






1968 Homecoming Was




The Madison High School grid season ended last fall with Madison in possession on the Watertown 20 yd. line. Watertown had scored in the final two minutes to go ahead 21-20. They couldn't beat the clock, however, and finished the season with a painful 2-7 won lost record. "But the spirit of that last effort of '67 has carried over to this year," Coach Dean Koster said.







One example of his worthiness for his honors was his unbelievable desperation shot from 25 ft. out with two seconds left on the clock to give MHS a 77-76 win over Pipestone.












Gymnastics





We praise our track team for their efforts, great endeavors, and the many trophies they presented to Madison High School.







- 4. Sponsoring two Socials.




