August 5, 2025

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chairman John Marquardt at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 5, 2025.

Action 25247AUD: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Heine to approve the Auditor's Monthly Settlement with the Treasurer and Pooled Cash Report as of June 31, 2025 showing Total Cash of \$12,229,123.62. Susan Bearman, from Minnehaha County spoke remotely on the Financial Action Network (FAN). The committee was formed to analyze the county budget and recommend future actions to ensure statutory obligations and future needs are met. No action was taken. The commission discussed options the board could take.

Richard Vellek appeared to express concerns on roads 439th and 304th by the Marquardt Gravel Pit for the Highway 81 project. Concerns are running stop signs, no sheriff presence, no dust control, noise and flagmen. Captain Meier spoke on actions that were taken by the Sheriff's Office. The commission discussed options the board could take. No action was taken.

Action 25249C: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Kettering to recess for five minutes. All present voted aye; motion carried. 5-0.

Action 25250: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Heine to reconvene. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Highway Superintendent Mike Sedlacek appeared for approval to surplus pile of milled asphalt. No action was taken because item was not advertised.

Action 25251C: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Heine to recess the regular session and convene as Board of Adjustment. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

CUP Public Hearing: This was the time and place for a public hearing for a Conditional Use Permit application from Dollar General. Applicant is requesting a Conditional Use Permit in a Lakeside Commercial District to construct storage building per Article 11 Section 1107, Article 18 Section 1905. Applicant wishes to build a storage building that was not included in the original Conditional Use Permit on his property. Said property is legally described as Lot 4 Whitetail Run, Section Four (16), Township Ninety-three (93) North, Range Fifty-six (56) West of the 5th P.M., Yankton County, South Dakota. E91 I address is 706 Kalea St., Yankton, South Dakota. Jim Den Herder spoke on the application.

Action 25252Z: A motion was made by Heine and seconded by Kettering, to approve the Conditional Use Permit for Jim Den Herder with condition applicant must comply with Article 27 of the Zoning Ordinance, based on Findings of Fact from the July 8, 2025 Yankton County Planning Commission meeting as presented, pursuant to Article 19, Section 1907 of the Yankton County Zoning Ordinance. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Action 25253C: A motion was made by Klimisch and seconded by Fox to recess Board of Adjustment and reconvene in regular session. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.

Representative Julie Auch appeared to give an explanation on HB1043 and the voting outcome of the bill after comments made at the July commission meetings.

Interim EMS Director Troy Cowman appeared to request approval to advertise for ambulance remount and power load system.

Action 25254C: A motion was made by Kettering and seconded by Heine to approve the request. Roll call vote was taken with Kettering, Heine, Fox and Marquardt voting aye; Klimisch voting nay; motion carried, 4-1.

Commissioner Heine would like to combine the 4-H Director and Extension Coordinator as one position and approve advertising for the position at the August 19, 2025 meeting. Commissioner Klimisch suggested donating funds to 4-H and they can do with that funding as they want. Commissioner Heine said Yankton would be the only county with no extension coordinator.

State Legislators passed a 2025 law, SDCL Section 1-25-23, requiring any public body to review South Dakota's open meeting requirements each year. Pursuant to the statue, the board has to include in the meeting minutes that commissioners acknowledged they reviewed the open meeting laws in an open meeting.

By roll call vote, Wanda Howey-Fox, Ryan Heine, Don Kettering, Dan Klimisch and John Marquardt have reviewed the open meeting laws in the state's open meetings brochure.

A Kaiser Road resolution will be presented for approval at the August 19, 2025 commission meeting.

The board discussed requests from Commissioner Klimisch to stipulate that raises should only be discussed during the budgeting process and to clarify that the county is in a hiring freeze in the county personnel handbook. States Attorney Larsen said he would prepare the resolution regarding the hiring freeze.

States Attorney Larsen was asked to look into adding a section to the employee handbook for mandating anti-sexual harassment discrimination training for county employees, possibly including department heads, elected officials and commissioners. Larson said the commissioners will have to discuss and decide who they want to take the class, and how to implement and draft it. Larson suggested hiring Alternative HRD to do the revisions since that company drafted the current Yankton County Personnel Handbook.

There was a comment from State Senator Lauren Nelson. Chairman Marquardt closed public comment.

Action 25255C: A motion was made by Fox and seconded by Heine to adjourn. All present voted aye; motion carried, 5-0.
