Commissioner Report

Yankton County

January-March 2023

PERSONNEL/OFFICE:

Now that our office is fully staffed, things are running more smoothly, and personnel are feeling more comfortable in their roles.

STAFF TRAINING:

The state has implemented a new program called Doxy.me that will allow health professionals to complete appointments virtually if needed. Training is on-going but staff will be able to use this if a client is not able to attend an appointment in person. The state is also transitioning to a new Immunization Information System so training will begin on that in April. The registry will be going live on May 1st.

IMMUNIZATIONS:

Jen provides immunizations by appointment. Clients in need of vaccinations are being identified in the SDIIS program so reminders can be sent. Jen continues to receive records for students transferring into the county to ensure that they meet South Dakota's school requirements.

WIC (WOMEN, INFANT, CHILDREN):

The WIC program continues to serve low-income families in our community. Staff have been focusing on helping clients who are not able to obtain their food benefits, whether from lack of knowledge about what foods to purchase or issues with the grocery stores not having items entered correctly in their systems. Our Strategic Community Outreach & Outcomes Plan (SCOOP) has been implemented and staff have started completing the tasks set forth in that plan.

MATERNAL HEALTH:

Jen continues to conduct a Patient Health Questionnaire-9 (PHQ-9) on each pregnant and postpartum woman, this helps to identify and address signs of depression. Referrals can be made immediately if necessary. Safe sleep for infants is addressed at each initial newborn visit and follow up is conducted three months later. Pack 'n plays are issued to families who do not have a safe place for infant to sleep. We have included information on the Cribs for Kids program to go out to other facilities so that families who are not using our services already can be informed of this.

CHILD/ADOLESCENT SERVICES:

Ages & Stages Questionnaires are childhood development questionnaires and are given to parents at each infant or child certification or assessment appointment. These surveys help identify possible concerns or delays and referrals are made when warranted.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:

Jen held a community breastfeeding class in January this year, with three pregnant women and two support persons attending. These are held in conjunction with Avera Lactation Counselors and take place in the Pavilion, there are a total of 8 classes per year. Jen attends monthly Child Protection Team and Spark meetings.



ARTICLE 4
OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AND BOUNDARY
INTERPRETATION

Section 401 General

The County is hereby divided into zones, or districts, as shown on the Official Zoning Map, which, together with all explanatory matter thereon, is hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this Ordinance. The Official Zoning Map shall be identified by the signature of the Chairman of the County Commissioners, attested by the Auditor, and bearing the seal of the County, under the following words: "This is to certify that this is the Official Zoning Map referred to in Section 401 of Ordinance ~~No. 16~~ 2020 of "Yankton County, South Dakota," together with the date of the adoption of this Ordinance.

Section 403 Zoning Map Changes

If, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, changes are made in the district boundaries or other matter portrayed on the Official Zoning Map, such changes shall be entered on the Official Zoning Map promptly after the amendment has been approved by the County Commissioners, with an entry on the Official Zoning Map as follows: "on [date], by official action of the Yankton County Commission, the following [change] changes were made in the Official Zoning Map: [brief description of nature of change]," which entry shall be signed by the Chairman of the Commission and attested by the Auditor. No amendment to this Ordinance which involves matters portrayed on the Official Zoning Map shall become effective until after such change and entry has been made on said map.

No changes of any nature shall be made in the Official Zoning Map or matters shown thereon except in conformity with the procedures set forth in this Ordinance.

Any unauthorized change of whatever kind by any person or persons shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance and punishable as provided under Section 2303.

Regardless of the existence of purported copies of the Official Zoning Map which may, from time to time, be made or published, the Official Zoning Map which shall be located in the office of the Zoning Administrator shall be the final authority as to the current zoning status of land and water areas, buildings, and other structures in the County.

Section 405 Zoning Map Replacement

In the event that the Official Zoning Map becomes damaged, destroyed, lost or difficult to interpret because of the nature or number of changes and additions, the Yankton County Commission may, by resolution, adopt a new Official Zoning Map,

Flooding was listed as likely along the James River, Vermillion River, Big Sioux River and Little Sioux River.

However, while flooding may affect these rivers, the Missouri River in the northern plains, at least at this time, is anticipated to have a quiet year.

Ryan Larsen, Reservoir Regulation Team Lead with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), said runoff above Sioux City is forecast at only 21.5 million acre feet (MAF) this year.

"We are expecting below-average runoff during the high-runoff periods of March-April, typically when the plains snowpack melts, and May-July, typically when the mountain snowpack melts," he said.

While the thick blanket of snow in eastern South Dakota and North Dakota may contribute to some flooding in the coming weeks, Larsen said it will have some benefit.

"Most of this snowpack is covering the James and Big Sioux watersheds, which drain into the Missouri River downstream of the system of reservoirs," he said. "The plains snowpack will help replenish the soil moisture deficit, which is reflected in the drought seasonal outlook showing drought improvement and removal over much of the Dakotas."

Larsen added that the snowpack in the Dakotas isn't expected to melt until the end of the month.

"As Secretary Wasco said during her legislative testimony, upon completion (of the new prisons), we will balance the state's population to accommodate each facility's design capacity with room for offender progression and regression throughout all facilities," he said.

The MDSF holds medium-security male inmates, while the Yankton Minimum Unit houses inmates completing their sentences and transitioning toward release.

As of Wednesday, MDSF housed 1,025 offenders at Springfield and 258 at the Yankton Minimum Unit, Winder said.

MDSF, a former college campus, holds the capacity for about 1,240 inmates, according to the DOC website. The census can vary daily, depending on incoming prisoners, releases and transfers.

The Springfield prison also oversees the Yankton Minimum Unit and the Rapid City Minimum Unit.

The DLR Group has provided a forecast of the anticipated explosion of inmates in South Dakota corrections. Within the next 20 years, the total population is expected to increase by 26% (from 3,407 to 4,296). The forecasted population increases by 19.1% (from 503 to 599) for females and 15.1% (from 2,904 to 3,342) for males from 2022 to 2026.

LAWMAKERS SPEAK OUT

District 18 lawmakers weighed in on corrections issues both during Saturday's legislative forum in Yankton and afterwards during interviews with the Press & Dakotan. The delegation includes Sen. Jean Hunhoff (R-Yankton) and Reps. Mike Stevens (R-Yankton) and Julie Auch (R-Lesterville).

All three lawmakers said they believe inmates may eventually be transferred from Springfield to Sioux Falls or remain housed in Sioux Falls for their entire sentence.

"With the new prison in Sioux Falls, we may see inmates from Springfield going back to Sioux Falls," she said, adding she doesn't Hunhoff any major changes at the Yankton trusty unit.

The women's prison in Pierre woefully underserves the growing female inmate population, Hunhoff said.

"No woman should have to live in those conditions," she said.

Stevens looks for adjustments with completion of the new men's prison, which he said will house an estimated 1,500 inmates.

"I think there will be a redistribution with some of the inmates in Springfield and other places," he said.

When it comes to the housing of female inmates, Stevens agreed with Hunhoff on the current dire facilities.

"As for the women's prison, it's just a terrible situation," he said. "You have nine people (housed) in a small room, and that makes it really difficult. It's just a hodgepodge bunch of buildings."

The state also needs to address juvenile justice and the worsening problem of young offenders, Stevens said.

"When I think about when we were kids, the situations that our friends were involved in, that's significantly different now," he said. "It's more serious and at a lot younger age, and the dynamic of the family isn't often what it was 20 or 30 years ago."

The state's corrections system, particularly for juvenile offenders, needs constant re-evaluation, Stevens said. "We don't have the resources in our rural areas to help those kids, and it's something we have to work on," he said.

Springfield and Yankton aren't included in the current bills, but the state may need to address those facilities in the future, Auch said.

She agreed on the need to deal with the state's correction

In addition, she spoke about staffing shortages at Springfield, Pierre and Sioux Falls.

During Saturday's forum, Hunhoff noted the state's major investment in the coming years for corrections. She acknowledged the need for more prison space, but she also called for alternatives to incarceration.

"We're spending half a billion dollars on prison. What are we spending to keep people out of prison?" she said.

The session's focus hasn't been only on building more prisons. Lawmakers are also looking at areas such as juvenile justice and rehabilitation programs for inmates with addiction issues.

The corrections issue isn't limited to the state facilities, as counties are asking for assistance in housing and transporting prisoners. By a 54-15 margin, the House defeated a bill that would have funded regional county jails. The bill would have created a \$40 million revolving loan fund for regional county jails with \$10 million in grants.

In the DOC system, Wasco brings her experiences from another state to the table in making changes to the South Dakota penal system, Hunhoff said.

"If you listen to the new Secretary of Corrections, she comes from a much different background as far as a corrections system," the state senator said. "She realizes the importance of behavioral health in prisons."

Wasco has indicated she wants to pursue rehabilitation programs seeking to keep inmates from returning to jail, Hunhoff said. In addition, the DOC has reviewed the way in which addiction recovery services are delivered for inmates.

"We're seeing a different approach in looking at the best practices for rehab for those inmates," Hunhoff added.

She pointed to Teen Challenge of the Dakotas as one example of alternative programming. It is a nonprofit addiction recovery ministry in Brookings that uses a faith-based, holistic approach to working with those struggling with addiction, depression, criminal activity or something else.

The residential program serves mesdn 18 years and older. The 16-month program consists of five phases. The first

four phases consist of a total of 10 months of induction and training. The final phase consists of six months of re-entry, focused on disciplining back into the "real world."

"Teen Challenge has resulted in a lower recidivism rate — the number of inmates who return to prison — than a number of other rehab programs, Hunhoff said.

A problem exists with the lack of mental health and other professionals to meet the growing need, Hunhoff said. "We don't have enough practitioners so they can treat more patients," she said.

PROVIDING SERVICES

Stevens pointed to the need for maintaining current alternative programs. HB 1170 didn't receive support, he said, because it would have eliminated four special courts in the justice system for DUI, drug, veterans and mental health.

The First Circuit, which consists of southeast South Dakota, has instituted community response teams and other innovative said.

"The other problem we have is that we have the community services readily available in areas such as the Yankton area, but you get out into the rural areas and they don't have it," he said.

In those rural areas, offenders must go through the DOC system to get the same services, Stevens said.

"It doesn't seem very fair compared to those persons who have those services (and can stay out of prison)," he said. "They're in prison because their community can put money into services."

With the new prisons, South Dakota will operate eight correctional facilities which represent ongoing financial commitments, Stevens said.

Hunhoff pointed to both the immediate and long-range needs.

"We have two major projects going on at the same time, and they have fixed operational costs," she said. "The big picture out there is the ongoing state expenses down the line."

one mile north of the Knox County Courthouse," he said. "We never received any reports of accidents. By now, I think everyone knows to slow down."

However, the conditions made for treacherous driving, Henry said.

"My 12:30 a.m. dispatcher said visibility was bad when she came to work but she made it by driving slowly," the sheriff said. "The highways are melting, but if the temperature drops below freezing, motorists should slow down and watch for icy patches."

In neighboring Cedar County, Nebraska, Sheriff Larry Koranda reported no major problems with this week's storm.

"The amount of snowfall varies around the county. Laurel had a couple inches. Hartington maybe had three or four," he said.

Roads were not an issue as the state (Department of Roads) was out early and cleared the roads. It was just normal winter driving early on. There were no school late starts, and it was treated as an early spring snowstorm."

Cedar County Emergency Manager Kevin Garvin reported little activity outside of a car that slid in the ditch.

"I heard of the 8-inch snowfall in Fordyce," he said. "I know Hartington seems to have gotten more snow than Coleridge and Laurel did, from my travels thus far (Thursday)."

COMING TOGETHER

Gumbs described the storm as a convergence of major weather patterns at the same time.

"We had a weak thunderstorm south of (Sioux Falls). Thundersnow went through Yankton and north of Sioux City," he said. "Most of it has to do with the instability (in the atmosphere). It was warmer to the south of us and actually could have been the transition from rain to snow near Sioux City."

The tri-state storm may have been fed from the backsides of a rain pattern in the Des Moines area, Gumbs added.

A strong front rolled along the South Dakota-Nebraska

state line, he said. "We had some reports of 7.5 inches just south of Yankton, but also 6 inches closer to Vermillion," he said. "There was a very narrow, intense band of snow in the southern part of our forecast area. As the snow band gets tighter, it produces quite a bit of snow. That's where you get the highest amounts."

As a sign of the narrow band, 6.2 inches was reported east of Bloomfield, Nebraska, and 4.8 inches southeast of the town.

Elsewhere in northeast Nebraska, 4.3 inches was recorded south of Verdell, 4 inches near Newcastle and Creighton and 2.3 inches northwest of Ponca.

The ingredients came together for the high snow totals in particular areas, Gumbs said. "We had a pretty strong air loft, which created a particularly heavy and intense band of precipitation," he said. "Those are usually hard to forecast."

Besides the differences in atmospheric levels, a slight pattern shift can create dramatic changes in precipitation and its location, Gumbs said.

"With this storm, you had 3 inches in Yankton," he said. "But if you went just a few miles south, you had 8 inches of snowfall. That's a pretty steep gradient."

LOOKING AHEAD

This week's snowfall could disappear rapidly, unlike storms earlier in winter.

"Usually, as we go into March and April, it's time for snow to melt fast," he said. "You're scheduled for a high of 51 degrees (Friday)."

Snow reflects 90% of light, which makes melting more difficult during winter, Gumbs said. But with the arrival of spring, the sunlight comes at a higher, more intense angle which combines with warmer weather to melt snow.

The NWS lists the Yankton area with 50.5 inches of snowfall from November to the present, but the Sioux Falls office doesn't add in the March totals until the end of the month. Still, the 50.5 inches has tied for seventh with the winters of 2016-17 and 2017-18.

The following are the top 10 snowfall totals for Yankton prior to the current winter,

according to the NWS office in Sioux Falls.

- 1. 2015-16 — 70.5 inches; 2. 2010-11 — 58.0 inches; 3. 2000-01 — 54.8 inches; 4. 2003-04 — 54.0 inches; 5. 2009-10 — 53.8 inches; 6. 1993-94 — 53.5 inches; 7. 2016-17 — 50.5 inches; 8. 2017-18 — 50.5 inches; 9. 1983-84 — 49.1 inches; 10. 2018-19 — 48.0 inches.

The National Drought Monitor, released Thursday, showed some improvement for the Yankton region. The report was compiled Tuesday and doesn't include the latest snowfall.

In southeast South Dakota, Charles Mix, Douglas, Hutchinson, Bon Homme, northern Yankton, Turner, Lincoln and most of Union counties are listed as abnormally dry. Yankton, Clay and southern Union counties remain in moderate drought.

In northeast Nebraska, Knox, Cedar and Dixon counties are listed in severe drought, with areas to the south are listed as the worst categories of extreme and exceptional drought.

The recent precipitation won't lift the region out of its long-term moisture deficits, Gumbs said.

"The area is still in drought," he said.

The outlook doesn't call for a stable picture in the coming days, Gumbs said.

"When we look into next week, it looks fairly quiet," he said. "We're looking at 50s on Friday, then back down to 46 for the weekend as we have a cold front moving through the area."

The outlook calls for temperatures in the mid-40s for Monday and Tuesday, with the mercury climbing into the 50s for Wednesday and Thursday.

As for precipitation, next Wednesday night brings a 30% chance of rain, while Thursday's outlook calls for a 30% chance of rain and snow.

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

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ARTICLE 4
OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AND BOUNDARY
INTERPRETATION

Section 401 General

The County is hereby divided into zones, or districts, as shown on the Official Zoning Map, which, together with all explanatory matter thereon, is hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this Ordinance. The Official Zoning Map shall be identified by the signature of the Chairman of the County Commissioners, attested by the Auditor, and bearing the seal of the County, under the following words: "This is to certify that this is the Official Zoning Map referred to in Section 401 of Ordinance ~~No. 16~~ 2020 of "Yankton County, South Dakota," together with the date of the adoption of this Ordinance.

Section 403 Zoning Map Changes

If, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, changes are made in the district boundaries or other matter portrayed on the Official Zoning Map, such changes shall be entered on the Official Zoning Map promptly after the amendment has been approved by the County Commissioners, with an entry on the Official Zoning Map as follows: "on [date], by official action of the Yankton County Commission, the following [change] changes were made in the Official Zoning Map: [brief description of nature of change]," which entry shall be signed by the Chairman of the Commission and attested by the Auditor. No amendment to this Ordinance which involves matters portrayed on the Official Zoning Map shall become effective until after such change and entry has been made on said map.

No changes of any nature shall be made in the Official Zoning Map or matters shown thereon except in conformity with the procedures set forth in this Ordinance.

Any unauthorized change of whatever kind by any person or persons shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance and punishable as provided under Section 2303.

Regardless of the existence of purported copies of the Official Zoning Map which may, from time to time, be made or published, the Official Zoning Map which shall be located in the office of the Zoning Administrator shall be the final authority as to the current zoning status of land and water areas, buildings, and other structures in the County.

Section 405 Zoning Map Replacement

In the event that the Official Zoning Map becomes damaged, destroyed, lost or difficult to interpret because of the nature or number of changes and additions, the Yankton County Commission may, by resolution, adopt a new Official Zoning Map,

which shall supersede the prior Official Zoning Map.

The new Official Zoning Map may correct drafting or other errors or omissions in the prior Official Zoning Map, but no such correction shall have the effect of amending the original Official Zoning Map or any subsequent amendment thereof.







During the 3/21/23 commission meeting, there was a discussion of county deposit accounts where erroneous information was shared regarding interest earned the prior year. I attended the 4/4/23 meeting to clarify but the item was removed from the agenda resulting in no discussion, therefore, not allowing me to provide the correct information to the Board and the Community.

The county was paid \$72,825.19 by various banks during record low deposit rates in 2022. In the first quarter of 2023, interest paid to the county so far is \$53,439.86, with deposit rates still in flux.

It is my statutory duty to be a vigilant steward of the county's money which I have done in the past and will continue to do in the future.
