will be required for submission of PDA
  documentation for all counties and all entities within counties beginning in calendar year 2025.

#### 26. COMPLIANCE WITH EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-01

By entering into this Agreement, Sub-Recipient certifies and agrees that it has not refused to transact business activities, it has not terminated business activities, and it has not taken other similar actions intended to limit its commercial relations, related to the subject matter of this Agreement, with a person or entity that is either the State of Israel, or a company doing business in or with Israel or authorized by, licensed by, or organized under the laws of the State of Israel to do business, or doing business in the State of Israel, with the specific intent to accomplish a boycott or divestment of Israel in a discriminatory manner. Sub-Recipient further agrees that, if this certification is false, such false certification will constitute grounds for the State to terminate this Agreement. #### 33. COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT WORKER(S) SCHEDULE:

County Emergency Management workers must maintain a work schedule commensurate with the percentage of time funded by this grant for Emergency Management functions. Emergency Management workers hours must meet or exceed the minimum requirement on a <u>quarterly</u> basis. Minimum monthly and quarterly hours based on percentage of time is listed in Appendix B of the Administrative Manual.

Percentage of time worked on Emergency Management functions must be documented in timekeeping records utilizing the State timesheet. For part-time personnel who do not receive paid leave, hourly employees should track hours they work on Emergency Management but will only be reimbursed for hours up to the percentage of time reported on their Personnel Action Form. For part-time personnel who do not receive paid leave, salaried employees should track hours they work on Emergency Management and are required to work minimum hours based on the percentage of time reported on their Personnel Action Form.

If the County Emergency Management worker is considered 100% time, they can hold no other role or position within county government. If the County wishes or requires for the County Emergency Management worker to conduct other activities for the County, such as 911 Coordinator, Veteran's Service Officer, Deputy Sheriff, etc., they cannot be considered a 100%-time County Emergency Management worker and the percentage of time should be adjusted accordingly on a Personnel Action Form.

McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, Pub. L. No. 115-232 (2018) and 2 C.F.R. sections 200.216, 200.327, 200.471, and Appendix II to 2 C.F.R. Part 200. Recipients of an award of Federal financial assistance from a program for infrastructure are hereby notified that none of the funds provided under this award may be used for a project for infrastructure unless:

- (1) all iron and steel used in the project are produced in the United States--this means all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States;
- (2) all manufactured products used in the project are produced in the United States? this means the manufactured product was manufactured in the United States; and the cost of the components of the manufactured product that are mined, produced, or manufactured in the United States is greater than 55 percent of the total cost of all components of the manufactured product, unless another standard for determining the minimum amount of domestic content of the manufactured product has been established under applicable law or regulation; and
- (3) all construction materials are manufactured in the United States-this means that all manufacturing processes for the construction material occurred in the United States.

The Buy America preference only applies to articles, materials, and supplies that are consumed in, incorporated into, or affixed to an infrastructure project. As such, it does not apply to tools, equipment, and supplies, such as temporary scaffolding, brought to the construction site and removed at or before the completion of the infrastructure project. Nor does a Buy America preference apply to equipment and furnishings, such as movable chairs, desks, and portable computer equipment, that are used at or within the finished infrastructure project but are not an integral part of the structure or permanently affixed to the infrastructure project.

#### Waivers

When necessary, recipients may apply for, and the agency may grant, a waiver from these requirements. Information on the process for requesting a waiver from these requirements is on the website below.

- (a) When the Federal agency has made a determination that one of the following exceptions applies, the awarding official may waive the application of the domestic content procurement preference in any case in which the agency determines that:
- (1) applying the domestic content procurement preference would be inconsistent with the public interest;
- (2) the types of iron, steel, manufactured products, or construction materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities or of a satisfactory quality;
- (3) the inclusion of iron, steel, manufactured products, or construction materials produced in the United States will increase the cost of the overall project by more than 25 percent.

A request to waive the application of the domestic content procurement preference must be in writing. The agency will provide instructions on the format, contents, and supporting materials required for any waiver request. Waiver requests are subject to public comment periods of no less than 15 days and must be reviewed by the Made in America Office.

There may be instances where an award qualifies, in whole or in part, for an existing waiver described at "Buy America" Preference in FEMA Financial Assistance Programs for Infrastructure | FEMA.gov.

DHS/FEMA is required to consider the potential impacts to natural and cultural resources of all projects funded by DHS/FEMA grant funds, through its EHP review process, as mandated by: the National Environmental Policy Act; National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended; National Flood Insurance Program regulations; and any other applicable laws and executive orders. General guidance for FEMA's EHP process is available on the HS/FEMA Website. Specific applicant guidance on how to submit information for EHP review depends on the individual grant program and applicants should contact their grant Program Officer to be put into contact with EHP staff responsible for assisting their specific grant program. The EHP review process must be completed before funds are released to carry out the proposed project; otherwise, DHS/FEMA may not be able to fund the project due to noncompliance with EHP laws, executive orders, regulations, and policies.

If ground disturbing activities occur during construction, applicant will monitor ground disturbance, and if any potential archaeological resources are discovered the applicant will immediately cease work in that area and notify the pass-through entity, if applicable, and DHS/FEMA.

#### Article XLIV - Applicability of DHS Standard Terms and Conditions to Tribes

The DHS Standard Terms and Conditions are a restatement of general requirements imposed upon recipients and flow down to sub-recipients as a matter of law, regulation, or executive order. If the requirement does not apply to Indian tribes or there is a federal law or regulation exempting its application to Indian tribes, then the acceptance by Tribes of, or acquiescence to, DHS Standard Terms and Conditions does not change or alter its inapplicability to an Indian tribe. The execution of grant documents is not intended to change, alter, amend, or impose additional liability or responsibility upon the Tribe where it does not already exist.

#### Article XLV - Acceptance of Post Award Changes

In the event FEMA determines that changes are necessary to the award document after an award has been made, including changes to period of performance or terms and conditions, recipients will be notified of the changes in writing. Once notification has been made, any subsequent request for funds will indicate recipient acceptance of the changes to the award. #### Article XLVI - Disposition of Equipment Acquired Under the Federal Award

For purposes of original or replacement equipment acquired under this award by a non-state recipient or non-state sub-recipients, when that equipment is no longer needed for the original project or program or for other activities currently or previously supported by a federal awarding agency, you must request instructions from FEMA to make proper disposition of the equipment pursuant to 2 C.F.R. section 200.313. State recipients and state sub-recipients must follow the disposition requirements in accordance with state laws and procedures.

#### Article XLVII - Prior Approval for Modification of Approved Budget

Before making any change to the FEMA approved budget for this award, you must request prior written approval from FEMA where required by 2 C.F.R. section 200.308.

# Introduction

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program is to provide Federal grants to states to assist state, local, territorial, and tribal governments in preparing for all hazards, as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (the Stafford Act), as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 5121 et seq.) and Section 662 of the Post Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006, as amended (6 U.S.C. § 762). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal government and the states and their political subdivisions. The Federal government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary direction, coordination, and guidance, and provides necessary assistance, as authorized in this title, to support a comprehensive all hazards emergency preparedness system.

The State, in turn, makes a large portion of this funding available to county emergency management organizations through the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG).

The LEMPG consists of a formal agreement that stipulates the terms and conditions of the grant, the work plan that supports the building and sustainment of the core capabilities across the prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery mission areas.

Funding is based on reimbursement of up to 50% of approved County/District Emergency Manager position(s). The funding is used for county/district costs of emergency management personnel expenses and requires a 50% non-federal cash match. All requirements of the LEMPG must be satisfied to receive funding.

This LEMPG Administrative Manual will guide the County/District Emergency Manager through the various administrative, training, and financial requirements of the program. It also references some of the terms and conditions of the LEMPG under which such reimbursements are made.

#### Note to the County Auditor:

The EMPG is provided to counties to reimburse up to 50% of the approved county emergency management staff(s) salary and benefit costs. The CFDA number is 97.042. This grant and any other associated with SDOEM shall be accounted for within fund 226.

# Section 1: Definitions & Acronyms

#### A. Definitions

- Authorized Local Official. Authorized Local Official refers to the individual on the local level who has the authority to sign the EMPG Subaward Agreement.
- 2. CERT. CERT refers to the Community Emergency Response Team.
- 3. CFR. CFR refers to the Code of Federal Regulations.
- CRMCS. CRMCS refers to the Comprehensive Resource Management and Credentialing System.
- 5. **DENR.** DENR refers to the Department of Environment & Natural Resources.
- 6. DHS. DHS refers to the Department of Homeland Security.
- 7. **DPS**. *DPS* refers to the South Dakota Department of Public Safety which is the state agency the SDOEM is a part of.
- Duty Officer. Duty Officer refers to the rotational position within the SDOEM designed to serve as a single point of contact to government entities when statelevel assistance is needed.

# Section 3: Reimbursement Process

## A. Quarterly Reporting Requirements

- All quarterly reimbursement claims must be submitted through WebEOC. Claims
  must include the following items to be processed. Sample paper forms can be
  found in the WebEOC File Library. For access to the WebEOC, please contact
  your Regional Coordinator.
  - a. LEMPG Form 85-21 (State and Local Management Expenses Claimed for Contributions)
    - All claims for reimbursement must be submitted through WebEOC on the 85-21 board.
    - ii. All claims the county pays for personnel wages and benefits identified on the 85-21 need to be supported by payroll registers, budget sheets, or other documents supporting the claims entered in the 85-21. Employee paid benefits such as additional insurance they pay for will not be reimbursed as that is not a county expense and should not be included on the 85-21 form. Supporting documentation must be uploaded to the 85-21 board in the WebEOC.
    - iii. All claims for approved training travel expenses must be submitted on the State Travel Expense Report form located in WebEOC and uploaded to the 85-21 board to substantiate the claim. All invoices supporting those claims must accompany the Travel Expense Report.
    - iv. All expenditures submitted on the 85-21 board will be used by the SDOEM to match Federal EMPG funds. Therefore, the county/district may not use any of these expenses as financial "match" for any other program or grant opportunities.

#### b. State Time Sheet

- i. Emergency Management work hours, and non-emergency management work hours if applicable, must be recorded on the State Time Sheet (WebEOC File Library) and submitted by uploading the form to the 85-21 board. For example, a Deputy Sheriff that is also the Emergency Manager for a county would need to record their emergency management hours as EM work hours and their Deputy Sheriff hours as non-emergency management work hours.
- ii. Hourly Emergency Management workers hours will only be reimbursed up to the percentage of time reported on their Personnel Action Form.
- Salaried Emergency Management workers hours must meet or exceed the minimum requirement on a <u>quarterly</u> basis listed under Appendix B of this manual.
- iv. During a disaster response, hours worked by the emergency manager may be claimed through the LEMPG or under a Presidential Disaster declaration if received. However, the hours can only be claimed from one source. The jurisdiction cannot be reimbursed twice for the same hours. This is also the case for any other grant in which you could also be reimbursed for any of your salary, benefits and travel costs.

### c. Quarterly Workplan Report

i. The Workplan Report will be uploaded to the Workplan board on a quarterly basis and in conjunction with the balance of the quarterly report. A hard copy of the Workplan can be found in the WebEOC File Library under County EM – LEMPG.

# Section 4: Personnel Procedures

#### A. New Personnel

 A Certification of Authorized Official form must be filed with SDOEM within 30 days for any new emergency manager hired. This form authorizes the employee to conduct emergency management business for the county. This form must be on file at SDOEM before expenses can be claimed. This form can be accessed through WebEOC.

### B. Personnel Action Form

 A Personnel Action Form must be completed every time an LEMPG-funded employee is hired, terminated, retired, receives a change in salary or a promotion, etc. and submitted to the SDOEM within 30 days. This form can be accessed through WebEOC.

# Appendix B: Schedule of Required Hours

- B. SD OEM provides access to Crisis Track software to utilize when collecting damage information. Training workshops for the software are offered during the year. Submission of PDA documentation for all counties and all entities within counties will be required through use of the Crisis Track software beginning in calendar year 2025.

#### 5. Training

A. New county emergency management staff: If you are a new county emergency management staff member (this Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) will be your first full year

and terminology for exercise design, development, conduct, evaluation, and improvement planning. HSEEP constitutes a national standard for all exercises.

- 2. There are seven types of exercises defined within HSEEP, each of which is either discussions-based or operations-based.
  - i. Discussions-based exercises familiarize participants with current plans, policies, agreements, and procedures. These types of exercises may be used to develop new plans, policies, agreements, and procedures.
    - a. Seminar. An informal discussion designed to orient participants to new or updated plans, policies, or procedures.
    - b. Workshop. Resembles a seminar but is employed to build specific products such as a draft plan or policy.
    - c. Tabletop Exercise. Involves key personnel discussing simulated scenarios in an informal setting and can be used to assess plans, policies, and procedures.
    - d. Games. A simulation of operations that often involves two or more teams, usually in a competitive environment using rules, dates, and procedures designed to depict an actual or assumed real-life situation.
  - ii. Operations-based exercises validate plans, policies, agreements, and procedures, clarify roles and responsibilities, and identify resource gaps.
    - a. Drill. A coordinated, supervised activity usually employed to test a single specific operation or function.
    - b. Functional Exercise (FE). Examines and/or validates the coordination, command, and control between various multi-agency coordination centers. A Functional Exercise does not involve "boots on the ground" response.
    - Full-Scale Exercise (FSE). A multi-agency, multi-jurisdictional, multidiscipline exercise involving functional and "boots on the ground" response.
- 3. Counties participating in the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG) as it relates to the Exercise Program are required to conduct or participate in one drill per quarter and conduct one exercise per year.
- B. Communications Drills. The State Exercise Coordinator schedules two communications drills per quarter to fulfill the LEMPG drill requirement. All County LEMPG funded staff must complete the communications drill participation survey distributed by the State Exercise Coordinator within one (1) week of the date of the drill to receive credit for participation. If a county misses a required drill, a make-up drill must be completed within the next quarter. In lieu of participating in a state drill, a county may choose to conduct its own drill. IE: Radio drill, telephone call tree test, etc. A Situation Manual (SitMan) and an After-Action Report-Improvement Plan must be submitted for the communications drill credit.
  - 1. Communications Drill Schedule

- i. Exercise Notification At least 45 days prior to exercise.
- ii. Exercise Plan (EXPLAN) At least 30 days prior to exercise.
- iii. Master Scenario Events List (MSEL) Within 90 days post exercise.
- iv. After Action Report-Improvement Plan (each participating county is required to submit if exercise is done as a multi-county exercise and must address items specific to that county) – Within 90 days post exercise.
- v. Exercise sign-in roster/ CRMCS participation summary Within **90 days** post exercise.
- 2. Real-World Event (Once authorization has been received)
  - i. Incident Action Plan(s) (IAP's) for one (1) operational period with the five (5) EOC functions staffed Within **90 days** post event.
  - ii. An After-Action Report-Improvement Plan that specifically addresses Operational Coordination, Operational Communications, and one additional core capability Within **90 days** post event.
  - iii. Event sign-in roster/CRMCS participation summary Within **90 days** post IAP date or **90 days** post event, whichever is sooner.
- 3. All exercise documentation must be entered and uploaded via the county's Exercise Reporting board in WebEOC. Failure to submit all documents outlined in this policy will result in the jurisdiction not receiving credit for the FSE LEMPG requirement.
- G. Additional Exercise Information. The State Exercise Coordinator is available to travel to the counties. This time may be used for visits with local emergency managers for training on Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP), training on required documents for exercises, and if requested, to assist with evaluating exercises, and to observe exercises.
  - 1. The Emergency Management Institute (EMI) conducts Virtual Tabletop Exercises (VTTX) via a video teleconference platform (Digital Dakota Network [DDN] in South Dakota). A VTTX event allows for 10-15 sites across the nation to participate in each offering. The State Exercise Coordinator works with other State agencies and the public and private sector to coordinate and facilitate the VTTX. South Dakota's DDN video portion is a statewide interactive video communications system.

tection Frogram loans, other lederal programs were funneled through the state. The senator told South Dakota Searchlight in an emailed statement that she hired independent legal counsel about her company's eligibility to receive federal grants through the state.

"After consulting with legal counsel, I believed my com-pany was eligible," Castleberry said, "Upon several occasions, I communicated directly and transparently with DSS staff regarding grant applications. I am committed to resolving the issue with the state and will work with them to ensure I acted

work with them to ensure I acted in compliance with the state constitution."

The documents released by Noem don't temize the allegedly flegal payments, but the state financial transparency website says Little Nest Preschool was awarded nearly \$355,400 in ARPA Childcare Stabilization Grants as of July 26. The business received an additional \$164,000 between

July 2021 and February 2022. The website does not list trans-actions older than July 2021.

Little Nest Preschool also received \$164,520 in federal PPP loans, which are not part of the state-allocated federal funds.

Noem's letter said Depart-ment of Social Services staff found the violations while processing a \$4,000 grant application from Castleberry's business, Little Nest Preschool, for another grant program. In that program. Noem approved \$12.5 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) lunds to help registered or licensed childcare providers expand or start a new lacility. #### Helpful Hints for Construction of Post Frame building with 2 feet on center truss spacing


- Posts are estimated at 8 feet on center maximum with a continuous header system to support the trusses.
- When the building length is not divisible by 8, a combination of posts 8, 6, or 4 feet on center spacing are estimated. For example, a 32-foot building will have posts evenly spaced at 8 feet on center. A 30-foot building will have 3 "bays" with posts at 8 feet and one "bay" with a 6-foot space between posts.
- Continuous headers are calculated based on the 8 feet on center span. Door opening headers are based on the door opening size.
- If steel is estimated (Pro-Rib or Pro-Snap), the steel lengths should be verified based off the actual framing. Plate height, truss heel and other framing should be confirmed. Steel is estimated to the inch, make sure the lengths are accurate based on final overall building design.
- Trusses included are estimated at 2 feet on center spacing. The design is based on the zip code provided, design and loading should be verified.
- Trusses should not be cut or modified with the exception of trimming the truss tails to the correct overhang.
- Dropped end trusses are estimated with 18 inch and 24 inch gable overhangs.





# PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT AP Triton, LLC

This Agreement, dated as of **SEPTEMBER 1, 2023** is by and between **YANKTON COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA** ("CLIENT"), and **AP TRITON, LLC** ("CONSULTANT"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties." The Agreement will be effective upon final execution by all parties.

#### 1. HEADINGS

Headings herein are for convenience of reference only and shall in no way affect interpretation of the Agreement.

#### 2. ATTACHMENTS

Attachments 1 and 2 are attached hereto and included by reference.

#### 3. CONSULTANT'S SCOPE OF SERVICES AND CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES

CONSULTANT agrees to perform all services described in Attachment 1, Scope of Work, for payment pursuant to Attachment 2, in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. CLIENT shall provide complete, accurate, and timely information regarding CLIENT'S requirements and shall designate by name a representative authorized to act on its behalf. CLIENT shall examine documents or other instruments submitted by CONSULTANT and shall promptly render any decisions necessary in order to avoid unreasonable delay. CLIENT shall provide any additional materials, other than those CONSULTANT is responsible to provide, that are reasonably necessary to complete the Scope of Work. CLIENT shall provide reasonable access to any locations under the control of CLIENT required for CONSULTANT to perform the services hereunder. Any additional requirements will be identified in Attachment 1.

#### 4. TERM

This Agreement shall terminate upon completion of the Scope of Work as described in Attachment 1, unless extended by mutual Agreement of the Parties in writing or terminated in accordance with Section 16.

#### 5. PAYMENT

For all services performed in accordance with the Agreement, payment shall be made to CONSULTANT as provided in Attachment 2.

#### 6. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>

No relationship of employer and employee is created by this Agreement. It is understood and agreed that CONSULTANT is, at all times, an independent contractor and can perform work for others. CONSULTANT is not the agent or employee of the CLIENT in any capacity whatsoever and CLIENT shall not be liable in any manner for any acts or omissions by CONSULTANT or for any obligations or liabilities incurred by CONSULTANT, its employees, or agents.

CONSULTANT shall have no claim under this Agreement or otherwise, for seniority, vacation time, vacation pay, sick leave, personal lime off, health insurance medical care, hospital care, retirement benefits, social security, disability, workers' compensation, or unemployment insurance benefits, civil service protection, or employee benefits of any kind.

CONSULTANT shall be solely liable for, and obligated to pay directly, all applicable payroll taxes (including federal and state income taxes) or contributions for unemployment insurance or old age pensions or annuities which are imposed by any governmental entity in connection with the labor used or which are measured by wages, salaries or other remuneration paid to its officers, agents, or employees, and CONSULTANT agrees to indemnify and hold CLIENT harmless from any and all liability which CLIENT may incur because of CONSULTANT's failure to pay such amounts.

In carrying out the work contemplated herein, CONSULTANT shall comply with all applicable federal and state workers' compensation and liability laws and regulations with respect to the officers, agents and/or employees conducting and participating in the work; and agrees that such officers, agents, and/or employees will be considered as independent contractors and shall not be treated or considered in any way as officers, agents and/or employees of CLIENT.

#### 7. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

To the fullest extent permitted by law, each Party shall release, hold harmless, defend and indemnify the other from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, lawsuits, liabilities and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, including but not limited to those attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, death or to injury to or destruction of property, including the loss therefrom, which arises out of or is any way connected with the performance of this Agreement (collectively "Liabilities") to the extent caused by such Party, except where such Liabilities are caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of any indemnitee.

#### 8. INSURANCE

CONSULTANT shall maintain at all times during the performance of this Agreement a commercial general liability insurance policy with a minimum occurrence coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000; an automobile liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of \$500,000; and, if any licensed professional performs services under this contract, a professional liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 to cover any claims arising out of CONSULTANT's performance of services under this Agreement. If requested by CLIENT, all insurance, except professional liability, shall name the CLIENT as additional insureds and shall provide primary coverage with respect to the CLIENT.

All insurance policies shall: 1) provide that the insurance carrier shall not cancel, terminate, or otherwise modify the terms and conditions of said policies except upon thirty (30) days written notice to the CLIENT'S representative as shown in Section 22 Notices; 2) be evidenced by the Certificate of Insurance; and 3) be approved as to form and sufficiency by the CLIENT.

CONSULTANT shall promptly forward all insurance documents to the CLIENT.

#### 9. CONFORMITY WITH LAW AND SAFETY

In performing services under this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall observe and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, codes and regulations of governmental agencies, including federal, state, municipal, and local governing bodies, having jurisdiction over the scope of services provided by CONSULTANT.

#### 10. TRAVEL EXPENSES

CONSULTANT shall be allowed and compensated for reasonable travel expenses to carry out the work of the CLIENT as approved in advance by the CLIENT in accordance with Attachment 2.

#### 11. TAXES

Payment of all applicable federal, state and local taxes shall be the sole responsibility of the CONSULTANT.

#### 12. ACCESS AND RETENTION OF RECORDS

CONSULTANT agrees to provide the CLIENT and its designees access to all of the CONSULTANT's records related to this contract and that the CONSULTANT shall maintain its records related to this contract for a period of not less than five (5) years after the final payment to the CONSULTANT is made by the CLIENT.

#### 13. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

CONSULTANT covenants that CONSULTANT presently has no interest, and shall not obtain any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner with the performance of services required under this Agreement, including but not limited to any provision of services to any federal, state or local regulatory or other public agency which has any interest adverse or potentially adverse to the CLIENT, as determined in the reasonable judgment of the CLIENT. Entering into this agreement does not preclude CONSULTANT from working for others as long as CONSULTANT ensures that such work does not constitute a conflict of interest.

#### 14. CONFIDENTIALITY

CONSULTANT agrees that any information, whether proprietary or not, made known to or discovered by CONSULTANT during the performance of or in connection with this Agreement for the CLIENT will be kept confidential and not be disclosed to any other person or entity except as required by law. CONSULTANT agrees to immediately notify the CLIENT if CONSULTANT is requested to disclose to others any information made known to or discovered by CONSULTANT during the performance of or in connection with this Agreement.

#### 15. USE OF CLIENT PROPERTY

CONSULTANT shall not use CLIENT property (including equipment, instruments, and supplies) or personnel for any purpose other than in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

#### 16. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Agreement for default upon five (5) days written notice to the other if the other party has substantially failed to fulfill any of its obligations under this Agreement in a timely manner as provided herein. CLIENT has and reserves the right to terminate this Agreement at its convenience and without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice to CONSULTANT. In the event that the CLIENT should terminate this Agreement for its convenience, CONSULTANT shall be entitled to payment for services provided hereunder, as provided in Attachment 2, including for such services performed prior to the effective date of said termination, including travel, accrued as of the date of the termination, which payment shall be per the terms set forth in Attachment 2.

#### 17. CHOICE OF LAW

CONSULTANT and CLIENT agree that if a dispute arises in the performance of this agreement the laws of the State of Wyoming will govern.

#### 18. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, including all attachments, exhibits, and any other documents specifically incorporated into this Agreement, shall constitute the entire agreement between CLIENT and CONSULTANT relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. As used herein, Agreement refers to and includes any documents incorporated herein by reference and any exhibits or attachments.

This Agreement supersedes and merges all previous understandings, and all other agreements, written or oral, between the Parties and sets forth the entire understanding of the Parties regarding the subject matter thereof. The Agreement may not be modified except by a written document signed by both Parties.

This Agreement and all related obligations and services hereunder are intended for the sole benefit of CLIENT and CONSULTANT and are not intended to create any third-party rights or benefits.

#### 19. MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement may be supplemented, amended, or modified only by the mutual agreement of the Parties. No supplement, amendment, or modification of this Agreement shall be binding unless it is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both Parties.

This agreement is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the successor, executors, administrators, and assigns of each party to this agreement, provided, however, that CONSULTANT shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all rights, burdens, duties, or obligations without prior written consent of the CLIENT. Any attempted assignment without such consent shall be invalid.

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# PROJECT UNDERSTANDING & APPROACH

The following represents the Scope of Work (SOW) prepared by Triton based on the requirements of your organization's request for proposal. The various sections and tasks have been developed specifically for this project. Each task is assigned to specific subject matter experts or to the project team.

#### PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

AP Triton, LLC (Triton) is committed to conducting a comprehensive study of the emergency medical ambulance system and services provided by Yankton County. The study will be conducted in two phases to ensure a thorough analysis and provide recommendations for system improvement.

Phase One of the study will involve a detailed review of the current revenue structure, including rates, fees, payer mix, reimbursements, costs, and transport volume. Thoroughly researched and relevant studies will be included during Triton's review. The documents and information relevant to this project will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Any previous studies
- Yankton County census and demographic data
- Current emergency medical services organizational chart

- Yankton County Standard Operating Guidelines (SOG) and service delivery and deployment practices; including policies regarding EMS quality improvement methods
- Any Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County and IAFF emergency medical services employees
- Inventory of Yankton County ambulances, including station assignment
- Inventory of capital medical equipment (e.g., cardiac monitor/defibrillators; powered stretchers, etc.)
- Historical records management data, including National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) incident data exported to an Excel spreadsheet format
- Incident records to include locations by latitude/longitude (if available) and full address, timestamps to allow for calculation of response times, turnout times, callprocessing times, and response mode to scene

- Analysis of actual Yankton County ambulance turnout time performance analyzed by individual components (to the extent data is available)
- Analysis of other components in the response time continuum, including call processing times
- Patient transport and hospital turnaround times
- Analysis of patient care records, to include levels of acuity, and ratios of Basic Life
   Support (BLS) versus Advanced Life Support (ALS) cases (if available)

#### Task 3-B: Capital Equipment

WHEREAS, SDCL 32-3-18.1 allows counties to charge an administrative fee for certificate of title applications for motor vehicle titles completed entirely by mail; and, WHEREAS, SDCL 32-3A-21.1 allows counties to charge an administrative fee for certificate of title applications for large boats, subject to titling under SDCL 32-3A-20 to 32-3A-32,

completed entirely by mail; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to SDCL 7-8-20(7), the Yankton County Commission is empowered with the responsibility to superintend the fiscal concerns of the county and secure their management in the best possible manner;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, the Yankton County Treasurer's Office will charge an administrative fee of \$25.00 for any certificate of title application, pursuant to SDCL 32-3A-20, 32-3A-21 and 32-3-18, that is received and processed entirely by mail.
