Constitutional Amendment D

Title: An initiative amendment to the South Dakota Constitution expanding Medicaid eligibility.

Attorney General Explanation: Medicaid is a program, funded by the State and the federal government, to provide medical coverage for low income people who are in certain designated categories. This constitutional amendment expands Medicaid eligibility in South Dakota. It requires the State to provide Medicaid benefits to any person over age 18 and under 65 whose income is at or below 133% of the federal poverty level, plus 5% of the federal poverty level for the applicable family size, as provided in federal law. For people who qualify under this amendment, the State may not impose burdens or restrictions that are greater than those imposed on any other person eligible for Medicaid benefits under South Dakota law.

The South Dakota Department of Social Services must submit to the federal government all documentation required to implement this

Veto "No" to leave the Constitution as it is.

Fiscal Note: The proposed expansion of Medicaid could cover an additional 42,500 eligible individuals, with a total estimated cost over the first five years of \$1,515,214,000. For the first five years under current federal law, the state's share of expenses could be \$165,244,000 with the state recognizing additional general fund savings of \$162,473,000.

That Article XXI of the Constitution of South Dakota be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

§10 Beginning July 1, 2023, the State of South Dakota shall provide Medicaid benefits to any person over eighteen and under sixty-five whose income is at or below one hundred thirty-three percent of the federal poverty level plus five percent of the federal poverty level for the applicable family size, as authorized by federal law as of January 1, 2021. Such person shall receive coverage that meets or exceeds the benchmark or benchmark-equivalent coverage requirements, as such terms are defined by federal law as of January 1, 2021.

The State of South Dakota may not impose greater or additional burdens or restrictions on eligibility or enrollment standards, methodologies, or practices on any person eligible under this section than on any person otherwise eligible for Medicaid under South Dakota law.

No later than March 1, 2023, the Department of Social Services shall submit all state plan amendments necessary to implement this section to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

The State of South Dakota shall into all policies necessary to maintain the federal financial medical assistance percentage in funding medical assistance pursuant to this section.

This section shall be broadly construed to accomplish its purposes and intents. If any provision in this section or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect other provisions or applications of the section that can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this section are severable.

Initiative Measure 27

Title: An Initiative measure legalizing the possession, use, and distribution of marijuana.

Attorney General Explanation: This Initiated measure legalizes the possession, use, and distribution of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia by people age 21 and older. Individuals may possess one ounce or less of marijuana. They may also distribute one ounce or less of marijuana without payment or other consideration.

Marijuana plants, and the marijuana produced from those plants, may be possessed under specific conditions. Marijuana plants may only be grown, and the marijuana from those plants may only be possessed, in counties or cities where no licensed retail marijuana store is available or where allowed by county or city ordinances.

Certain violations of the restrictions the measure places on the possession, use, and distribution of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia are subject to various civil penalties. Individuals under age 21 can attend drug education or counseling instead of paying a civil penalty.

The measure legalizes substances considered felony-controlled substances under State law. Marijuana remains illegal under Federal law.

Judicial or legislative clarification of the measure may be necessary.

Vote "Yes" to adopt the Initiated measure.

Vote "No" to leave South Dakota law as it is.

Fiscal Note: The State and counties could see a minimal decrease in expenses due to decreased incarceration for marijuana-related offenses, and the State could see marginal additional revenue in the form of new civil penalty fines.

Section 1. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

Terms used in this chapter mean: (1) "Hemp," the plant of the genus cannabis, and any part of that plant,

of one percent or a dry weight basis;

(2) "Local government," means a county, municipality, town, or township;

(3) "Marijuana," the plant of the genus cannabis, and any part of that plant, including the seeds, the resin extracted from any part of the plant, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or its resin, including hash and marijuana concentrate. The term includes an altered state of marijuana absorbed into the human body. The term does not include hemp, or fiber produced from the stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant, sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable of germination, or the weight of any other ingredient combined with marijuana to prepare topical or oral administrations, food, drink, or other products;

(4) "Marijuana accessory," any equipment, product, material, which is specifically designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana into the human body.

Section 2. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

This chapter does not affect laws that otherwise regulate: (1) Delivery or distribution of marijuana or marijuana accessories, with or without consideration, to a person younger than twenty-one years of age;

(2) Purchase, possession, use, or transport of marijuana or marijuana accessories by a person younger than twenty-one years of age;

(3) Consumption of marijuana by a person younger than twenty-one years of age;

(4) Operating or being in physical control of any motor vehicle, train, aircraft, motorboat, or other motorized form of transport while under the influence of marijuana;

(5) Consumption of marijuana while operating or being in physical control of a motor vehicle, train, aircraft, motorboat, or other motorized form of transport, while it is being operated;

(6) Smoking marijuana within a motor vehicle, aircraft, motorboat, or other motorized form of transport, while it is being operated;

(7) Possession or consumption of marijuana or possession of marijuana accessories on the grounds of a public or private preschool, elementary school, or high school, in a school bus, or on the grounds of any recreational facility;

(8) Smoking marijuana in a location where smoking tobacco is prohibited;

(9) Consumption of marijuana in a public place, unless permitted by statute;

(10) Consumption of marijuana as part of a criminal penalty or a diversion program;

(11) Conduct that endangers others;

(12) Undertaking any task under the influence of marijuana, if doing so would constitute negligence of professional judgment; or

(13) Performing solvent-based extractions on marijuana using solvents other than water, glycerin, propylene glycol, vegetable oil, or food grade ethanol, unless permitted by statute.

Section 3. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

This chapter does not:

(1) Require that an employer permit or accommodate an employee to engage in conduct allowed by this chapter;

(2) Affect an employer's ability to restrict the use of marijuana by employees;

(3) Limit the right of a person who occupies, owns, or controls private property from prohibiting or otherwise regulating conduct permitted by this chapter on or in that property; or

(4) Limit the ability of the state or a local government to prohibit or restrict any conduct otherwise permitted under this chapter within a building owned, leased, or occupied by the state or the local government.

Section 4. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

Subject to the limitations in this chapter, and notwithstanding any other law, the following acts, if done by a person at least twenty-one years of age, may not be an offense under state or local law, regulation, or ordinance: be subject to a civil fine, penalty, or sanction; be a basis for detention, search, or arrest; be a ba-

distributing without consideration one ounce or less of marijuana, except that not more than eight grams of marijuana may be in a concentrated form;

(2) Possessing, planting, cultivating, harvesting, drying, processing, or manufacturing not more than three marijuana plants and possessing the marijuana produced by the plants, if:

(a) The plants and any marijuana produced by the plants in excess of one ounce are kept at one private residence, are in a locked space, and are not visible by normal, unaided vision from a public place;

(b) Not more than six plants are kept in or on the grounds of a private residence at one time; and

(c) The private residence is located within the jurisdiction of a local government where there is no licensed retail store where marijuana is available for purchase pursuant to this chapter.

(3) Assisting another person who is at least twenty-one years of age, or allowing property to be used, in any of the acts permitted by this section; and

(4) Possessing, using, delivering, distributing, manufacturing, transferring, or selling to persons twenty-one years of age or older marijuana accessories.

Section 5. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

A person who commits the following acts is subject to a civil penalty not exceeding the amount specified:

(1) Violates section 4(2)(a) of this chapter by cultivating marijuana plants that are visible by normal, unaided vision from a public place, two hundred and fifty dollars;

(2) Violates section 4(2)(a) of this chapter by cultivating marijuana plants that are not kept in a locked space, two hundred and fifty dollars;

(3) Smokes marijuana in a public place, other than in a place licensed for such activity by the department, one hundred dollars;

(4) Is under twenty-one years of age and possesses, uses, ingests, inhales, transports, delivers without consideration or distributes without consideration one ounce or less of marijuana or possesses, delivers without consideration, or distributes without consideration marijuana accessories, one hundred dollars. The person shall be provided the option of attending up to four hours of drug education or counseling in lieu of the civil penalty.

Section 6. That title 34 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

This chapter must be broadly construed to accomplish its purposes and intents. Nothing in this chapter purports to supersede any applicable federal law, except where allowed by federal law. If any provision in this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality may not affect other provisions or applications of the chapter that can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this chapter are severable.

decisions based on success for the entire project, not just one segment. I believe in researching beyond what is presented and that a point-counterpoint discussion makes for a better decision. A great deal of my time is invested in reading laws, reviewing regulations and posing questions to a variety of folks at both the local and state level. And of course my "to do" list still has a few items on it that I would like to check off as achieved.

• **How will you approach medical cannabis permits and what, if anything, do you believe the County Commission should be doing to prepare for prospective passage of recreational marijuana either in November or beyond?**

The licensing process and zoning regulations for medical cannabis are already in place. The County Commission voted to allow up to 10 licenses for each area, with five dispensary, four cultivation, two manufacturing, and no testing applications already approved at the county level. The inflated measure for recreational use leaves much of the regulation up to the state Legislature, thus we have no idea how much regulation our county is allowed and whether we will receive any funding to address the potential concerns that follow. The commission has already discussed how the current medical cannabis language could be used as a guide if counties are given the authority to regulate in a similar fashion as medical use.

• **What is your philosophy on agricultural operations in Yankton County?**

Agriculture is an important part of our community and comprises the largest zoned area of the county. I grew up on a family farm with cattle, sheep and hogs (both outside and confined), so I am aware of the advantages and challenges that come with both types of operations. When I took office in 2019, there was a great deal of controversy over confinement operations and how they should fit into our county. The commission passed changes that recognized smaller operators should be allowed to function with basic requirements, but that larger operators and liquid confinements should have more review of their proposed site and operational plan. One "side" did not win, and we all walked away a little skinned up.

• **How would you approach infrastructure, especially roads and bridges?**

The same way I've approached infrastructure over the past four years: develop a plan and follow it through. The 2019 task force served an important role as it laid out where to invest

He admitted to being intoxicated, and the incident involved another person who fired a gun.

Authorities note the size difference between Samsoci, listed as about 6 feet tall and 240 pounds, and the 13-year-old female victim, listed as approximately 5-foot-5 and 150 pounds.

At the sentencing, defense attorney Nathan Stratton sought probation in order for this client to turn his life around. The attorney noted everyone at the incident was intoxicated. He also noted Samsoci's family background, which included alcoholism, and the defendant's own efforts to seek a right path in life.

"I believe, if Skyler was sober, we wouldn't be here today," Stratton said. "If he hadn't been drinking, if he was sober, then this wouldn't have happened."

Samsoci took full responsibility for his role in that night's events and was sorry for the outcome, Stratton said. In addition, the attorney noted his client had already served 177 days and, with a felony on his record, would face difficult prospects ahead of him.

Judge Bryan Melsmer said, in passing sentence, he took into account the defendant's age, experience and criminal background. The judge agreed, but Samsoci didn't have different, and Samsoci didn't start the fight and didn't possess the gun.

"But to give less (of a sentence) would show disrespect for the law," the judge said, noting the defendant's multiple physical attacks and the extensive injuries suffered by the victim.

Trooper Dustin Nutsch, with the Nebraska State Patrol (NSP) in Norfolk, provided his report on the incident in court papers.

On April 1, he was contacted at 4:50 a.m. by NSP dispatch and called in to work, assisting the Cedar County sheriff's office with an emergency. Gunshots had been fired at Shop EZ store and plaza, located at South Yankton in Cedar County.

The shooter had left the scene in a white Ford Taurus and had last been seen turning west onto Highway 121 from Highway 81.

Nutsch arrived at Shop EZ at 5:20 a.m., where Cedar County authorities were already on scene. Sheriff Larry Koranda contacted

Nutsch and directed the trooper to the residence directly west of the gas station business.

Nutsch went to the residence, where he and deputies had contact with the occupants, who indicated they had been involved in an altercation with multiple parties with one person using a firearm. The occupants indicated the firearm had been a handgun possessed by a male.

The occupants indicated the man fired the handgun multiple times into the air before leaving the residence in a white Taurus. The occupants reiterated the man was gone and was last seen westbound on Highway 121.

Samsoci and the man with the gun, later identified as Arthur Denny, provided their versions — including some conflicting details — about the incident and the assault on the woman.

While on scene, Nutsch requested that one of the occupants exit the home and speak with him. The person identified himself as "SKYLER" Samsoci and complied with the trooper's request to sit in the patrol car. Nutsch asked Samsoci about the incident involving the shooting as well as incidents before and after the shooting.

Troopers, including Sgt. Scott Rutten, began searching the Knox County area and completing record checks to locate persons and vehicles matching the descriptions for follow-up interviews.

Officers on scene searched the area but were unable to locate spent bullet casings.

Nutsch conducted a further check, learning "SKYLER" Samsoci had a record of gang activity, jail booking photos from 2018 and 2019, and photos to confirm his identity. Samsoci was not currently wanted.

When asked about the proper spelling of his first name, Samsoci maintained the original spelling. Nutsch informed him of the photos and information, detaining him for false reporting. Samsoci said he lied because he had warrants in Santee and was avoiding jail.

Nutsch arrested him for false reporting and transported him to the Cedar County Jail.

Rutten, the other trooper, located Arthur Denny, 18, of Santee who admitted to being involved in an incident at the residence near Shop EZ with this 19-year-old girlfriend (the Press & Dakotan is using her initials J.J. because she is an assault victim).

Authorities had contact with J.J. at Santee, where she was found with serious injuries

requiring medical attention. Rutten indicated her visible injuries included a swollen bump on the right side of her head, a swollen right eye including a cut in the skin below the eyes, abrasions to the right and left elbow, abrasions on the back of the right shoulder, significant skin missing from the right kneecap, which was bloody, along with visible bruising to the left shoulder.

Rutten also indicated the woman's family was arranging to transport her to the hospital in Yankton for a CT scan. Rutten took photos of the woman's visible injuries and relayed them to Nutsch.

At the jail, Samsoci reiterated the same information he gave on scene. Samsoci was placed into custody of the Cedar County sheriff's office.

Cedar County Chief Deputy Chad Clausen relieved security camera video footage from the north side of the business, with Nutsch securing a copy as evidence.

The video footage (no audio) showed the altercation began in the driveway and moved toward the Shop EZ parking lot. During the altercation, a significant amount of body language including aggressive posturing by J.J. and others was observed.

The video shows Denny attempted to pull J.J. away from the group of people whom Nutsch recognized from the residence that morning. During this time, J.J. was physically assaulted by another female before Denny pulled her away again.

During the altercation, a man recognized as Samsoci approached the parking lot and altercation from the residence. He was seen striking J.J. in the face with a closed fist, knocking her to the ground. At this point, J.J. fell backward and onto the ground, where she is seen lying in the parking lot.

Samsoci was observed approaching J.J. again and standing over where she was lying.

At this point, Samsoci was seen striking the woman three additional times with a closed fist, while the woman was lying on her back and later rolled onto her left side.

Samsoci was shown placing himself between Denny and his vehicle, while aggressively posturing. Denny eventually relieved his vehicle, loaded J.J. into it and left the scene.

maintenance work on the gyrocopter several days prior to the accident. The maintenance records showed that at the last work entry on September 24, 2022, the gyrocopter had accumulated 37.8 flight hours."

It also notes that "the gyrocopter was equipped with a Rotax Aircraft Engines 915 series engine."

The preliminary report also contains weather information from the time of the accident but no information on a cause — potential or established — of the accident. No further details were released in the NTSB's preliminary report.

A final NTSB report could take up to one to two years for final publication.

Last week, the Press & Dakotan reported that, according to an eyewitness, the gyrocopter appeared to be struggling in mid-air before crashing. The Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) preliminary Accident and Incident Notification noted that the "aircraft crashed under unknown circumstances and appeared to be on fire while descending and burned on impact."

The AG-915 Spartan is a gyrocopter produced by Airgyro Aviation, LLC, which has its headquarters in Rockledge, Florida, and a factory in Europe, according to its website.

October 18, 2022

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Vice-Chair Cheri Loest at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 18, 2022.

Building Local Government Social Media Policies

Social media is a new world of opportunity for local governments to communicate with citizens and receive feedback. Its risks are similar in nature to those of other types of communication, but with a different twist because material circulates so widely and there are many potential contributors. One recommended tool for addressing these risks is to adopt a social media policy. But what should be in that policy? It is not an easy question to answer.

Many local government social media policies are posted online, but this is an area where one size definitely does not fit all. Social media policies do not stand in isolation. They usually incorporate related policies by reference, and policies that address other issues are often amended to include social media specific provisions. Thus, social media policies are often a web of interrelated policies. Each government must take an individual approach to ensure that all these diverse parts come together to meet its unique needs.

Pools have a strong interest in their members' management of social media risks. They can help their members develop a social media policy by providing suggestions about what a social media policy should do. To assist RISC member pools in this outreach, NLC-RISC has prepared these recommendations about the building blocks for a social media policy. This resource can be used by the pool as a starting point for preparing its own guidelines or can be distributed to pool members under its name.

Control and structure of the government's official social media

Failure to control when and how social media sites are being created and used on behalf of the government sets the stage for losses. The first task for a social media policy is to establish the control structure for the government's official social media program. Three major issues are who has the authority to:

- Establish and terminate official social media accounts.
- Develop and implement the government's social media strategy.
- Develop and enforce a social media policy.

Some governments centralize control over their official social media presence. Centralized programs restrict who can establish an account and require prior review by an identified authority for all posts or comments on behalf of the government. Centralized control has an advantage from the risk control

perspective. It establishes authority and accountability and reduces the chances of a deviation from policy that results in liability.

Other governments decentralize control over their official social media presence to accommodate their operations' different goals and objectives. For example, emergency management may want to tweet alerts and recreation may want to post its activities on a Facebook page. A government might give those operations significant control over their social media presence so they can more nimbly accomplish their goals.

Not all decentralization is the same. The most decentralized approach is a policy that gives some guidelines about acceptable and prohibited use but otherwise allows agencies the freedom to establish social media accounts and pursue their own strategies. A more conservative approach would be a policy that decentralizes day-to-day control subject to general guidelines, but requires prior approval to establish a social media site and designates someone to monitor all the government's social media resources and order necessary changes. For risk control purposes, the more conservative approach offers the advantage of consistent oversight to ensure compliance with policy, combined with a degree of freedom to allow operations to take full advantage of the real-time nature of social media.

Small governments that plan relatively limited use of social media – for example a single Facebook page for the city – will probably use centralized control. Larger governments are likely to have a more decentralized social media program. Both will benefit from a social media policy that outlines the government's official position on social media, identifies who is authorized to participate in the government's official social media sites, and guides them on its implementation. Most of the approaches outlined below are consistent with either a centralized or decentralized approach.

Public records

One of the most difficult issues in local government use of social media is how to comply with the state's public records laws. Some social media posts are akin to casual conversation, but others pertain to official government business. Even comments posted by members of the public may qualify as public records, including those that have been removed as violating the public comment policy. How to draw the line between social media content that does and does not qualify as public records, identify the content that must be retained, and develop an archiving system are all issues of concern to governments using social media.

Many social media policies simply require compliance with the local government's existing public records policy. Three specific social media policy

provisions that an government can consider to facilitate compliance with public records laws are:

- Post all original content to the government's website and use the social media site as a secondary outlet.
- Link back to the official government website for additional information.
- Require employees who post public records to a social media site to ensure that the original document is retained in a manner that complies public record policy.

Guidelines for employee use of the government's official social media

Guidelines for employee use of the government's official social media are a critical part of a social media policy. Even if only one employee posts and responds to comments, that employee must know what is expected and the government must have some way of holding the employee accountable.

The guidelines for use derive from what can go wrong in a social media environment. Some of the major concerns are the following:

- Bad information that misleads the public and causes harm
- Violation of intellectual property rights
- Disclosure of private or confidential information
- Harassment
- Defamation

Any of these can lead to claims and lawsuits. The goal of guidelines is to prevent adverse outcomes.

Guidelines for employee use of the government's official social media encourage some conduct and prohibit other conduct. Some examples of useful positive requirements include:

- Be honest and transparent.
- Post only within one's area of expertise.
- Post only useful information.
- Keep it professional - avoid confrontation.
- Be accurate.
- Correct errors, and if modifying an earlier post, identify the change.
- Be responsive to citizen concerns.
- Adopt a user name that follows a standard format and clearly identifies the user as a city employee.

Employees should be prohibited from posting:

- Information about actual or potential claims and litigation involving the government.
- The intellectual property of others, without written permission.

- Photographs of employees or members of the public, without written permission.
- Defamatory material.
- Any personal, sensitive or confidential information about anyone.
- Obscene, pornographic or other offensive/illegal materials or links.
- Racist, sexist, and other disparaging language about a group of people.
- Sexual comments about, or directed to, anyone.
- Political campaign materials or comments.
- Threatening or harassing comments.
- Other information that is not public in nature.

The policy should also address the sanctions that will be imposed for breach of the policy. Be consistent with, or simply incorporate by reference, the employee discipline policy.

Many of these issues may already be addressed in other policies that can be incorporated by reference or used as a resource. In particular, any code of conduct or ethics should be incorporated by reference. Be consistent with or incorporate by reference website, information technology, communication, media relations, public information and privacy and confidentiality policies should also be considered.

Guidelines for employee use of other social media

Many employees already have purely personal social media accounts they use to interact with friends and family. They also may participate in “professional” social media that are related to their work or profession, but are not their employer’s official site and usually are not a part of their job. An example of professional social media is GovLoop, a social networking site for government workers. Another example is LinkedIn. An employee also might establish a page on what is traditionally a personal social media site, such as a Facebook, for purposes of networking with professional colleagues.

Active participants in professional social networks can gain useful information that will help them do their jobs better, but they may also be more likely to discuss the details of their job on those sites. Their identification with a specific employer means that their posts can easily reflect upon the employer.

Personal and professional social media sites pose risks to the government even if employees access them when they are off-duty and using their own personal devices. Major risks include:

- Disclosure of private or confidential information
- Posting photographs of fellow employees or citizens without their permission

- Harassment
- Retaliation
- Defamation

Looking first at purely personal social media, the entity has little control over employees' actions in their free time using their own personal social media accounts and their own devices. Despite this lack of control, the exposures for the government are very real. Employees sometimes use their personal social media to discuss their jobs and post work-related photographs or information that expose the government to liability or compromise its confidential information. Many interact with co-workers, even with their supervisors/subordinates, and real or perceived slights, harassment, retaliation or discrimination can follow them into the workplace.

Many employees also use personal social media during work hours, either through the government's or the employee's personal technology, such as a smart phone. Personal use of social media through government technology has all the same risks identified above, as well as:

- Reduced work performance
- Downloading to government servers and distributing the same inappropriate content that may be accessed through the Internet.
- Inappropriate use of government property for political, commercial or criminal activity.

A government can prohibit social media at work and adopt blocking and/or monitoring programs for its own technology equipment. These techniques likely will not eliminate the use of personal social media at work, as many employees now have access to social media through their smart phones. However, they will help keep inappropriate content off government servers.

Monitoring employee use of social media and disciplining employees for violating a no-use policy have their own risks. Employees may claim that monitoring invades their privacy and constitutes an unreasonable search. Whether or not the government routinely monitors employees, notify employees in writing that they have no expectation of privacy in their use of government technology. Include the notice in the government's technology policy. If the government needs to access the employee's computer, the notice provides a defense. Also avoid taking job action against an employee based solely on monitoring results. Other factors, such as performance, should be considered.

Professional media sites pose many of the same risks as purely personal sites. They are also more likely to be accessed during work time using the government's technology, often with the government's explicit approval or encouragement. Because professional social media specifically relates to

professional interests, the employee is more likely to be identified with the government and discuss its business than on a purely personal social media site. Disclosing confidential information, casting the government in an unfavorable light, and misrepresenting the government's position are all risks.

To address these risks, consider including in the social media policy:

- A requirement that employees include in any post related to the government or their job on a personal or professional site a disclaimer that the posting reflects their own opinion, and not that of the government.
- By reference, policies that relate to conduct and ethics, privacy and confidentiality, harassment, retaliation and other relevant conduct.
- If monitoring employee use of social media at work, written notice of the nature and scope of monitoring.
- Notice that employees have no reasonable expectation of privacy when using government technology.
- If access of personal social media through government technology is permitted, notice that employee use of personal social media at work must be brief, not interfere with performance of the employee's duties or with the workplace, and not involve commercial, political or other prohibited activities.

Guidelines for elected official use of social media

Elected officials' use of the government's official social media or their personal or professional social media can raise many of the same risks just discussed with regard to employees. Elected officials who use the city's official social media should be subject to the same requirements as employees. (For open meetings purposes, discussed below, they may not want to use the official social media.) Many local governments have codes of ethics for elected officials, sometimes combined with the code for employees, which can be adopted by reference into the social media policy.

A risk that is different for elected officials is possible violation of the state's open meetings laws through the use of social media. A quorum of lawmakers holding a discussion about public business through social media may constitute a meeting that is subject to the open meetings law. This could happen through the official government social media, and some governments consequently prohibit elected officials from participating in their official social media. Equally problematic is elected officials' use of their own social media to communicate in their official capacity with members of the public. Informal communication with constituents is generally acceptable, but discussion of public business is risky, especially if it involves other elected officials. The dynamic nature of social media and the sheer volume of posts may make it difficult to track who is involved in the discussion and detect when the open meetings line has been crossed.

Another potential risk associated with elected official use of social media is use of government resources for political purposes. Elected officials are increasingly using social media for campaign purposes. Elected officials who use the same social media for communicating with constituents as they do to campaign risk violating the law against using government resources for political purposes.

To address these risks, consider including in the social media policy:

- Recognition that elected official use of social media to discuss public business may violate the open meetings law.
- A prohibition against elected officials using any social media (personal, professional or the government's official social media) to discuss public business.
- A requirement that a social media site used by an elected official to communicate with constituents include a link back to the city's official website for detailed information.
- A requirement that elected officials who use social media for campaigning establish separate social media for that purpose and not access that social media through government technology.

Public comment on the government's official social media

Some governments use their social media as a one-way communication tool to flow information to members of the public. Those governments disable comment features on their social media. Others view social media as an opportunity to receive information and feedback from the public and enhance operations. For example, members of the public might be encouraged to post a report of potholes, rather than calling.

The benefits of public comments have accompanying risks. A member of the public may post content that is inappropriate by being off-topic, defamatory, harassing, obscene or pornographic, criminal, or commercial. Or a citizen may just post an opinion that is critical about some aspect of the local government.

The risks of permitting public comments include:

- Failure to act on information reported by a member of the public resulting in harm to someone. If a member of the public posts a comment about a dangerous condition on public property, the government has notice. If it does not take action to address the dangerous condition and someone is injured or killed, a lawsuit may result.
- Although it would seem obvious that posts to social media are not private, members of the public who post may be disturbed if their comments are disclosed as public records under the state's open records law.

Other significant risks associated with public comment arise from what the government does (or does not do) to manage it. These include:

- Failing to monitor and remove inappropriate comment.
- Government employees responding inappropriately (in a harassing manner) to public comments.
- Violating the free speech rights of members of the public by removing comment based on the viewpoint or opinion expressed.

To address these risks, consider including in the social media policy:

- A public comment policy for posting on the social media site that does the following:
 - Identifies viewpoint neutral criteria that will be used to determine when a comment or link posted by a member of the public will be removed, which can include comments that are off-topic, obscene or pornographic, defamatory, harassing, commercial, criminal, political, or that violate the intellectual property rights of others.
 - Reserves the right to remove posts that violate the policy.
 - Gives notice that the comments are monitored only during business hours, and thus information conveyed after hours will not be received until the next business day.
 - Gives notice that comments are subject to disclosure as public records.
- Procedures and responsibility for monitoring of public comments and removal of inappropriate comments in accordance with the public comment policy.
- Procedures and responsibility for monitoring, responding to, and taking timely action to act upon information conveyed via public comments.

Conclusion

There are risks to undertaking any new activity, but social media is a powerful tool for local governments looking for new and cost-effective ways to engage their citizens. Just be sure to adopt social media with due consideration and planning. This means having clear objectives, knowing the target audience, selecting the right social media for the task, and taking the time to develop the right policy. Social media evolves quickly, so it is a good practice for the social media policy to remain platform neutral, and to review and revise it frequently to meet the changing environment.

2.10 Social Media Online social networks such as Twitter, Facebook, YouTube and LinkedIn can be valuable tools for communicating with the public and employees. Pennington County departments are encouraged to study and deploy these new communications methods where appropriate.

The social media restrictions do not apply to Elected County Officials.

Pennington County Departments

1. Pennington County social media sites make every effort to clearly identify their official status. Feed names will incorporate the program or unit's name or acronym whenever possible and will use the appropriate official logo if possible.
2. Some social media sites allow user comments. Pennington County will consider carefully whether to allow comments before launching a social media initiative. However, if comments are allowed, user feedback should remain regardless of whether it is favorable or unfavorable to the agency. Comments will be deleted only if they are offensive, abusive, racially inflammatory, threatening or clearly off topic. Comments that endorse a political candidate, party or commercial product will be deleted.
3. When reposting or referencing a post on one of the County's online sites, provide a link to the original post.
4. Do not post or link to any materials that are defamatory or obscene.
5. Always be mindful of functions that allow the organization to be a "fan" of an individual or cause. Consider whether such an action would imply support for a political cause.

Pennington County Employees

Pennington County employees should be sensitive to the fact that social networks and other online forums blur the distinction between an individual's official and personal identities.

1. If you publish content to any website outside of the Pennington County's official online presence and it has something to do with Employee Handbook Page 31 subjects associated with our County, provide a disclaimer such as this: "The postings are my own and do not necessarily represent the opinion of Pennington County."
2. Never use or reference your formal position when writing in a non-official capacity. Do not use your official email to establish a private social media presence.
3. Those with leadership responsibilities, by virtue of their position, must consider whether the personal thoughts they publish, even in clearly personal venues, may be misunderstood as expressing the position of Pennington County. They should assume that those outside our agency will read what is written. Be aware of your Pennington County association in online social networks. If you identify yourself as a Pennington County employee or have a prominent position in which your association with Pennington County is known to the general public, ensure your profile and related content (even if it is of a personal and not an official nature) is consistent with how you wish to present yourself as a professional, appropriate with the public trust associated with your position.
4. When writing in your official capacity, do not write anything that could appear to be legal advice. Legal issues should be handled through the agency's regular procedures to avoid conflicts and other ethical problems.
5. Emails and other correspondence conducted over personal social media channels that is official business of the agency should be preserved and retained in a manner similar to other official documents. If you receive an unsolicited official contact through your personal email or social media presence, forward a copy of the correspondence to your official email account and respond from that platform.
6. Remain focused on customers, existing commitments, and achieving Pennington County's mission. Your use of social media tools should never interfere with your primary duties, with the exception of where it is a primary duty to use these tools to do your job.
7. To others online, there is no clear distinction between your work life and your personal life. Always be honest and respectful in both capacities.

Each full-time employee, beginning with starting date of employment, shall be eligible for legal holidays, with regular base pay.*

A holiday that occurs on a Saturday will be observed on the preceding Friday and a holiday occurring on a Sunday will be observed on the following Monday.

The following days are deemed holidays for eligible employees per SDCL 1-5-1:

1. New Year's Day	January 1
2. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day	January, 3 rd Monday
3. President's Day	February, 3 rd Monday
4. Memorial Day	May, last Monday
5. Juneteenth	June 19
6. Independence Day	July 4
7. Labor Day	September, 1 st Monday
8. Native Americans' Day	October, 2 nd Monday
9. Veterans' Day	November 11
10. Thanksgiving Day	November, 4 th Thursday
11.	
12. Christmas Day	December 25

In addition, every day appointed by the President of the United States or by the Governor of South Dakota for a public fast, thanksgiving, or holiday will be observed as a legal holiday by the County Commission.

If any employee is required to work during a holiday caused by emergency circumstances, then that employee shall receive overtime pay plus holiday pay.

*Employees in certain departments are required to work on holidays. Those departments, including Sheriff's Department, Ambulance Department and Office of Emergency Management, handle holidays differently than described here. Efforts will be made to let these employees off when deemed possible by their Department Head.

Holidays

All employees in permanent positions in state government receive their regular pay for eleven legal holidays plus any other day proclaimed as a holiday by the Governor of South Dakota or the President of the United States. The State of South Dakota recognizes the following holidays:

If a holiday from the list falls on a Saturday, the preceding Friday is observed as the paid holiday. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it is observed on the following Monday. Holiday pay is prorated based on hours worked for employees who are working less than full-time. A permanent employee is eligible for holiday pay if the employee works at least one shift or is on approved paid leave during the calendar week in which the holiday falls. For more information about holiday pay provisions, contact your human resource representative.

1-5-1. Holidays enumerated.

The first day of every week, known as Sunday; the first day of January, commonly known as New Year's Day; the third Monday in January, commonly known as Martin Luther King, Jr. Day; the third Monday in February, the anniversary of the birthdays of Lincoln and Washington; the last Monday of May, commonly known as Memorial Day; the nineteenth day of June, commonly known as Juneteenth; the fourth day of July, commonly known as Independence Day; the first Monday in September, commonly known as Labor Day; the second Monday in October, commonly known as Native Americans' Day; the eleventh day of November, known as Veterans' Day; the fourth Thursday in November, commonly known as Thanksgiving Day; and the twenty-fifth day of December, commonly known as Christmas Day; and every day appointed by the President of the United States, or by the Governor of this state for a public fast, thanksgiving, or holiday shall be observed in this state as a legal holiday.

If the first day of January, the nineteenth day of June, the fourth day of July, the eleventh day of November, or the twenty-fifth day of December falls upon a Sunday, the Monday following is a legal holiday and shall be so observed; and if any such day falls upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday is a legal holiday and shall be so observed.

1-5-1.1. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day established.

The third Monday in January, to be known as Martin Luther King, Jr. Day shall be observed in this state as a legal holiday. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is dedicated to the remembrance of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and to the observance and appreciation of the various ethnic minorities who have contributed so much to the state and nation.

1-5-1.2. Native Americans' Day established.

The second Monday in October, to be known as Native Americans' Day, shall be observed in this state as a legal holiday. Native Americans' Day is dedicated to the remembrance of the great Native American leaders who contributed so much to the history of our state.

1-5-1.3. South Dakota Statehood Day established.

The second day of November, to be known as South Dakota Statehood Day, shall be observed in this state as a working holiday. South Dakota Statehood Day is dedicated to the remembrance of the anniversary of South Dakota's admittance into the union on November 2, 1889. This day will be to reflect on the history and the heritage of the state.
