ONE ACT PLAY





The 1984-85 debate season was very successful, with many people advancing to final rounds of competition and a total of 39 trophies won. The season of invitational tournaments got off to a good start at Beresford. The Junior Varsity debate team of Laura Meyer, Jeanelle Robson, Erich Gilbert and Brett Carlson took 2nd place, and Brett won a superior speaker award. The next contest, at Aberdeen saw the J.V. team (with Max Richter in place of Erich Gilbert) with a 3rd, Suellen Hageman with a second in novice extemp, and Carmen Means with a second in Lincoln-Douglas debate and 3rd in Oratory. At the Brookings Bell Special, the final tournament of 1984, the J.V. team won 3rd place, and Carmen placed 1st in L.D., 2nd in International Extemp, and won a speaker award.

The first invitational tournament of 1985 was the Lincoln H.S. Silverbowl. Ken Meyer won 6th in Domestic extemp, Heather Means won 4th in Novice Oratory, and Carmen Means won 5th in International Extemp and 1st in Lincoln Douglas. At the Pi Kappa Delta tournament at NSC in January, Carmen again won 1st place in L-D. At the Karl E. Mundt Tournament held in Madison, Ken placed 3rd in Domestic Extemp, and Carmen won second in international Extemp and 1st in Lincoln-Douglas.

Madison debated at 3 Central Forensic Conference Tournaments in Mitchell during the 1984-85 season. The trophies won at these tournaments were: Elizabeth Haar - 1st in novice extemp, Max Richter - 2nd Varsity Oratory, Ken Meyer - 1st - LD and 1st Varsity Extemp, Heather Means - 2 seconds in Novice Oratory, Carmen Means - 2 seconds in LD, 2 firsts in Varsity Oratory, 1 first and 1 second in Varsity Extemp, the JV team (Jeanelle, Laura, Erich, Brett) 2 firsts, and the debate team of Mike Benning, Elizabeth Haar, Ryan Gienapp and Max Richter - 1st place in novice debate. All debators won speakers awards. Madison won the debate sweepstakes trophy, and the travelling trophy for total sweepstakes points.

The culmination of the debate season was the 2 national-qualifying tournaments - N.F.L. and state debate. At the National Forensic Tournament in Sioux Falls, Ken Meyer placed 8th in Domestic Extemp and Carmen Means won second in International Extemp and first in LD, earning her the right to compete at Nationals in Eau Claire in June.

After being co-champions in the Regional debate contest in Huron, the champ team of Ken Meyer and Tim Ewald advanced to the State Debate Tournament. They were quarter-finalists, tying for 4th place in the state.

BULLDOGS LEAVE ESD CONFERENCE

The Madison Bulldogs played their first season of non-ESD Conference football in sixty years. It was in 1924 that Madison entered the Eastern South Dakota Football Conference. Because of declining enrollment at Madison High School and the increased size of the other ESD Schools the decision to drop out of the EDS Conference was made by the Board of Education. Recommendations of the coaching staff, school faculty and community sports fans influenced the decision. Some local ESD fans decried the decision saying that Madison was able to compete in the ESD, but records indicate that in sixty years Madison's only conference championship was a three-way tie in 1965. Most years the Bulldogs ended up in the bottom half of the conference standings. This year the Bulldogs played an independent schedule. In 1986 they will be competing in the reorganized Big Eight Conference with Brandon, West Central, Lennox, Canton and Vermillion. This should give the Bulldogs a better chance of bringing home the spoils. Increased school loyalty and support is expected. Hopefully, there will be less injuries such as have plagued the team in former years because of being outnumbered and outsized.
