ORDINANCE #03-40 WHEEL TAX ORDINANCE

An Ordinance of the County of Lake, State of South Dakota, for the imposition, collection and enforcement of a Wheel Tax.

Pursuant to SDCL 32-5A-1 et seq and consistent with legislative intent permitting counties to impose and administrate a wheel tax;

BE IT ORDINAED by Lake County that a county wheel tax be imposed in and for Lake County as set forth herein.

SECTION 1.

All motor vehicles as defined in SDCL 32-3-1, registered in the County, shall have a wheel tax imposed upon each vehicle at a rate not to exceed four (\$4.00) per vehicle wheel.

SECTION 2.

The wheel tax shall be administered and collected by the county. The per vehicle wheel rate shall be the same for all types of licensed vehicles and the total vehicle tax may not exceed sixteen dollars (\$16.00) per vehicle.

SECTION 3.

Proceeds from the tax created by this Ordinance shall be retained by the county, deposited in a special highway fund. The revenue may be used only for highway and bridge maintenance and construction and amounts collected in excess of the two dollars (\$2.00) per vehicle wheel shall replace property taxes that the county would otherwise impose for highway purposes. Twenty percent (20%) of the \$2.00 per wheel fee collected shall be distributed to the townships based on number of maintained miles in each township.

SECTION 4.

If a vehicle is licensed for a period of time less than twelve months, any wheel tax imposed on such vehicle pursuant to this ordinance shall be prorated on a monthly basis. Upon purchasing a vehicle from a dealer, the purchaser shall pay the appropriate tax at the time of title transfer. Nothing in this ordinance shall prevent an automobile dealer from licensing the vehicles on his/her lot without paying any taxes created by this Ordinance.

SECTION 5.

This Ordinance shall cover and impose the wheel tax for all vehicles eligible for license registration or license renewal for July 1, 2003, and all subsequent months. This Ordinance shall impose a wheel tax upon all vehicles so described, even though license registration or renewal takes place before July 1, 2003.

SECTION 6.

RESOLUTION #03-16

Resolution authorizing the execution, terms, issuance, sale and payment of Tax Increment Revenue Bonds, Series 2003 and Taxable Tax Increment Revenue Bonds, Series 2003 Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Two Million One Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Fifty-Eight Dollars and 24/100 (\$2,148,058.24) plus costs of issuance of the County of Lake, South Dakota.

WHEREAS, the Lake County is authorized by the provisions of SDCL §§ 6-8B-30 though 6-8B-52 to issue bonds to refund and refinance validly issued outstanding bonds of the County; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission has determined that refunding certain Tax Increment Revenue Bonds, Series 2001 in order to reorganize the tax increment debt into two issues is in the best interest of the County; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission has determined that is necessary and in the best interest of the County to issue Tax Increment Refunding Bonds, Series 2003 and Taxable Tax Increment Refunding Bonds, Series 2003 for the purpose of providing funds to (i) refinance all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds, as such term is defined herein; and (ii) pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

DEFINITIONS

Section I.1. Definition of Terms.

In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Bond Resolution, the following words and terms as used herein, whether or not the words have initial capitals, shall have the following meanings, unless the context or use indicates another or different meaning or intent, and such definitions shall be equally applicable to both the singular and plural forms of any of the words and terms herein defined:

"Act" means collectively SDCL Chapters 6-8B and 11-9, as amended.

"<u>Authorized Officer of the County</u>" means the Chairman and the County Auditor, or, in the case of any act to be performed or duty to be discharged, any other member, officer, or employee of the County then authorized to perform such act or discharge such duty. "<u>Bonds</u>" means not collectively the Taxable 2003 Series Bonds and Series 2003 Bonds, or such other designation or date as shall be determined by the County Commission pursuant to Section 8.1 hereof, authorized and issued under the Bond Resolution. "<u>Bond Counsel</u>" means Danforth, Meierhenry & Meierhenry, LLP, a firm of attorneys recognized as having experience in matters relating to the issuance of state or local governmental obligations.

"<u>Bond Payment Date</u>" means each date on which interest, or both principal and interest, shall be payable on the Bonds so long as any of the Bonds shall be outstanding.

"Bond Resolution" means the within Resolution, duly adopted by the County

Commission the date hereof, as it may be amended from time to time.

"<u>Bondholder</u>", "<u>Holder</u>" and "<u>Registered Owner</u>" means the registered owner of a Bond, including any nominee of a Depository.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the County Commission.

"<u>County</u>" means the County of Lake.

"<u>County Commission</u>" means the County Commission of the County elected pursuant to South Dakota Law.

"<u>County of Lake</u>" means the County of Lake, South Dakota.

"<u>Closing Date</u>," means the date of delivery and payment of the Bonds.

"<u>Code</u>" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the applicable regulations of the United States Department of Treasury promulgated there under as in effect on the date of issuance of the Bonds.

"<u>County Auditor</u>" means the County Auditor of the County elected in accordance with South Dakota Law or in the event the person so elected is unable or incapable of acting in such capacity, the person appointed by the Chairman and approved by the County Commission to perform the duties otherwise performed by the County Auditor, or his/her designee.

"Outstanding," "Bonds Outstanding," or "Outstanding Bonds" means, as of a particular date all Bonds issued and delivered under this Bond Resolution except: (1) any Bond paid or redeemed or otherwise canceled by the County at or before such date; (2) any Bond for the payment of which cash, equal to the principal amount thereof with interest to date of maturity, shall have theretofore been deposited prior to maturity by the County for the benefit of the Owner thereof; (3) any Bond for the redemption of which cash, equal to the redemption price thereof with interest to the redemption date, shall have theretofore been deposited with the Registration Agent and for which notice of redemption shall have been mailed in accordance with this Bond Resolution; (4) any Bond in lieu of or in substitution for which another Bond shall have been delivered pursuant to this Resolution, unless proof satisfactory to the County is presented that any Bond, for which a Bond in lieu of or in substitution therefore shall have been delivered, is held by a bona fide purchaser, as that term is defined in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code of the State, as amended, in which case both the Bond in lieu of or in substitution for which a new Bond has been delivered and such new Bond so delivered therefore shall be deemed Outstanding; and, (5) any Bond deemed paid under the provisions of Article VII of this Resolution, except that any such Bond shall be considered Outstanding until the maturity or redemption date thereof only for the purposes of being exchanged, transferred, or registered.

"<u>Person</u>" means an individual, partnership, corporation, trust, or unincorporated organization, or a governmental entity or agency or political subdivision thereof.

"<u>Purchase Agreement</u>" means the Bond Purchase Agreement authorized pursuant to and described in Section 8.1 hereof by and between the County and the Purchaser. "<u>Purchaser</u>" means the First National Bank in Brookings, Brookings, South Dakota or such other entity or person that may purchase the Bonds.

"Refunded Bonds" means the Series 2001 Bonds.

"<u>Registration Agent</u>" means the County Auditor or her successor or successors hereafter appointed in the manner provided in Article VI hereof.

"<u>Resolution</u>" means this Bond Resolution.

"Schedule" the schedule, which indicates the principal and interest payments on the Bonds.

"<u>Series 2001 Bonds</u>" means the County's outstanding Tax Increment Revenue Bonds, Series 2001, dated May 1, 2001, maturing December 1, 2003 through December 1, 2018 as follows:

"<u>Series 2003 Bonds</u>" means the County's Tax Increment Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2003, dated the date of closing.

"<u>Taxable Series 2003 Bonds</u>" means the County's Taxable Tax Increment Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2003, dated the date of closing.

"<u>Tax Increment</u>" means the total value of the tax incremental district minus the tax incremental base pursuant to § 11-9-19.

Section I.2. References to Resolution.

The words "hereof", "herein", "hereunder", and other words of similar import refer to this Bond Resolution as a whole.

Section 1.3. References to Articles, Sections, Etc.

References to Articles, Sections, and other subdivisions of this Bond Resolution are to the designated Articles, Sections, and other subdivisions of this Bond Resolution as originally adopted.

Section 1.4. <u>Headings</u>.

The headings of this Bond Resolution are for convenience only and shall not define or limit the provisions hereof.

ARTICLE II

FINDINGS

Section 2.1

It is hereby found and determined by the County Commission as follows:

(a) The refunding of the Refunded Bonds as set forth herein through the issuance of the Bonds will reorganize in debt service payable by Tax Increments over the term of the Refunded Bonds which is in the best interest of the County;

(b) It is advantageous to the County to deposit a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds and other funds of the County, if any, with the paying agent of the Refunded Bonds, will be sufficient to pay principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Refunded Bonds.

(c) The County hereby determines that all limitations upon the issuance of Bonds have been met and the Bonds are being authorized, issued and sold in accordance with the provisions of §§ 6-8B-30 to 6-8B-52, inclusive.

ARTICLE III

AUTHORITY, PLEDGE, AND COLLECTION OF TAXES Section 3.1 <u>Authorities</u>.

In order to (i) refund the Refunded Bonds and (ii) pay costs incident to the sale and issuance of the Bonds, there shall be issued pursuant to, and in accordance with, the provisions of the Act, the Bond Resolution, and other applicable provisions of law, Tax Increment Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2003 of the County and Taxable Tax Increment Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2003 of the County in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,148,058.24 plus costs of issuance.

Section 3.2 <u>Pledge</u>.

The County does hereby pledge so much of the collections of the Tax Increments as may be necessary to pay the principal, premium and interest on the outstanding Bonds and to maintain any debt service reserve established herein, if any. The Tax Increment is irrevocably pledged to the prompt and full payment of the principal of and interest on each and all of said Bonds as such principal and interest respectively become due.

Section 3.3. <u>Collection of Taxes</u>.

The County agrees and covenants to impose and collect the Tax Increment as long as the Bonds are outstanding in accordance with Act.

ARTICLE IV

FORM, TERMS, EXECUTION, AND TRANSFER OF BONDS Section 4.1. Authorized Bonds;

The aggregate principal amount of Bonds that may be issued under the Bond Resolution shall not exceed Two Million One Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Fifty-Eight and 24/100 dollars (\$2,148,058.24).

Section 4.2. Form, Execution and Terms of the Bonds.

The Bonds are issuable in the form, in the manner and upon the terms as set forth in the Purchase Agreement.

ARTICLE V

REDEMPTION OF BONDS PRIOR TO MATURITY

Section 5.1 Optional Redemption; mandatory redemption

The redemption provisions shall be set forth in the Purchase Agreement.

ARTICLE VI

REGISTRATION AGENT

Section 6.1. Appointment and Acceptance of Duties.

(a) The County hereby authorizes the County Auditor to appoint the registration and paying agent with respect to the Bonds and authorizes and directs the Registration Agent

to maintain Bond registration records with respect to the Bonds, to authenticate and deliver the Bonds as provided herein, either at original issuance, upon transfer, or as otherwise directed by the County, to effect transfers of the Bonds, to give all notices of redemption as required herein, to make all payments of principal and interest with respect to the Bonds as provided herein, to cancel and destroy Bonds which have been paid at maturity or upon earlier redemption or submitted for exchange or transfer, to furnish the County at least annually a certificate of destruction with respect to Bonds canceled and destroyed, and to furnish the County at least annually an audit confirmation of Bonds paid, Bonds Outstanding and payments made with respect to interest on the Bonds. The Chairman and the County Auditor, or either of them is hereby authorized to execute and the County Auditor is hereby authorized to attest such written agreement between the County and the Registration Agent, as they shall deem necessary or proper with respect to the obligations, duties and rights of the Registration Agent.

ARTICLE VII

DEFEASANCE OF BONDS

Section 7.1. Defeasance of Bonds.

(a) If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Bonds in any one or more of the following ways, to wit:

(a) By paying or causing to be paid, by deposit of sufficient funds as and when required with the Registration Agent, the principal of and interest on such Bonds as and when the same become due and payable;

(b) By depositing or causing to be deposited with any trust company or financial institution whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or similar federal agency and which has trust powers ("an Agent"; which Agent may be the Registration Agent) in trust or escrow, on or before the date of maturity or redemption, sufficient money or Federal Obligations, as hereafter defined, the principal of and interest on which, when due and payable, will provide sufficient moneys to pay or redeem such Bonds and to pay premium, if any, and interest thereon when due until the maturity or redemption date (provided, if such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to maturity thereof, proper notice of such redemption shall have been given or adequate provision shall have been made for the giving of such notice);

(c) By delivering such Bonds to the Registration Agent, for cancellation by it; and if the County shall also pay or cause to be paid all other sums payable hereunder by the County with respect to such Bonds, or make adequate provision therefore, and by resolution of the Governing Body instruct any such Escrow Agent to pay amounts when and as required to the Registration Agent for the payment of principal of and interest and redemption premiums, if any, on such Bonds when due, then and in that case the indebtedness evidenced by such Bonds shall be discharged and satisfied and all covenants, agreements and obligations of the County to the holders of such Bonds shall be fully discharged and satisfied and shall thereupon cease, terminate and become void. If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Bonds in the manner provided in either clause (a) or clause (b) above, then the registered owners thereof shall thereafter be entitled only to payment out of the money or Federal Obligations deposited as aforesaid.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, neither Federal Obligations nor moneys deposited with the Registration Agent pursuant to this Section nor principal or interest

payments on any such Federal Obligations shall be withdrawn or used for any purpose other than, and shall be held in trust for, the payment of the principal and premium, if any, and interest on said Bonds; provided that any cash received from such principal or interest payments on such Federal Obligations deposited with the Registration Agent, (A) to the extent such cash will not be required at any time for such purpose, shall be paid over to the County as received by the Registration Agent and (B) to the extent such cash will be required for such purpose at a later date, shall, to the extent practicable, be reinvested in Federal Obligations maturing at times and in amounts sufficient to pay when due the principal and premium, if any, and interest to become due on said Bonds on or prior to such redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be, and interest earned from such reinvestments shall be paid over to the County, as received by the Registration Agent. For the purposes of this Section, Federal Obligations shall mean direct obligations of, or obligations, the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States of America, or any agency thereof, obligations of any agency or instrumentality of the United States or any other obligations at the time of the purchase thereof are permitted investments under South Dakota Law for the purposes described in this Section, which Bonds or other obligations shall not be subject to redemption prior to their maturity other than at the option of the registered owner thereof.

ARTICLE VIII

SALE OF BONDS AND DEPOSIT OF PROCEEDS Section 8.1. Sale of Bonds.

The Bonds shall be sold to the Purchaser at a price of not less than one hundred percent (100%) of par less any original issue discount on the Bonds plus accrued interest. The Chairman and the County Auditor, or either of them, in consultation with the Purchaser, are authorized to make such changes in the structuring of the terms and sale of the Bonds, as they shall deem necessary to maximize the savings from the refunding of the Refunded Bonds. In this regard, they, or either of them, in consultation with the Purchaser, are authorized to cause to be sold an aggregate principal amount of the Bonds less than that authorized herein, cause fewer than all the Refunded Bonds to be refunded, to sell any or all of the Bonds as term Bonds with annual mandatory redemption requirements which will produce substantially the same annual principal reductions as authorized herein, to change the dated date of the Bonds, and to adjust principal and interest payment dates and redemption dates of the Bonds. The Chairman and the County Auditor, or either of them, are hereby authorized to execute and the County Auditor is authorized to attest the Purchase Agreement with the Purchaser providing for the purchase and sale of the Bonds. The Purchase Agreement shall be in form and content acceptable to the Chairman and County Auditor, the execution thereof by either of them to constitute conclusive evidence thereof, and approved as to form and legality by resident attorney; provided the Purchase Agreement effects the sale of the Bonds in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, and is not inconsistent with the terms hereof. The Chairman, the County Auditor, and the County Auditor, or any of them, are authorized to cause the Bonds to be authenticated and delivered by the Registration Agent to the Purchaser and to execute, publish, and deliver all certificates and documents, including the Official Statement, and closing certificates and documents, as they shall deem necessary in connection with the sale and delivery of the Bonds.

Section 8.3. Disposition of Bond Proceeds.

The proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be disbursed as follows:

(a) An amount representing accrued interest on the Bonds from the dated date to the closing date shall be deposited to the appropriate fund of the County to be used to pay interest on the Bonds on the first interest payment date following delivery of the Bonds.(b) An amount which, together with other legally available funds of the County, if any, and investment earnings thereon and on said Bond proceeds, will be sufficient to pay principal of and premium and interest on the Refunded Bonds to their earliest optional redemption dates shall be transferred to the paying agent to be applied to the payment of interest and principal on the Refunded Bonds;

(c) The remaining proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be used to pay the costs of issuance and sale of the Bonds including necessary legal, accounting and fiscal expenses, printing, engraving, advertising and similar expenses, administrative and clerical costs, rating agency fees, Registration Agent fees, and other necessary miscellaneous expenses incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. Any funds remaining after payment of said expenses shall be used to pay interest on the Bonds on the first interest payment date following delivery of the Bonds.

Section 8.4. Tax Matters.

(a) The County covenants and agrees with the registered owners from time to time of the Series 2003 Bonds that it will not take or permit to be taken by any of its officers, employees or agents any action which would cause the interest on the Series 2003 Bonds to become includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code and applicable Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations"), and covenants to take any and all actions within its powers to ensure that the basic interest on the Series 2003 Bonds will not become includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code and applicable Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations"), and covenants to take any and all actions within its powers to ensure that the basic interest on the Series 2003 Bonds will not become includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code and the Regulations.

(b) The Chairman and the County Auditor, being the officers of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Series 2003 Bonds pursuant to this Resolution are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the Purchaser thereof a certificate in accordance with the provisions of section 148 of the Code, and Section 1.148-2(b) of the Regulations, stating that on the basis of facts, estimates and circumstances in existence on the date of issue and delivery of the Series 2003 Bonds, it is reasonably expected that the proceeds of the Series 2003 Bonds will be used in a manner that would not cause the Series 2003 Bonds to be "arbitrage Series 2003 Bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations.

(c) The County hereby represents that the Series 2003 Bonds qualify for the exception for two-year Construction Expenditure to the arbitrage rebate provisions contained in Section 148(f) of the Code. If, notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 of this Section, the arbitrage rebate provisions of Section 148(f) of the Code apply to the Series 2003 Bonds, the County hereby covenants and agrees to make the determinations, retain records and rebate to the United States the amounts at the times and in the manner required by said Section 148(f).

(d) The County shall file with the Secretary of the Treasury a statement concerning the Series 2003 Bonds containing the information required by Section 149(e) of the Code.
(e) Pursuant to Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Code, the County hereby designates the Series 2003 Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. The County hereby represents that it does not anticipate that

obligations bearing interest not includable in gross income for purposes of federal income taxation under Section 103 of the Code (including refunding obligations as provided in Section 265 (b) (3) of the Code and including "qualified 501 (c) (3) Series 2003 Bonds" but excluding other "private activity Series 2003 Bonds," as defined in Sections 141(a) and 145(a) of the Code) will be issued by or on behalf of the County and all "subordinate entities" of the County in 2003 in an amount greater than \$10,000,000.

ARTICLE IX

NOTICE OF REFUNDING

9.1 Notice of Refunding.

Prior to the issuance of the Bonds, notice of the County's intention to refund the Refunded Bonds shall be given, at the direction of the County Auditor, by the respective paying agents for the Refunded Bonds, via first-class mail to the respective Registered Owners of the Refunded Bonds.

ARTICLE X

MISCELLANEOUS

Section 10.1. Failure to Present Bonds.

(a) Subject to the provisions of Section 4.7 hereof, in the event any Bond shall not be presented for payment when the principal or redemption price hereof becomes due, either at maturity or at the date fixed for prior redemption thereof or otherwise, and in the event monies sufficient to pay such Bond shall be held by the Registration Agent for the benefit of the Owner thereof, all liability of the County to such Owner for the payment of such Bond shall forthwith cease, determine, and be completely discharged. Whereupon, the Registration Agent shall hold such monies, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the Owner of such Bond who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such monies for any claim under the Resolution or on, or with respect to, said Bond.
(b) If any Bond shall not be presented for payment within a period of five years following the date when such Bond becomes due, whether by maturity or otherwise, the Registration Agent shall, subject to the provisions of any applicable escheat or other similar law, pay to the County any monies then held by the Registration Agent for the payment of such Bond shall (subject to the defense of any applicable statute of limitation) thereafter constitute an unsecured obligation of the County.

Section 10.2. Payments Due on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays.

In any case where the date of maturity or interest on or principal of any Bond, or the date fixed for redemption of any Bond, shall be a Saturday or Sunday or shall be, at the place designated for payment, a legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions similar to the Registration Agent are authorized by law to close, then the payment of the interest on, or the principal, or the redemption price of, such Bond need not be made on such date but must be made on the next succeeding day not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday or a day upon which banking institutions similar to the Registration Agent are authorized by law to close, with the same force and effect as if made on the date of maturity or the date fixed for redemption, and no interest shall accrue for the period after such date.

Section 10.3. Miscellaneous Acts.

The appropriate officers of the County are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to do any and all such acts and things, and to execute, acknowledge, deliver, and, if applicable file or record, or cause to be filed or recorded, in any appropriate public offices, all such documents, instruments, and certifications, in addition to those acts,

things, documents, instruments, and certifications hereinbefore authorized and approved, as may, in their discretion, be necessary or desirable to implement or comply with the intent of the Bond Resolution, or any of the documents herein authorized and approved, or for the authorization, issuance, and delivery by the County of the Bonds.

Section 10.4. <u>Amendment</u>.

The County Commission is hereby authorized to make such amendments to the Bond Resolution as will not impair the rights of the Bondholders.

Section 10.5. No Recourse Under Bond Resolution or on Bonds.

All stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County contained in the Initial Resolutions or the Resolution shall be deemed to be the stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County and not of any officer, director, or employee of the County in his or her individual capacity, and no recourse shall be had for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds or for any claim based thereon or on the Initial Resolution or the Resolution against any officer, director, or employee of the County or against any official or individual executing the Bonds.

Section 10.6. Partial Invalidity.

If any one or more of the provisions of the Bond Resolution, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, by final decree of any court of lawful jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, but the Bond Resolution, and the exhibits and attachments thereto, shall be construed the same as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, or therein, as the case may be.

Section 10.7. Conflicting Resolutions Repealed.

All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 10.8. Effective Date.

This Bond Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of the County requiring it.

(added) SECTION 2.04.1 DRAINAGE PERMITS IN LP1, LP2, AND LP3

DISTRICTS Due to the unique situation with the LP1, LP2, and LP3 Districts, a proposed building permit being issued in these areas shall require information relating to the drainage that will be conducted or affected in the course of the building permit being completed. New drainage must be identified as a part of the building permit, a drainage permit, and drainage plan, detailing how runoff from said building would be address is required. The person or entity pursuing the drainage work and permit would be required to obtain the necessary signed waivers of adjoining land owners, the appropriate lake association, or homeowner's association, and any road district, if applicable.

(updated) SECTION 2.05 DRAINAGE APPLICATION FEE A non-refundable fee of \$50 shall be charged for the filing of drainage applications other than routine maintenance when the applicant has obtained the written approval of all downstream landowners <u>for 1 mile downstream of drain outlet</u>. (removed within the legal section of the drain outlet and for 1 mile downstream in the adjacent legal section).

REGISTER OF DEEDS NEW DRAINAGE PERMIT WITH WAIVERS (must be done ¹/₄ section with waivers)

- 1. When people come in for new drainage permit forms, ask if they have filed their drainage maps. If they have not filed drainage maps send them to NRCS and return for filing. If they have, ask what quarter section or more, they plan on doing the new drainage in and furnish them with copy or copies of the map as necessary along with waiver forms.
- 2. When they bring back the permit application (per ¹/₄) with all the necessary waivers signed, get out the township directory, go to appropriate township and have them show you what signature corresponds to what piece of property in the directory. Waivers are required from all downstream landowners for 1 mile downstream of the drain outlet.

If applicant owns any part of land downstream for 1 mile downstream of the drain outlet, MUST sign and date waiver state to that effect.

3. When you are satisfied that the proper waiver signatures have been furnished then have them draw on the ¹/₄ section map or maps you furnished them where the drainage will be and what type and then collect \$50 per ¹/₄, and file the permit or permits.

The application fee shall be interpreted to apply to each individual landowner where more than one landowner signs a single drainage application.

4. Tell that person getting the permit to bring in a detailed map furnished by the contractor showing what has actually been done and file it with the permit.

Any drainage maps filed after October 1, 2003 must be marked or flagged as such and will require a \$25 fee per quarter section for <u>maintenance.</u>

NEW DRAINAGE PERMIT WITH HEARING

- 1. When people come in for new drainage permit forms, ask if they have filed their drainage maps. If they have not filed drainage maps send them to NRCS and return for filing. If they have, ask what quarter section or more, they plan on doing the new drainage in and furnish them with copy or copies of the map.
- 2. Have applicant draw on the ¹/₄ section map or maps you furnished them where the drainage will be and what type. Send to Auditor's Office for scheduling of a public hearing.
