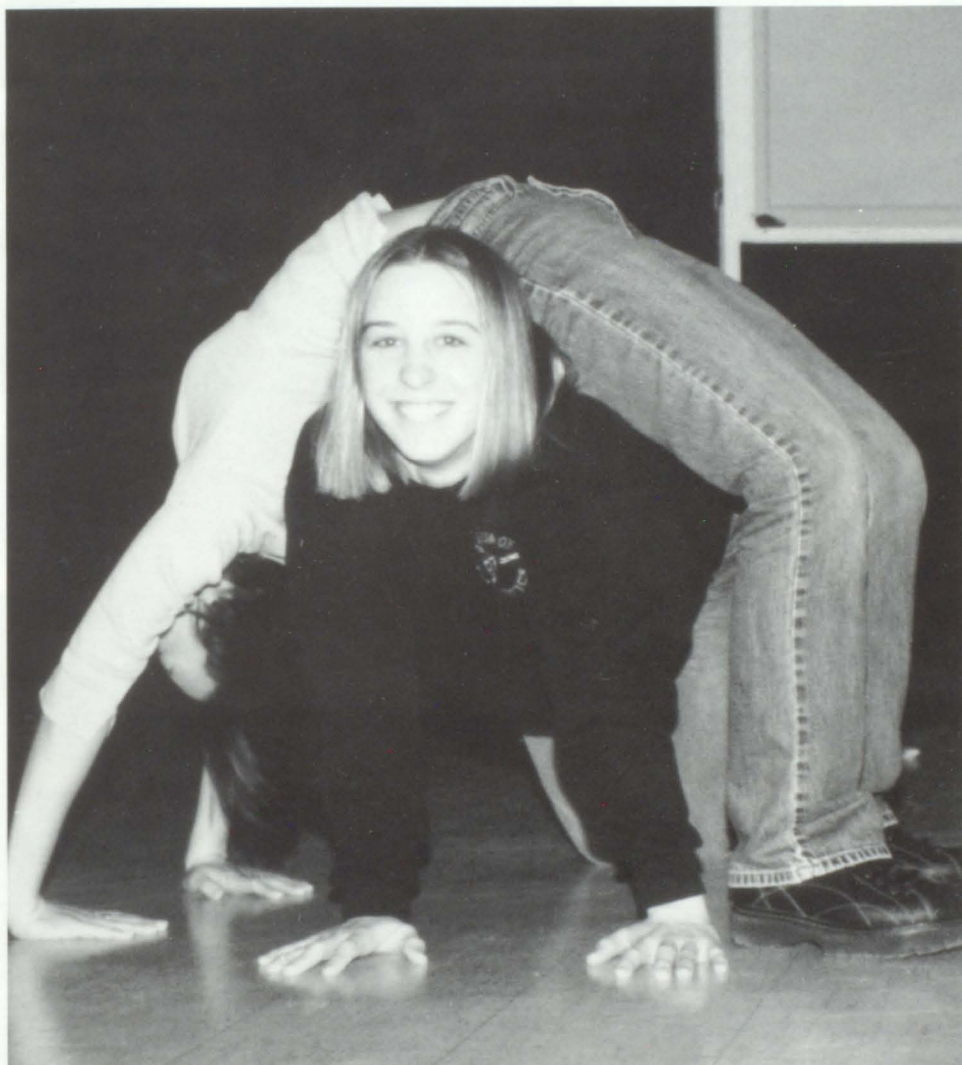

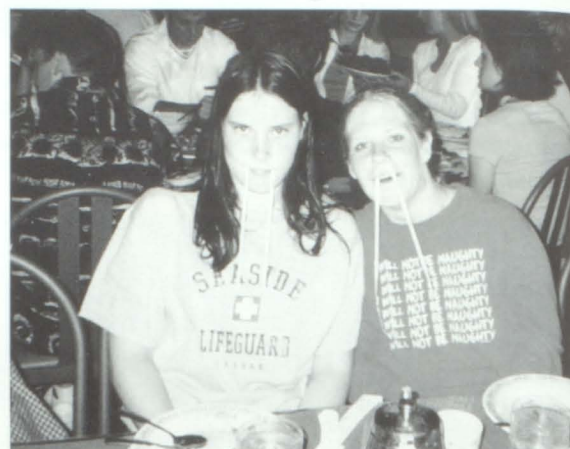

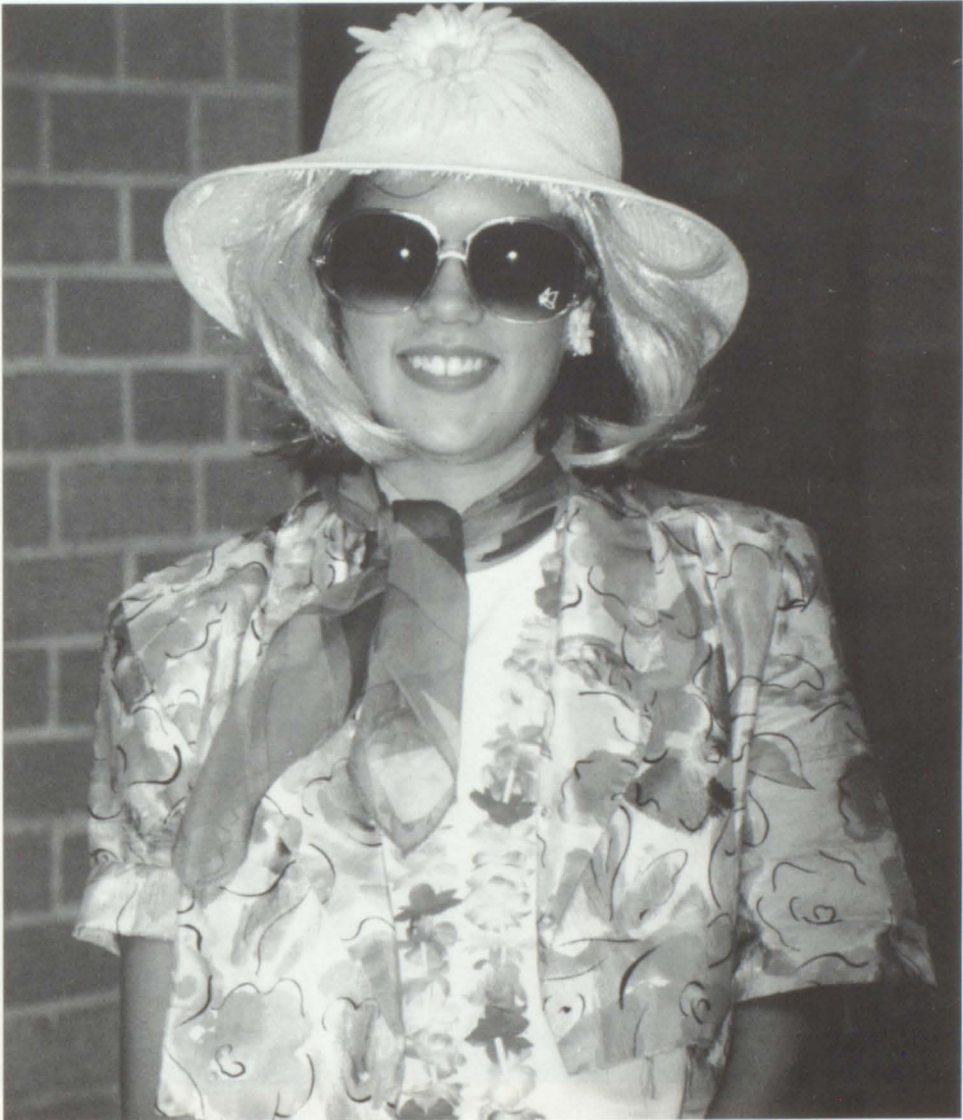

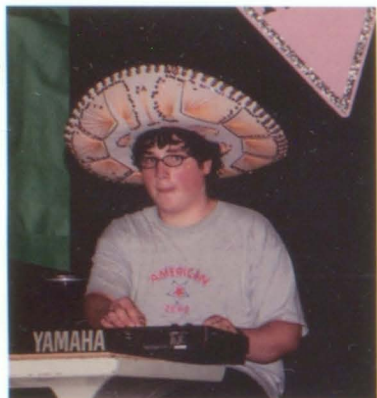

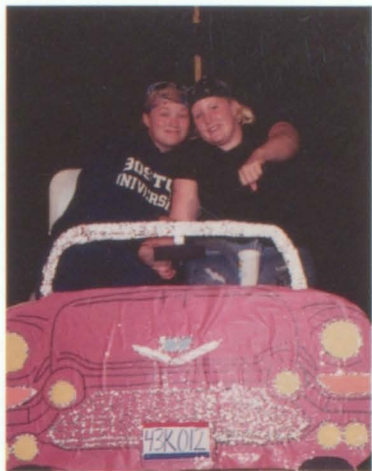

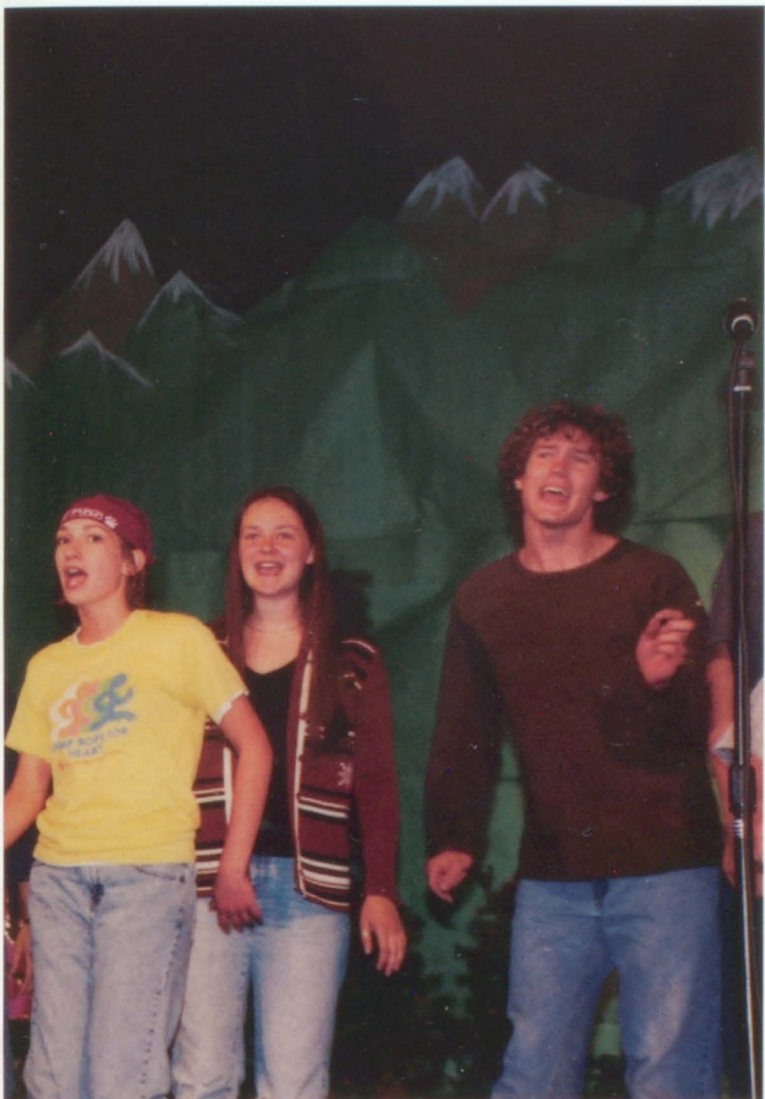

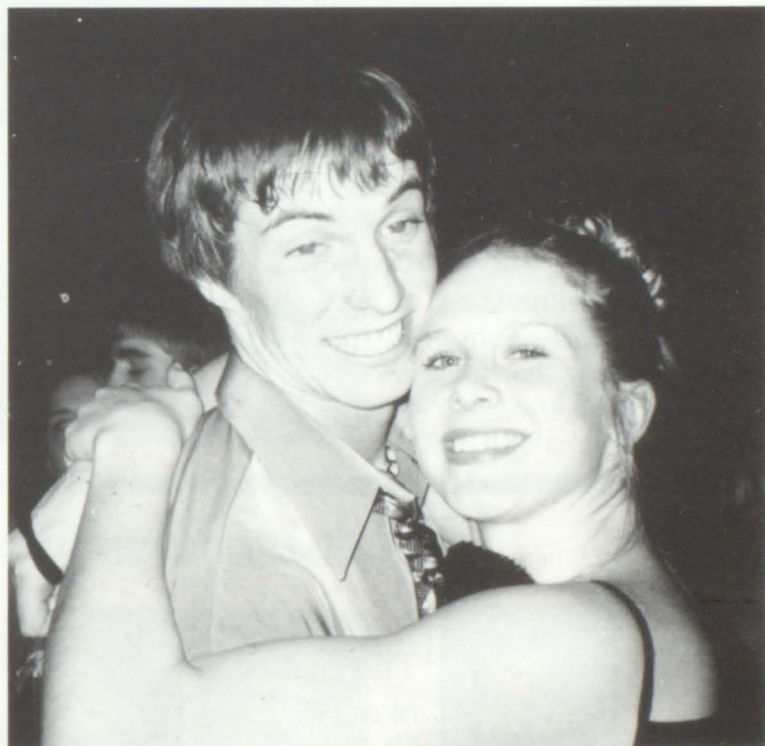

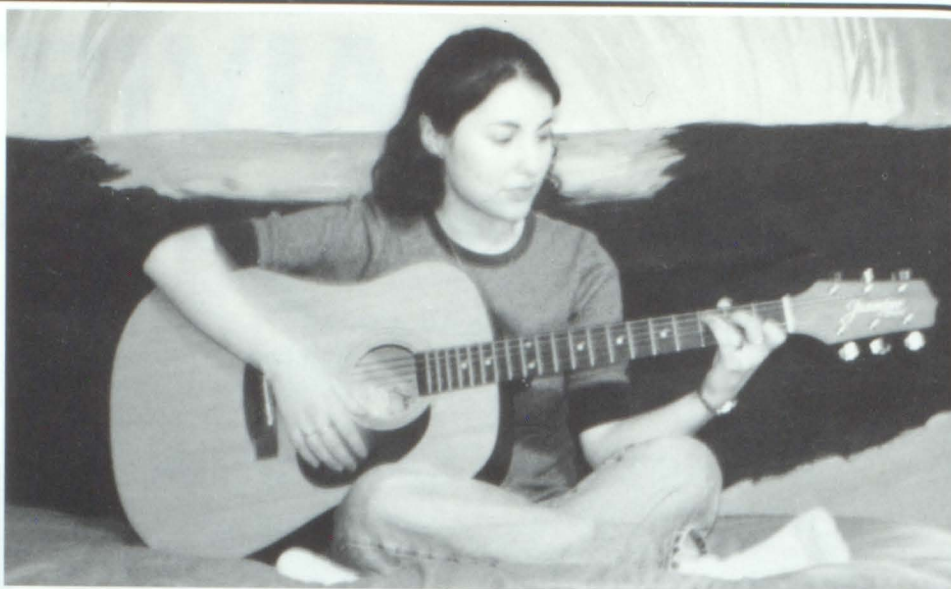

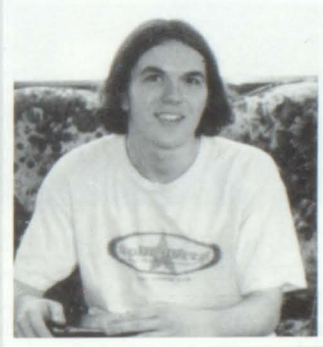

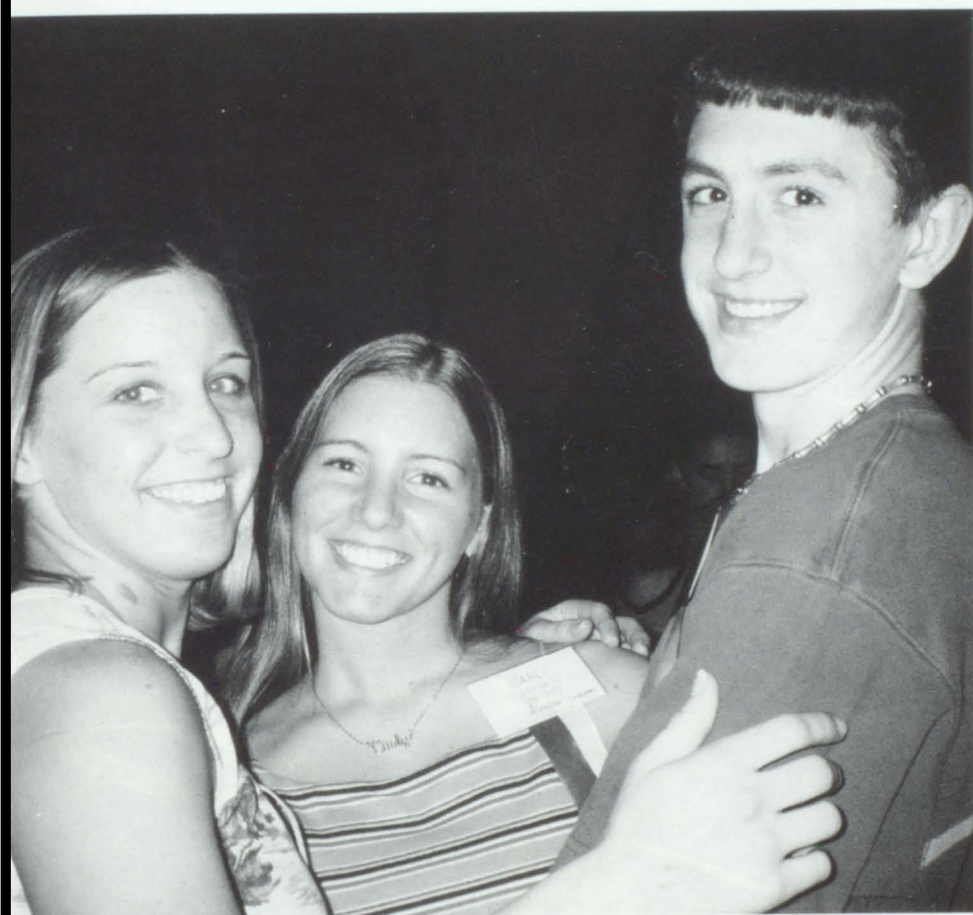

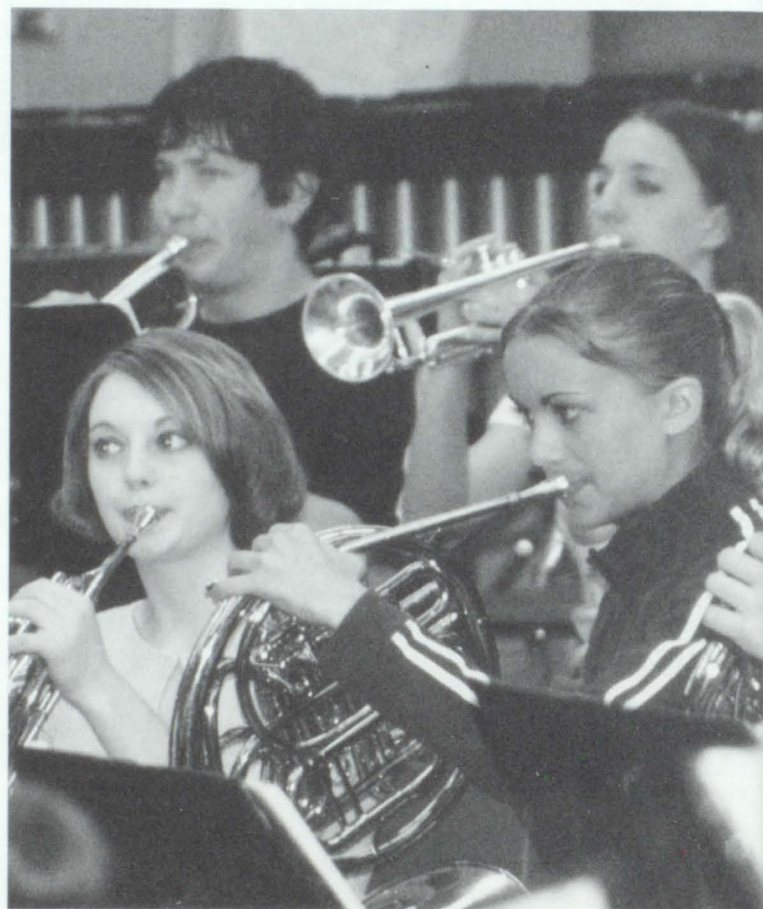

This year is also Mrs. Lynch's last year as advisor. In honor of that, the council would like to say they had a great time and will miss her next year.

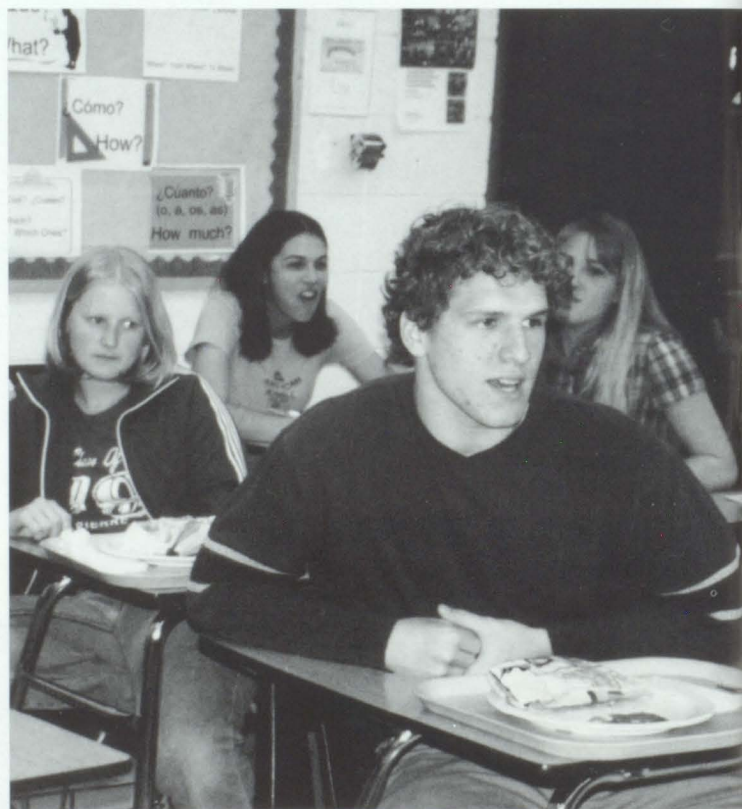

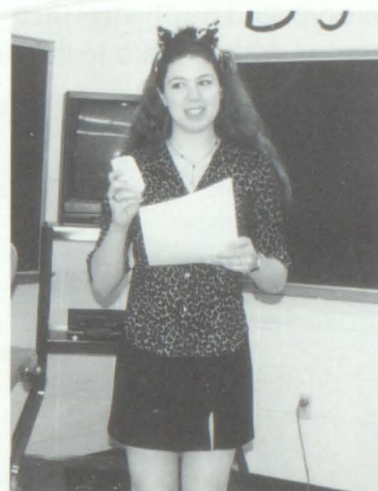

Despite bad weather, illness, and startling mishaps, once again the cast and crew of the one-act play proved that nothing can stop a spunky group of thespians.

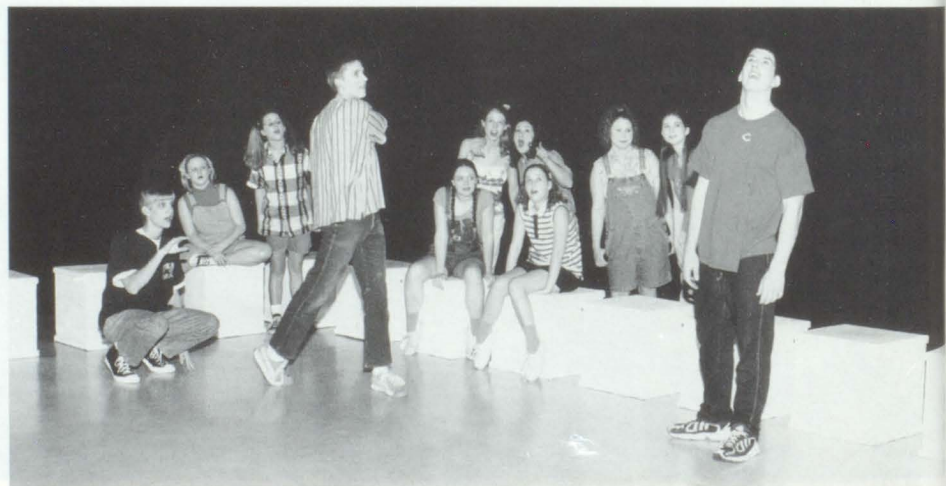

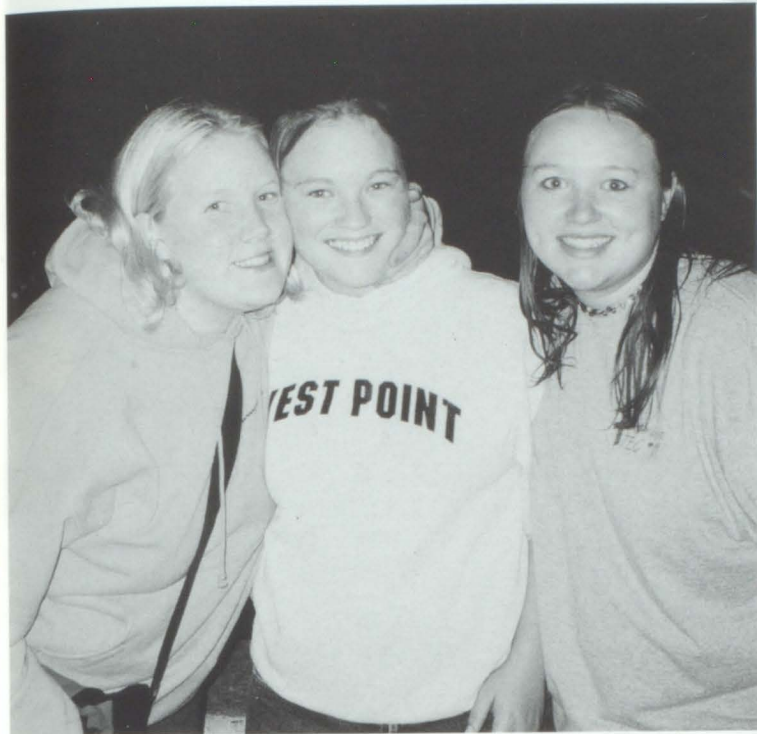

Along the sewing lines, the chapter with the help of the Consumer and Family Resource Class made school bags to be sent to third-world countries.

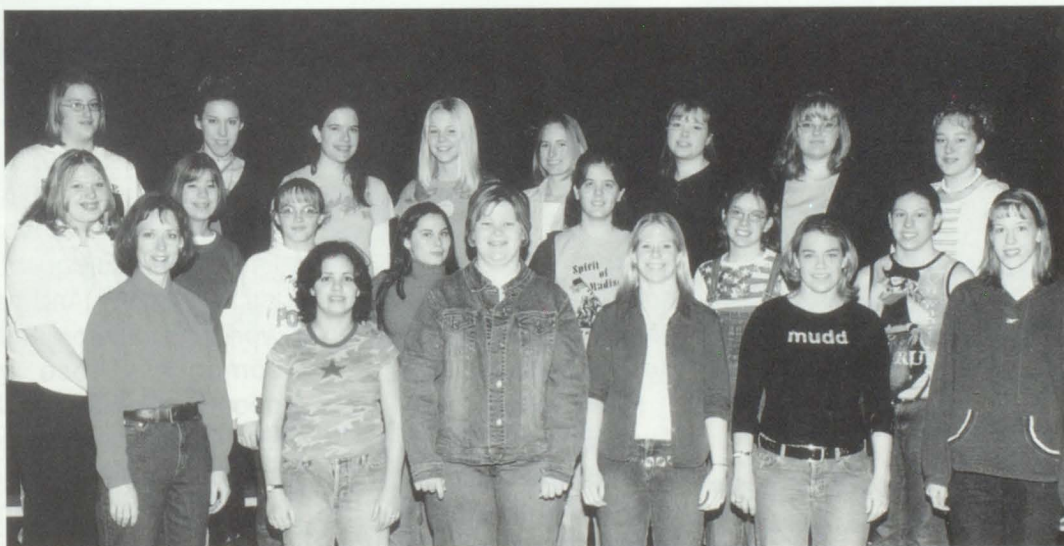

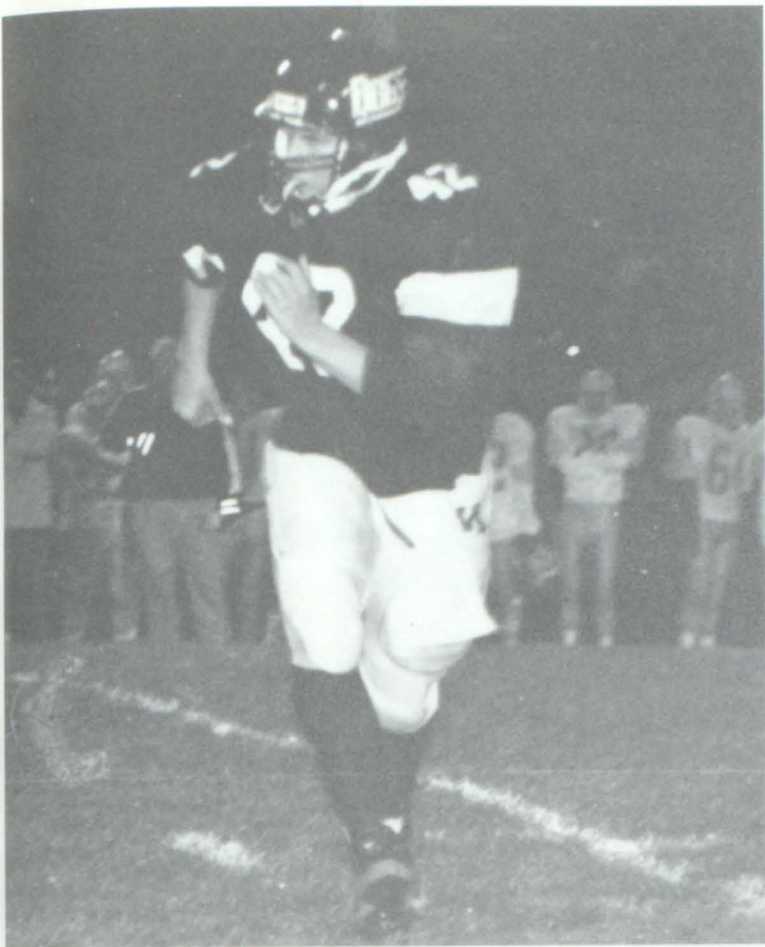

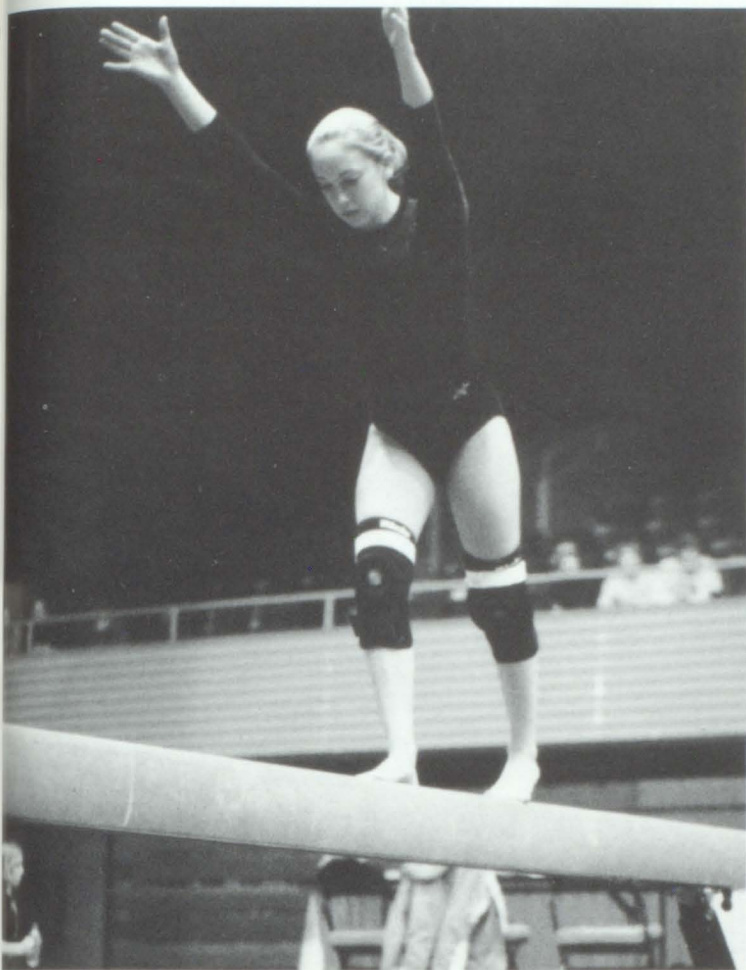
