YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING December 17, 2019

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chairman Dan Klimisch at 6:00 PM on Tuesday, December 17, 2019.

The General Fund was \$6,081,921.80; Special Funds were \$3,637,095.09; and Trust and Agency Funds were \$1,719,138.94 adding to a Grand Total of General Ledger Cash and Investments of \$11,438,155.83. A detailed report is on file with the County Auditor. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 19579Aud: A Motion was made by Loest and seconded by Healy to approve the Juvenile Detention Center agreement with Minnehaha County for 2020. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Smith Insurance: Roger Smith presented property and casualty renewal policies and pricing. Mr. Smith said the county's liability insurance has increased 10%. Smith also said the county can lower the deductible or delete coverage on older equipment. Chairman Klimisch said he would volunteer to sit down and discuss options with Mr. Smith and the Auditor Patty Hojem.

There will be a special Commission meeting at 10:00 a.m., December 30, 2019.

Highway: Highway Superintendent Mike Sedlacek appeared for board approval of an entrance application and also gave an update on the James River bridge repairs. Sedlacek said the design is complete, they are working on plans that will be sent to contractor and quotes will be sent hopefully in January. Chairman Klimisch was concerned about the 180 day deadline for the repair. Klimisch asked if there was someone they could talk to about an extension. Sedlacek said he has been talking to Tammy Williams and Shane Carnahan from Department of Transportation. Fleeg's Bridge is complete and Johnsons Bridge was started today and will be finished tomorrow.

Action 19580H: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to approve the application for Entrance from Gregg Davis located in S25-T96N-R54W, Yankton County. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 19581C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to reappoint Michael McDonald as the Veteran's Service Officer through the first Monday in January, 2023. Roll call vote was taken with Swensen, Loest, Healy, and Klimisch voting Aye; motion carried, 4-0.

Sound System: Jon Andersen and Chris Schloss, from Andersen Telecom. LLC, explained quotes they presented for the audio system upgrade in the commission chambers. No action was taken.

911 Radio Project: Duane Johnson from the city appeared to update the commission on the dispatch project and request carryover of funds for budget year 2020. Auditor Hojem said budget dollars cannot be carried over. When project is finished in 2020, there will have to be a budget supplement. No action was taken

Zoning Enforcement: Vetter said there is an appeal hearing scheduled tomorrow and a second one on December 26, 2019. Chairman Klimisch asked States Attorney what the process is going forward after board of adjustment decisions. Klimisch said they can appeal the board's rulings to the circuit court.

Yankton County States Attorney read the statute referring to the voting requirement. No county official may participate in discussions or voting if official has a conflict of interest.

Plat: **Action 19582Z**: A motion was made by Loest and seconded by Healy to adopt the following resolution: Whereas it appears, Nelson Wetland Conservation Easement, owner of record, has caused a plat to be made of the following real property: NW1/4, SE1/4 S10-T96N-R54W, hereinafter referred to as Turkey Valley Township County of Yankton, S.D., and has submitted such plat to the Yankton County Planning Commission and the Yankton County Commission for approval. Now therefore be it resolved that such plat has been executed according to law and conforms to all existing applicable zoning, subdivision and erosion and sediment control and the same is hereby approved. The County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to endorse on such the proper resolution and certify the same. Roll call vote was taken with Loest, Healy, Swensen and Klimisch voting Aye; Motion carried, 4-0.

Planning & Zoning: Planning and Zoning Administrator Gary Vetter read the county mission statement. Mr. Vetter sent the document to the department heads and they were ok with it. Chairman Klimisch suggested adopting the mission statement in January 2020. No action was taken.

Action 19583C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to recess for 5 minutes. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 19584C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to reconvene. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 19585D: A motion was made by Loest and seconded by Healy to recess the regular session and convene as Drainage Board. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Randy Golden appeared before the board to present more information of surface water runoff at the property legally described as LT BP1 in SE4, NE4, 15-93-56

Kerri Cook Huber spoke on behalf of Ryken Legacy Land Trustees on the continued objection of the Yankton County Drainage Board making declaration of the surface water runoff on the property.

No action was taken by the board.

Action 19586C: A motion was made by Healy and seconded by Loest to recess the Drainage Board and reconvene in regular session. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Planning & Zoning: Gary Vetter said there have been discussions with states attorneys and legal consultant and recommendations moving forward on and start working on some resolutions on the ordinance in this upcoming year.

Ambulance Taskforce: There were eleven residents who submitted their names for the ambulance task force: John Kraft, Tom Slowey, Cherie Hoffman, Kevin Frangenberg, Brian Steward, Levi Stevens, Stephanie Horst, Catherine R. Cuka, Mark Nickles, Vernon C. "Skip" VanDerhule and Shelly Stockstad-Erickson. Commissioner Loest said 4 from this group will be chosen plus a representative from Yankton City, Avera Sacred Heart, Human Services Center and Loest and Commissioner Healy. Loest said it is possible the first meeting of the taskforce will be the 2nd Monday in January in the evening.

Action 19587C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to approve Stephanie Horst, Tom Slowey, Cherie Hoffman and Brian Steward as members of the ambulance taskforce. All present voted aye; motion carried.

There was no public comment.

Chairman Klimisch closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Commission Updates: HR consultant Alternative HRDHR is progressing and should have a report by January 2020 and the Government Center Pot Luck will be December 19. Chairman Klimisch mentioned he had met with tower consultant and gave recommendations on article 5

Action 19588C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to recess the regular session at 8:00 pm and convene in executive session to discuss litigation SDCL 1-25-2(3). All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 19589C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Loest to adjourn the executive session at 9:15 pm and reconvene in regular session. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Chairman Klimisch reported no action would be taken as a result of the executive session.

Action 19590C: A motion was made by Swensen and seconded by Healy to adjourn. All present voted aye; motion carried.
