










Follies Fun For Everyone






This year with a great number of returning wrestlers, the Madison team won a total of 67 Matches. They got off to a good start by winning their first match against the Flandreau Indians 34-20.










At one of our assemblies a gentleman from Chicago presented a reading entitled "A Man Without a Country" to the student body of Central.






