A man in a wheelchair, a girl with an acid-burned face, and a man with a neurological disease. A love story? Probably the most unusual play about love MHS has put on. "Tell Me That You Love Me, Junie Moon" was the 1977 all-school play. A cast of 17 put on the three-act drama on Friday, May 6, and Saturday, May 7. Special make-up by Bob Fischbach was used on Harriet Deming (Junie Moon) to make her face appear terribly scarred. Kyle Friedow (Arthur) limped as evidence of his progressive neurological disease, and Bob Burg (Warren) was confined to a wheelchair because of his "paraplegia". The play was a mixture of comedy and tragedy as the three of them decided to live together and face the world themselves. Tragedy appeared when Arthur had a seizure and afterwards his health failed rapidly. He fell in love with Junie Moon, but in an emotional ending, he died and never got to hear her say that she loved him. Judy Kroll was the director of the play and Charles Page was technical director.

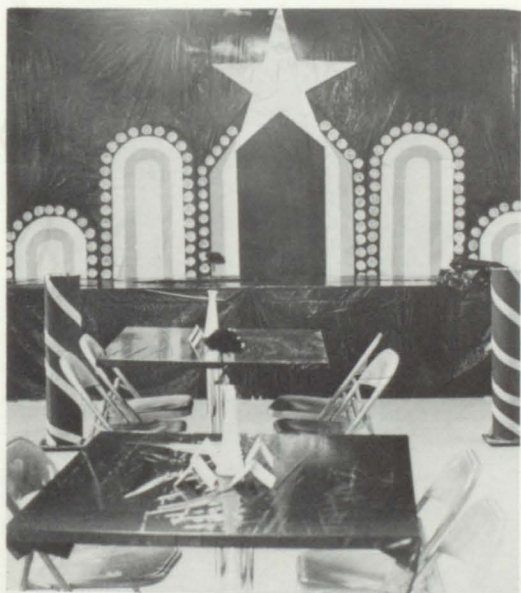

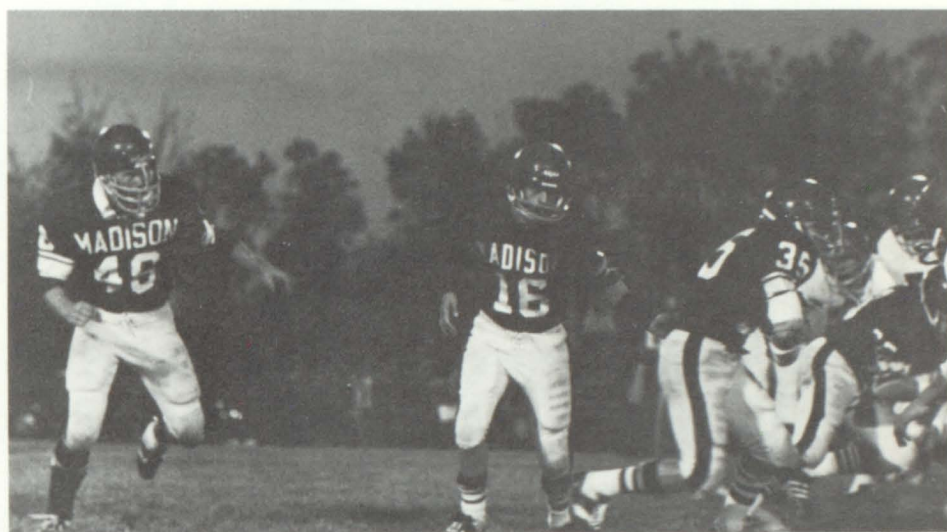
The varsity football team ended its season with a 4—5 record, 3—4 ESD. Dan Johnson was named most valuable player and Marcus Hepler named most improved player for the 1976 season. "We lost some close games that could have gotten us up to second or third place in the conference," said Coach Dean Koster. "As a whole, the team was very competitive, as good as any team in the ESD conference." The Bulldogs upset third-ranked Huron 18—0 on the home field the last game of the season. The sophomores ended the season with a 1—3 record, with a number of top players on both offense and defense. "It was a successful season" said Coach Tom Osterberg, "with the number of players who went out for the team." Next year Osterberg hopes for more players and time for scrimmages. Delane Poppe, also sophomore coach, said, "I hope the players gained some knowledge of the fundamentals of the game," and felt that the players improved. The freshmen earned a 2—4 record on the year under the coaching of Norm Johnson and Jim Cordts. Cordts said that this season was better than last season because out of 25, there were 20 players who could play on the varsity team in the future.

The sophomores earned an 8—8 record for the season. "The team was evenly balanced," said Coach Tim Gusso, considering the number of sophomores who played on the varsity team.

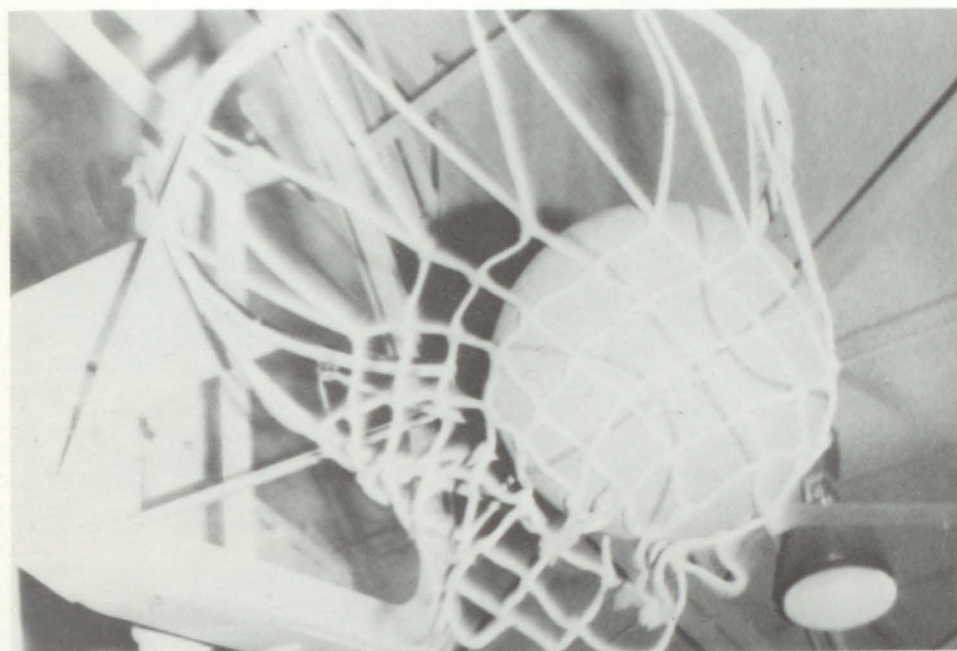
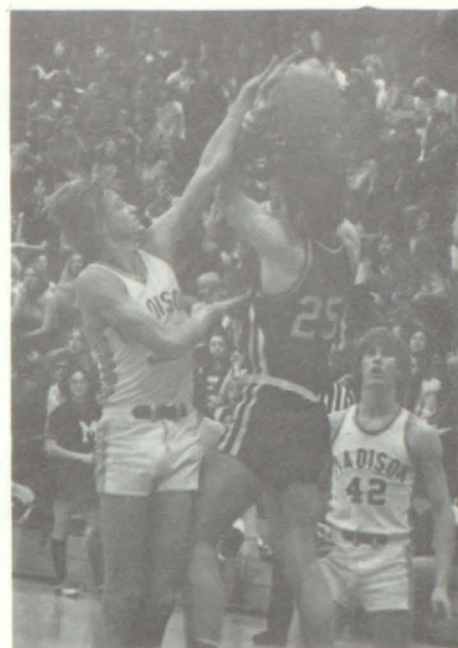
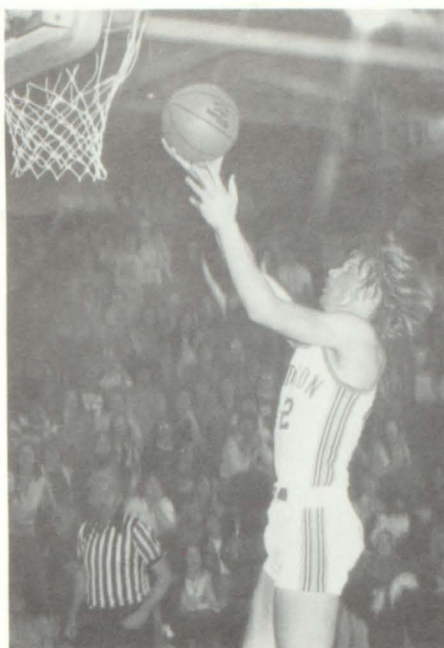
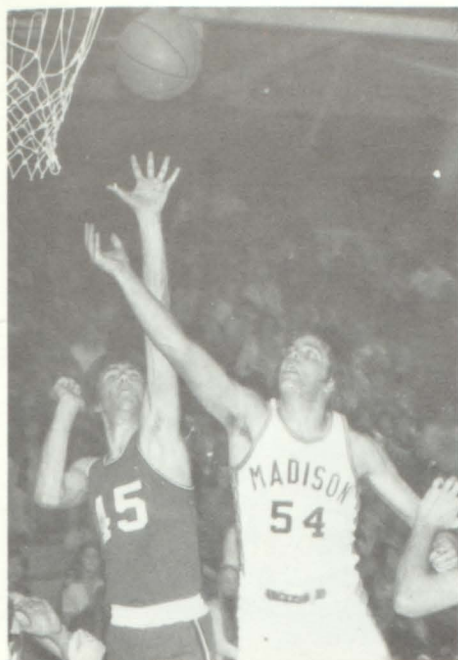

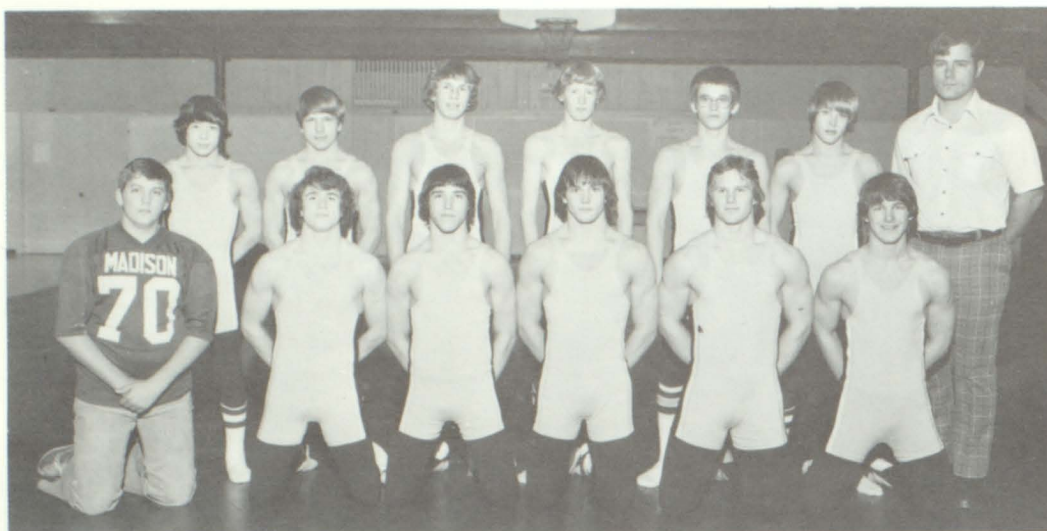


BOY'S BASKETBALL

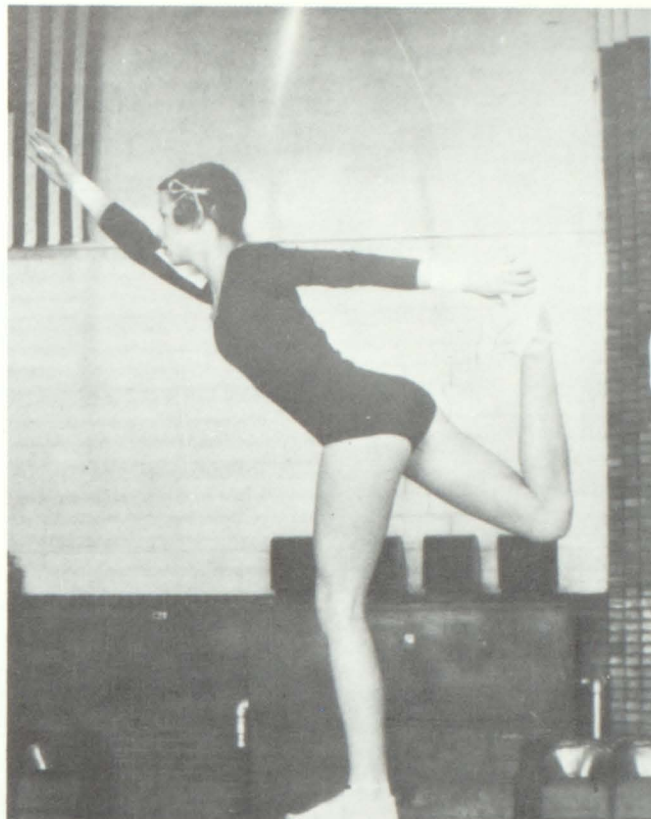

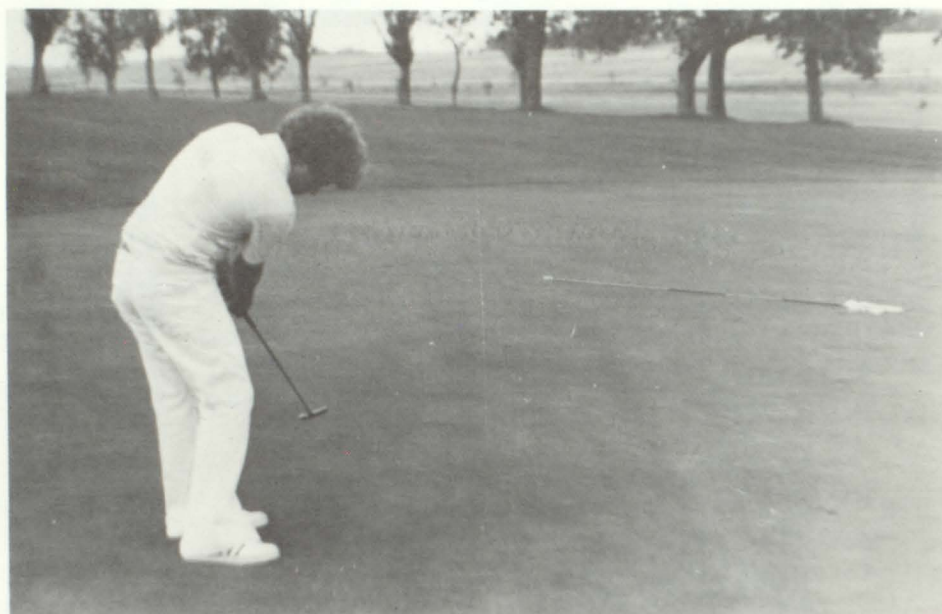
GOLF

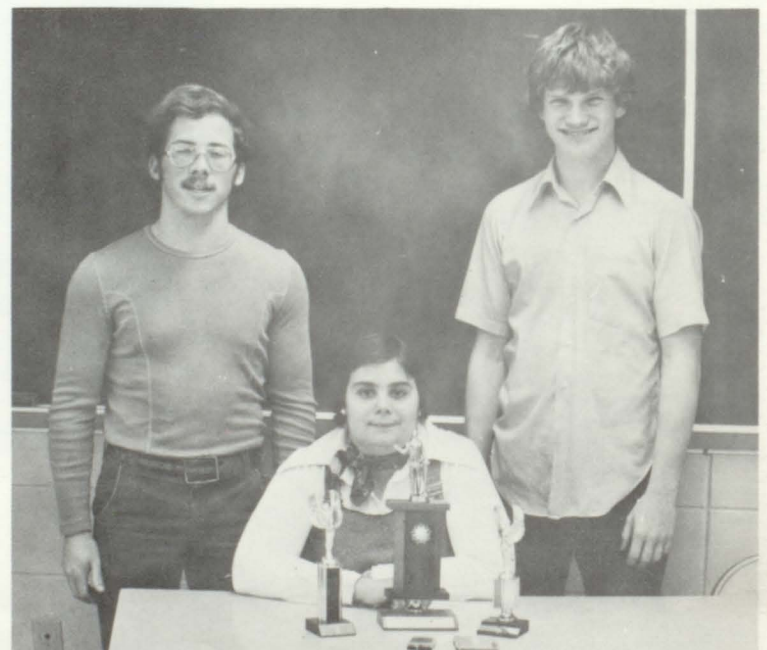

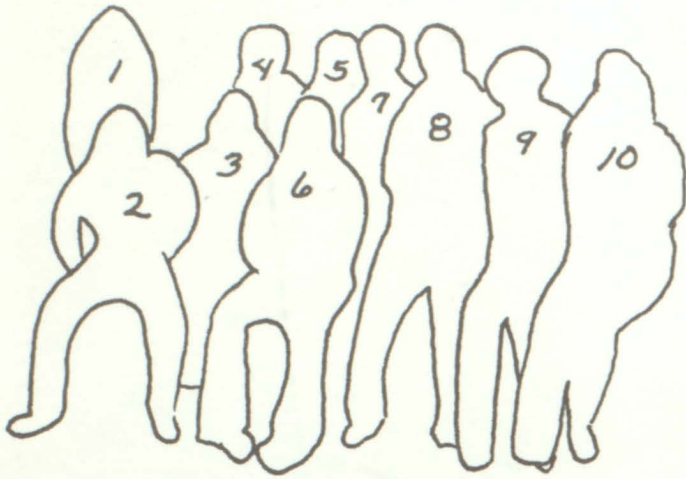

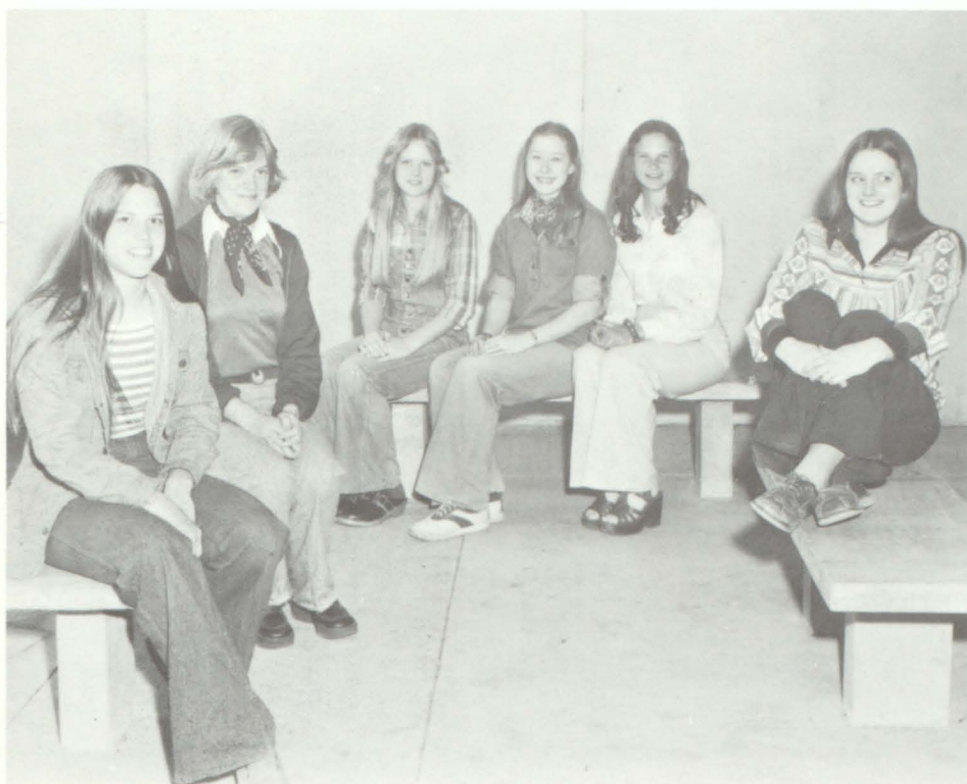

GIRLS' and BOYS' STATE DELEGATES

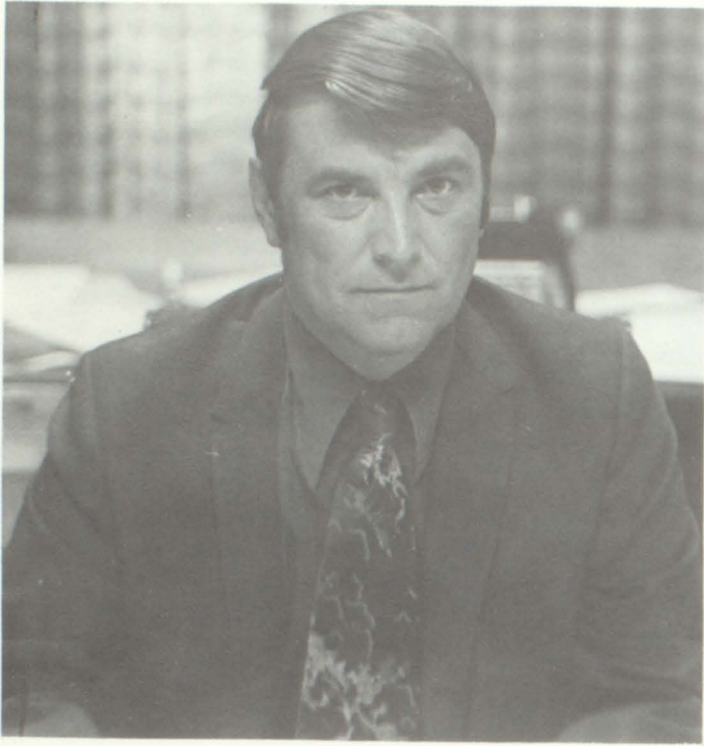
