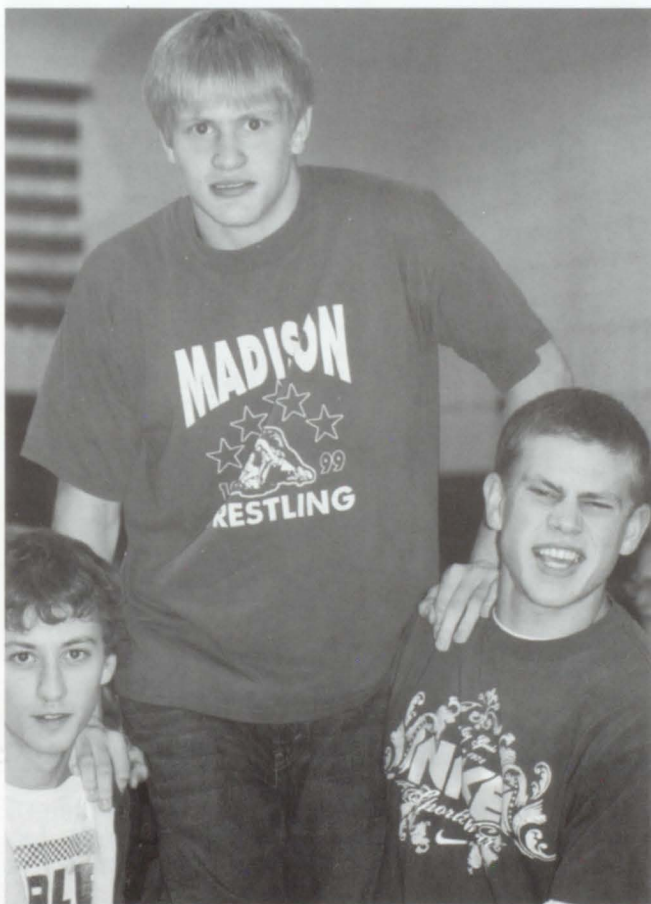

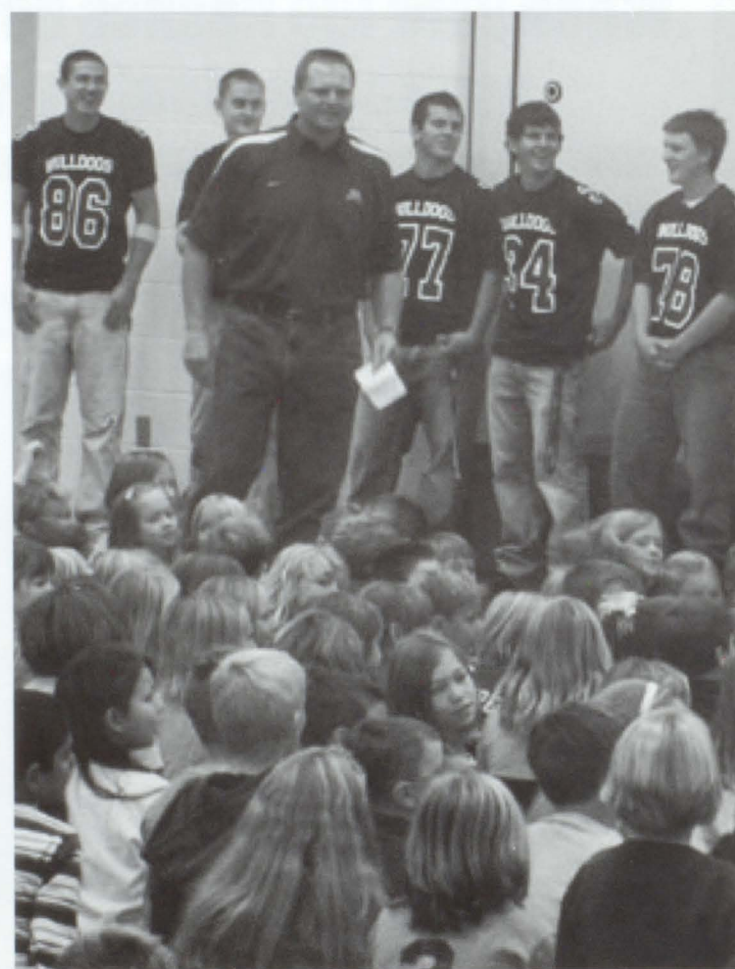

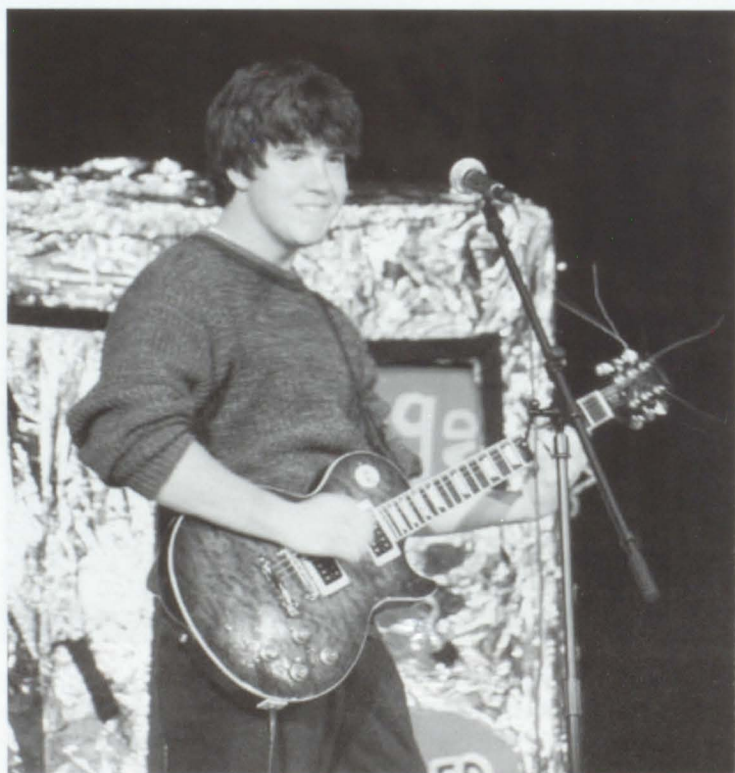

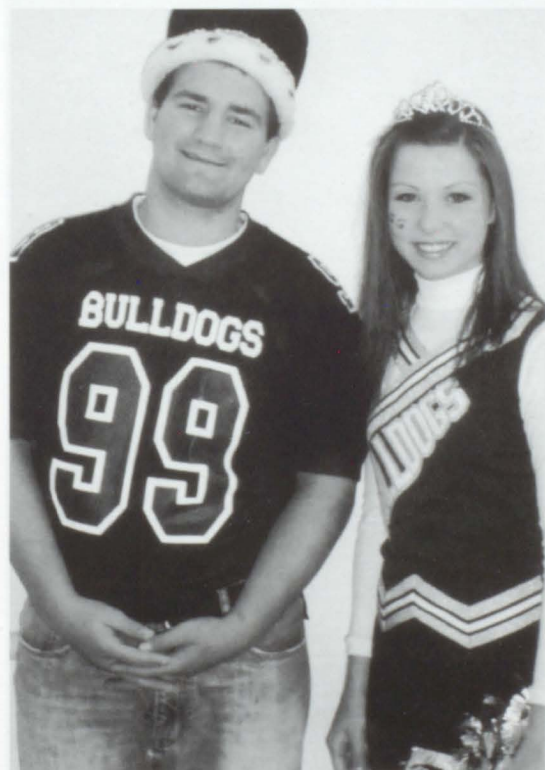

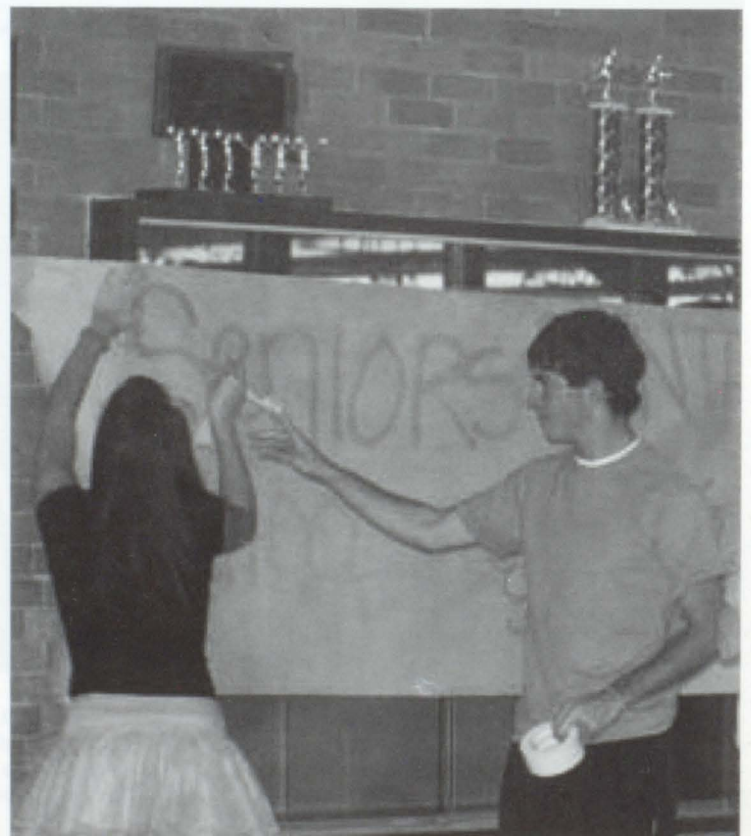

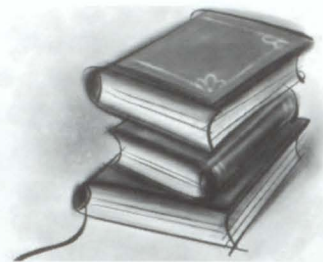


A Little Crazy But Definitely Fun!

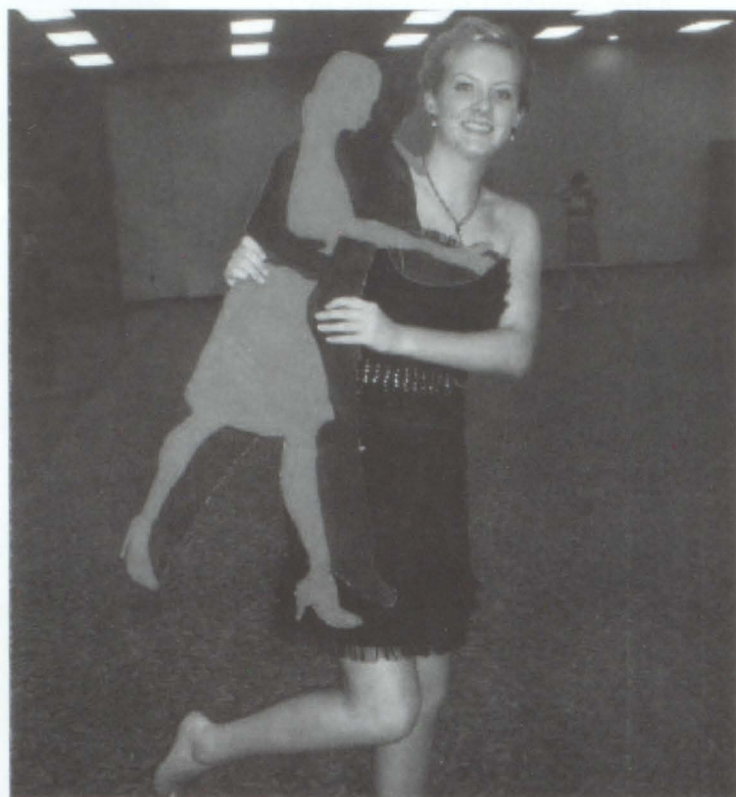
Fall Formal

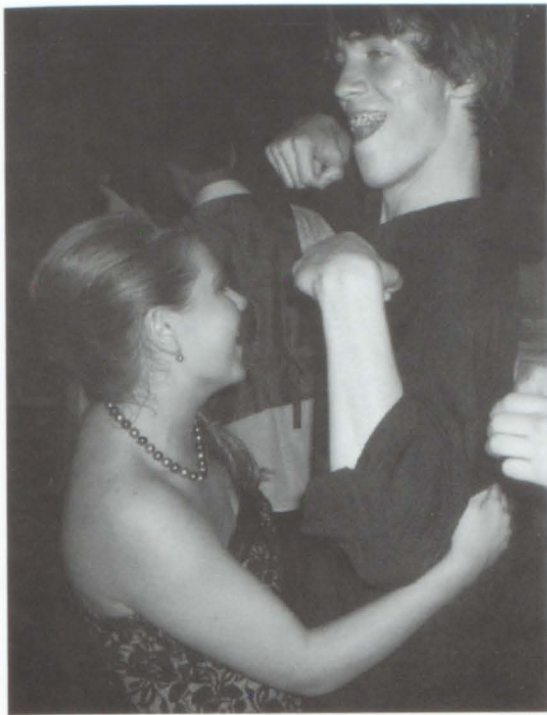

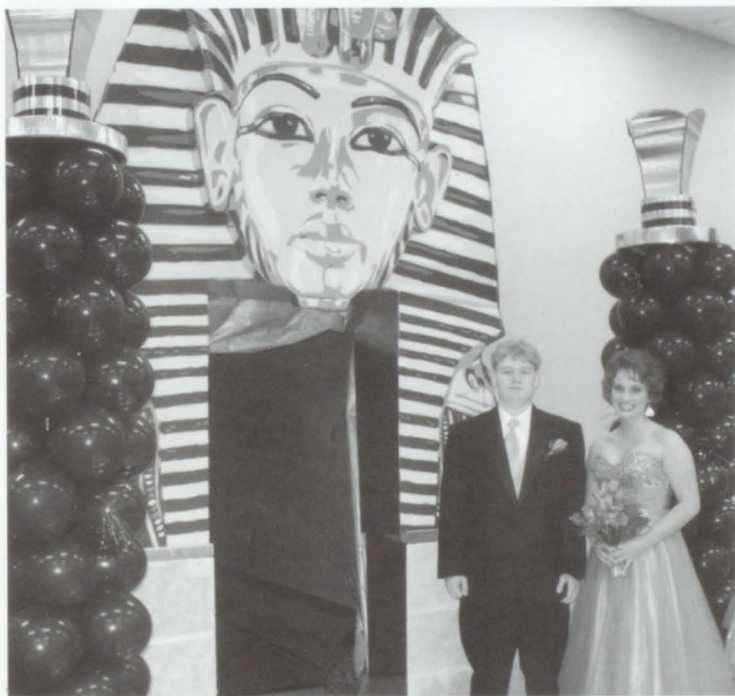

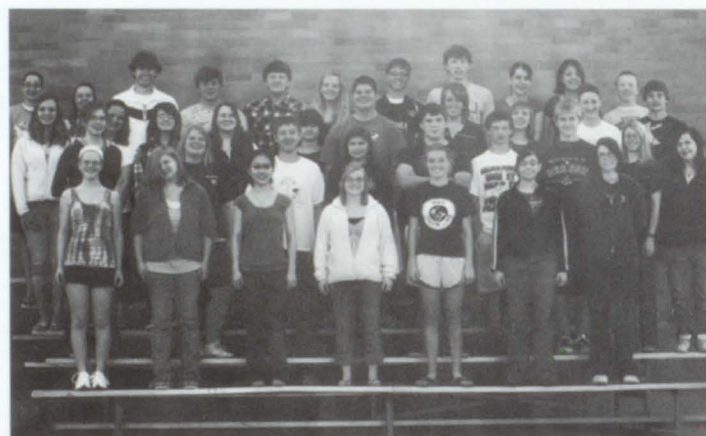

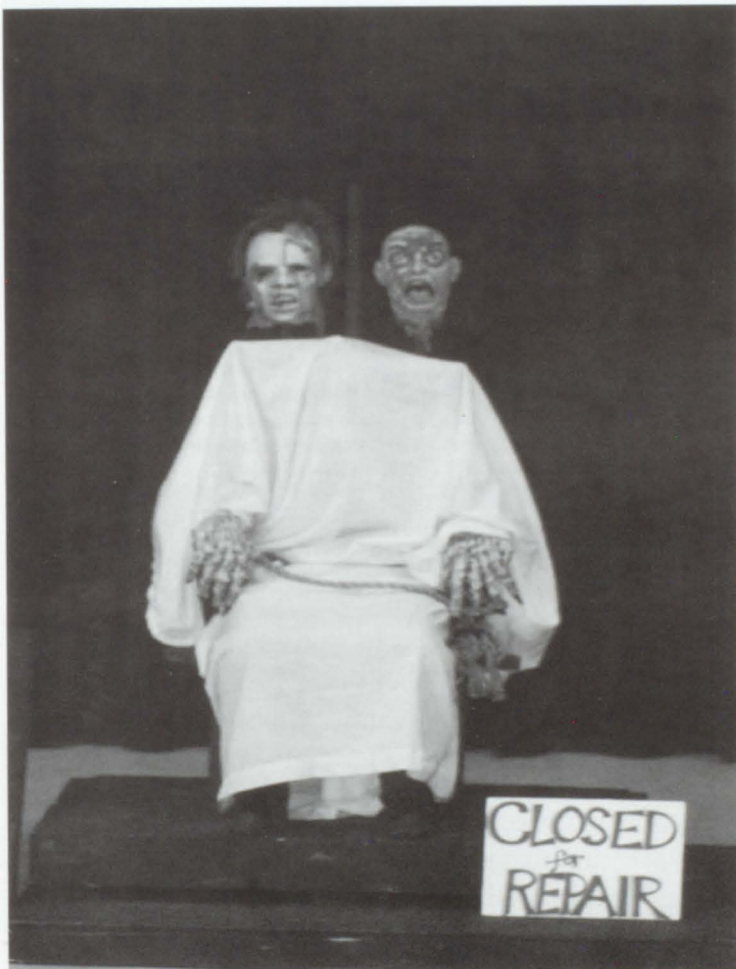

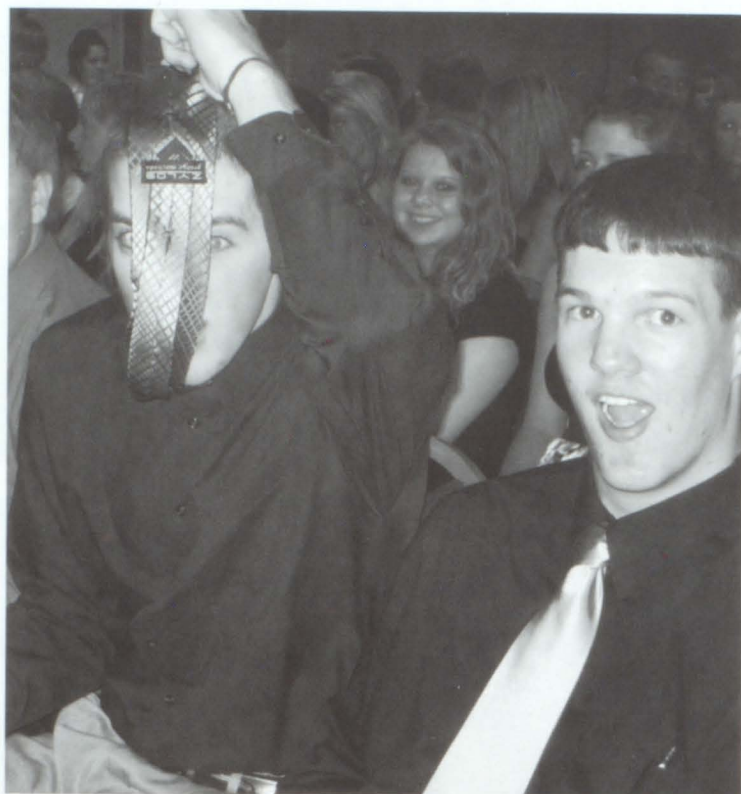

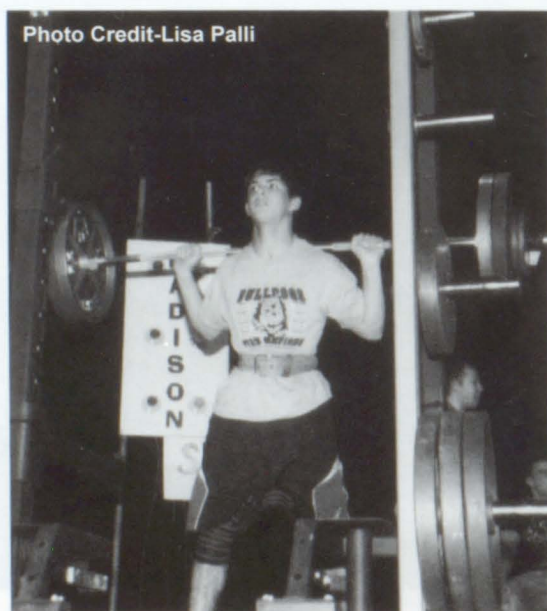

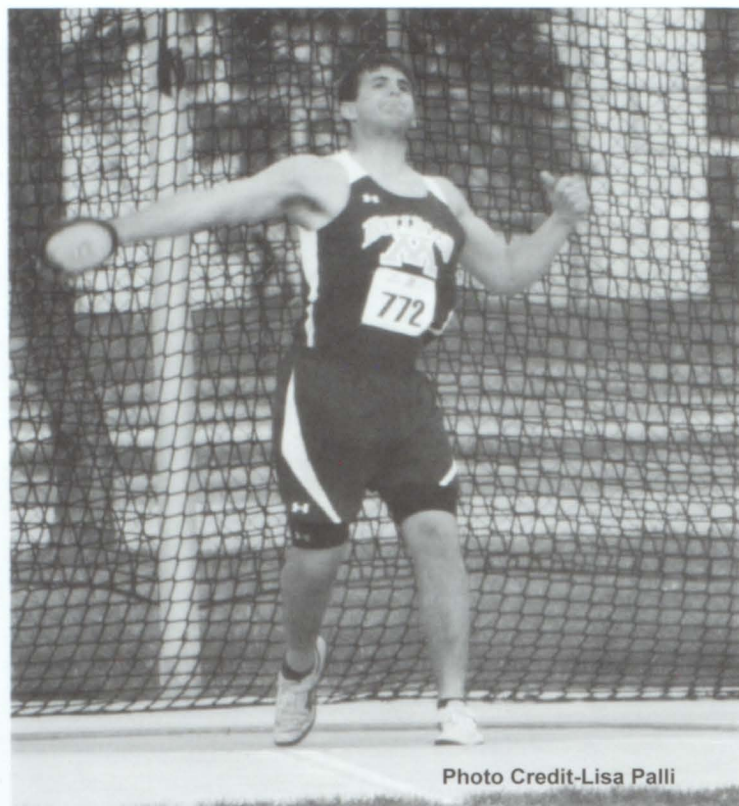

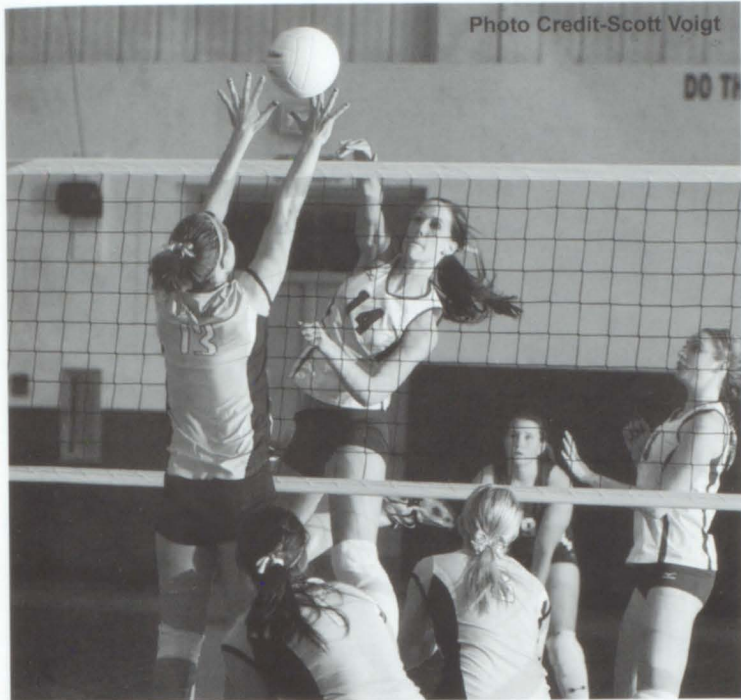

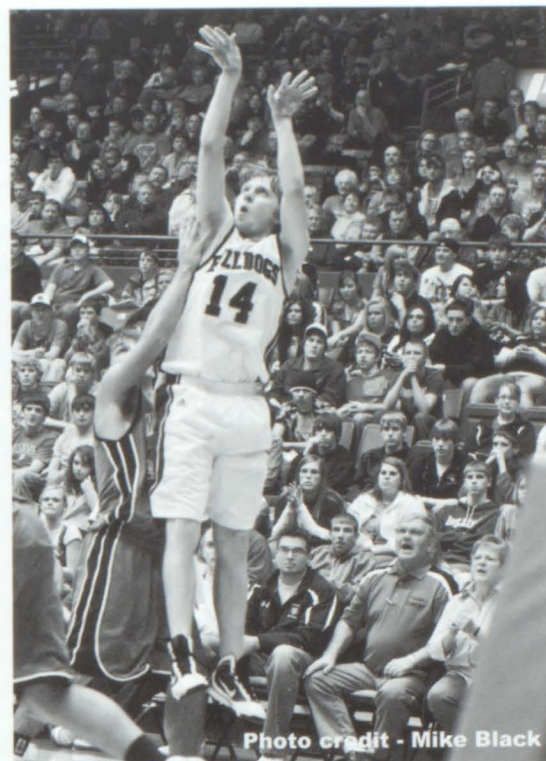

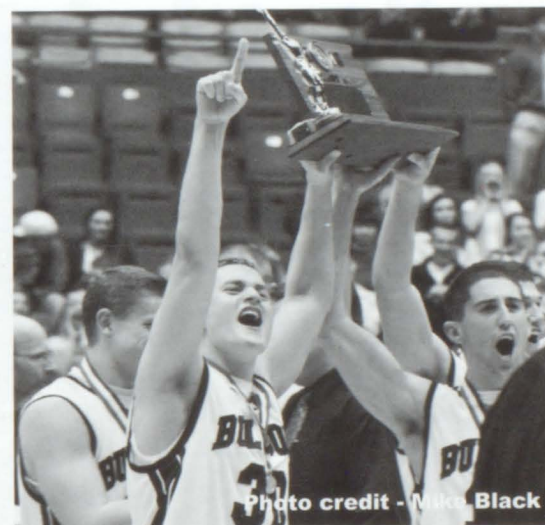

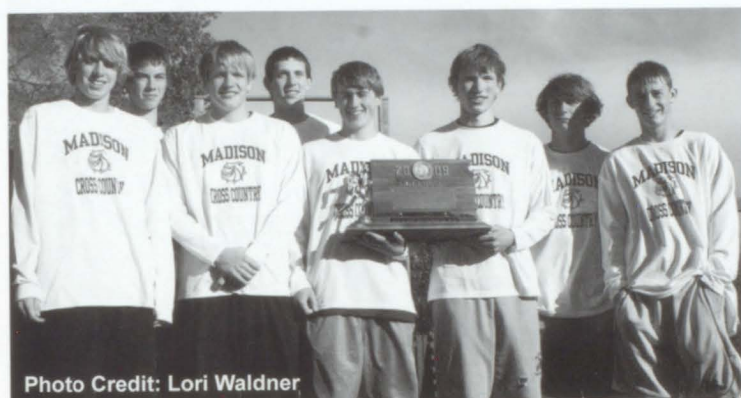

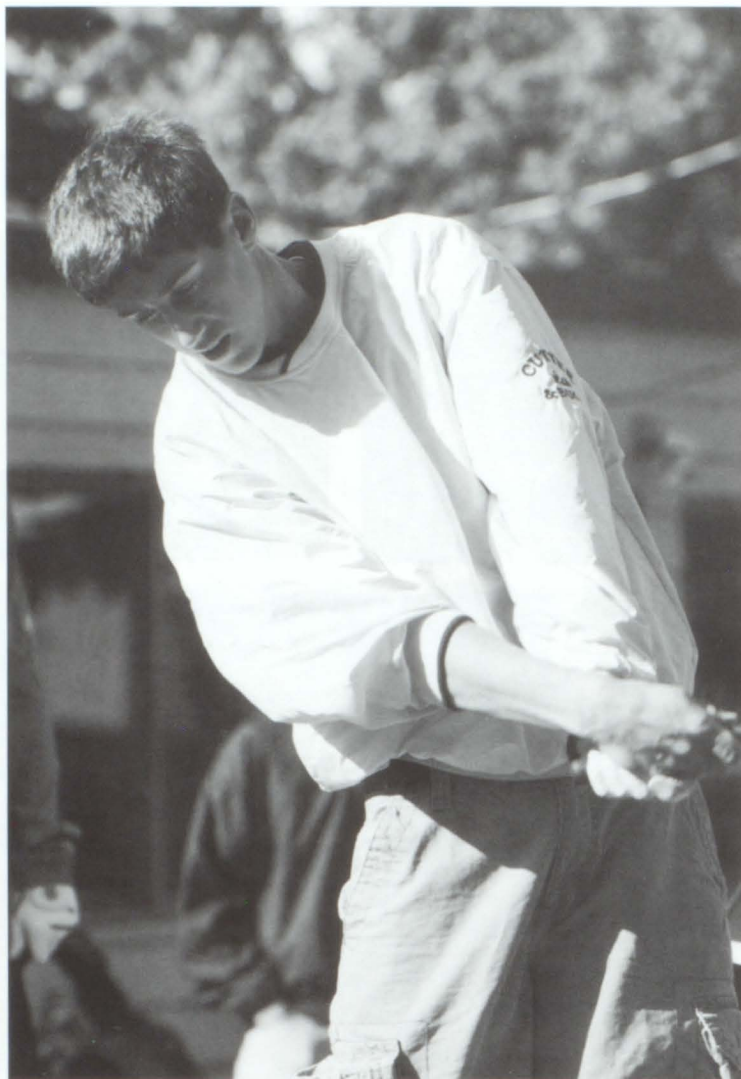

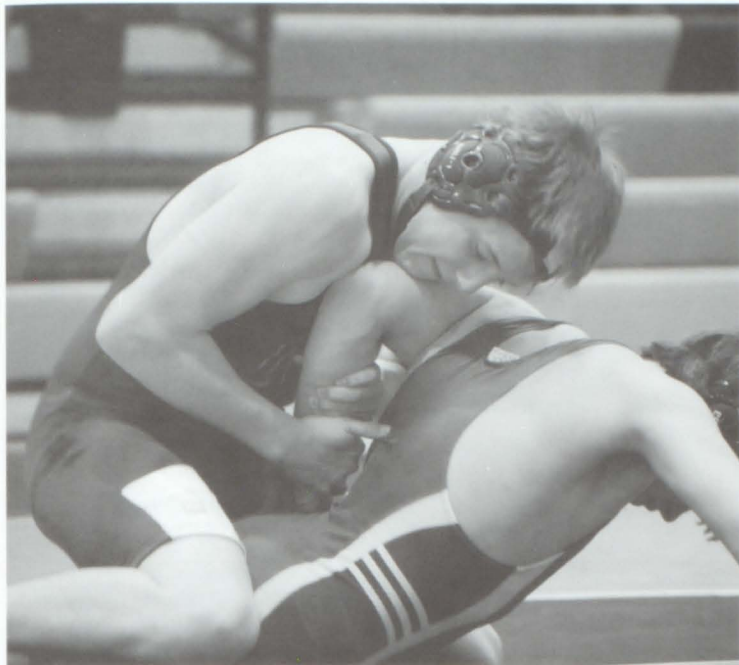

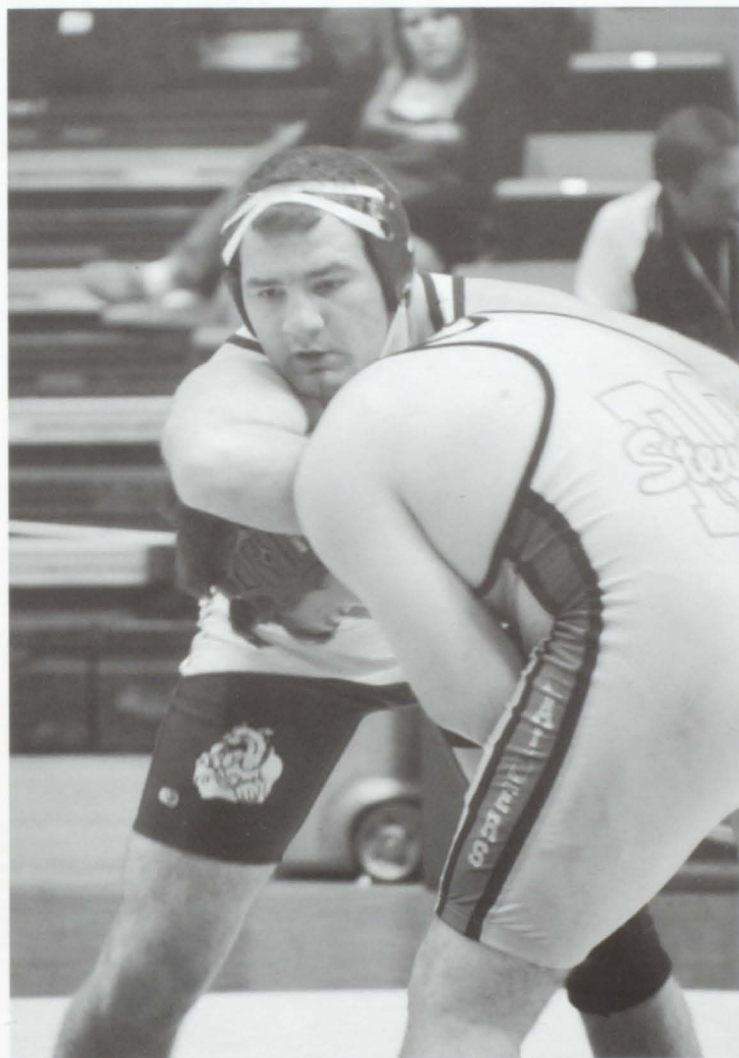

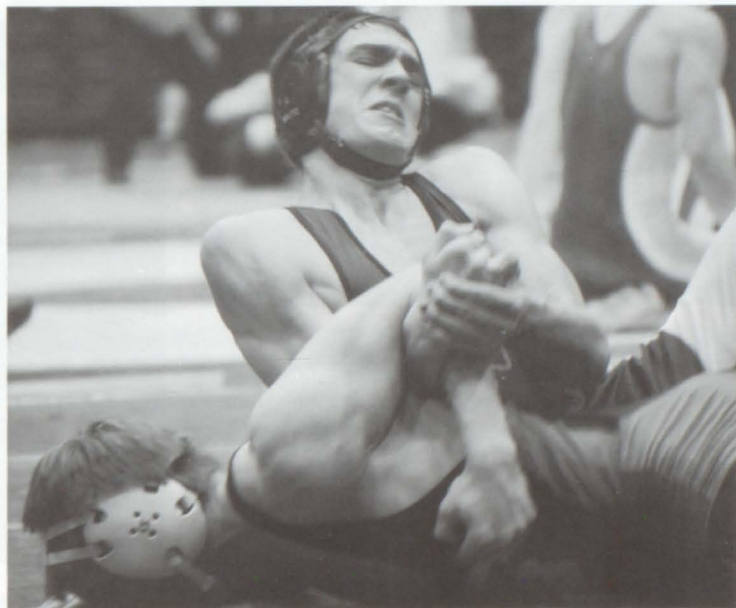

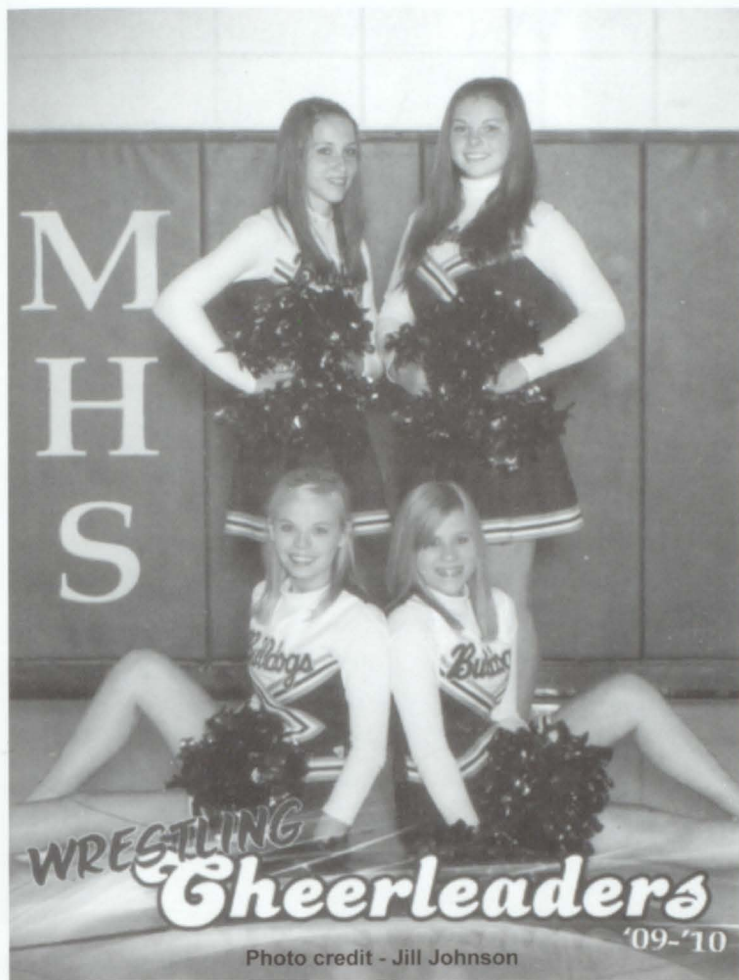

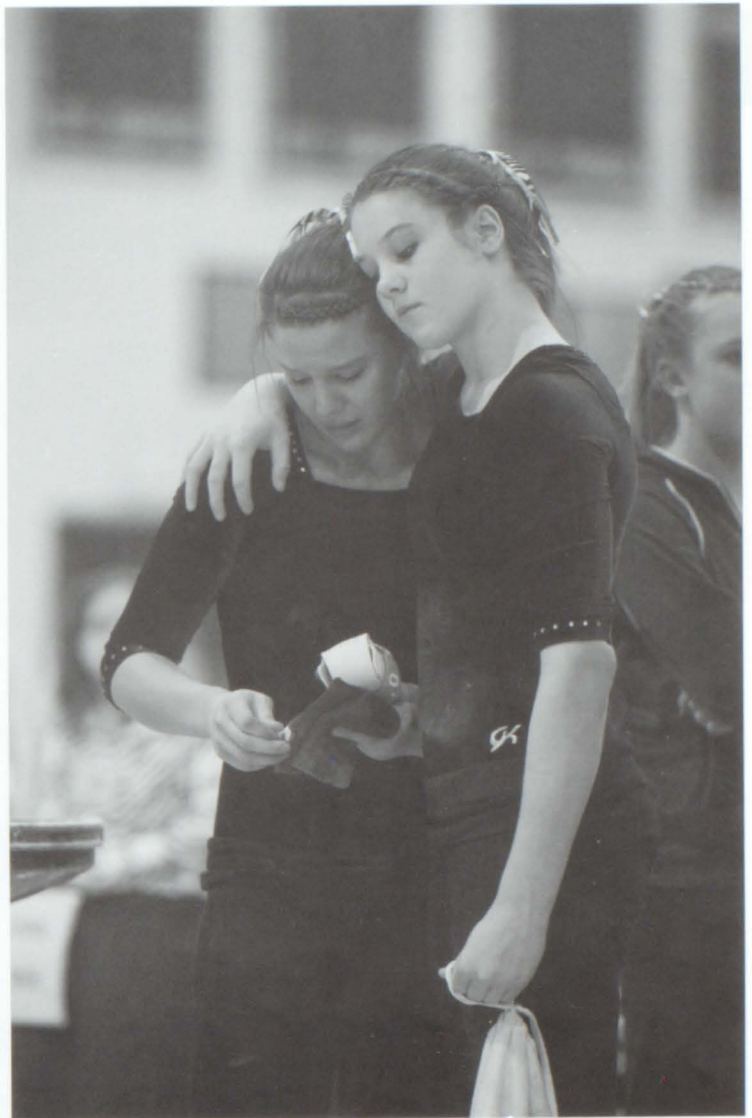

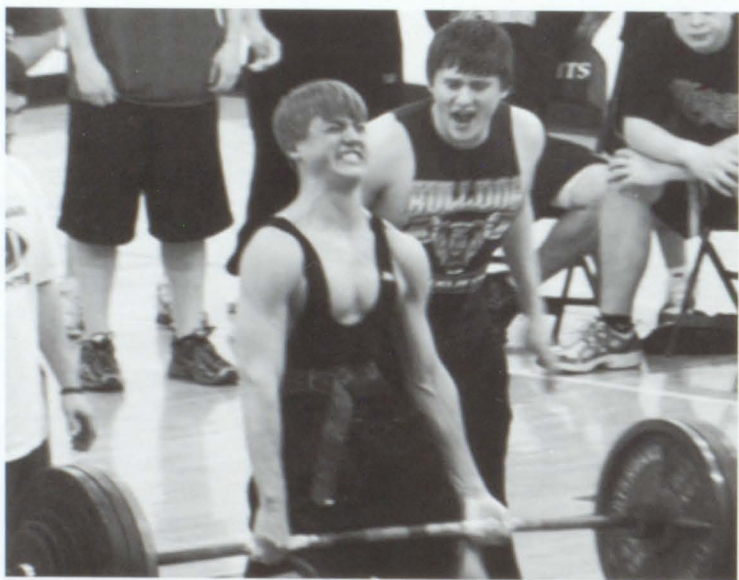

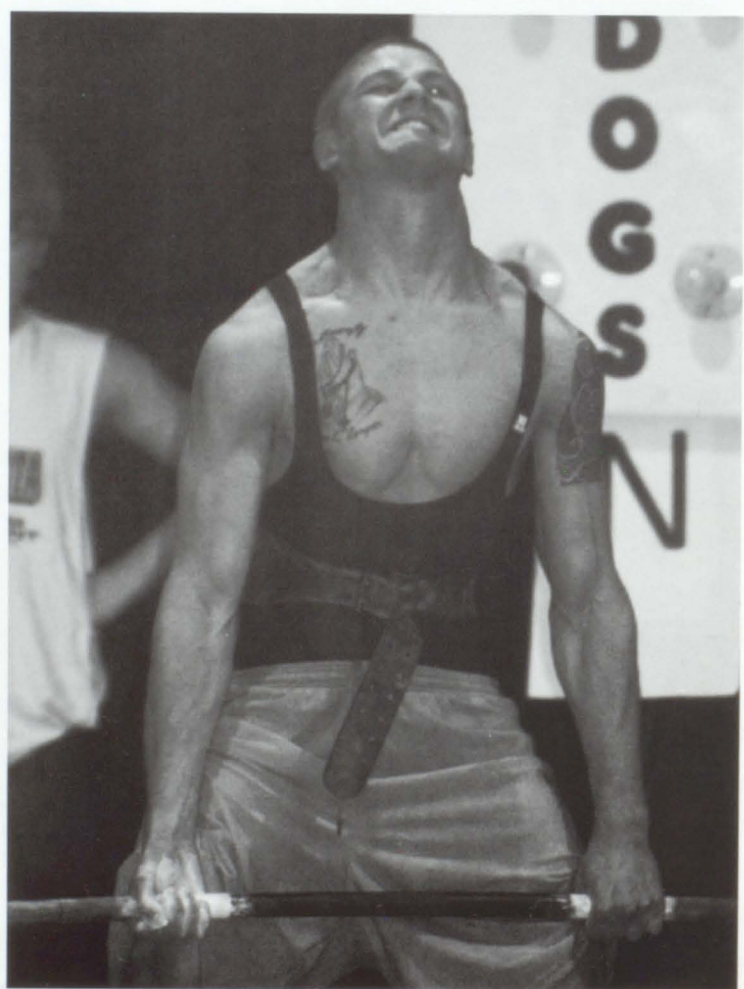

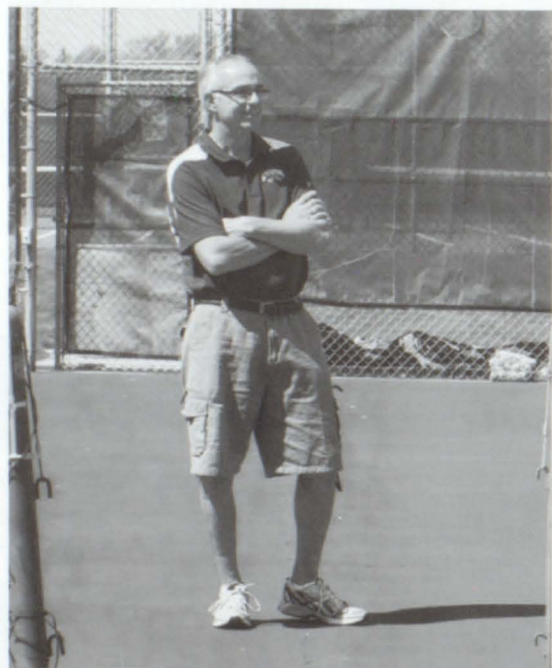

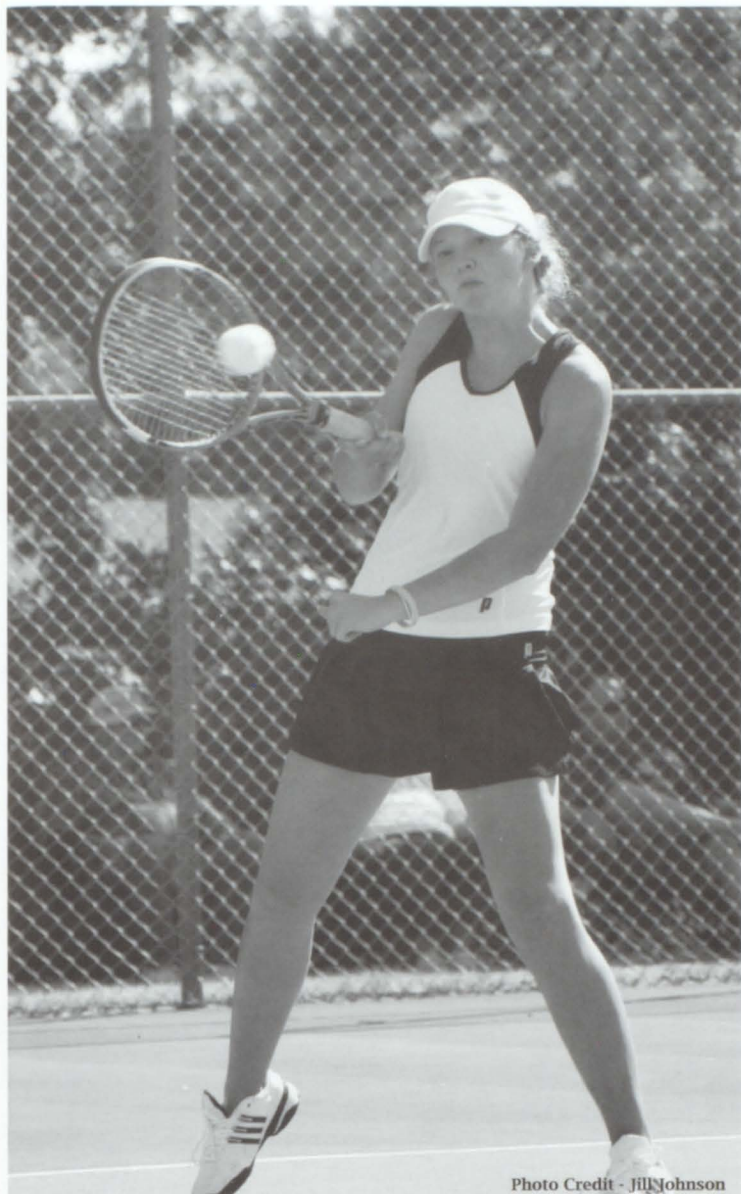

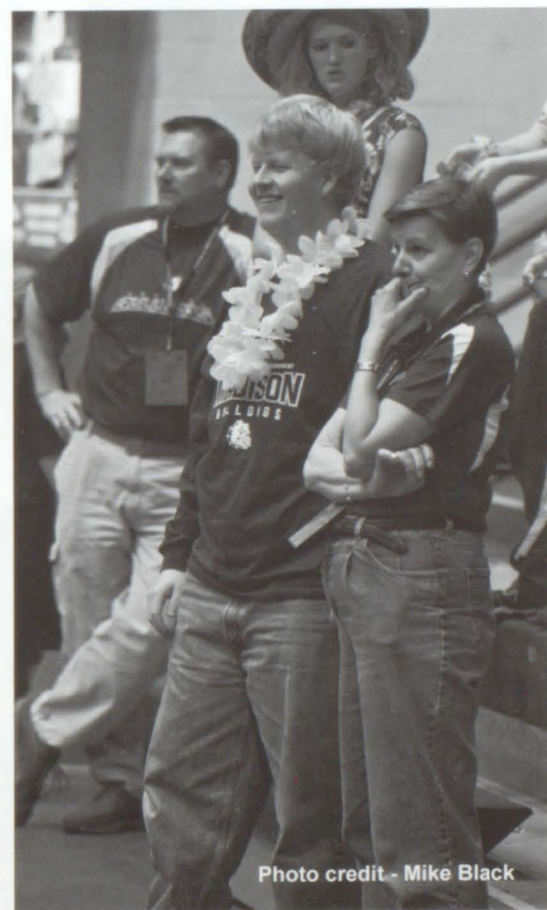

Taking After Rube Goldberg

Complicated Machines, A Simple Task

This is Physics at its finest. As defined by Webster's New World Dictionary, a Rube Goldberg device is a comically involved, complicated invention, laboriously contrived to perform a simple operation. In other words it is easier and less time consuming to complete the task than it is to use one of these machines. Mr. Swenson challenged his senior physics student to create a device that dispenses hand sanitizer in a fairly clean manner.

There were several requirements for this project. It had to include all six simple machines: a screw, a wedge, a pulley, an incline plane, a lever, and a wheel and axle. It also had to have a minimum of ten steps. Students had about a week and a half to create their machines and followed the national guidelines found at rubegoldberg.com. Wood, cardboard, fishing reels, paper plates, string, balloons, tin foil, dominos, and tape are just some of the materials that were used by physics students to make their machines. All four designs were very unique.

I would like to report that no one was injured in the creating and presenting of these machines, but there was one mishap that found two students in the office. I, Carlye Williams, was tying a string between an open pair of scissors. The step before, which involved a weight dropping onto those scissors, was already in place. When part of our machine accidentally went off, the weight came down on the scissors and sliced through the tip of my finger. There was quite a bit of blood, and Nick Kranz a short while later fainted near the machine. It was an event I'm sure neither of us will forget.



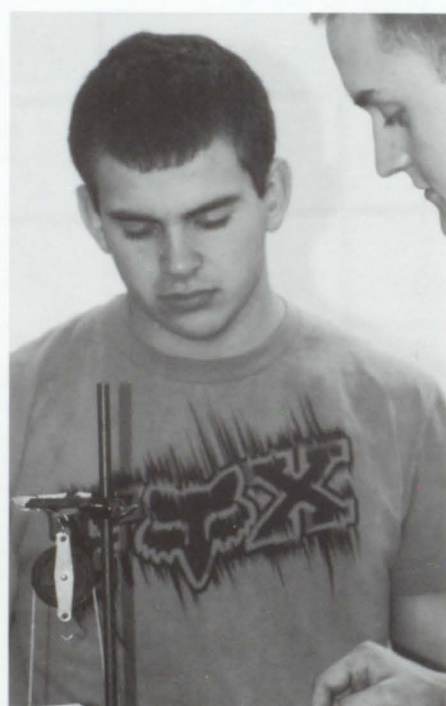

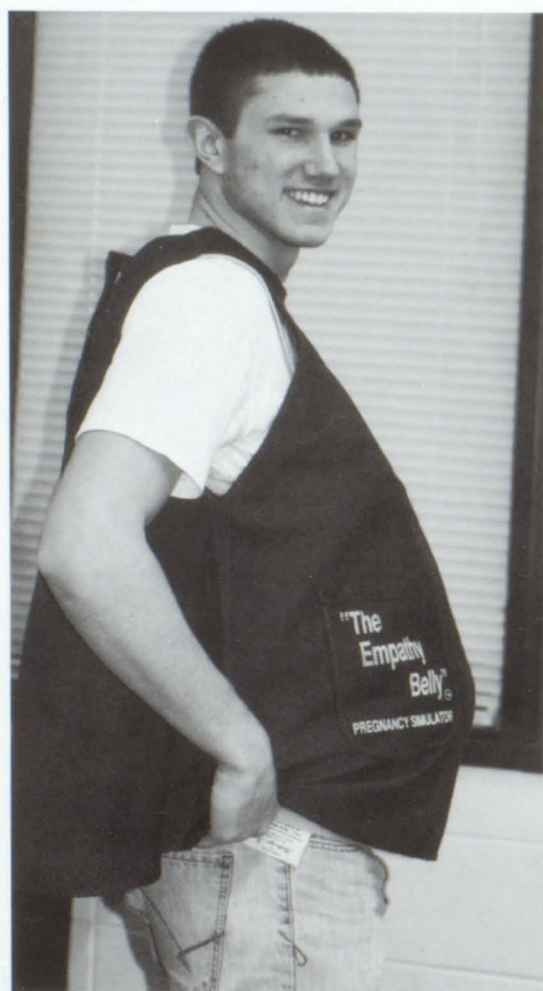
