






Color Guard





What is Student Congress? That might be a question that runs through one's mind when they hear about it. Well, according to Mrs. Nills, Student Congress is, "a speech opportunity, sponsored by the National Forensics League (NFL), in which students write and debate student-related bills and resolutions. You can gain points from each speech that you give." The purpose of Student Congress is to "expose students to this realm of public speaking, and to build stronger speaking skills." The types of things that you do in Student Congress include, "understanding and demonstrating your knowledge of Parliamentary Procedure, and you have to have good research skills."

With Student Congress you can gain NFL points to win awards and you can use the points with other forensic activities as well. You get scored based on a one to six scale, six being the best, and if you speak for a long time in a coherent manner you may get a six. Twenty-four is the maximum amount of points that you can earn.































Madison Dominates In Powerlifting







Physics

Use Your Brain, Not Your Boat

Taught by Mr. Hodgen, Physics explores the world of mathematics and logic reasoning. From issues involving velocity and gravity, to figuring out the buoyancy of an object, students in this class must often think outside of the box to solve the problem.

Along with learning the world of mathematics and logic reasoning, these students use brain teasers daily to get their minds really going. These brain teasers make them look at problems in a different perspective. Solving problems from how to make multiple squares with only a limited amount of sticks to whom lives in which house, with what animal, in what order; proves to be no problem for these students when they receive help from fellow classmates.

Even though these students must study hard, listen closely to lectures, and do numerous practice math problems, they do get a break from it all in labs. Well, not quite! These labs make them prove that they can put their skills in physics to use.

Along with labs the students must do constructive project too. Including cardboard boat racing. Cardboard boat races are done at the end of the year when the students are studying buoyancy and pressure. Students may use as much cardboard that they can find, duct tape, glue, and a paint or varnish to waterproof the cardboard. The challenge is that they only have four days of class time to construct the boat. This isn't an easy task considering you must have a plan to keep a cardboard boat afloat with two to three people in the boat. Meaning that they must calculate the amount of weight that they will be deplacing on the water, ranging anywhere from 350 lbs. to 450 lbs. This event then takes place at Lake Herman the last week of school.

Once the students finish this course they have the satisfaction of knowing that they now know the world of physics!


