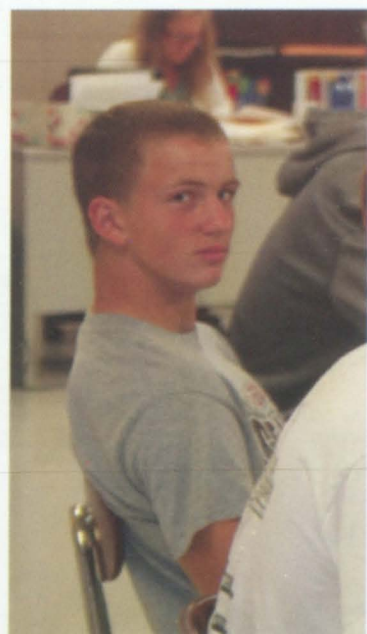

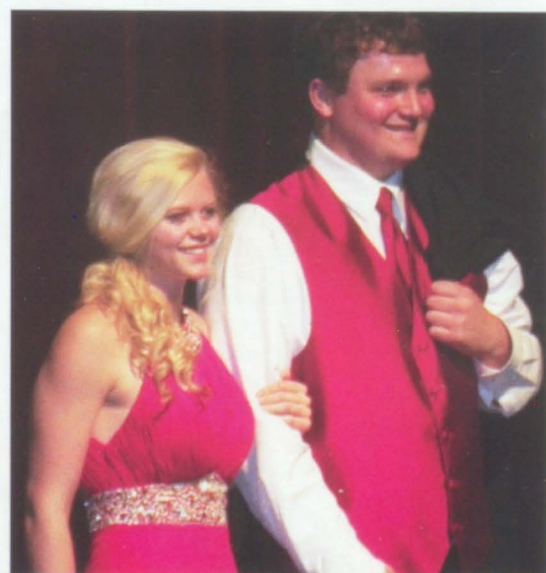

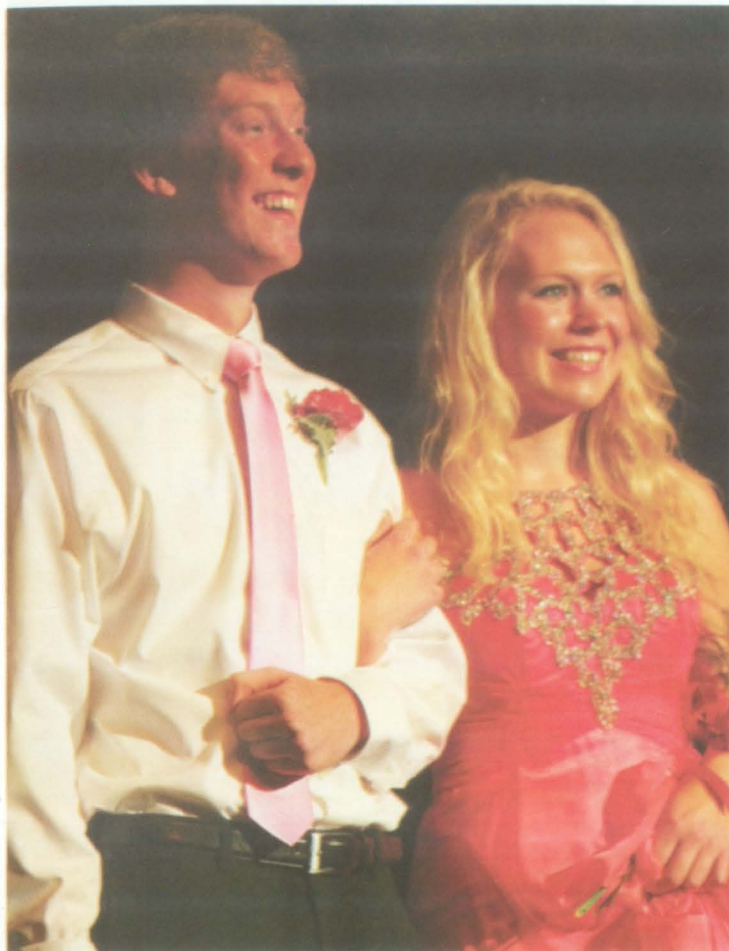

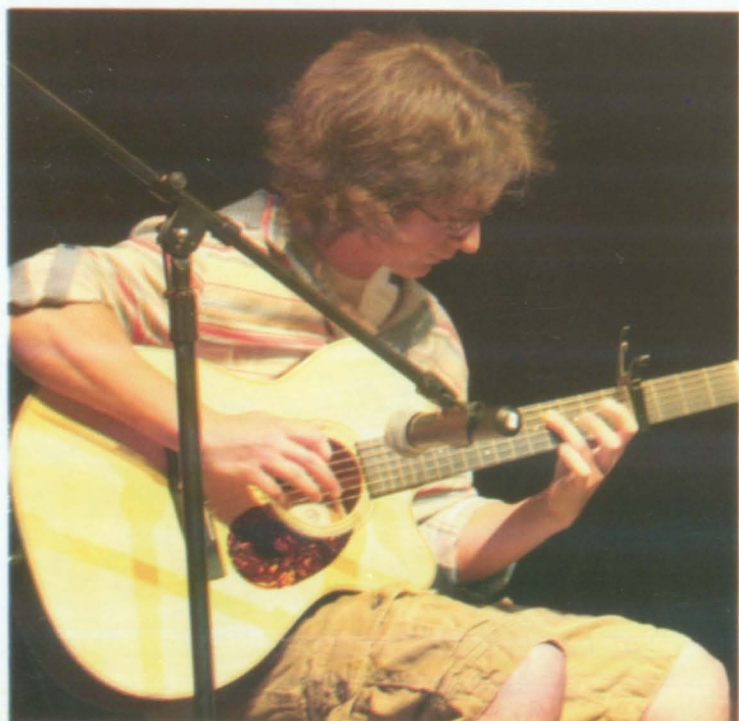

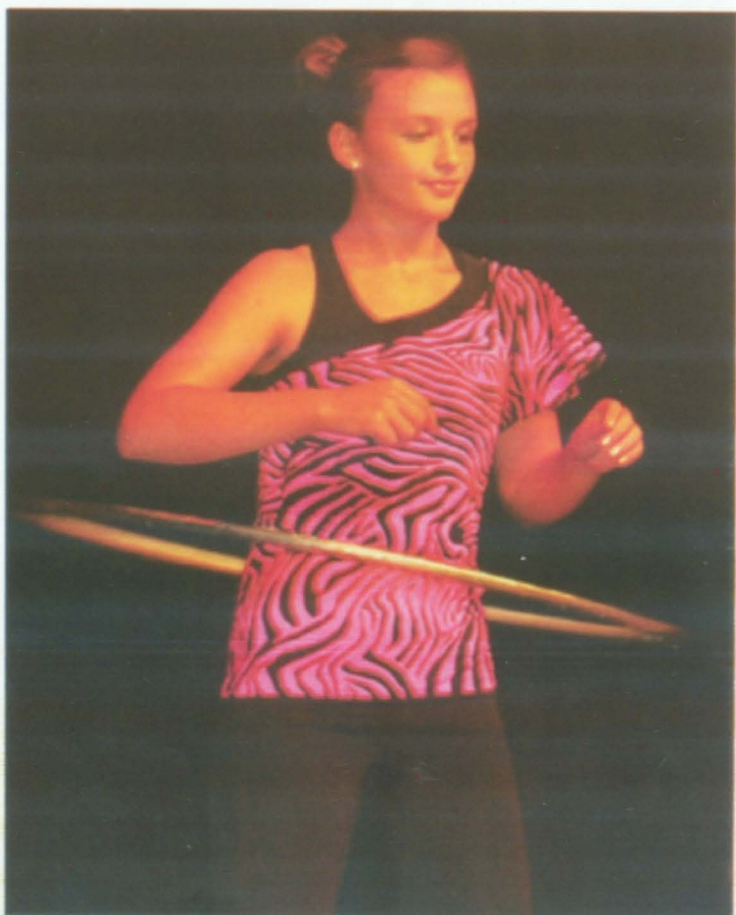

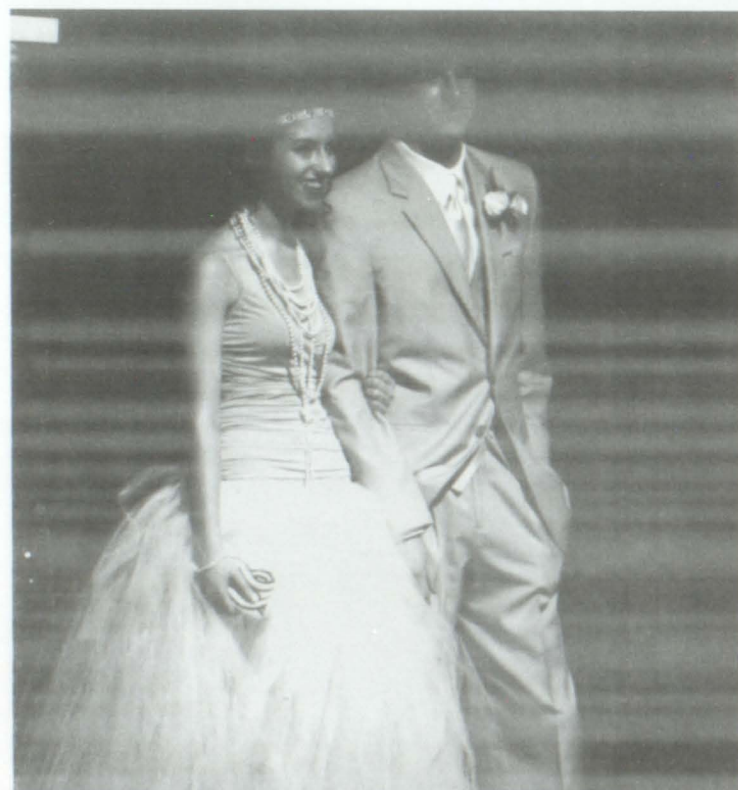

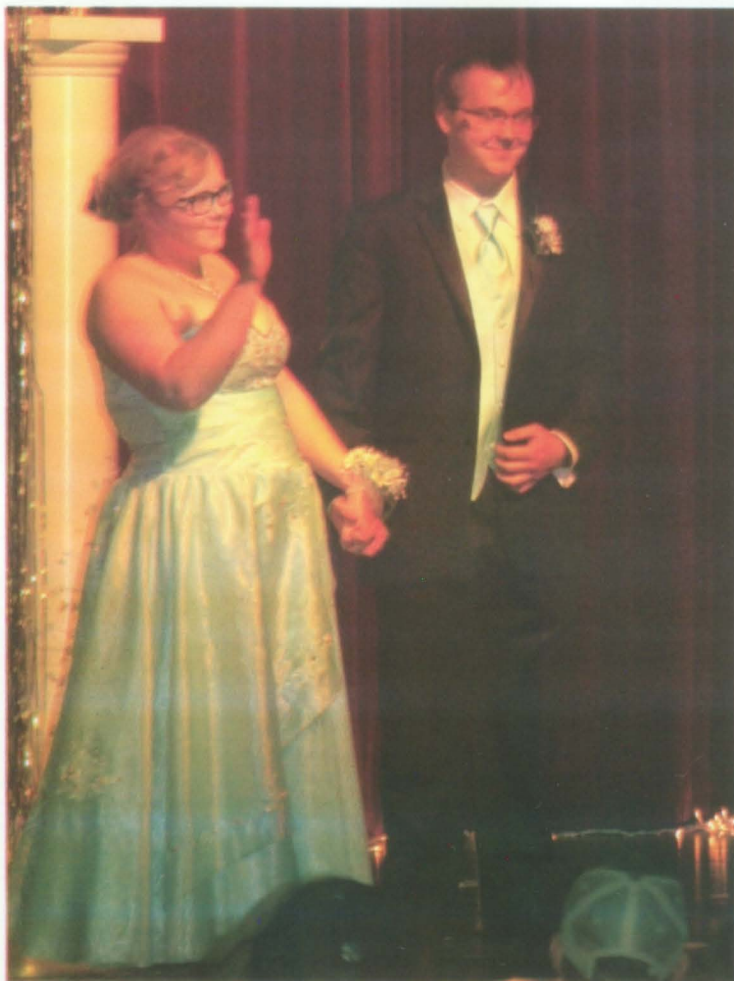

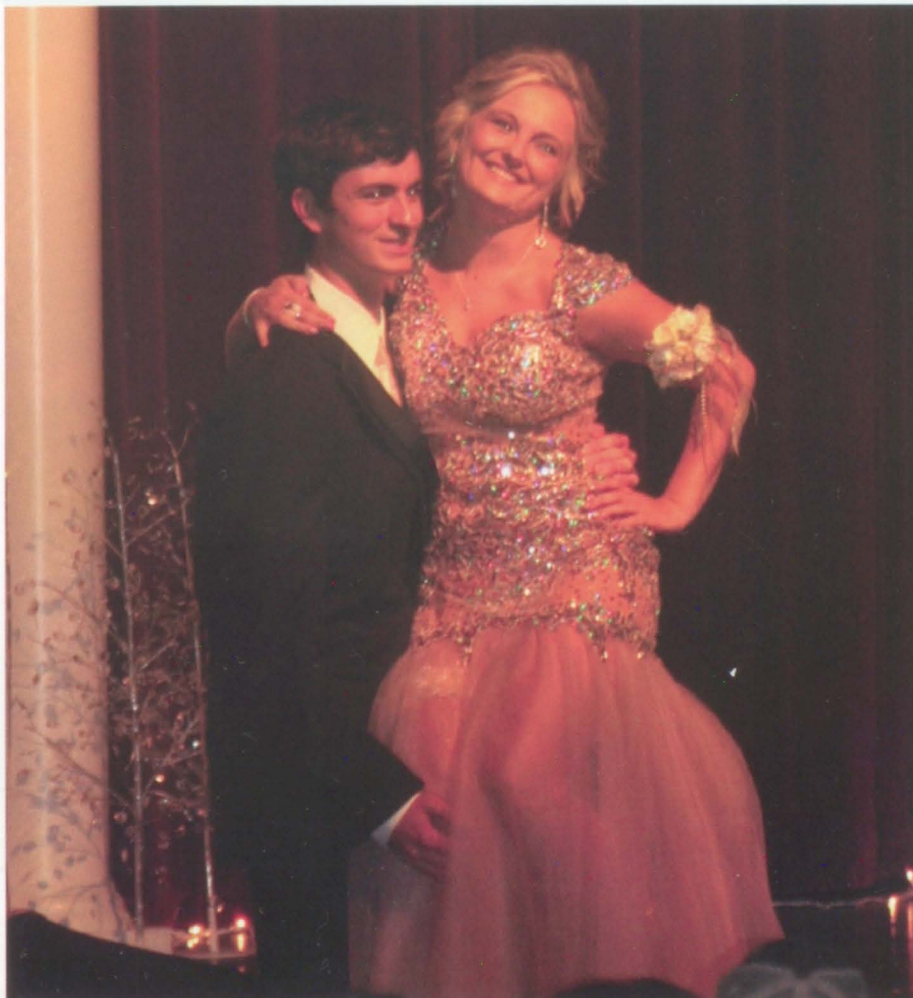
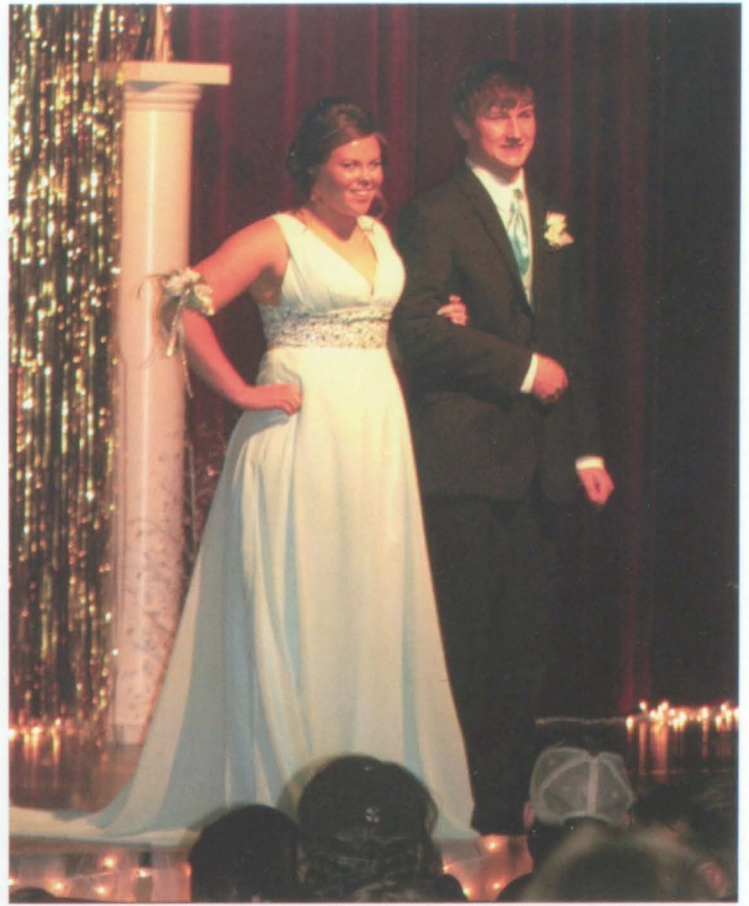

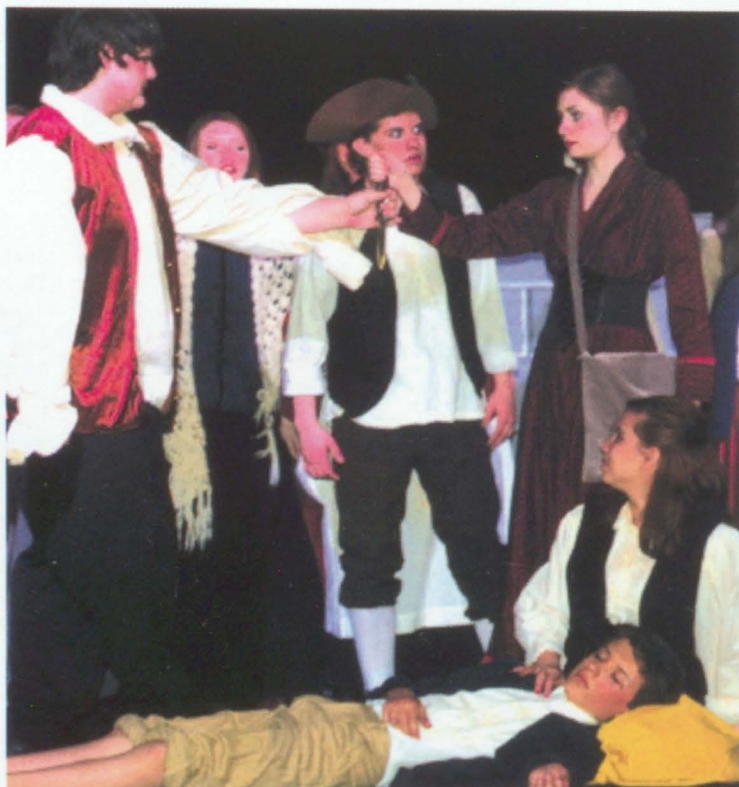

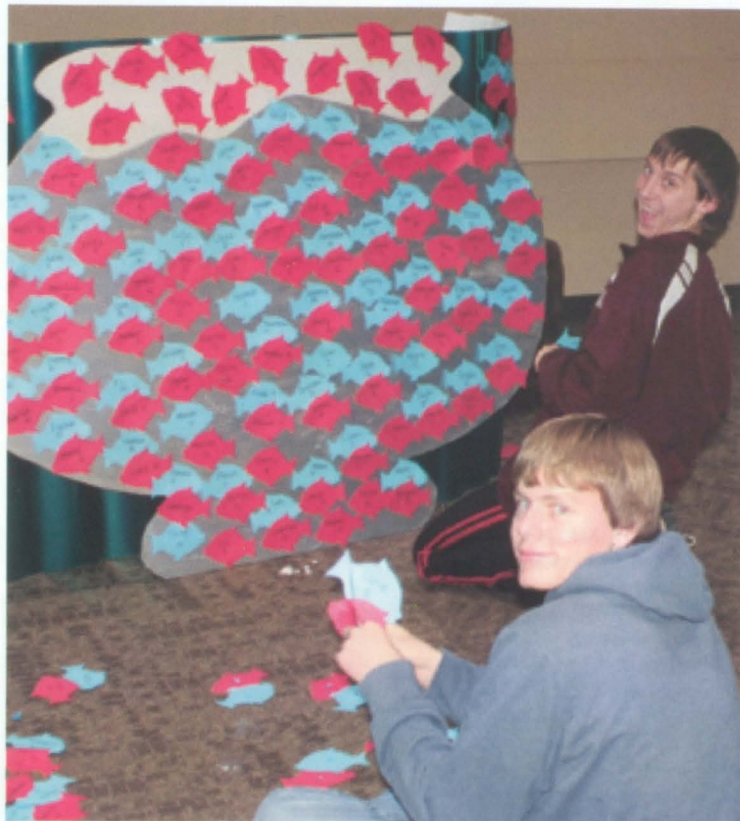

"Debate is judged by an individual judge for the preliminary rounds," says Ms. Kunkel. Madison participated in Public Forum, which consists of "two partners arguing for the pro or con of a topic that is released every month." That means that every month a new topic will be given to the team and everyone will have to research that topic to prepare for their debate. According to Ms. Kunkel, "There is one prepared speech that outlines the argument that the team will be debating" and students do not know coming into the round which side of the argument they will have. When they get to the round they flip a coin to decide who will argue for which side, meaning that they have to have both sides thoroughly researched before they come. "The rest is impromptu" said Coach Kunkel.

A large part of debate is extemporaneous speaking, which means that one has to create their speeches on the spot. According to Coach Kunkel, "You need to have a compilation of proof and evidence so that you can argue points." She says, "The students have a set form to follow for the argument, taking turns back and forth until the crossfire, in which it is a free-flow of debate."

Finally, Ms. Kunkel said, "It was an excellent season. We had a lot of new members and they rocked it. I had the honor of working with a group of incredibly motivated students. Debate is difficult and stressful; it takes an inordinate amount of work outside of school and practice. But these debaters put their best work forward. They helped one another and gave each other pointers. I think one of my favorite moments from this year was walking into my classroom one day after school and finding the team there. On their own, they had decided to get together and share notes and just argue. And that same dedication followed us to the meets. Between rounds, in the car, in hotel rooms, they would be there, quizzing each other so that they could all succeed. They truly exemplified the definition of 'team'."

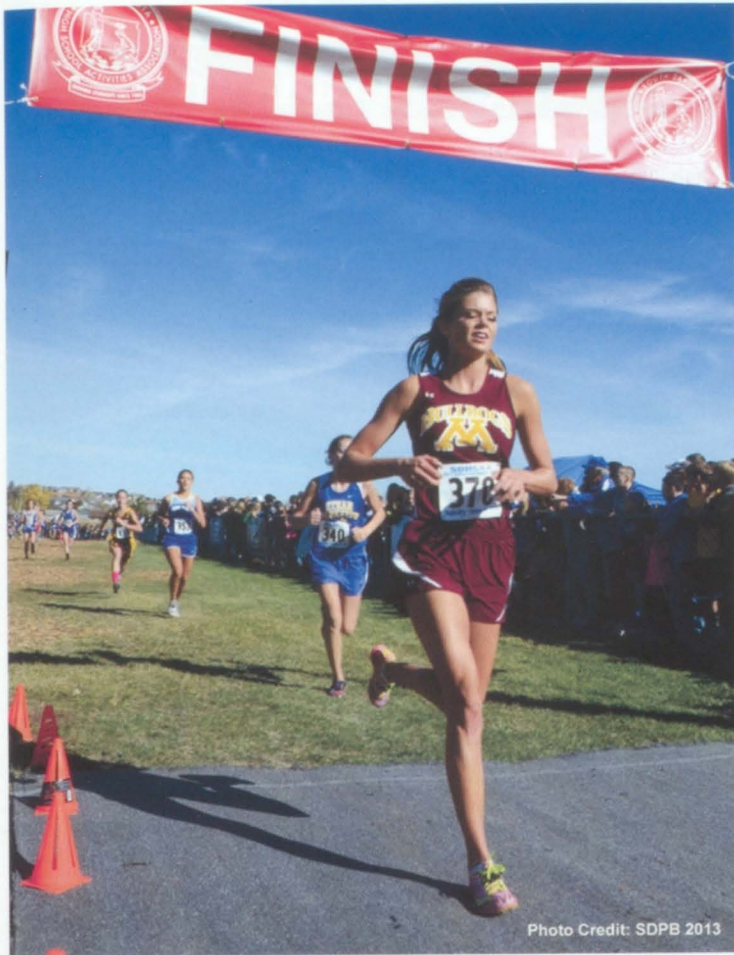

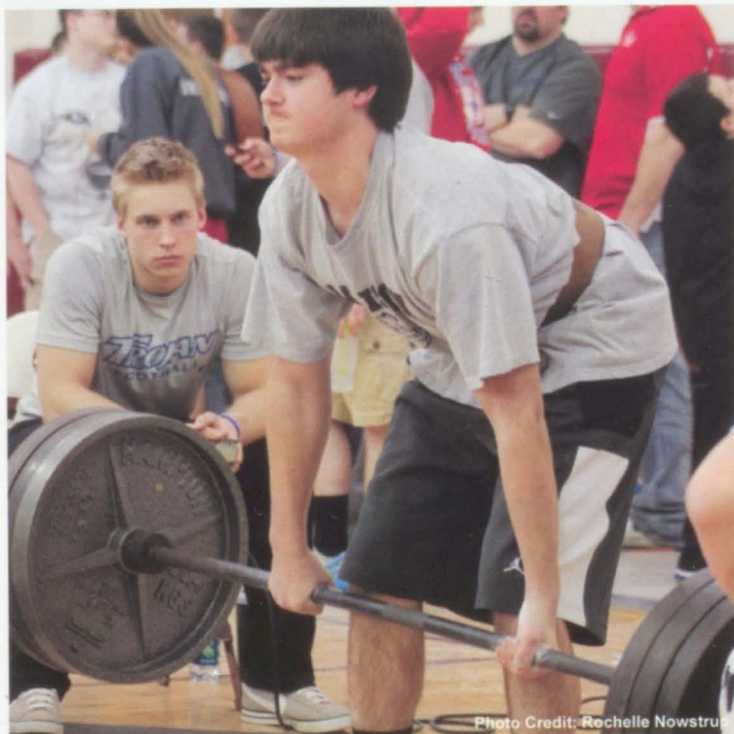

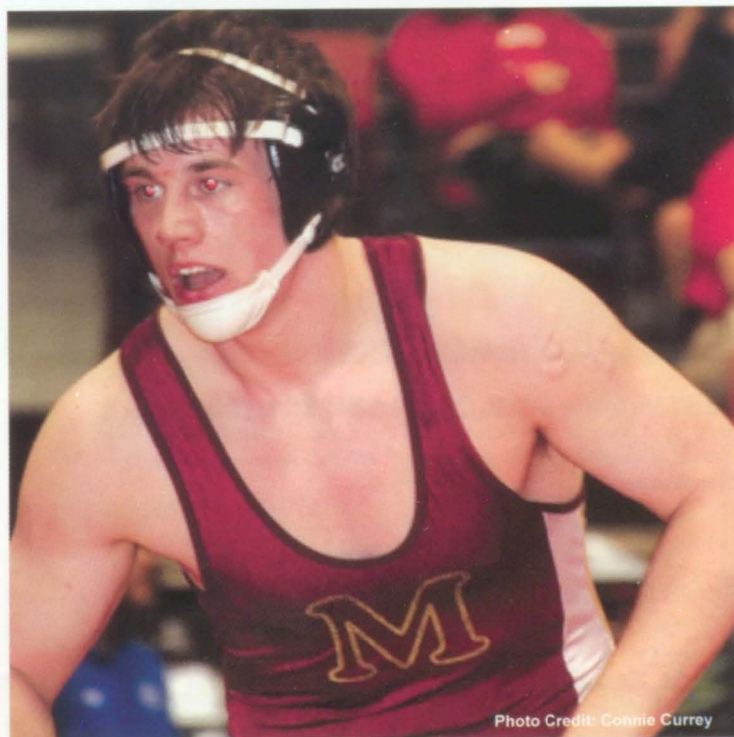

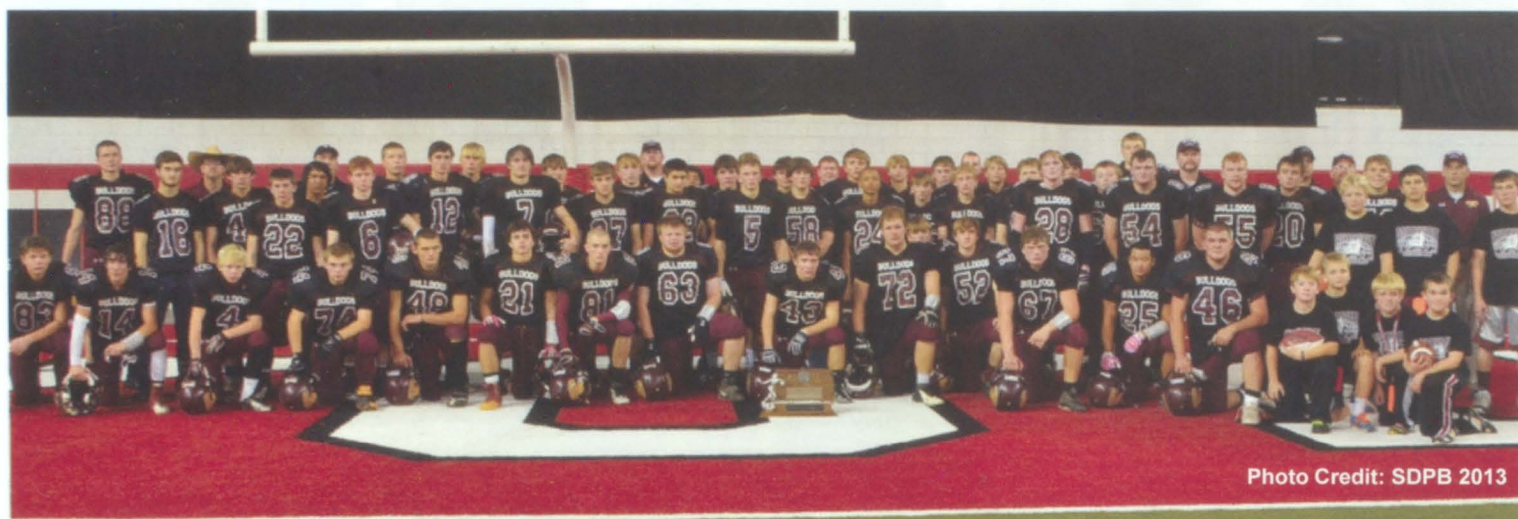

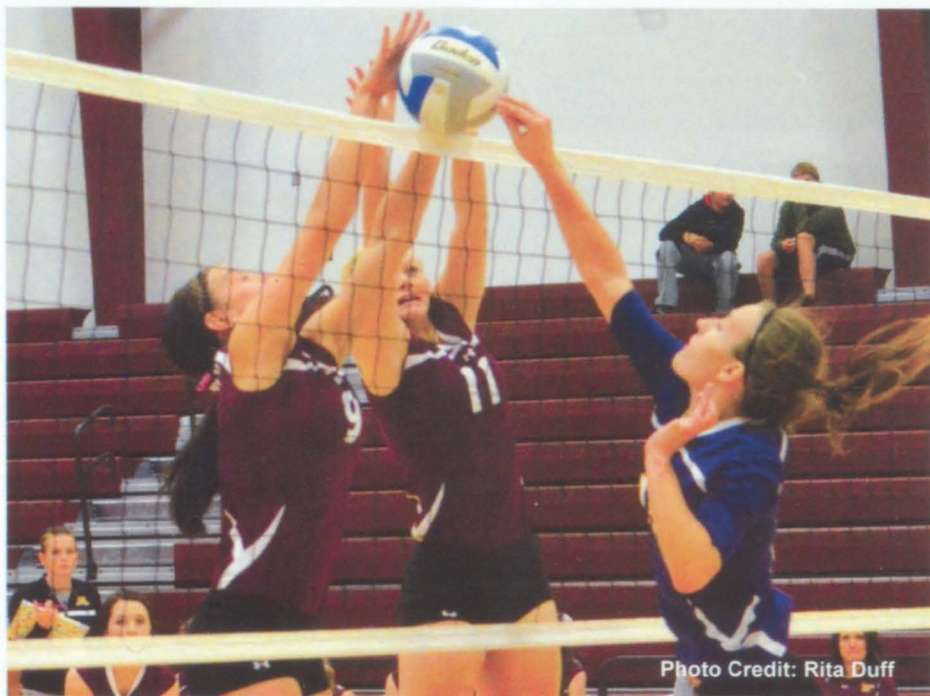

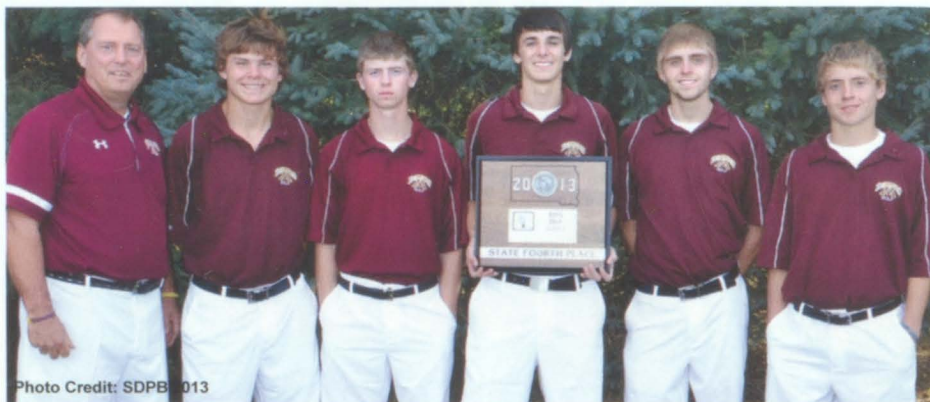

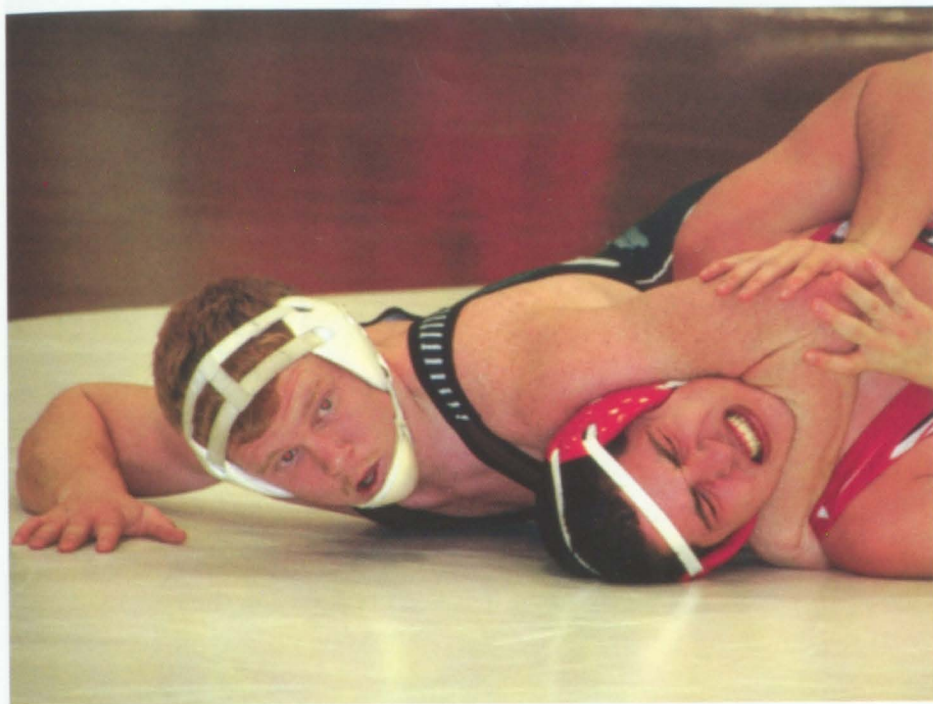

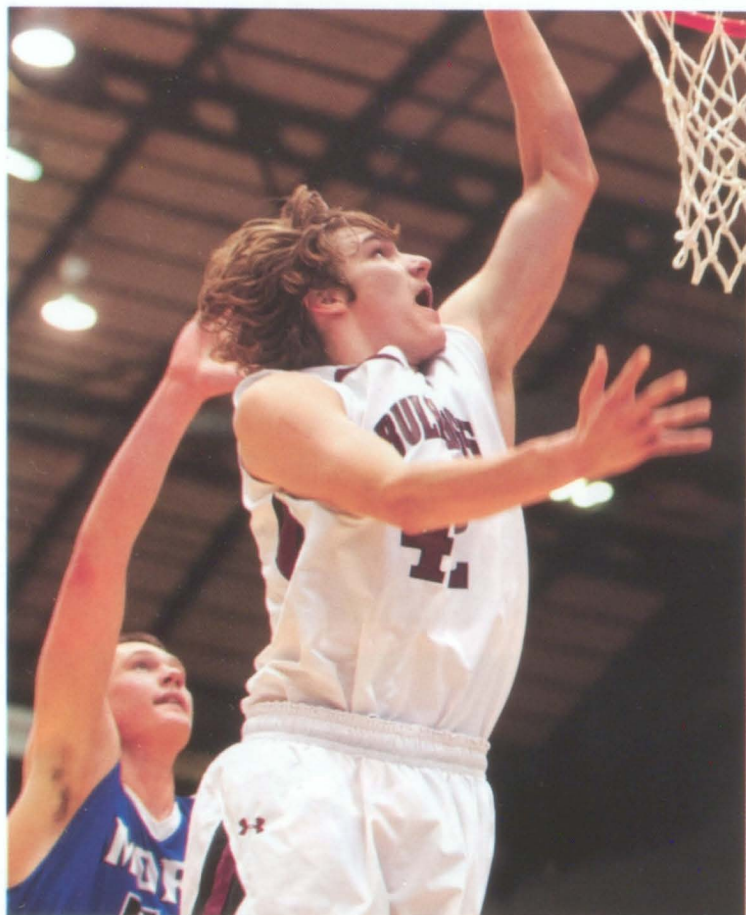

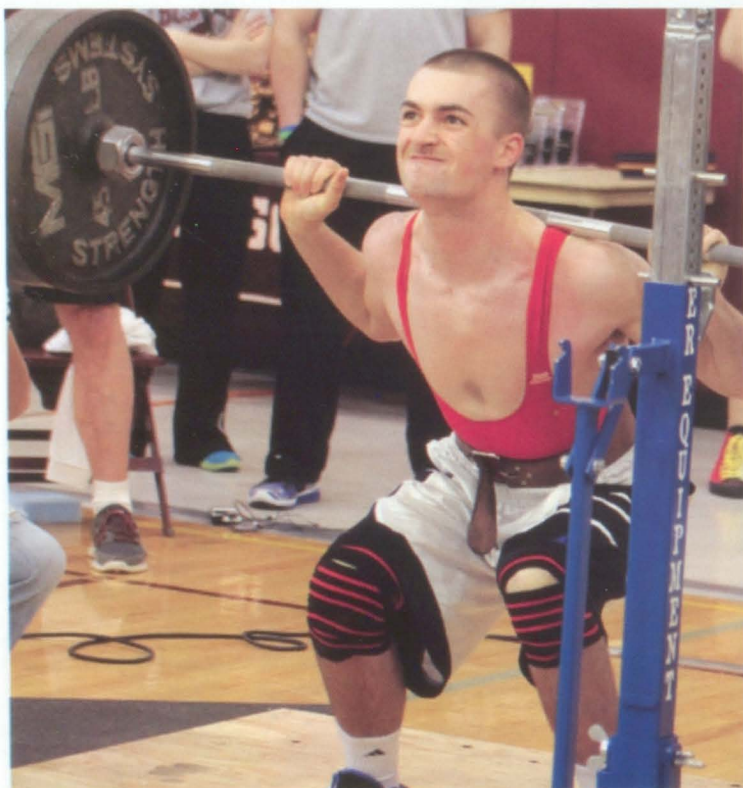

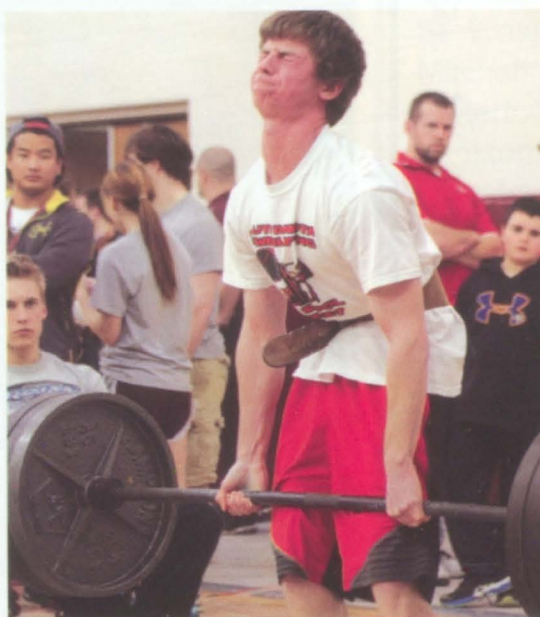

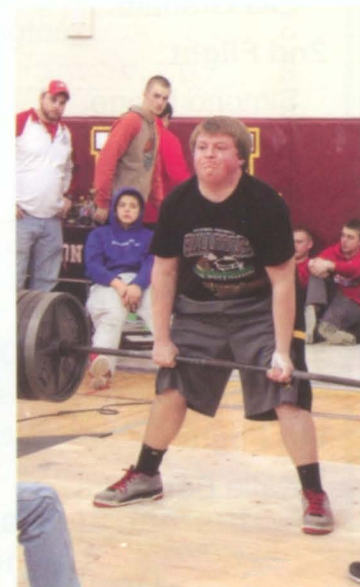

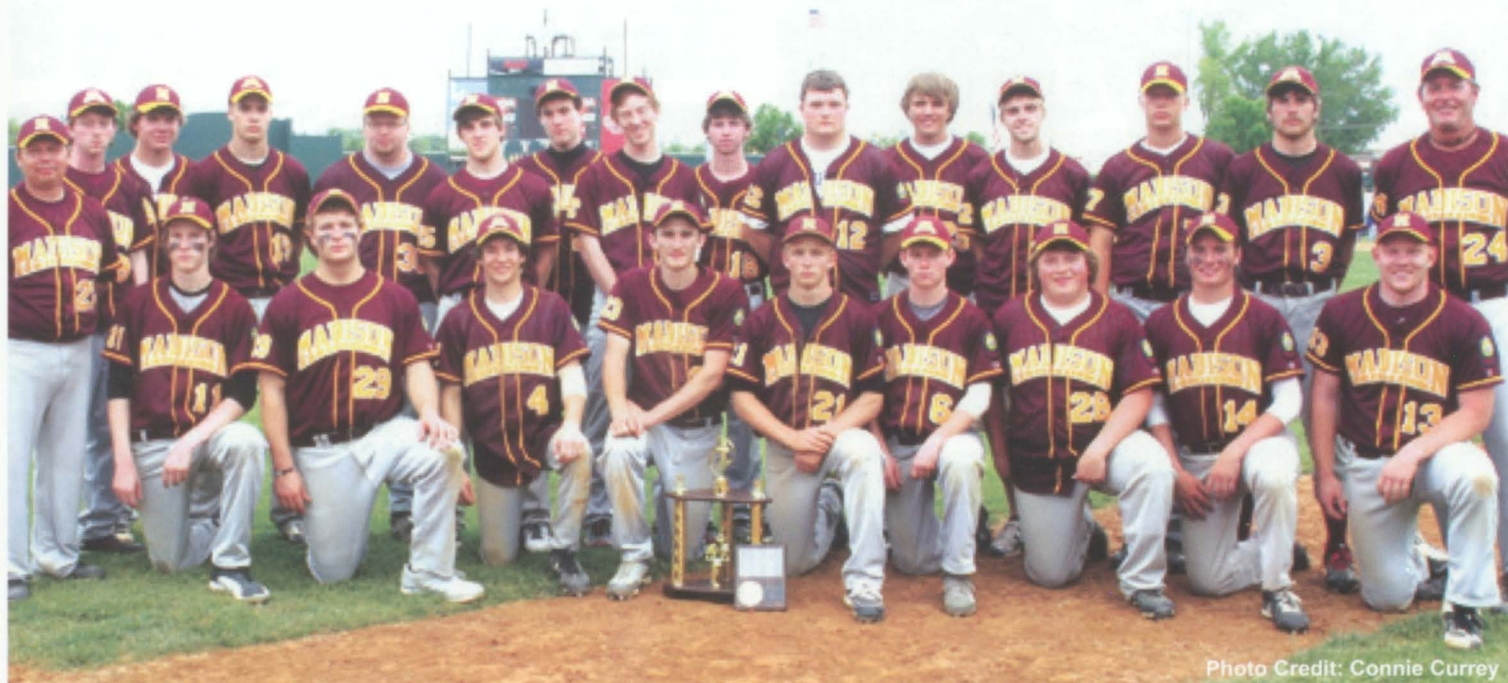

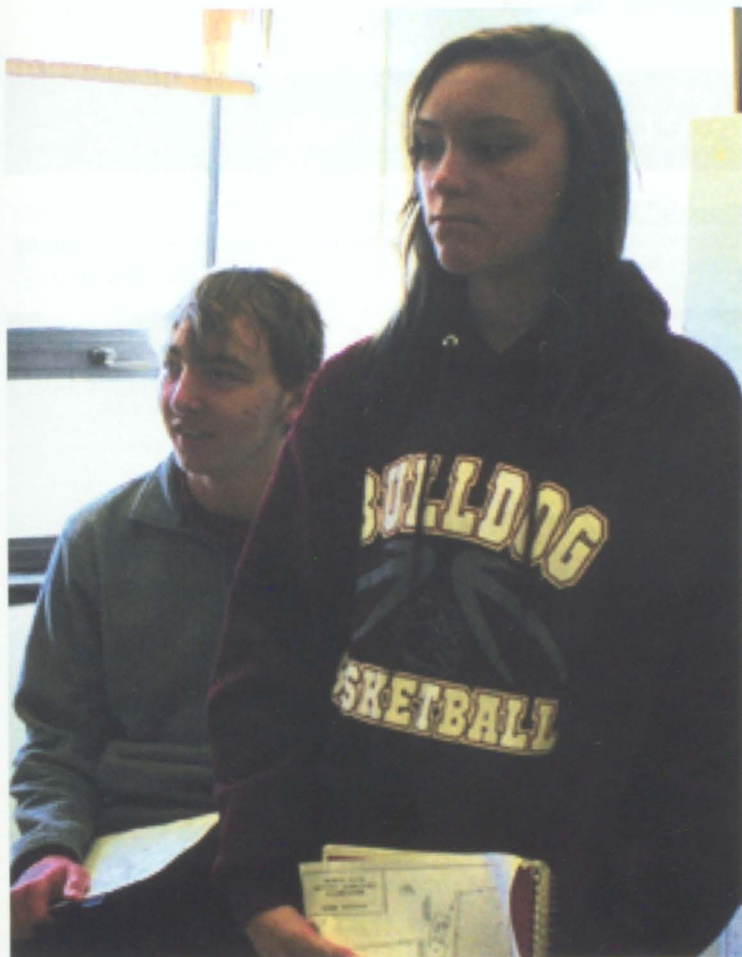

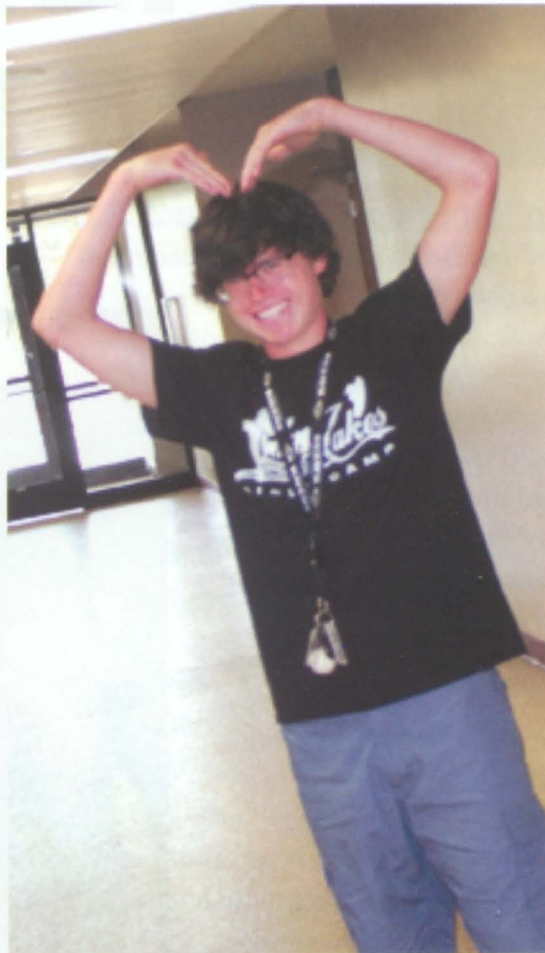

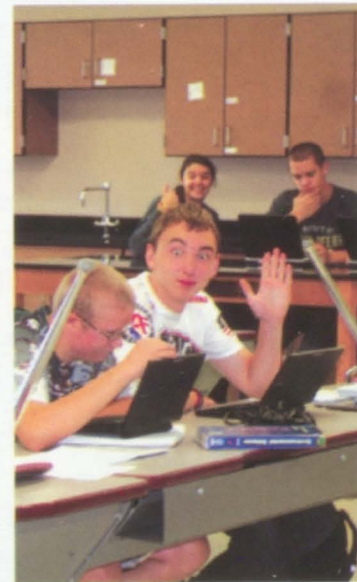

About ProStart

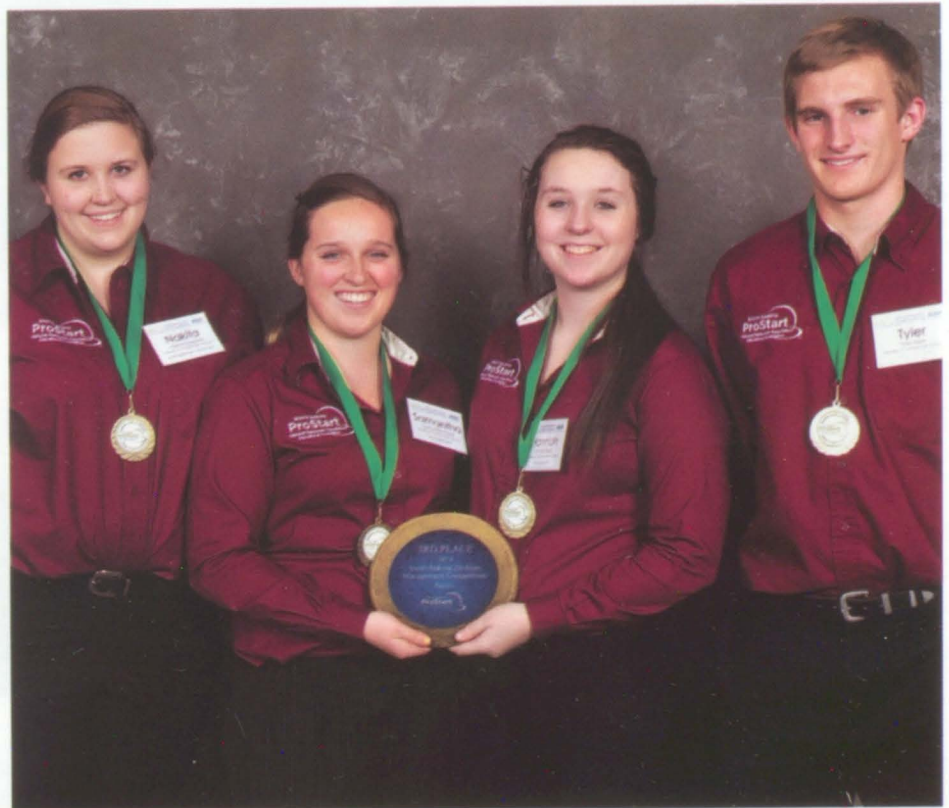

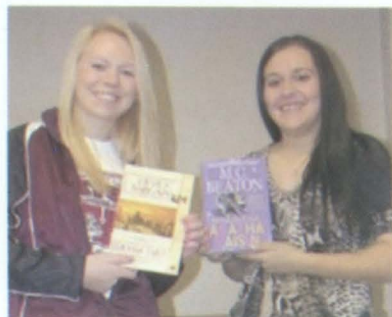
