##### INTRO

1 The purpose of the fire prevention code is to provide reasonable protection of life and property from the hazards of fire and explosive materials. 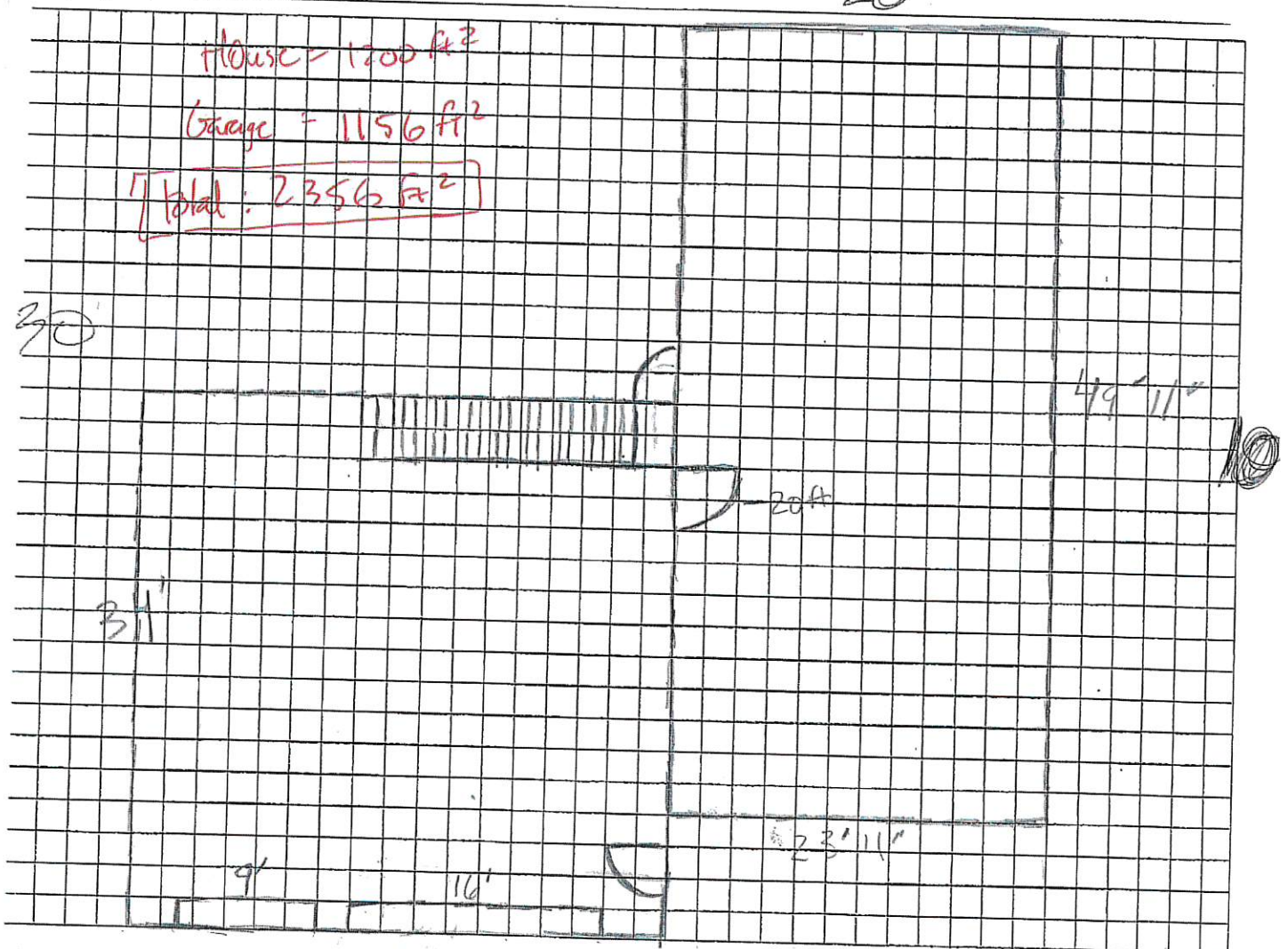

**Re:** Emergency Medical Responder

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Yankton County EMS is requesting to add a part-time job classification, Emergency Medical Responder with a hourly pay rate of \$13.40. We currently have two part-time classifications, EMT-\$14.56/hr. & Paramedic-\$16.42/hr. This classification will not add to our budget but be paid from the currently approved 2022 budget.

Emergency Medical Responder, EMR, is an entry level EMS provider with 60-hours of education. The EMR has been approved by SDDOEMS to work with an EMT or Paramedic on an ambulance. Adding this job classification will assist in covering last minute scheduling short falls, EMS Standbys, 3rd and 4th out calls. At times, these slots are difficult to fill, so we would like to grow our pool of candidates in order to help alleviate this situation. Also, by having this entry level position, we may be able to usher them into EMT and eventually paramedic training.

This is not the overall answer to our staffing problem, but we feel it will be helpfull.

I am writing on behalf of Lewis & Clark Behavioral Health Services (LCBHS) to request a letter of support. The letter of support is for a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development loan application. A sample letter of support is attached.


Lewis & Clark Behavioral Health Services (LCBHS) has been involved over the past several years in a review of our current and future facility needs. The review culminated in a decision to build a new facility, bringing all existing LCBHS Yankton based services together in one location. In addition, the plan is to add new space to be used for managing behavioral health crises. This space will include a crisis care receiving center and space for residential crisis stabilization and detoxification.

The governor has proposed the use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to cover the costs of the new space for the crisis care services. This will be a regional crisis care center that is part of the Governor's plan to transform behavioral health service delivery in South Dakota. The total project cost is estimated to be 17 million dollars with funds coming from the legislature - assuming the behavioral health portion of the governor's plan is approved - LCBHS building funds and a USDA Rural development loan. The goal is to break ground as soon as the summer of 2022.

The proposed facility will be transformative. The receiving center will allow immediate access to behavioral health crisis care for individuals, families, and others. The crisis care center will provide easy access and quick turn-around times for law-enforcement and other first responders. The facility will provide an option for residential stabilization preserving inpatient psychiatric beds for individuals requiring the highest level of care. There is a potential for substantial savings to the county while allowing for the continued future growth of vital community-based behavioral health services for residents of Yankton County.

Yankton County has a long history supporting behavioral health services and continued support is critically important. Your letter of support will serve notice to decision makers of the community's support. Support that is critically needed to leverage the funds needed for this project.

They both eventually decided to make payment to get the claim closed....\$3.9 million paid by EMC and \$1.98 million by the Nebraska Pool. These payments were far short of the \$28,000,000 award; therefore, property and sales taxes were increased to pay the balance.
3. Also enclosed is some information put together by EMC, which gives you a brief summary of why insurance costs are increasing across the country. # Nebraska Bill To Allow Sales Tax For 'Beatrice Six' Payment Advances

LINCOLN, Neb. — A Nebraska county that owes \$28.1 million for the wrongful convictions of six people in a 1985 murder case is one step closer to imposing a new half-cent sales tax to pay off the judgment faster.

State lawmakers gave initial approval Thursday to a bill that would let Gage County authorize the tax to help cover its legal debt to the so-called Beatrice Six. The Gage County Board of Supervisors endorsed the legislation after raising property taxes as high as state law allows and lobbying lawmakers unsuccessfully for a state-funded bailout.

"The goal is to pay the judgment as quickly as possible," said state Sen. Myron Dorn, of Adams, a former Gage County supervisor who introduced the bill.

The Beatrice Six collectively spent about 75 years in prison for the death of 68-year-old Helen Wilson until DNA evidence exonerated them in 2008. Wilson's death has since been linked to a former Beatrice resident who died in 1992.

After they were cleared, the six filed a federal lawsuit against the county alleging that local law enforcement officials coerced false confessions and recklessly pursued a case against them despite contradictory evidence.

Last month, the U.S. Supreme Court turned away the county's last-ditch effort to avoid the hefty judgment after a federal appeals court found that the award

was justified because of egregious law enforcement conduct.

In September, the county raised its property tax levy to the maximum allowed under state law. The increase will generate an estimated \$3.8 million a year and places most of the burden on farmers and homeowners in a mostly rural county with less than 22,000 residents.

The new legislation would help Gage County generate an additional \$1.2 million annually through the sales tax, which is paid by consumers in the county regardless of whether they own property or even live there. Both taxes would expire as soon as the judgment is fully paid, and they can't be used for other purposes. The extra revenue would allow Gage County to satisfy the debt about 1 1/2 years early.

Sen. Tom Bries, an Albion farmer who often

advocates for lower property taxes, said the bill offered a better way to spread the tax burden than relying on real estate taxes alone.

"Forcing a disproportionate share onto ag producers is hardly a balanced approach," he said.

Sen. Ernie Chambers, of Omaha, said the case shows what can happen when law enforcement uses the threat of capital punishment as leverage to secure a confession. Several of the wrongfully convicted suffered from mental health problems and intellectual disabilities and admitted to the crime after authorities told them they could face the death penalty.

"These people were willing to give up their freedom, their dignity, their self-respect, their innocence, to save their lives," Chambers said.

Chambers, an ardent death penalty opponent,

said he would have blocked any effort to pay off the judgment with state tax dollars. He noted that, despite the high-profile case, residents there still voted to reinstate capital punishment in the 2016 election.

The Legislature's Judiciary Committee considered a bill that would have allowed the state to pay off the judgment, but lawmakers rejected it because it could have opened the door to other local governments seeking state money for their problems, said Sen. Steve Lathrop, the committee's chairman.

"There are things that are county responsibilities," said Lathrop, of Omaha. "And this, I believe, is one of them."

The bill advanced, 40-1, through the first of three required votes in the Legislature.

# County settles with insurers on coverage in Beatrice Six case

Six carriers will pay a total of \$5.98 million of \$28 million judgment for wrongful convictions in '85 rape and killing

BEATRICE, Neb. — Gage County has reached a settlement with insurance companies that officials argued should provide coverage for the \$28 million judgment in the Beatrice Six case.

On Wednesday, the County Board approved memorandums of understanding with the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association, Employers Mutual Casualty and four excess insurance carriers for settlements.

The county expects to collect a total of \$5.98 million from the carriers to put toward the judgment.

"We started with an understanding that there may or may not be any coverage," County Board Chairman Erich Tiemann said. "We reached this point, and I think we all are in agreement that this is the best possible outcome at this time."

The Beatrice Six — Joseph White, Ada JoAnn Taylor, Thomas Winslow, James Dean, Kathleen Gonzalez, Debra Shelden and Joseph White — were convicted in the 1985 rape and slaying of Helen Wilson in her downtown Beatrice apartment.

They were arrested in March and April 1989 and ultimately spent a combined 75 years in prison until DNA evidence showed that another man had committed the crime. In 2016, a federal jury awarded the six a combined \$28 million.

The case gained national notori-

ety for having the largest number of defendants wrongfully convicted in a single prosecution.

After the judgment, Gage County filed lawsuits against the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association and Employers Mutual Casualty, which both argued that they were not obligated to provide coverage.

Joel Bacon, a Lincoln attorney, said Employers Mutual Casualty is paying \$3.9 million and Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association is paying \$1.98 million, with \$95,000 being paid by four other insurance companies.

"The total settlement amount of just under \$6 million is modest compared to the judgments entered against the county and its former employers, but in our professional opinion this outcome is the best that could be achieved under the circumstances," Bacon said.

The judgment is being paid by property tax revenue and a half-cent additional sales tax that went into effect with the start of the year.

The insurance settlements could mean the judgment will be paid two years sooner, for a total of around five years. The first payment to the Beatrice 6 was made last June.

Tiemann said Gage County has also accumulated a total of \$2.1 million in legal fees fighting the judgment and arguing the insurance companies should provide coverage.

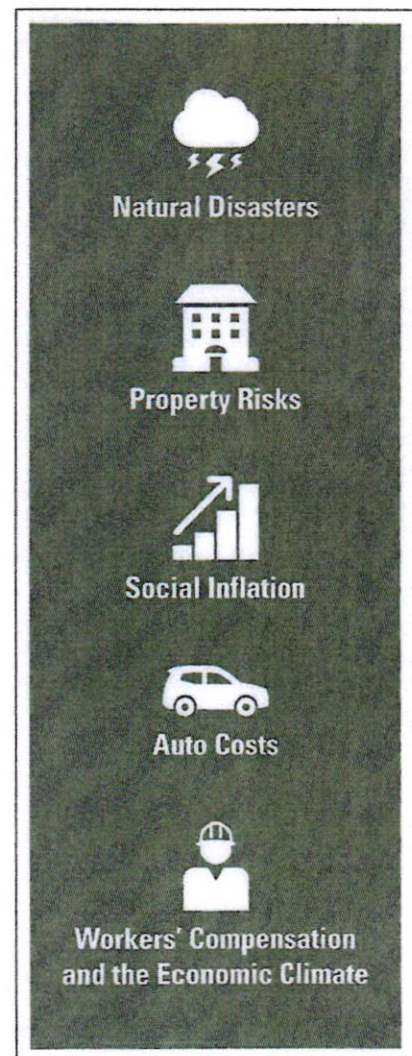

## 2 Property Risks

According to Conning®, estimated commercial property losses increased in 2020 due to wildfires, wind events, civil commotion and riots, as well as increased legal expenses regarding business interruption due to COVID-19.

Another trend driving the need for increased property rates is the rise in costs of goods and construction (e.g. building materials and construction delays).

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, annual increases in construction costs held steady prior to 2020, however over the last year, construction cost inflation more than doubled.





## 3 Social Inflation

The United States is seeing more losses today resulting in higher claim costs than in the past which creates "social inflation." Social inflation is a term used to describe the driving up of insurance costs due to rising medical and litigation costs. 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# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

**SDSU Extension and Counties of South Dakota**

**2022**

*In accordance with Chapter 4.05, Section 4.0504, Revised Code of 1939 and as subsequently amended to conduct Extension educational programs in Agriculture and Natural Resources, Family and Consumer Sciences, Community Development and 4-H Positive Youth Development with the complete understanding of all parties concerned. South Dakota State University Extension, the United States Department of Agriculture, and the Board of County Commissioners of **Yankton County** enter in the following agreement:*

## **COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT**

SDSU Extension agrees to give guidance and active assistance to the 4-H Youth Program Advisors in determining and carrying out 4-H and Youth Development educational programs that will be of greatest benefit to the people in the county. SDSU Extension agrees to assist the 4-H Youth Program Advisors in the conduct of their work by providing program planning and development, leadership, training, supervision (state employed 4-H Advisor only), and subject matter support through Extension specialists, field specialists, publications, and technology information services.

## **PERSONNEL AND FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF COOPERATING COUNTY**

The Board of County Commissioners agrees to furnish an office suitable to all parties of the Memorandum. The Board of County Commissioners further agrees to provide sufficient funds for qualified office administrative support, 4-H Advisors travel expenses, office supplies, and equipment, postage, demonstration and educational supplies, telephone/internet and related charges and up-to-date computer/related equipment, subject to the county's budgetary authority.

The Board of County Commissioners agrees to pay annually to South Dakota State University for partial salary support of the 4-H Advisor position. Payments must be made by the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March in this calendar year. For the calendar year 2022, this is in the amount of \$4,227.31 which reflects the 4-H Youth Program Advisor's .20 FTE appointment in Yankton County. Should the position become vacant during the 2022 calendar year, or portions thereof, the county shall be reimbursed on a pro-rata basis for such period(s) of vacancy at the close of the calendar year. Additionally, the intent of SDSU Extension is to allow the Yankton County Commission to fund a county employee to serve in the role of 4-H Youth Program Advisor.

The Board of County Commissioners agrees to reimburse the 4-H Youth Program Advisor for official use of their personal vehicle, meals, and lodging on official business away from their county office headquarters at rates and policies (e.g., IRS, GSA) equal to or above those established by the State Board of Finance. The 4-H Youth Program Advisor will submit itemized vouchers for official travel expenses to the County Auditor for presentation to the Board of County Commissioners for payment.

The 4-H Youth Program Advisors will travel within the county to serve clientele and conduct educational programming. Furthermore, the 4-H Youth Program Advisors will participate in some out-of-county activities that are related to their duties for the county (e.g., State Fair) for which the Board of County Commissioners agrees to reimburse travel expenses. The Board of County Commissioners further agrees to allow the 4-H Youth Program Advisors to participate in some training and special events outside of the county which are related to







their duties and continued professional development. For these specific mandated professional development events, SDSU Extension will provide travel reimbursement to the *state employed* 4-H Youth Program Advisor. The *county employed* 4-H Youth Program Advisor will attend any statewide trainings that 4-H Advisors must attend (usually Extension Fall Conference and 4-H Spring Training). Cost to attend these trainings will come at county expense.

### ACCESS TO CONFIDENTIAL DATA

Access to SDSU Extension data and communications, whether it resides on county-owned or SDSU Extension-owned equipment, shall be restricted to South Dakota State University personnel or their respective designees. As stated in the South Dakota Board of Regents Acceptable Use Policy, information resources and technology should be used to support the operations and missions of the South Dakota Regental System. Accordingly, the Technology and Security Office at South Dakota State University will investigate any and all allegations of misuse of technology by SDSU Extension personnel. Allegations of misuse of technology on county-owned equipment by SDSU Extension personnel will be investigated jointly by the SDSU Office of Technology and Security and the appropriate county personnel. SDSU will work with individual counties as requested to establish a standard Third Party Agreement to address network access concerns.

### COOPERATIVE PERSONNEL EMPLOYMENT POLICY

It shall be the responsibility of SDSU Extension to screen and certify the qualifications of applicants for a vacant position. The County Commission will be represented in interviewing candidate(s) for the open position and participate in recommending approval or rejection of the candidate's employment by SDSU Extension. Salary will be determined by SDSU Extension with approval of South Dakota State University and the South Dakota Board of Regents.

If the performance of a 4-H Youth Program Advisor becomes unsatisfactory, his/her employment may be terminated in accordance with South Dakota State University and Board of Regents Personnel policies. In addition, SDSU Extension may need to remove a 4-H Youth Program Advisor when either appropriated State or Federal funds or the County funds are not adequate to satisfactorily carry on effective 4-H Positive Youth Development Extension educational programs in the county.

The employment policies of SDSU Extension and parties to this cooperative agreement are required to conform to provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related amendments thereto prohibiting discrimination.

### APPROVAL AND/OR MODIFICATION OF MEMORANDUM

This memorandum will be in effect when the Board of County Commissioners and SDSU Extension approve it. It supersedes all previously signed agreements and shall remain in effect until it is expressly terminated in writing by one or more of the parties concerned. This agreement should be reviewed at the first meeting of the County Commission each year for purposes of informing new members and reacquainting experienced members with its provisions.
