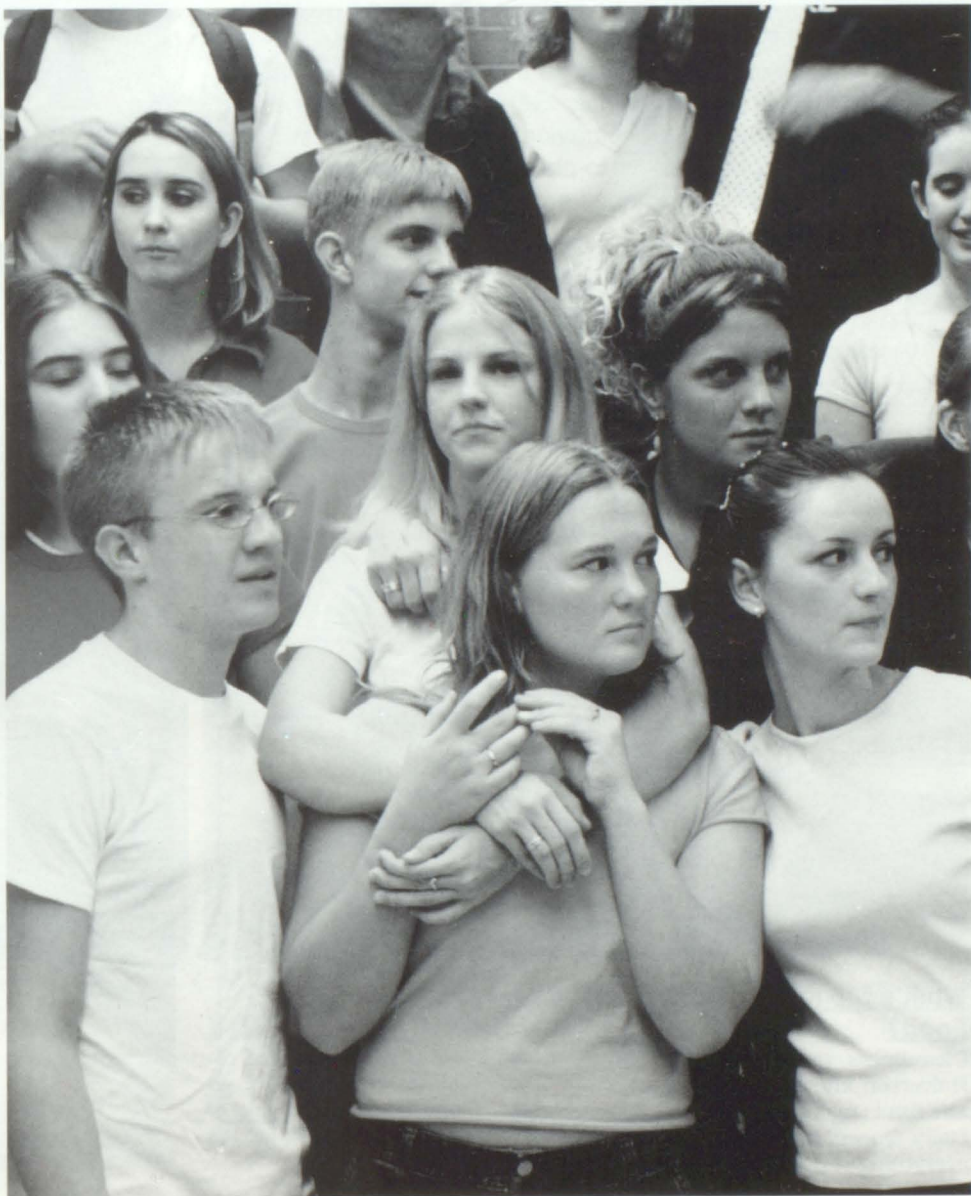

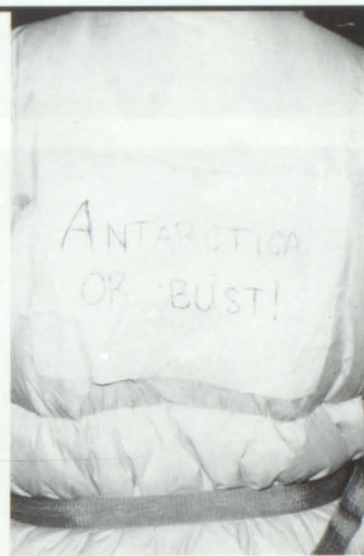

Under the Sea

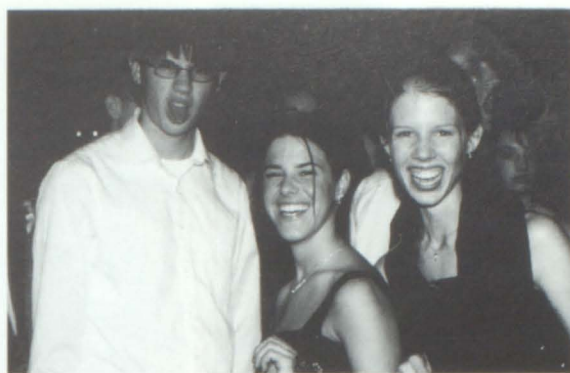

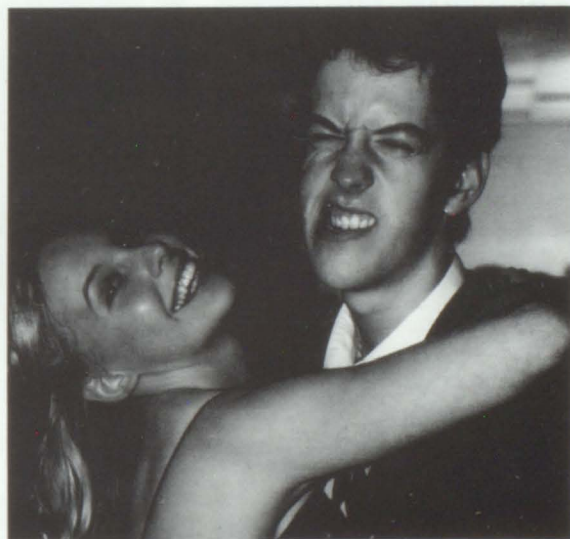

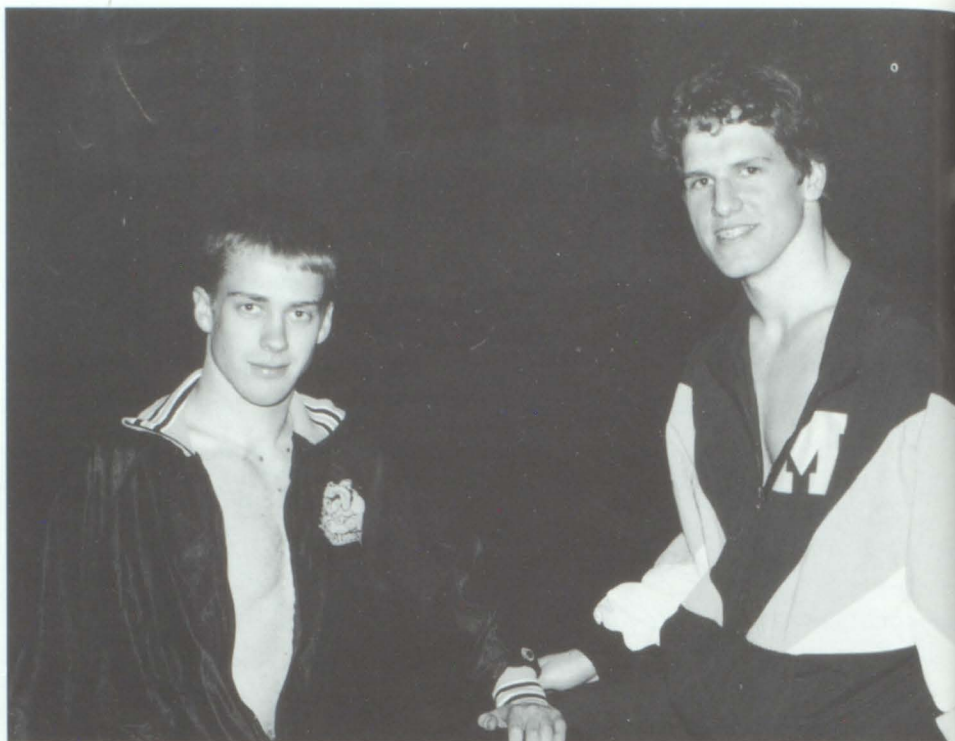

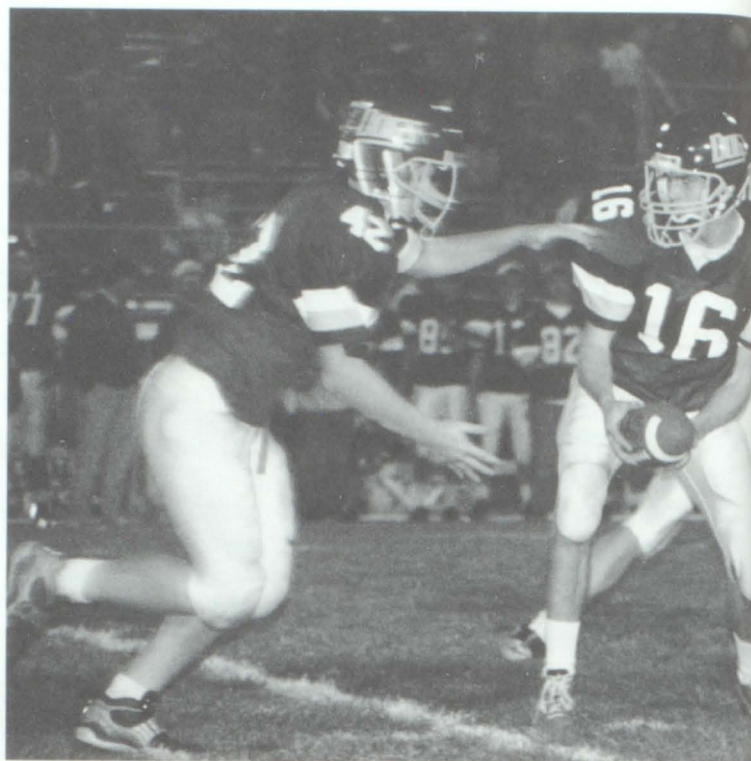

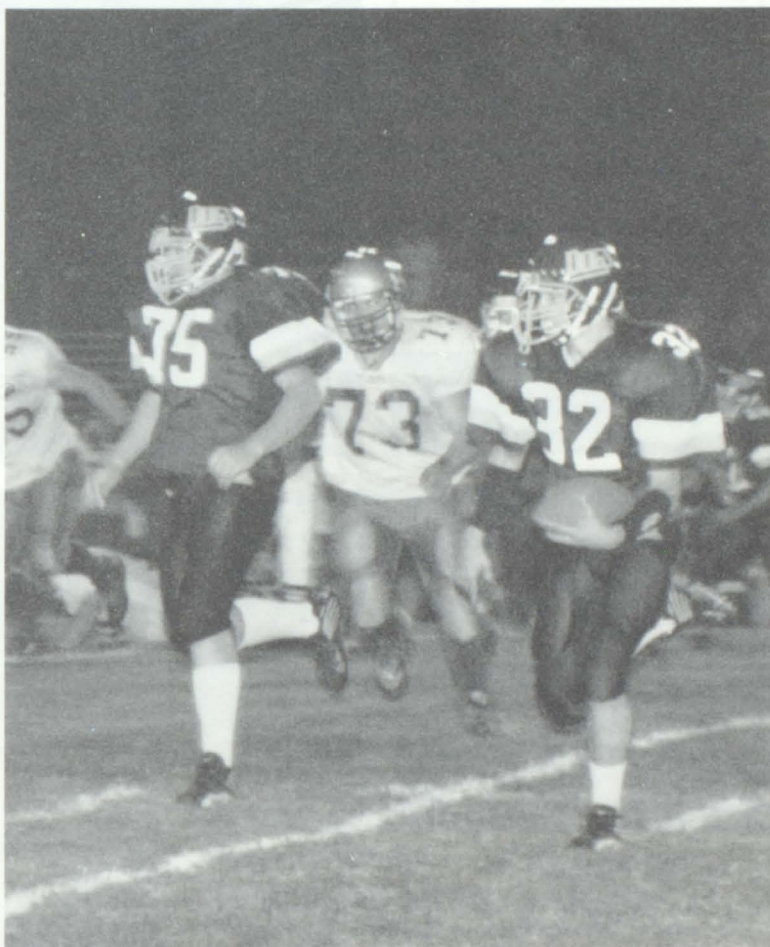

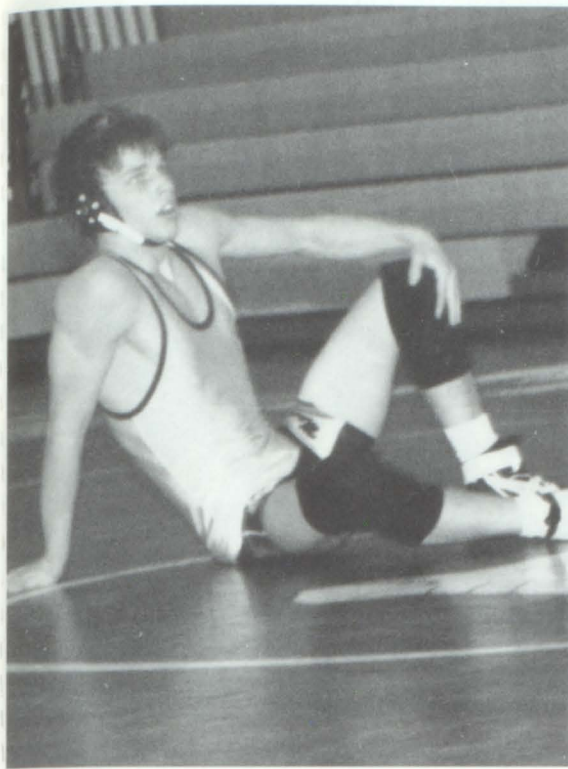

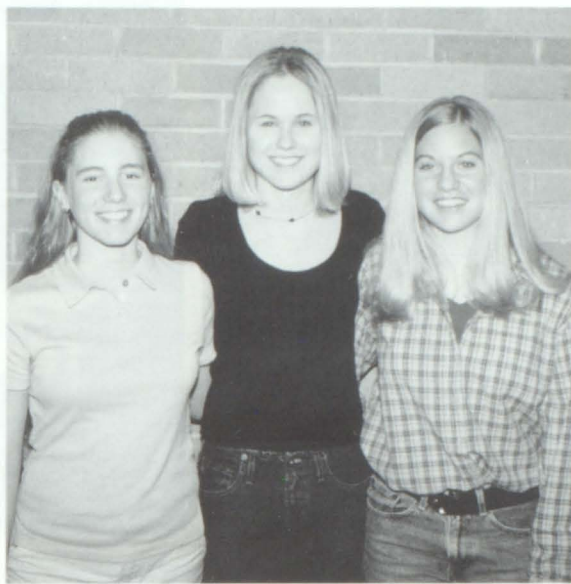

Madison Grabs Second Straight Title

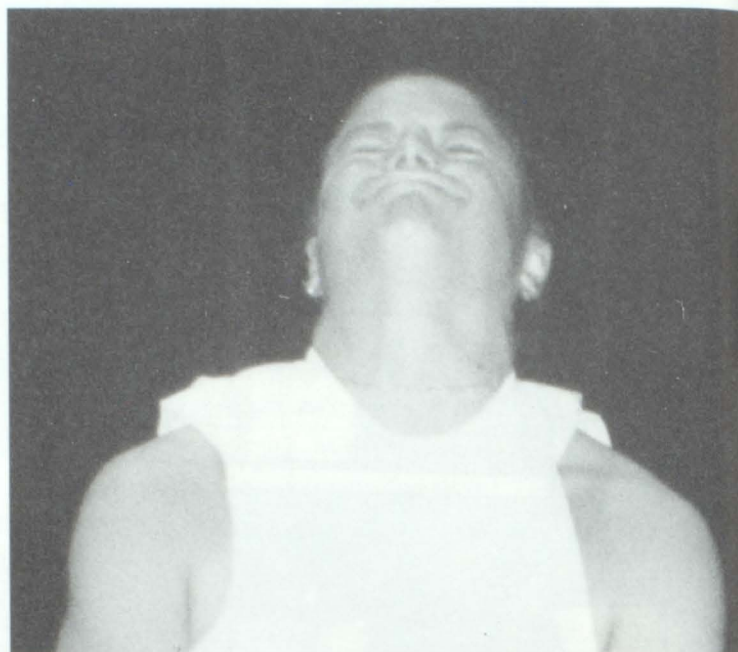
With the state powerlifting meet moving from the high school gym into the spacious stadium seating of the auditorium, fans all around watched Madison win their third team title in four years.

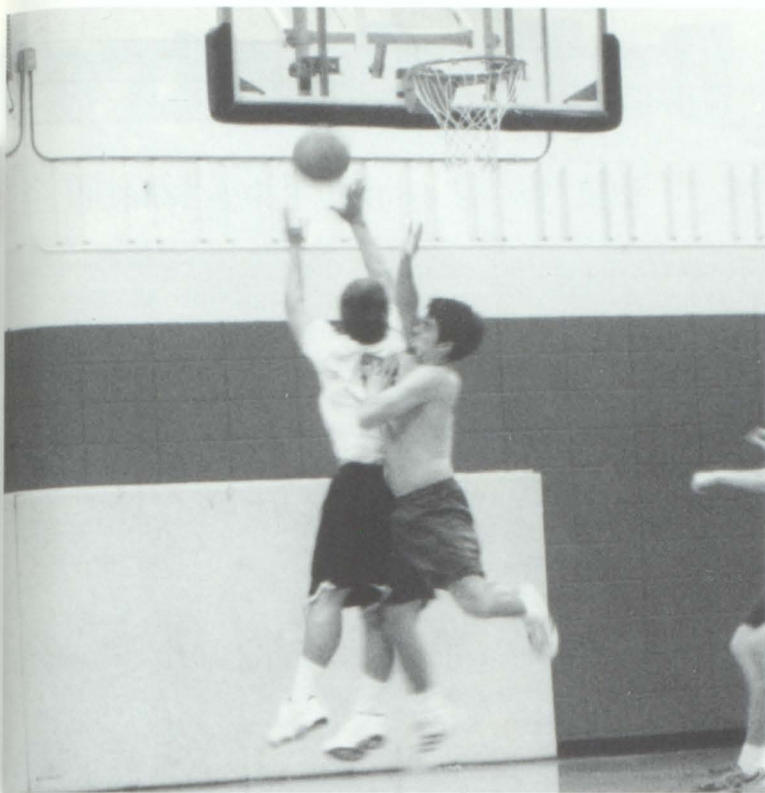

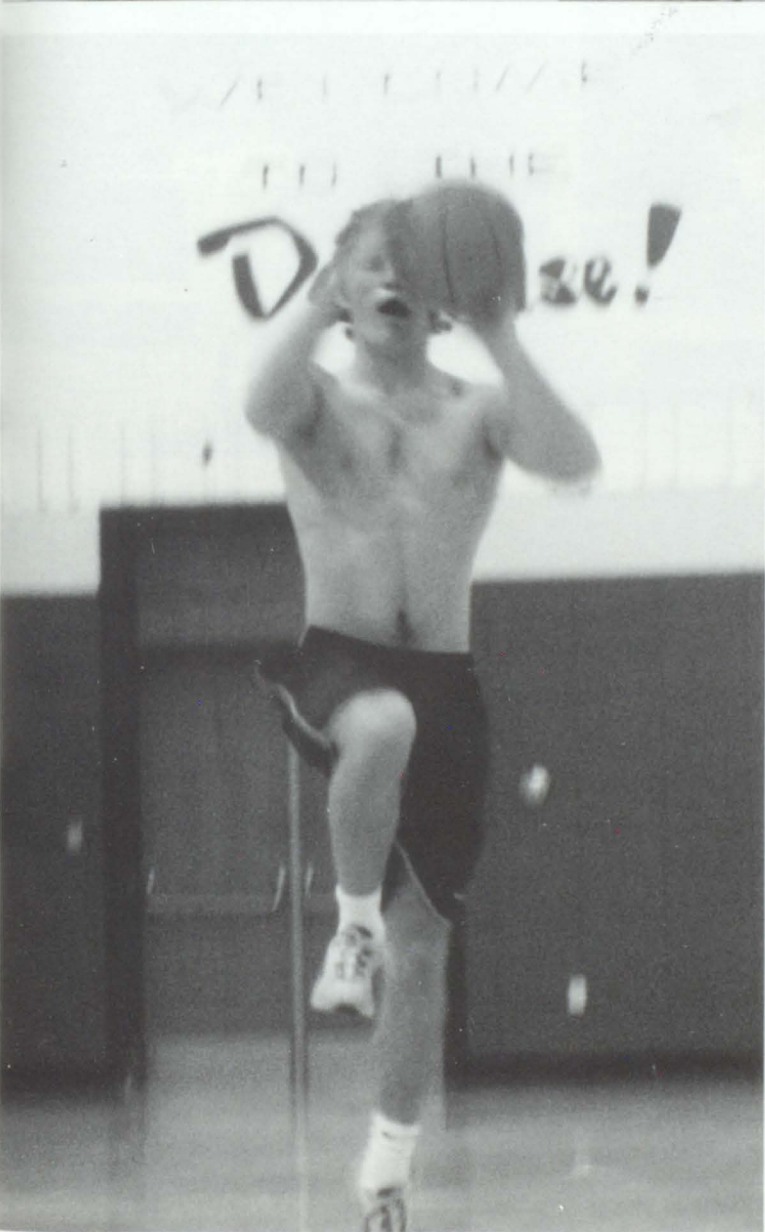

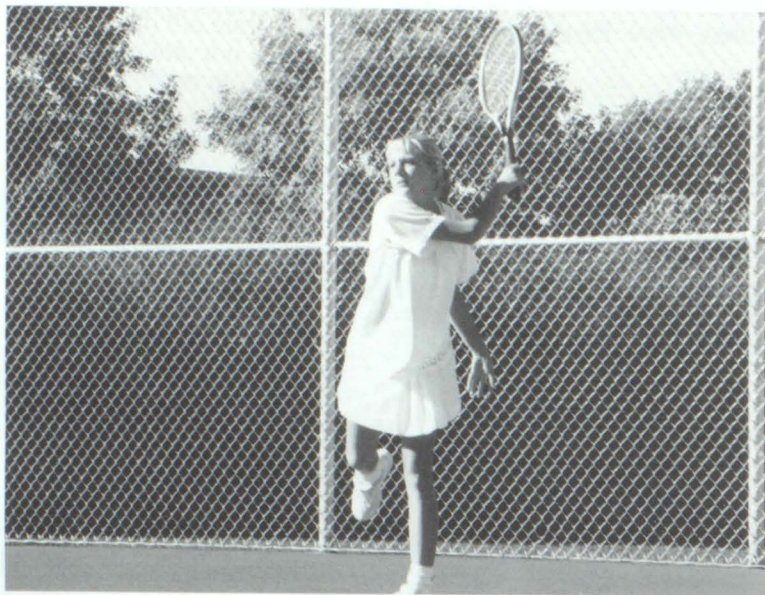

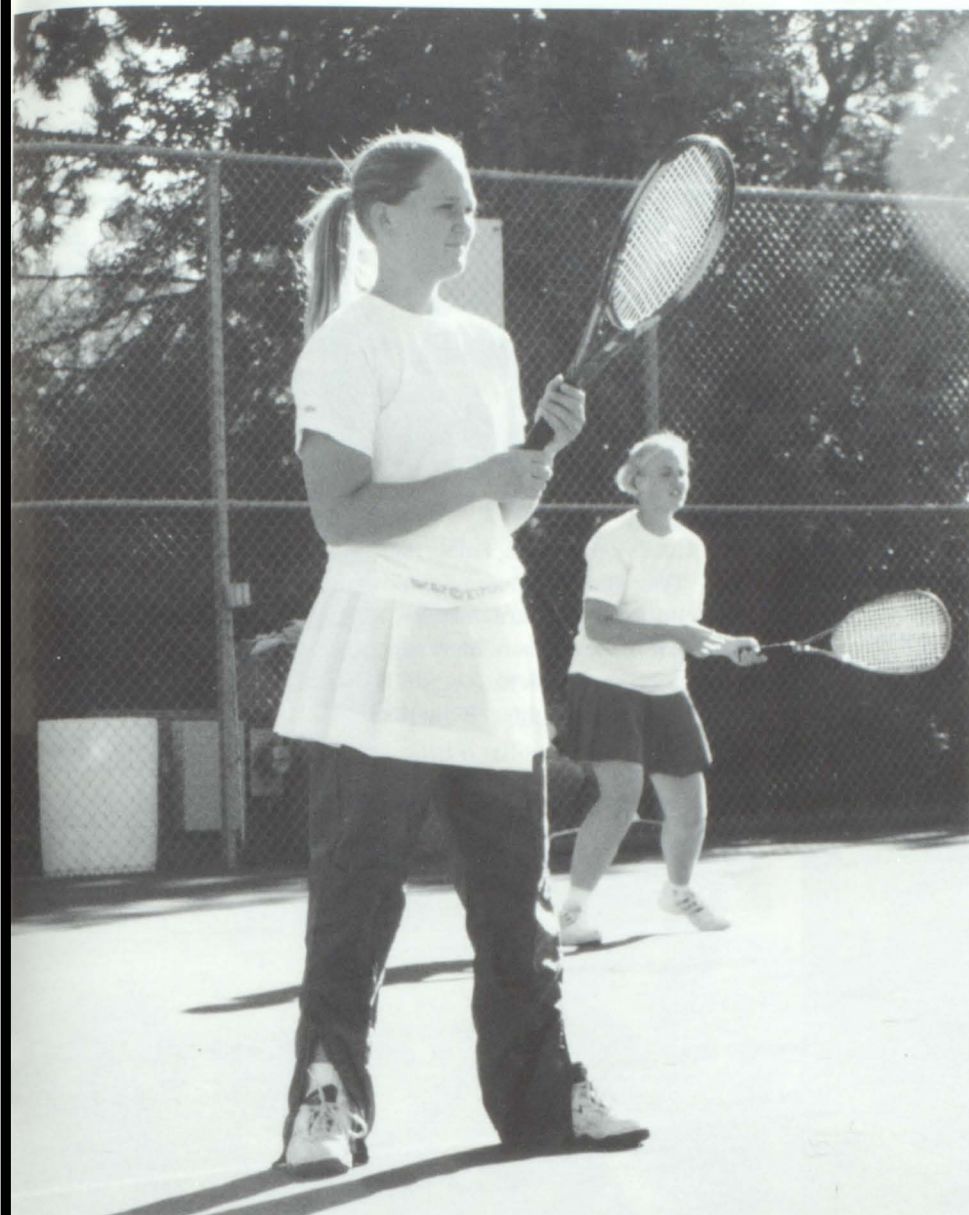
Who Wants to Play Some Tennis?

"I am so happy that baseball has finally been added as a sport in high school," said David Neu, "even if it is just at the club level."

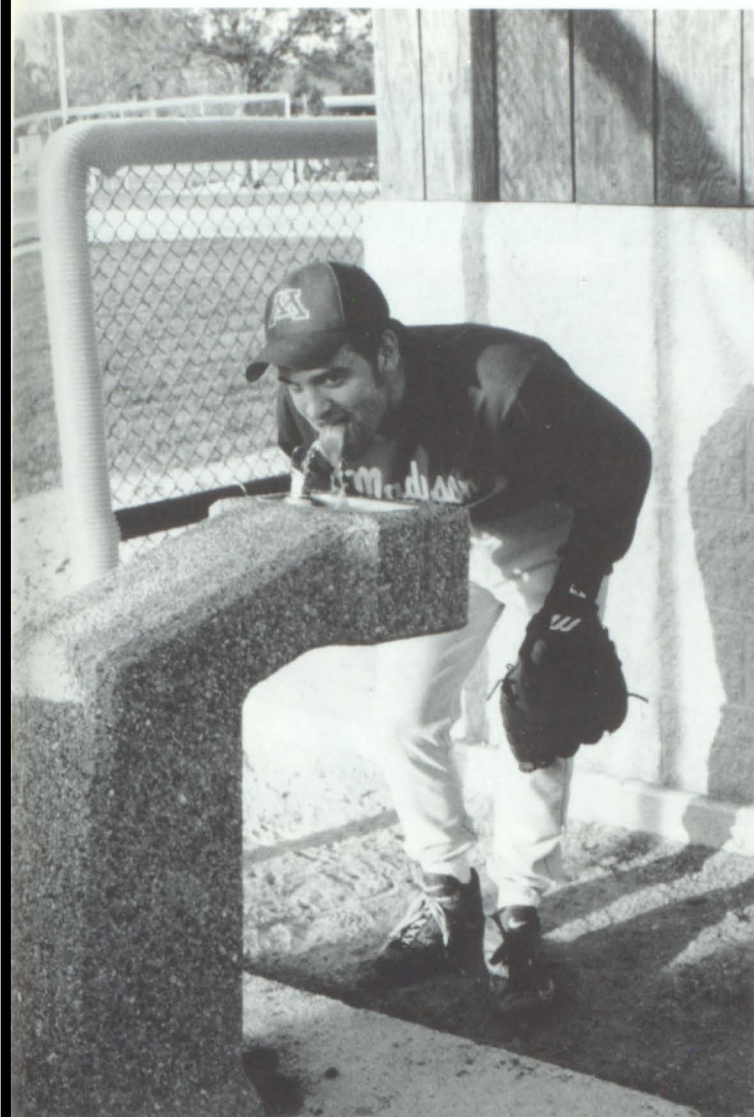

Shop classes are very good hands-on experiences in a variety of the industrial arts. They give you the ability to decide if you want to follow a career in any of the areas that are available.

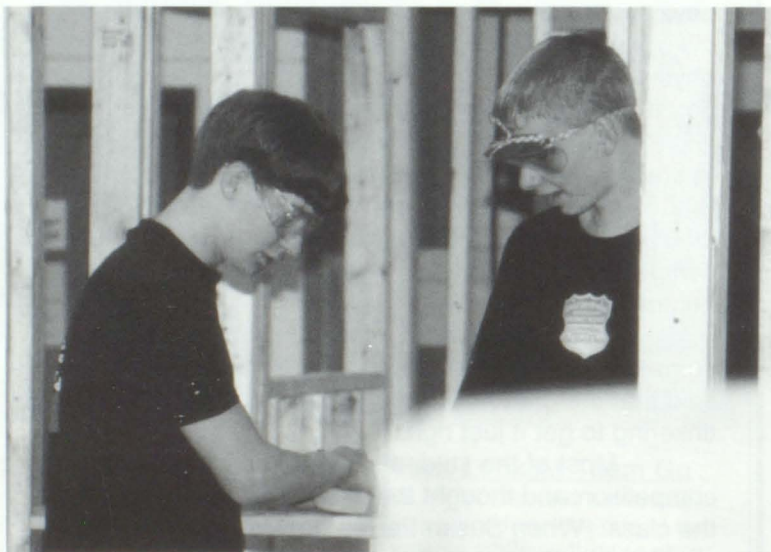

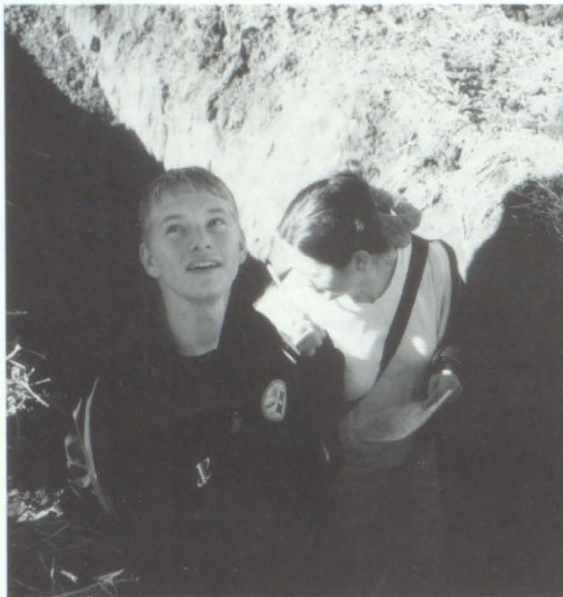
