



The play takes place in Chinon, France in 1183 A.D. Chinon is part of Europe now under English rule. King Henry II, the first of the Plantagenet dynasty is in power. Henry had ascended to the throne by way of war and marriage. He became Duke of Normandy in 1150, Count of Anjou in 1151 and in 1152, by marrying Eleanor of Aquitaine, after her marriage to Louis VII of France was annulled, Duke of Aquitaine. By 1153, he became King of England. Henry's reign brought about a working judicial system but was still under his anarchy. In an attempt to gain more control, he made his best friend, Thomas Beckett, Archbishop of Cantebury. A quarrel developed between them which led to Thomas' murder (1170) by four knights who thought they were acting on Henry's orders. In 1173-1174 Henry put down a rebellion led by his and Eleanor's sons - Richard, Geoffrey and John but it was not to be the end of it all. Henry's reign ended tragically. Eleanor resented the fact that Henry treated her inheritance as his own and encouraged her sons to revolt at every opportunity. The King of France, Phillip, helped them and in 1189 they had Henry at their mercy. Heartbroken at the discovery that even his youngest son John had betrayed him. Henry died at Chinon on July 6, 1189 muttering "Shame, shame on an anointed King."
