CUP Public Hearing: This was the time and place for a public hearing for a Conditional Use Permit application from Just Kidding farms. Applicants requested a permit for a Hobby Farm in a Low Density Zone (R1). Said property is legally described as Block 7 Deer Run Subdivision, W1/2, SE1/4, exc Tract 1, S1-T93N-R57W, hereinafter referred to as Ziskov South Township, County of Yankton, State of South Dakota. The Planning Commission recommended approval, 8-0.

Matt Winsand spoke on the CUP request.

Commissioner Klimisch recognized Jeff Pfeifle, Buildings and Grounds Supervisor on how well the war memorial looked for the dedications that were recently held. Klimisch, along with Commissioner Swensen, also thanked Jeff for his dedication and the job he has done keeping county buildings clean during the pandemic.

Commissioners Swensen gave a presentation of Yankton County Veterans and the suicide rate among veterans.

Ambulance Administrator presented his 2020 third quarter report.

Action 20466AMB: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Healy to approve the 2020 third quarter report from the Ambulance Department. A detailed report is on file with the County Auditor. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Emergency Management Director Paul Scherschligt appeared before the board for approval to update technology in the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). The technology will enhance video conferencing and update old equipment. Scherschlight received a quote from Andersen Telecom, LLC in the amount of \$18,418.40. Mr. Scherschlight also updated the commissioners on the COVID-19 pandemic.

Action 204670EM: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Kettering to approve the proposal from Andersen Telecom, LLC not to exceed \$18,418.40. All present voted aye; motion carried.

The board discussed reducing the planning commission to seven members instead of the current nine and have only one commissioner serve on the panel.







STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT GRANT AGREEMENT FOR PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING – STATE ADMINISTRATION

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between the State of South Dakota, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, referred to in this Agreement as the "STATE," and Yankton County, South Dakota, referred to in this Agreement as the "COUNTY."

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The STATE has funding available for preservation, rehabilitation, or replacement of eligible local public agency bridges. The funding is only available for bridges located on local public roads.
- 2. The COUNTY has applied for and the STATE has awarded to the COUNTY a Bridge Improvement Grant ("BIG") for preliminary engineering for structure number 68-156-182, project number BRF 6366(00)21-1, PCN 08CR, referred to in this Agreement as the "PROJECT."

THE STATE AND THE COUNTY MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The COUNTY applied for and was awarded a BIG for preliminary engineering for the PROJECT.
- 2. The STATE issued a letter on August 27, 2020 notifying the COUNTY of the award of the BIG. The letter of award is attached to and incorporated in this Agreement as **Exhibit A**.
- This Agreement is effective on the date of the letter of award attached as Exhibit A. The preliminary
 engineering work contemplated by this Agreement will be completed no later than three years from the
 date of the letter of award. No reimbursements will be processed by the STATE for work performed
 after the date of August 27, 2023.
- 4. The COUNTY will select a professional engineering firm from the STATE'S current consultant retainer list for the bridge design category of work.
- 5. The STATE will hire the professional engineering firm selected by the COUNTY to perform the preliminary engineering for the PROJECT. The scope of the preliminary engineering services to be performed is identified in the attached **Exhibit B**.
- 6. The STATE will invite the COUNTY, and the COUNTY will participate in, all planning, scoping, and inspection meetings held in connection with the PROJECT.
- 7. The STATE will submit to the COUNTY a draft type, size, and location (TS&L) report for the PROJECT for the COUNTY'S review and comment. The COUNTY will review the TS&L and provide the COUNTY'S comments to the STATE. The STATE will address, in writing, all comments made by the COUNTY to the COUNTY'S satisfaction.
- 8. The STATE will directly pay the professional engineering firm for all PROJECT costs.
- 9. The STATE will be responsible for eighty percent (80%) of eligible PROJECT costs not to exceed the maximum BIG amount of fifty-four thousand, seven hundred dollars (\$ 54,700). The COUNTY will reimburse the STATE for the COUNTY'S twenty percent (20%) match on eligible PROJECT costs. Once the total BIG amount has been paid, the COUNTY will be responsible for one hundred percent (100%) of all remaining PROJECT costs. The COUNTY will also be one hundred percent (100%) responsible for any PROJECT costs incurred prior to the date of the letter of award. The COUNTY will reimburse the STATE within thirty (30) days of receipt of a billing from the STATE.
- 10. The COUNTY certifies the COUNTY has a conflict of interest policy and enforces said policy.

- 11. The COUNTY certifies the COUNTY has filed an Internal Revenue Services (IRS) Form 990 in compliance with federal law, if applicable. The COUNTY will display the filed IRS Form 990 on the COUNTY'S website immediately upon filing.
- 12. The COUNTY certifies the COUNTY employs an effective internal control system.
- 13. The COUNTY certifies the COUNTY is in compliance with the federal Single Audit Act and the requirements of SDCL § 4-11-2.1, if applicable. The COUNTY further certifies audits are displayed on the COUNTY'S website.
- 14. The COUNTY will include provisions in the COUNTY'S contracts and subcontracts requiring the COUNTY'S contractors and subcontractors to comply with the applicable provisions of this Agreement, to indemnify the STATE, and to provide insurance coverage for the benefit of the STATE, all in a manner consistent with this Agreement. The COUNTY will cause the COUNTY'S contractors, subcontractors, agents, and employees to comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, ordinances, guidelines, permits, and requirements and will adopt such review and inspection procedures as are necessary to assure such compliance.
- 15. The COUNTY will indemnify the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all actions, suits, damages, liability, or other proceedings that may arise as the result of the COUNTY'S performance under this Agreement. This section does not require the COUNTY to be responsible for or defend against claims or damages arising from errors or omissions of the STATE, its officers, agents, or employees.
- 16. All PROJECT charges will be subject to audit by the STATE. The COUNTY and the COUNTY'S contractors and subcontractors will keep accounting records clearly identified with this Agreement, and will support all PROJECT charges by documents which evidence, in detail, the nature and propriety of those charges.
- 17. Upon reasonable notice, the COUNTY and the COUNTY'S contractors and subcontractors will allow the STATE, through any authorized representative, to have access to and the right to examine and copy all records, books, papers, or documents related to services rendered under this Agreement. The COUNTY will keep these records clearly identified and readily accessible for a period of three (3) years after the date of final payment under this Agreement.
- 18. The COUNTY will abide by the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, incorporated in and attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit C**.
- 19. The COUNTY will perform under this Agreement in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and any amendments.
- 20. This Agreement may not be amended, except in writing, which writing will be expressly identified as a part of this Agreement, and be signed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- 21. This Agreement depends upon the continued availability of appropriated funds and expenditure authority from the Legislature for this purpose. If for any reason the Legislature fails to appropriate funds or grant expenditure authority, or funds become unavailable by operation of law or federal funds reductions, the STATE may terminate this Agreement. Termination for any of these reasons is not a default by the STATE nor does it give rise to a claim against the STATE.
- 22. The parties may terminate this Agreement by mutual written agreement. The STATE may also terminate this Agreement if the COUNTY breaches any terms of this Agreement. If the STATE terminates this Agreement due to the COUNTY'S breach, then any payments owed to the COUNTY at the time of termination may be adjusted to cover any additional costs to the STATE because of the COUNTY'S breach. The adjustment of payments will be in addition to any other remedies the

STATE may pursue as a result of COUNTY'S breach, and the STATE does not waive these other remedies by making a payment adjustment. If termination is not due to a breach by the COUNTY, then the COUNTY will be paid for eligible PROJECT costs incurred up to the date of termination, subject to the maximum limiting amount of the BIG.

- 23. The COUNTY must comply with all federal, state, and local laws, together with all ordinances and regulations applicable to the work and will be solely responsible for obtaining current information on such requirements. The COUNTY must procure all licenses, permits, or other rights necessary for the fulfillment of its obligations under this Agreement.
- 24. This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota. Any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this Agreement will be venued in Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.
- 25. If any court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this Agreement unenforceable or invalid, such holding will not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement.
- 26. All other prior discussions, communications, and representations concerning the subject matter of this Agreement are superseded by the terms of this Agreement, and, except as specifically provided in this Agreement, this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement with respect to its subject matter.
- 27. The COUNTY has designated its County Commission Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative and has empowered the Chairperson with the authority to sign this Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY. A copy of the COUNTY'S Commission minutes or resolution authorizing the execution of this Agreement by the Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative is attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit D**.

This Agreement is binding upon the signatories not as individuals but solely in their capacities as officials of their respective organizations and acknowledges proper action of the STATE and the COUNTY to enter into the same.

Memorandum of Agreement

Between Yankton County (SD) and the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition

1.0 PARTIES

The parties to this agreement are the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition (MSAC), a 501c3 non-profit organization, with mailing address of PO Box 2, Springfield, South Dakota and physical location address of 100 Douglas, Suite 103, Yankton, South Dakota, and Yankton County, South Dakota, hereafter referred to as "the Parties."

2.0 Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to establish funding support from **Yankton County** to the MSAC for development of a sediment management plan (SMP) for Lewis and Clark Lake, to include consideration of the lake's delta within the reservoir and extending upstream, along with contributing tributaries and other watershed components. The SMP's goal is to foster reservoir sustainability.

In recognizing that Lewis and Clark Lake is already more than 30 percent full of sediment and projected to be 50 percent full by 2045, MSAC and Yankton County support pursuing a SMP for Lewis and Clark Lake through Section 22 Planning Assistance to States (PAS) of WRDA 1974 as amended which is available in working with the US Army Corps of Engineers. MSAC will continue to monitor other appropriate authorizations such as Section 1179a of the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) of 2016 that are available in working with the US Army Corps of Engineers as to their feasibility with SMP development. The harmful effects of sedimentation at Lewis and Clark Lake also extend upstream with the delta. The plan is expected to outline action(s) for preventing sediment from reducing water storage capacity at the reservoir and/or increasing water storage capacity through sediment removal at the reservoir. In order to achieve sediment management at the reservoir, the delta in and above the reservoir also must be addressed. To effectively develop the plan, the process will be conducted in phases, with Phase 2 of the Lewis and Clark Lake Sediment Management Plan Section 22 Study expected to include an economic analysis applied to dredging scenarios. The analysis will include applying the standard USACE economic model along with the Life-Cycle economic model. The analysis will include estimating current and future benefits lost to sedimentation and those that could be preserved with sediment management. This more holistic approach is intended to provide supporting information necessary for the implementation of large scales projects needed for reservoir sustainability. A Solutions Workshop is planned with subject matter experts to explore the full spectrum of possible actions to manage sediment. Results of Phase 2 will be assessed prior to

advancing to Phase 3 intended to expand the engineering and economic analysis of actions identified in the Solutions Workshop. The cumulative result of Phases 2 and 3 is intended to be a SMP for Lewis and Clark Lake. Further more specific engineering and environmental assessments for implementation would be necessary, which is not possible with a Section 22 PAS program study.

3.0 Responsibilities

Yankton County agrees to contribute \$10,000 to the MSAC toward development of a SMP with other stakeholders and the anticipated Federal cost share partner, the US Army Corps of Engineers. In 2021, MSAC will provide a written request to Yankton County for the Phase 2 contribution (\$3,800), due within 30 days or Yankton County can choose to submit the Phase 2 contribution to MSAC in 2020 after reaching a signed agreement.

With Phase 2, MSAC will allocate 38% of **Yankton County's** contribution of **\$10,000** or a total of **\$3,800**. With Phase 3, MSAC will allocate 62% of **Yankton County's** contribution of **\$10,000** or a total of **\$6,200**. Near the conclusion of Phase 2, MSAC will provide a written request to **Yankton County** for the remaining 62% for Phase 3. If Phase 3 is not pursued, this will also be communicated.

MSAC will communicate local cost share requirements, timeline, and necessary stakeholder contribution amounts for in a timely fashion after the information is available to MSAC. If a higher percentage of **Yankton County's** contribution is needed for Phase 2, Parties must consent to amending this agreement. If a lower percentage of **Yankton County's** contribution is needed for Phase 2, it will be applied to Phase 3.

MSAC encourages **Yankton County's** active participation in development of the SMP by engaging in stakeholder meetings and communications with MSAC. MSAC will maintain regular communication with stakeholders by issuing progress, financial and other reports.

Section 22 requires a 50 percent non-Federal (local) and 50 percent Federal cost share. **Yankton County's** contribution is to be applied to the local, non-Federal cost share required to develop Phase 2 and 3 of a SMP. Estimations provided here are subject to change at the agreement of MSAC and the USACE. See the Project Management Plan for specific information. Phase 2 costs were developed in Phase 1.

Cost Estimate of Phase 2 (Section 22 PAS): \$215,667 (\$107,834 local share)
Cost Estimate of Phase 3: (TBD with completion of Phase 2)

Additional Phases Are Necessary for Construction/Implementation of a SMP

If MSAC, and its supporting unit of government, do not reach an agreement with the US Army Corps of Engineers to proceed, this will be communicated to **Yankton County**. If development of a SMP does not progress past Phase 2, the remaining balance of **Yankton County's** contribution that was not expended toward plan development, will be returned to **Yankton County**.

4.0 Publicity of This Relationship

With this agreement, MSAC may indicate in press releases, on websites and in educational material that **Yankton County** is a partner with MSAC in pursuit of developing a SMP with other stakeholders. Prior to using **Yankton County's** logo in publication, MSAC will receive authorization from an authorized official designated by **Yankton County**, named here, **(NAME OF INDIVIDUAL or JOB TITLE.)**

5.0 Signatory Authority for Modification

Any modification to this agreement must be made in writing and executed by an authorized representative of each Party.

6.0 Term of Agreement

This agreement is effective on the last date affixed to the signature of the Parties. This Agreement shall expire 4 years from the effective date of signature by all Parties and may be, by written mutual agreement, extended for an additional term as deemed appropriate.

RESOLUTION NO.18-6

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE YANKTON COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS (DAKOTA PROTEIN LLC PROJECT), SERIES 2018 IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED EIGHT MILLION DOLLARS (\$8,000,000), AND APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING OTHER ACTIONS IN RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, Yankton County, a body politic and corporate duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of South Dakota (the "County"), pursuant to South Dakota Codified Laws Section 7-18-16 and Chapter 9-54, as supplemented and amended (collectively, the "Act"), is authorized and empowered to issue and sell its revenue bonds to finance the costs of manufacturing facilities to stimulate and develop the general economic welfare and prosperity of the state through the promotion and advancement of manufacturing; and

WHEREAS, as a result of negotiations between the County and Yankton Protein, LLC (the "Borrower"), contracts will be entered into by the Borrower for the purpose of the acquisition, construction, installation and equipping of a new 50,000+- sq. ft. DDG Pellet manufacturing facility (the "Project"), located at Lot 5 of Lot 1 of Dakota Rail Park Subdivision in the SW ½ of Section 21, Township 94 North, Range 56 West of the 5th

Principal Meridian, Yankton County, South Dakota, (located near what is locally known as Napa Junction) (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project will be owned by the Borrower for use as manufacturing facility and leased to and operated by Dakota Protein, LLC (the "Lessee"), pursuant to a written Lease Agreement (the "Lease Agreement") for use by the Lessee"; and

WHEREAS, the County proposes to issue its Economic Development Revenue Bonds (Yankton Protein LLC Project), Series 2018 (the "Bonds"), in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000), to provide funds for financing all or portion of the Project, by lending the proceeds of the Bonds to the Borrower pursuant to a Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement") between the County and the Borrower, which prescribes the terms and conditions under which the Borrower shall repay the loan; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the costs of the Project, including costs relating to the preparation and issuance of the revenue bonds will exceed \$8,000,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), a public hearing on the proposed plan of financing of the Project was held on September 4, 2018, prior to the adoption of this Resolution, pursuant to notice caused to be published on August 21st, 2018 in the Yankton Press and Dakotan being a newspaper of general circulation published in the County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to authorize its Chairman, Vice Chairman or County Auditor to take certain action in preparation for issuing and selling the Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Yankton County as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> <u>Definitions.</u> In addition to the words and terms defined in this Resolution, the words and terms used in this Resolution shall have the meanings as set forth in the Loan Agreement, unless the context or use indicates another or different meaning of intent.
- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>Determination of the County</u>. The County determines that notice of said public hearing was published as required by Section 147(f) of the Code, that a hearing was held and that all persons appearing were given a reasonable opportunity to express their views, both orally and in writing.
- Section 3. Small Issue Election of County. The County elects to have the provisions as to the \$10,000,000 limitation contained in Section 144(a)(4)(A) of the Code apply to the Bonds.
- <u>Section 4</u>. <u>Authorization of Bonds</u>. There are hereby authorized to be issued, sold and delivered the Bonds, designated as "Economic Development Revenue Bonds (Yankton

Protein LLC Project), Series 2018," in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000) for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs of the acquisition, construction, installation and equipping the Project, including costs of issuance which will not exceed 2%.

Section 5. Terms and Execution of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued as fully registered Bonds, without coupons, in the form and denomination set forth in the Loan Agreement; shall bear such date as provided in the Loan Agreement; shall mature no later than thirty (30) years from the date of issue; shall bear interest at a rate or rates set forth in the Loan Agreement, but not to exceed seven percent (7.00 %) per annum; shall be payable at such place or places and in such medium as provided in the Loan Agreement; shall be subject to the terms of redemption as are set forth in the Loan Agreement; and shall contain such other terms and provisions as are set forth in the Loan Agreement.

The Bonds shall be executed by the manual of facsimile signatures of any of the Chairman or Vice Chairman of the County Commission or the County Auditor (each an "Authorized Signatory" and, collectively, the "Authorized Signatories") and attested by the manual or facsimile signature of any other Authorized Signatory.

The Bonds are special limited obligations of the County payable solely from revenues and receipts derived from the Loan Agreement except to the extent that the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds maybe paid out of money attributable to Bond proceeds or from temporary investments or from other moneys, if any.

The County will assign to the purchaser of the Bonds the County's rights under the Loan Agreement (except for certain unassigned County rights) as security for the repayment of the Bonds. As a result of the County's assignment as provided herein, the County will have no ownership interest in the Project.

The Bonds and obligation to pay interest thereon do not now and shall never constitute a debt, a liability, a general, moral or other obligation or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the County, the state of South Dakota or any political subdivision thereof, or a charge against the general faith and credit or taxing powers, if any, of any of them, within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory provision, but shall be secured as aforesaid, and are payable solely from the revenue and receipts derived from the loan agreement. No holder of any of the Bonds shall have the right to compel the taxing powers, if any, of the county, the state of South Dakota or political subdivision thereof to pay any principal of or premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds. Neither the commissioners, officers, employees or agents of the county nor any person executing the Bonds shall be subject to personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Bonds or failure to issue or sell such Bonds.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>General</u>. The Authorized Signatories, or any of them, are hereby authorized and directed, in the name of and on behalf of the County, to execute any and all instruments, documents and certificates, perform any and all acts, approve any and all

matters, and do any and all things deemed by them to be necessary or desirable in order to carry out the purposes of this Resolution (including the preambles hereto), the acquisition, construction equipping and financing of the Project by the Borrower, the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the securing thereof pursuant to the Loan Agreement.

<u>Section 7</u>. <u>Invalidity</u>. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be ruled by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, clauses or provisions.

<u>Section 8</u>. <u>Conflicts</u>. All ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

<u>Section 9</u>. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.


