





















Students were assigned to these Vice President positions: Player Personnel, Marketing, Facility Design and Management, and Public and Community Relations. In order for their franchise to be successful, students must work together in facing the trials and tribulations that are so much a part of the sports industry today. The class had four teams: the Las Vegas Vipers, a baseball team; the San Diego Demons, a basketball team; the Oklahoma City Lizards, a football team; and the Los Angeles Colts, another football team. The final Business Plans were presented in multimedia presentations.






