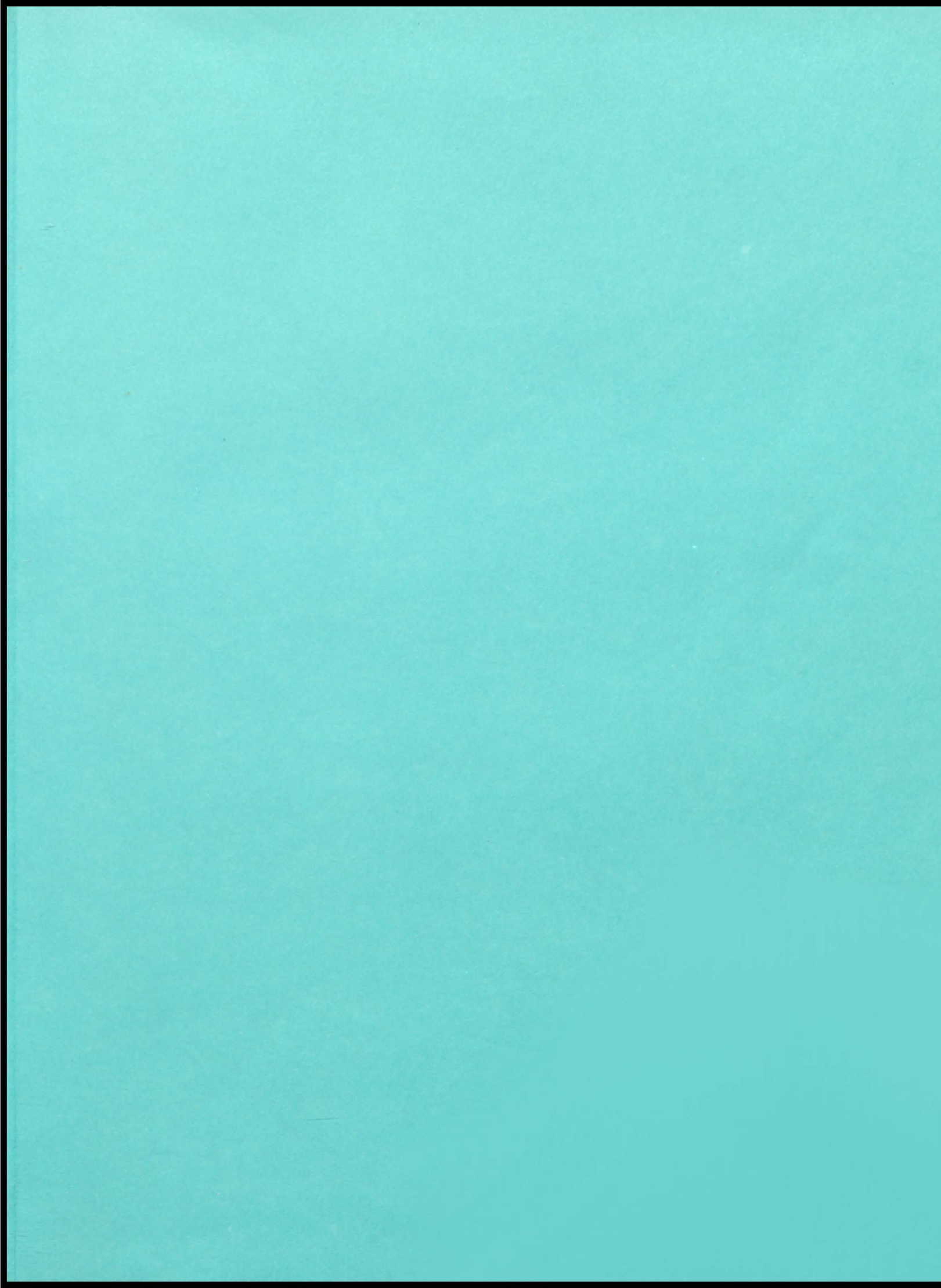


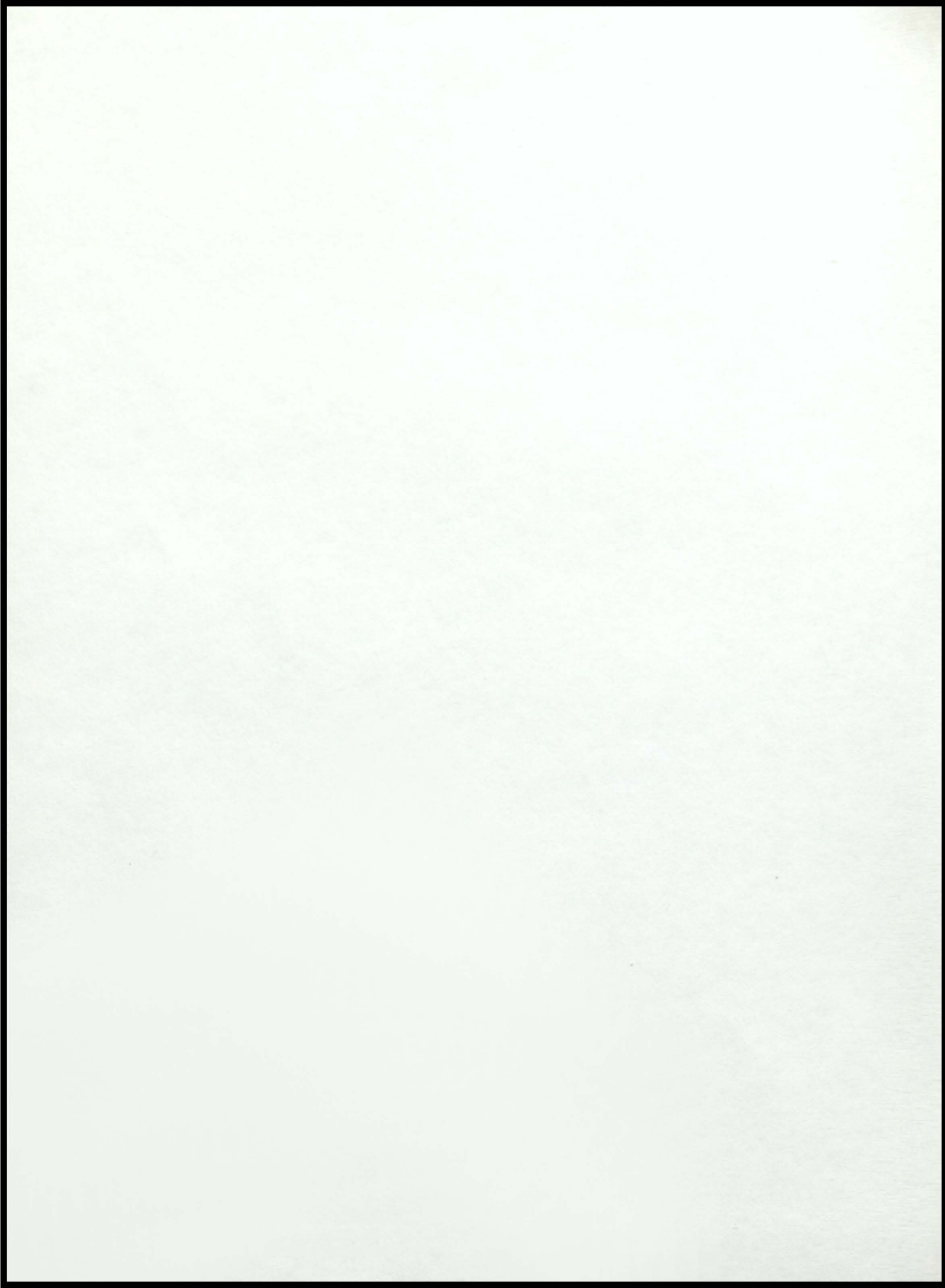

Coach Jerome Garry said of the 1990 season, "The Bulldog football team set out to begin a new trend. Our goal was to achieve what no MHS team in the '80s could do - finish with a winning record.

"Well, we fell short of our goal - disappointingly short. Injuries riddled the 'Dogs all season with more than 20 players missing at least one game due to injuries.

"In retrospect, I feel somewhat consoled in the fact that our conference was represented by not just one but two state champions combining for three of our losses.

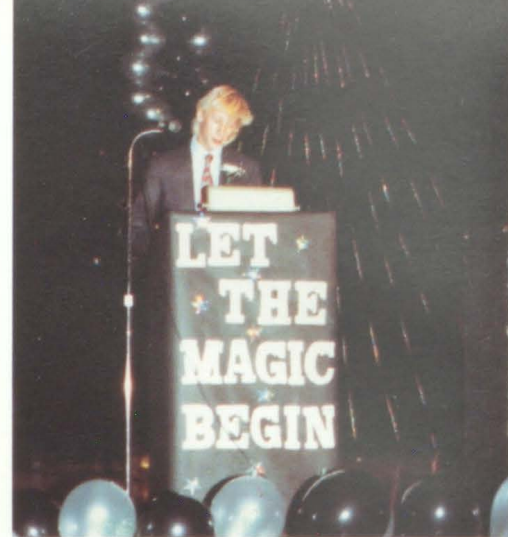

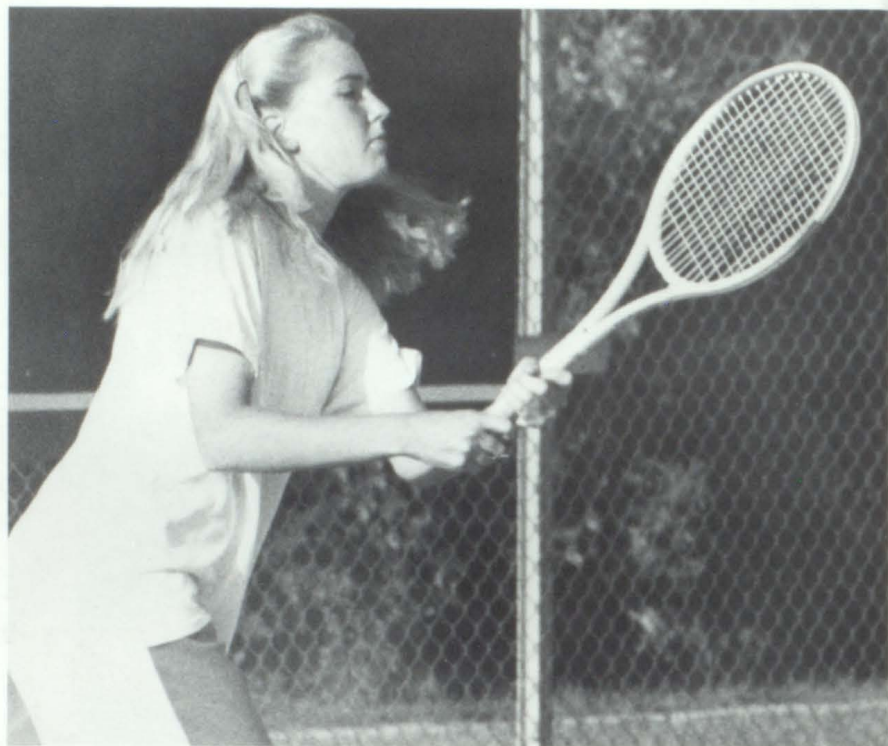

The next week found us at the Festival of Bands in Sioux Falls. In our class it was simply another 3rd place.

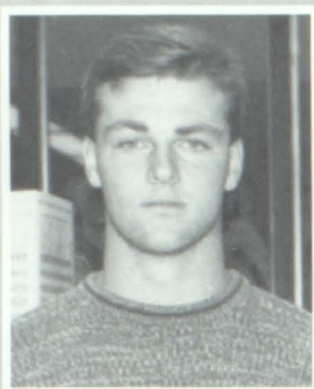

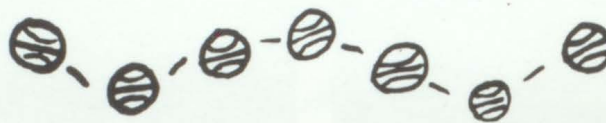

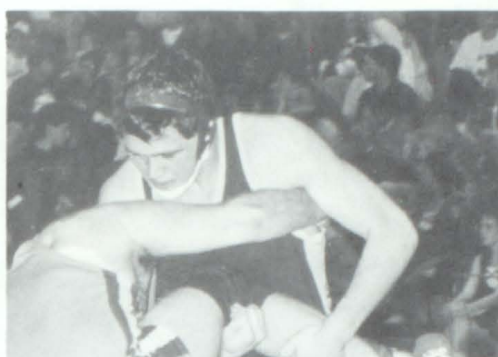

The 1991 STATE FHA meeting was held April 14-16 in Sioux Falls. The theme was "Future Unknown-Determine Your Own."

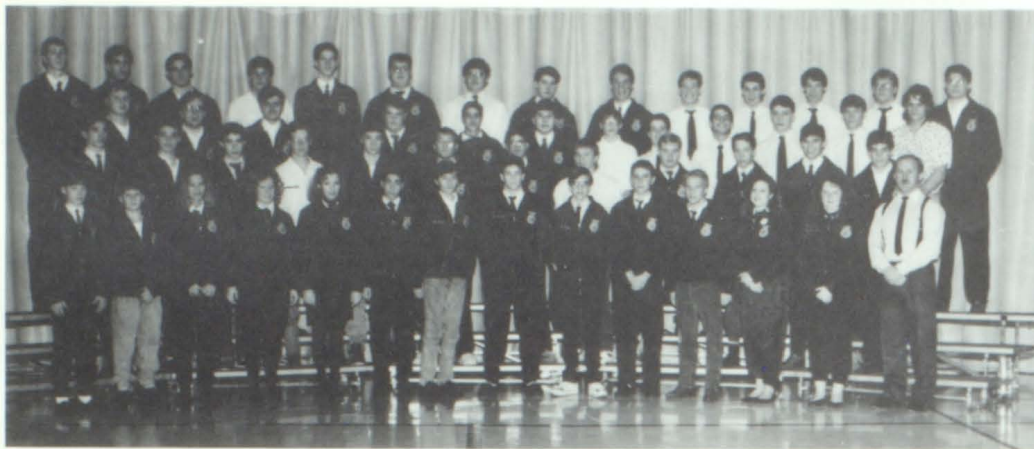

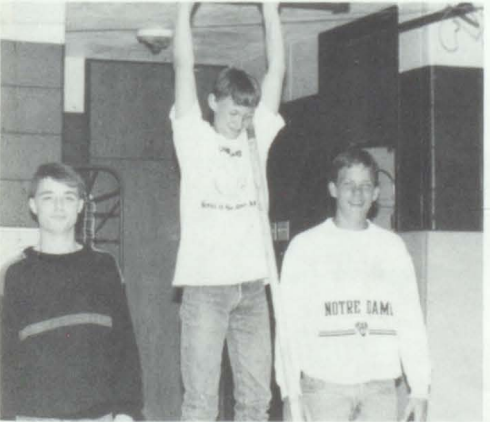

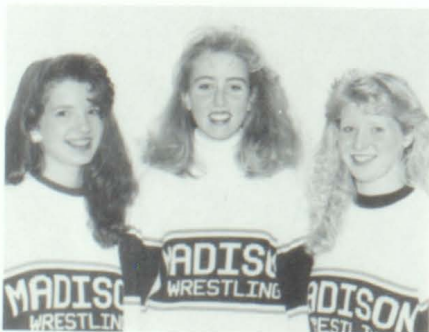

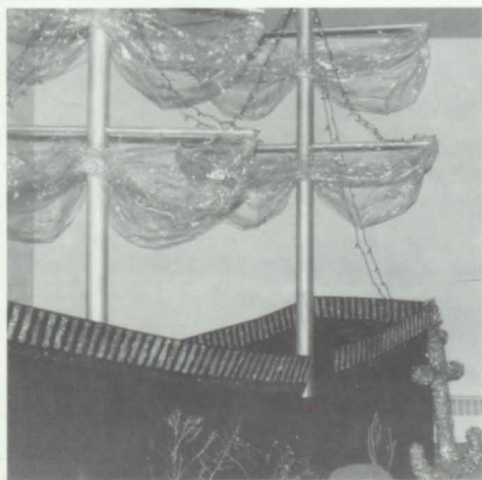

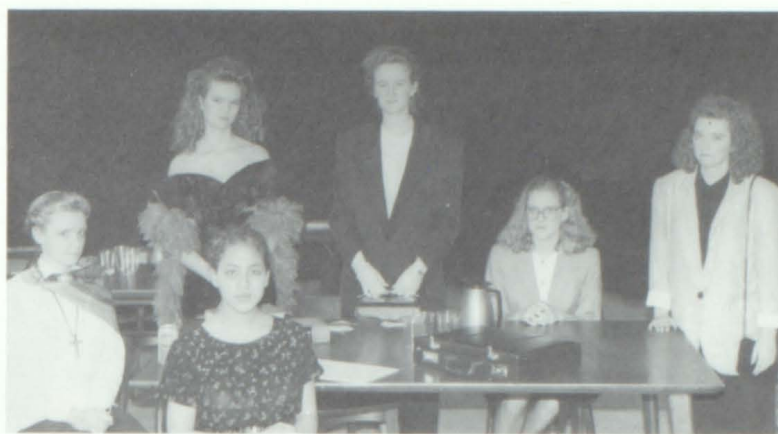
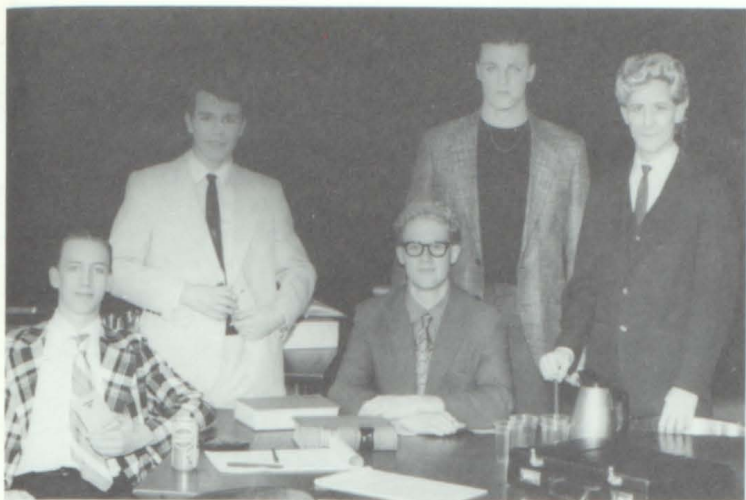
