Public Health Nursing Services



Pregnancy Care

- 4 Available to all pregnant or postpartum women and infants in South Dakota.
- Services are provided by a public health nurse to support healthy pregnancies and families.
- Pregnant women receive an initial risk assessment to help identify needs and connect with resources.
- Monthly nurse visits supplement prenatal care with your healthcare provider.
- Operation Postpartum women and infants are also eligible for a nurse visit, in addition to their provider's follow-up.

O Nurse visits may include:

- Weight and blood pressure checks
- Health assessments
- Education and emotional support
- Referrals to community services
- Communication with your healthcare provider
 Breastfeeding support and education

Maternal Depression Screening:

- All pregnant and postpartum women are offered a mental health screening during nurse visits.
- Includes use of validated screening tools, supportive conversation, and referral to your provider if needed.

Safe Sleep Support:

- ▶ Education is provided based on the latest American Academy of Pediatrics guidelines.
- A nurse will assess your baby's sleep environment and offer quidance to keep your baby safe.
- Eligible families may receive a free pack-nplay if a safe sleep option is not available.

Immunizations

- Review of your child's or family's vaccine records.
- Age-appropriate vaccinations provided.
- **©** Education on vaccine safety and benefits.
- Scheduling of future vaccine appointments.
- Influenza vaccination services for workplaces.

Child and Adolescent Services

Developmental Screening

- For children ages 2 to 60 months.
- ▶ Parent-led screening tools help detect normal development or possible delays.
- ▶ Tools offered:
 - » ASQ (Ages and Stages Questionnaire): tracks development.
 - » ASQ:SE (Social-Emotional): focuses on emotional and social skills.

Oral Health

- For eligible children 6 months through 6 years; and eligible school aged children
- A nurse provides an Oral Health Risk Assessment.
- ▶ Eligible children may receive fluoride varnish to help prevent cavities.

School Health

- Health screenings and education available upon school district request.
- School-based vaccination services offered.

Health & Safety Information

- Guidance on nutrition and healthy food choices.
- Referrals to community resources for additional support.

O In-office screenings available:

- Blood pressure
- Vision and Hearing
- Employer-based health screenings and education available.
- Services ordered by a healthcare provider can also be delivered by the nurse.

Public Health Nursing Services



Pregnancy Care

- Available to any pregnant or postpartum South Dakota women and/or infants
- Services are delivered by a nurse with the purpose to improve outcomes that help to support healthy pregnancies and families
- Pregnant women will receive an initial risk assessment to help identify needs/social determinants of health with the goal to identify resources and educational needs
- Monthly visits with a nurse that are supplemental to regular prenatal care with their healthcare provider
- A nurse visit will be offered to postpartum women and/or infants that will be supplemental to a follow-up visit with their healthcare provider
- Nurse visits will include weight check, blood pressure check, health assessment, education, support, referrals to community resources, and communication with their healthcare provider as individual needs arise
- Breastfeeding support and education

Safe Sleep

- Safe sleep education will be provided to all pregnant/postpartum women and caregivers of infants based on the latest guidance by the American Academy of Pediatrics
- A visit will be completed with a nurse to assess for a safe sleep environment and to provide education
- Families without a safe sleep environment may be eligible to receive a pack-n-play

Maternal Depression Screening

- All pregnant and postpartum women are eligible for a depression screening with a nurse
- The visit will consist of completing the screening tool(s), education, support, and referral to provider, if needed

Hours: Monday 9am-3pm

Developmental Screening

- All families with children 2 months 60 months of age will be offered a parent-led screening tool(s) to complete to help promote early detection and identify normal development
- The two screening tools offered are the Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) helps to capture developmental delays or disorders. Age and Stages Questionnaires: Social Emotional (ASQ-SE) helps to capture emotional and social competencies

Immunizations

- Review vaccine records of patients
- Provide age-appropriate vaccines
- Educate families on vaccines
- Schedule follow up vaccinations as necessary
- Employer-based influenza services

Oral Health

- For eligible children 6 months through 6 years; and eligible school aged children
- The assessment will determine those children eligible to receive fluoride varnish to help reduce dental caries

School Health

- Health screenings and education as requested by the school district
- School-based immunization services

Health & Safety Information

- Guidance on nutritional needs and healthy food choices
- Linking individuals and families to community resources
- In-office screenings for blood pressure, vision, and hearing
- Employer based health screenings and education
- Office services ordered by a healthcare provider
