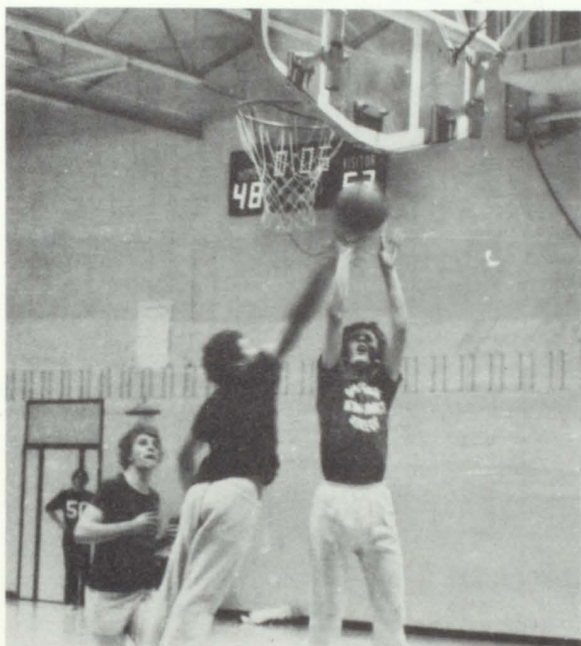

Graduation address was given by Dr. Sherwood O. Berg, president of South Dakota State University. Dr. Berg compared conditions of 30 years ago with present times. He talked of three challenges that the graduates of 1980 face that were not a major problem facing past generations of Americans. The challenges are: energy shortages, high inflation, and worldwide food shortages. He challenged the 1980 graduates with the responsibility of solving these problems and not dismissing them by blaming government. He stated, "When we have governmental problems it usually indicates that we have problems with ourselves as we are the government." Dr. Berg challenged the seniors to build for themselves and others a life of dignity and meaning. He closed by saying, "May 29th is the 100th anniversary of the 1st successful climb of Mount Everest. Seniors you have climbed your first mountain."

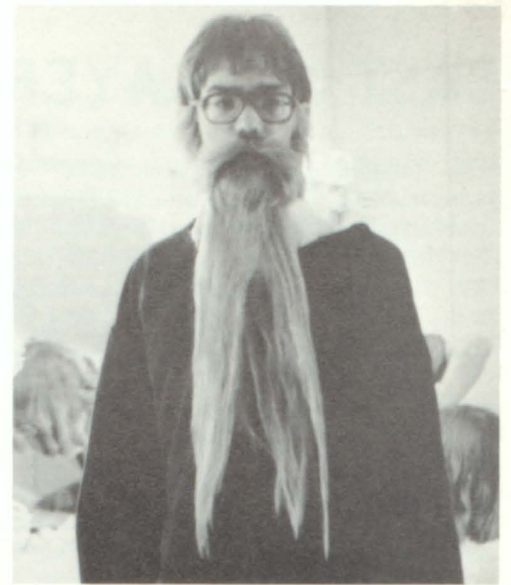

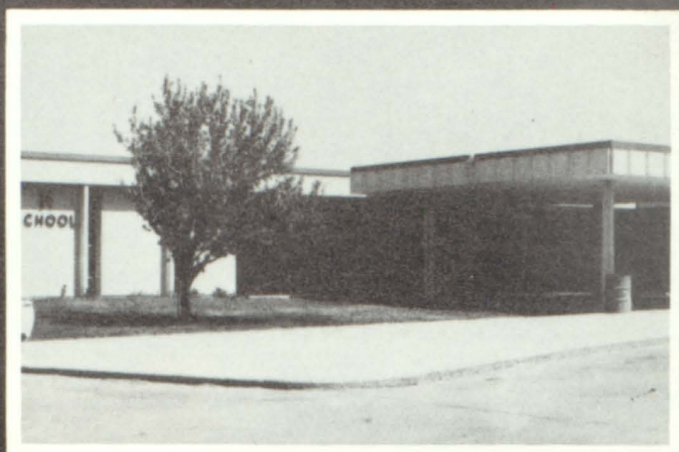
