We Dedicate . . .

To the newly organized Lake Central High School of Madison, South Dakota. we dedicate our 1964 Interlakes. The voters found it necessary to form the new school when Beadle High School, a combined grade school-high school used by G.B.S.T.C. for teacher training purposes, went up in smoke January 19, 1963. Students of Beadle received their classroom instruction in the old Madison Community Hospital.

After reorganizing the school districts in the sum-

mer of 1963, the students of the former Beadle High merged with the students of Central as one school, increasing the enrollment from 330 to 480.


The citizens of the Madison area realized the desperate need for a larger, better high school. On December 10, 1963, a \$1.3 million school bond was passed with 71%, of the votes cast. The new high school, located by the new General Beadle College Armory, is expected to be completed by fall, 1965.

The architect's plans for the new Madison Central High show a modern, well equipped institution of learning.



Tables were a new addition to the gymnasium during the noon hour. These multi-purpose tables served as cafeteria tables, study desks, and props for table tennis boards.






The balcony of the auditorium was converted into two classrooms by building partitions. Those classrooms proved satisfactory except for the thin walls.










Race to Victory












