The Pioneer Memorial Foundation has developed a scholarship program to assist students who are pursuing or planning to pursue a health care degree at a post-secondary two or four year college, university or vocational-technical

### SCHOOL IMMUNIZATIONS - STAY ON TRACK THIS SUMMER!

Summer vacation is a great time to schedule your child's well-child visit and stay on track with required school immunizations. Routine assessments of your children's medical needs and personalized recommendations from our providers will help prevent illness and ensure a healthy start to the school year this fall. With a little preparation before school begins, you can avoid some of the stressful days and frenetic running around that characterizes back-to-school time.

#### 6th GRADE REQUIREMENTS:

- Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis) Requirement for SD 6th grade
- MCV4 (Meningococcal) Requirement for SD 6th grade students
   HPV (Human Papillomavirus) recommended
   Flu (Influenza) recommended

#### KINDERGARTEN REQUIREMENTS:

- 4 or more doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis)
- vaccine, at least one dose on or after age 4
   4 or more doses of poliovirus (IPV) vaccine, at least one dose on or after age 4
- 2 doses of a measles/ mumps /rubella vaccine (MMR) or submit serological evidence of immunity. Minimum age of the 1st dose is 12
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. Minimum age for the 1st dose is 2 months. History of disease is acceptable with parent or guardian

Note: Although not required for school entry, Hib, Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Influenza, and Pneumococcal vaccines are also recommended for your kindergartener.



Back-to-school is also a good time to schedule your child's annual physical. These check-ups are often the only visit health school-age kids and teenagers have with their medical provider every year. The annual physical gives the medical provider a chance to give the child a thorough physical exam and addresses any emotional, developmental, or social concerns. Getting your children all of the vaccines recommended by CDC's immunization schedule is one of the most important things you can do to protect their health. Pioneer Memorial is offering \$30 Athletic Physicals for students in grade school through high school participating in athletics during the 2022-2023 school year. Everyone playing a sport needs to have a physical before practice begins.

Prior to the physical exam, athletic physical forms must be completed, including a parent or guardians' signature, and presented at your appointment. These forms are available through your school.

Appointments can be made at any of our clinics. When making an appointment, ask for an "Athletic Physical" or schedule a "Wellness Exam" if your insurance covers wellness visits. \$30 is due at the time of appointment if scheduled as an Athletic Physical. Any additional testing (i.e., laboratory, radiology) is not included in the price.
