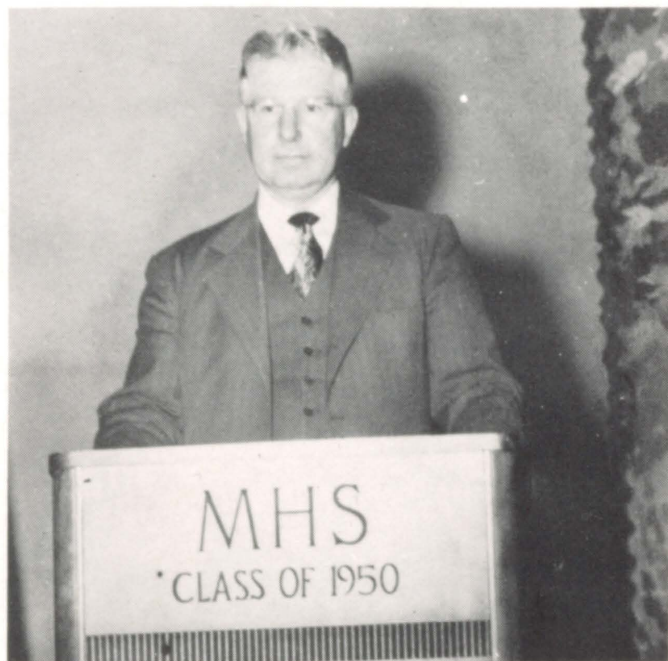


Administration

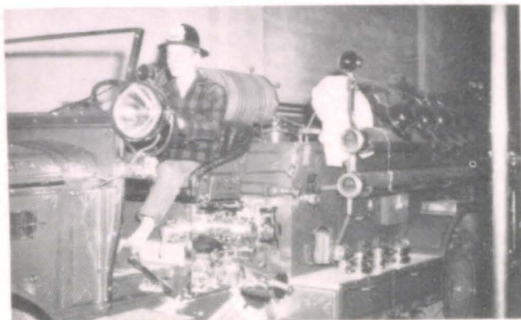
