YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING

October 20, 2020

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chair Cheri Loest at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 20, 2020.

Matt Winsand spoke on the hearing.

Action 20460Z: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch to approve the rezone application from R2 to R1. Roll call vote was taken with Kettering, Klimisch, Healy, Swensen and Loest voting aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Action 20461C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Kettering to recess the regular session and convene as Board of Adjustment. All present voted aye; motion carried.

CUP Public Hearing: This was the time and place for a public hearing for a Conditional Use Permit application from Just Kidding farms. Applicants requested a permit for a Hobby Farm in a Low Density Zone (R1). Said property is legally described as Block 7 Deer Run Subdivision, W1/2, SE1/4, exc Tract 1, S1-T93N-R57W, hereinafter referred to as Ziskov South Township, County of Yankton, State of South Dakota. The Planning Commission recommended approval, 8-0.

Matt Winsand spoke on the CUP request.

Action 20462Z: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch, to approve the Conditional Use Permit on contingent of successful rezone, based on Findings of Fact from the September 8, 2020 Yankton County Planning Commission meeting as presented, pursuant to Article 19, Section 1907 of the Yankton County Zoning Ordinance. Roll call vote was taken with Kettering, Klimisch, Swensen, Healy and Loest voting aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Action 20463Z: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch to recess the Board of Adjustment and reconvene in regular session. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 20464C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Healy to recess the commission meeting for five minutes. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 20465C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Healy to reconvene. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Commissioner Klimisch recognized Jeff Pfeifle, Buildings and Grounds Supervisor on how well the war memorial looked for the dedications that were recently held. Klimisch, along with Commissioner Swensen, also thanked Jeff for his dedication and the job he has done keeping county buildings clean during the pandemic.

Commissioners Swensen gave a presentation of Yankton County Veterans and the suicide rate among veterans.

Ambulance Administrator presented his 2020 third quarter report.

Action 20466AMB: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Healy to approve the 2020 third quarter report from the Ambulance Department. A detailed report is on file with the County Auditor. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Emergency Management Director Paul Scherschligt appeared before the board for approval to update technology in the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). The technology will enhance video conferencing and update old equipment. Scherschlight received a quote from Andersen Telecom, LLC in the amount of \$18,418.40. Mr. Scherschlight also updated the commissioners on the COVID-19 pandemic.

Action 204670EM: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Kettering to approve the proposal from Andersen Telecom, LLC not to exceed \$18,418.40. All present voted aye; motion carried.

The board discussed reducing the planning commission to seven members instead of the current nine and have only one commissioner serve on the panel.

Action 20468C: A motion was made by Healy and seconded by Kettering to close the open position and move to six appointed members and one commissioner. Commissioner Klimisch will remain on the planning commission with Commissioner Healy stepping down. Roll call vote was taken with Healy, Kettering and Loest voting aye; Swensen and Klimisch voting nay; motion carried, 3-2.

The board discussed the secretary position for the Conservation District which will be open October 30th, 2020.

There was one public comment from Gary Swensen.

Chair Loest closed public comment.

Commissioner updates: NACO Training, Flyover, Salary Matrix, Drainage ordinance, Farm forum Monday October 26th. Commission Swensen spoke on Washington conference calls.

Action 20469 C: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Klimisch to adjourn. All present voted aye; motion carried.
